THE REFRESHMENT PRINCIPLE:

I am most refreshed when God moves through me to refresh others. MY REFRESHMENT COMES FROM GOD WHEN I POUR MYSELF INTO OTHERS.

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your brothers, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect..."

Matthew 5:43-48

If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right. But if you show favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as lawbreakers.

Slaves, obey your earthly masters in everything; and do it, not only when their eye is on you and to win their favor, but with sincerity of heart and reverence for the Lord.... Masters, provide your slaves with what is right and fair, because you know that you also have a Master in heaven.

Colossians 3:22; 4:1

Paul wants Philemon to **<u>f</u>ree** his **<u>s</u>iave**</u>. How does this apply to us? We have favor slavery // ILL: DWIGHT AND ANDY
