BY-LAWS FOR THE COMMISSION ON YOUTH & STUDENT MINISTRY LEADERSHIP

Article One: Name

The name of this ministry shall be The Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership.

Article Two: Statement of Purpose

The Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership shall be responsible for promoting student ministry events and programs throughout the Original Free Will Baptist Convention. To this end, the commission will advocate for outlets for student ministry among Convention Ministries, promote the Woman's Auxiliary, Laymen's League, and State Youth Convention's programs and other events, facilitate leadership development among Student/Youth leaders, and offer recommendations to and assist Conferences and Churches in issues dealing with student ministry staff.

Article Three: Philosophy of Ministry

The philosophy of ministry for the Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership shall be an emphasis on the connection between the local church, conferences, and the Convention of Original Free Will Baptist. The Commission's focus shall be equipping leaders of student ministries for effective Christian ministry through training conferences, articles, websites, mailings and special presentations in order to expose Original Free Will Baptists to new methods of reaching children and teenagers for Christ. The intended audience of said Commission will be adult leaders of student ministries to help them clarify their calling to student ministry and equip them with the most up to date tools for effective ministry.

This Commission shall work in support of all other Student Ministry organizations to bring about unity in the mission field of Student Ministry. This Commission shall uphold a spirit of unity and cooperativeness.

Article Four: Membership and Appointment

The election of members, establishing terms of service, and the filling of vacancies on the Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership are the responsibility of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. The Commission shall consist of at least one pastor, one salaried youth ministry leader, and one lay-member to maintain balance. It shall also seek to incorporate members with knowledge of denominational Student Ministries to gain perspective.

Article Five: Officers

Section One: Listing

The officers of the Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership shall consist of a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Secretary. The officers shall be elected by the entire Board at the first meeting following the Annual Convention.

Section Two: Duties

Chairperson

The chairperson shall:

- Preside over all meetings of the Commission
- Make any annual reports to the Annual Convention and Executive Committee that may be necessary
- Appoint any temporary committees
- Prepare the agenda for each meeting

Vice-Chairperson

The Vice-Chairperson shall:

- Preside over meetings in the absence of Chairperson
- Assist the Chairperson in the general supervision of the Commission and various projects.

Secretary

The Secretary shall:

- Record proceedings of all meetings of the Commission on Student Ministry Leadership. All minutes, records, etc. are property of the Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership and shall be turned over to the Chairperson when the Secretary's term has expired.
- Send copies of minutes of meeting to Commission members.
- Assist with registration and records for training conferences, events, and presentations
- Assist with the upkeep of websites and oversee mailings

Article Six: Fiscal Responsibility

Shall be discussed at a later time with respect to Convention and other funding sources that may be available.

Article Seven: Meetings

The Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership shall hold at least four (4) business meetings per year (one each quarter). All other meetings may be called at the discretion of the Chairperson or by written, signed request of any three Commission members.

Article Eight: Amendments to By-Laws

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the *Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership* at any regular or special meeting. Proposed amendments shall be furnished to the Commission members at least ten (10) days prior to a regular or special meeting.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL ADDITION Bylaws

Article II

OFFICERS, BOARDS, COMMITTEES, AND THE MANNER OF THEIR ELECTION

SECTION 21: Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership: The commission of youth & student ministry leadership shall be composed of five (5) members with the term of one member expiring each year. Of these five (5) members should be at least one (1) ordained Original Free Will Baptist minister, one (1) salaried youth minister and one (1) lay person on the commission to maintain balance. The establishing of terms and the filling of vacancies shall be the responsibility of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

Article III DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

SECTION 23: Commission on Youth & Student Ministry Leadership: It shall be the responsibility of this commission to focus on equipping leaders of youth and student ministries for effective Christian ministry. This commission will advocate for outlets for youth and student ministry among Convention Ministries, through the Woman's Auxiliary, Laymen's League, State Youth Convention and other events that facilitate leadership development among youth and student leaders. This commission will also be responsible for offering recommendations to and assisting Churches and Conferences in issues dealing with both salaried and volunteer youth and student ministry staff.

This Commission shall work in support of all other youth and student organizations to bring about unity in the mission field of youth and student ministry. This Commission shall uphold a spirit of unity and cooperativeness.

Motion to accept the request of brother Harold Jones to appoint the Reverend Phillip Boykin to fill the unexpired term of the Reverend Calvin Heath on the Board of Foreign Missions. MSP

Buddy Sasser, Director of Convention Services, presented his report, as well as a report on behalf of the Convention Program Committee. *Motion to accept the recommendations of the Program Committee to invite the Mission Valley Original Free Will Baptist Church choir to sing at the Tuesday night worship service for the 2007 Annual Convention and for the Reverend James Howard Nobles to speak at the worship service; also to invite the Reverend Ashley Summerlin to speak at the Wednesday morning worship service for the Annual Convention and the Reverend Barry Stallings be asked to speak for the Thursday morning worship service. MSP

Discussion was held concerning the Yearbook format for 2007.

•Motion to publish a Convention and Conference Annual Reports Book for the 2007 Convention, to include the minutes of the 2006 Convention and Annual Conference Meetings, Ministry Reports, the Convention Constitution and Bylaws, the Convention program, and contact information for our ministries. This book will be printed in the same format as the "2005 Convention and Conference Annual Reports" book. Directory information would not be included in this book, nor would a separate Directory be printed at this time. MSP

*Following are minutes of the February 28 and April 4, 2006 meetings of the Executive Committee. These minutes were read and adopted during the 2006 setting of the Annual Convention, however, they were not printed in the Program and Annual Reports Book. They are being printed here for historical purposes.

Executive Committee Meeting February 28, 2006

The Executive Committee of Original Free Will Baptist met February 28, 2006 at the Headquarters with the following members present: The Reverends Charles Renfrow, Ray Wells, Garland Suggs, Leon Grubbs, Harold Swinson, Ronnie Hobgood, Sam Weeks, Al Markuson, and Mrs. Andrea Cox, sitting in for the Director of Convention Services. Vice-President Charles Renfrow served in absence of President Fred Baker.

The meeting opened with prayer following the sharing of several needs within the members of the board. Prayer was given by the Vice-President.

The minutes of the meeting of February 7, 2006 were read and approved.

The treasurer presented the work of the Finance Committee and the report of the budget for 2007. •Motion made and carried to adopt the budget for 2007.

Following a short break, Mrs. Mary Dudley, director of the Sunday School Ministries, shared an idea with the committee. After much discussion concerning our Convention and the need to assist all of our churches, the following proposal was presented to the committee: That we (the Convention) sponsor regional meetings to focus attention on different topics of interest/needs that we feel we have in our denomination. The meetings will be held in various locations on Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM--12:00 noon. There would be focus groups with a table leader and a reporter. All suggestions given would be compiled and disseminated to appropriate groups for action. The times and places will be announced soon. *Motion made and carried to support this idea and encourage our churches to participate in the meetings.

The Sub-Committee on the Constitution and By-Laws gave the following report. All changes are in the By-Laws section.

•As consideration was given to the office of treasurer under Term Limits (Article 2 Section 23 the following change is proposed: The new article would read as follows:

NEW READING: No person shall be eligible to serve as a General Officer for more than two (2) consecutive terms except the Treasurer who may serve no more than four (4) consecutive two (2) year terms.

OLD READING: Term Limits: No person shall be eligible to serve as a general officer or a member of any standing board, committee or commission for more than two (2) consecutive terms.

•To delete Article III Section 4 completely which reads: Director of Convention Services: The Director of Convention Services shall maintain an office to be recognized as headquarters or home office for the Convention for the purpose of general public relations within and without our denomination relative to the entire program of the Convention. The term public relations is to be understood to mean the combining of the activities of publicity and promotion into an overall and well-coordinated program in order to influence and guide our Free Will Baptist constituency and the public relative to the program of the Convention.

Public relations within our Convention must include all boards, standing committees, commissions, auxiliaries, conferences or associations, churches, and ministers of the Convention.

Public relations without our Convention must include proper publicity and official representation whenever and wherever possible to properly inform the public of the goals and accomplishments of the Convention.

All publications designed or purported to represent an official position of this Convention and denomination shall be coordinated through the office of Director of Convention Services.

This office is a hired office not an elected office. For reference see Article 2 Section 4 which reads: The Director of Convention Services shall be employed by the Convention under such contract as may be agreed upon by himself and the Executive Committee. The Convention's Executive Committee shall be the directing and governing authority of this office.

•<u>To delete Article II Section 18 completely which reads:</u> Commission on Free Will Baptist College Student Fellowship: It shall be the responsibility of this commission to direct the work among Free Will Baptist College Student Fellowships throughout North Carolina.

*To change the reading of Article III Section 20 as follows: OLD READING: Retirement Homes Board: The Retirement Homes Board shall be responsible for the management and control of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries: (A) The scope of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries is to own, operate, and maintain apartments, rest homes, skilled nursing care, day care and all other facilities and services necessary or incidental to the operation of such retirement ministries and to do all other things usually done in the conduct of such ministries for the care of elderly and indigent persons. (B) It shall give an annual report to the convention of it achievements and needs.

NEW RÉADING Article III Section 20: The Retirement Homes Board: The Retirement Homes Board shall be responsible for the management and control of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries: The scope of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries is to own, operate, and maintain apartments, rest homes, skilled nursing care, day care and all other facilities and services necessary or incidental to the operation of such retirement ministries and to do all other things usually done in the conduct of such ministries for the care of elderly and indigent persons.

•Motion made and carried that we recommend these Constitutional Changes to the By-laws section at the seating of the Convention in May 2006.

•Motion made and carried to recommend to the Nominating Committee the following name for the office of Secretary of the Convention: The Reverend Al Warrick.

With work completed motion to adjourn carried and we dismissed with prayer.

Executive Committee Meeting April 4, 2006

The Executive Committee of Original Free Will Baptist met April 4, 2006 at Headquarters with the following members present: The Reverends Fred Baker, President; Buddy Sasser; Andrea Cox; Leon Grubbs; Ray Wells; Ronnie Hobgood; Harold Swinson; Charles Renfrow; Garland Suggs; and Sam Weeks.

Devotion was given by President Baker. Several prayer request and concerns were shared with the members before prayer.

Following the reading of the minutes of February 28, 2006 several changes were made to the recommendations by the Sub-Committee on the Constitution and By-Laws. With those changes noted the minutes were approved.

Following the discussion on the changes to the By-Laws section the President appointed a committee for the purpose of Constitutional Changes. These changes would be editorial changes and the date of those changes would be noted on the printing of the constitution by date. 

2006... A Year in Review

Telling the story with numbers ...

- Mount Olive College has been named the fifth largest, the second fastest growing and the third most affordable private college in NC.
- The College served 4,136 students in 2006.
- MOC served students from 66 counties, 22 states and 7 foreign countries.
- First generation college students accounted for 30% of student body in 2006.
- The College provided more than \$2.4 million in institutional scholarships last year.
- MOC is now offering more than 40 majors, including seven programs specially designed for working adults.
- · Ninety percent of the College's faculty have terminal degrees.
- The College's endowment grew by \$3,827,398 during the 05-06 fiscal year.
- Support from the Church Dinner Program totaled \$507,108 in 2006.
- The College's New Century Capital Campaign came to a close in May 2006, generating \$27.7 million in gifts and pledges. Added to that was \$15,685,000 made available through the MOC Foundation from USDA, which made the overall investment in MOC as a result of the work of those who guided the campaign \$43 million.

Telling the academic story...

- In February, the Board of Trustees approved the College's new branding initiative (Mount Olive College ... Transforming Education. Transform Your Life).
- In March, the College held an endowment appreciation luncheon to honor those donors who have made possible our 256 named scholarship endowed funds.
- In June of 2006, Mount Olive College began offering its most popular, accelerated, one-night a week program, the Management and Organizational Development Program, at Johnston Community College.
- In July, 18 students and friends of the College went on a 16-day tour of Burgundy France. The study abroad program is slated to become an annual event for MOC.
- August 2006 marked the inauguration of a partnership program between Campbell
 University Divinity School and Mount Olive College. Campbell University Divinity School is now offering courses on the Mount Olive College campus leading to a
 Master of Divinity degree. This spring Drs. Michael Pelt and Alan Lamm taught the
 course "Free Will Baptist History and Heritage" for Campbell in Mount Olive.
- In August, the College launched its newly redesigned website which capitalizes on the liveliness of the College and shows the institution is transforming to meet students' needs.
- When students moved into the dorms in August they were pleasantly surprised to see some major renovations. The bathrooms in the women's residence complex received a facelift with new showers, toilets, sinks, ceramic tile floors, lighting, a brand new vanity counter, and new counter tops. New HVAC systems were installed in the common area to improve humidity. The men's residence hall also received new HVAC for each individual room.

- At the start of the fall semester MOC announced a partnership that they had developed with Campbell University to offer a bachelor of science degree in music education at MOC. In the program, students complete their first three years of study at MOC and complete their senior internship year at Campbell University which will include teacher licensure recommendation.
- During the summer and into the fall, the Lois K. Murphy Regional Center received a face-lift with new paint, carpeting and wallpaper.
- To improve campus safety, 11 blue light stations were installed throughout campus and were activated at the beginning of the fall semester.
- In September of 2006, Health Care Management was introduced as a new major.
- In September, the MOC Business Advisory Board celebrated their first anniversary.
 The 15-member board is charged with the task of providing guidance in the areas of public visibility, relevance of curriculum and overall support of the School of Business.
- October marked the one-year anniversary for MOC at Washington. In its first 12 months of operation, the location served over 170 students.
- In November, MOC Washington seated its first Modular Religion Major cohort.
 Licensed or ordained ministers can continue their preparation in Mount Olive, New Bern, or Washington.
- Pope Wellness Center, a \$3.2 million, 23,500 square-foot facility designed to meet the health and wellness needs of the Mount Olive community as well as Eastern North Carolina, was dedicated in October.
- The Communications building, which is enabling our five locations to function as a single institution with the aid of state-of-the-art delivery systems including video conferencing, video streaming, and wireless networks, was opened for business in October. A companion building to our existing Moye Library, the Center provides a new and larger space to house our ever-expanding special collections, among them the Free Will Baptist Historical Collection.
- W. Burkette and Rose M. Raper Hall was dedicated in November honoring Dr. and Mrs. Raper. This new academic complex doubled the College's current classroom space and houses the Tillman School of Business, the Lois G. Britt Agribusiness Center, and the Department of Science and Mathematics. Within the same two-story building is the Southern Bank Auditorium and Mount Olive Pickle Conference Center for hosting conferences, forums, training meetings, and workshops. The complex offers students state-of-the-art facilities with modern classrooms and laboratories.

Telling the Athletic Story ...



- MOC has 14 NCAA Division II teams.
- The Trojans have won 16 conference titles in the past 7 years.
- In 2005-06, four MOC teams earned berths in NCAA postseason play, setting a school record for the most teams competing in NCAA Championships in the same year.
- In 2006, the athletics department unveiled its new logo which represents the excitement and competitiveness of MOC Athletics.

Telling the Story in 2007 and Beyond

What is the future story for MOC?

- MOC vows to maintain its commitment to Christian principles.
- New Bern Campus Expansion In the very near future Mount Olive College plans to seek funding for construction of a campus in New Bern. It is projected that the campus will encompass 10 to 15 acres of land on which a 20,000-square-foot academic/administrative building would be erected. The additional space would accommodate 300 to 400 more students and provide facilities for community use such as conference and training rooms. This will be a huge benefit to the FWB in the New Bern and surrounding areas.
- New Forensic Science Major Mount Olive College has made a \$400,000 investment in state-of-the-art equipment that will provide students with hands-on experience in testing and analyzing data for crime scene investigations. It's all a part of the curriculum for the new forensic science major which will be introduced in the fall of 2007.
- New Chemistry Major Coming in the fall of 2007.
- Formation of the Mount Olive College Society The Mount Olive College Society is a significant new step in the advancement efforts of the College. The Society is composed of individuals, businesses and organizations that have committed \$1,000 or more on an annual basis, or have made irrevocable planned gifts, to support the mission of Mount Olive College. An elegant kick-off gala has been planned for Friday, September 14, 2007 to acknowledge all charter members of the Society.
- Two New Residence Halls These structures will be the first two units in a residence hall court to contain four units and a club house. Funds for this project have been generously provided by an anonymous donor.
- Ag/Ed Partnership with NCSU A cooperative teacher education program in AgriScience education for teaching agriculture in the secondary school system.
- Leadership for the Future The MOC Board of Trustees and Dr. J. William Byrd have laid out a development plan for future leadership of the College. The plan includes beginning a search for a Provost, who will be responsible for the internal operations of the College in all areas except for Institutional Advancement which will continue to report to the President. On July 1, 2008, Dr. Byrd will be appointed Chancellor of the College. In this new role, he will concentrate on external relations and special projects with continued oversight of Institutional Advancement. A new president will be appointed in 2008.



Good News from Washington, DC

Congress recently passed the Pension Protection Act of 2006 into law. This law covers many important items relating to retirement plans; however, it allows individuals to make gifts from their IRA and exclude the amount of the gifts from their gross income.

To qualify:

- Donors must be 70 ½ years of age or older.
- The gift must be transferred directly from an IRA to Mount Olive College.
- The maximum gift allowed is \$100,000 per taxpayer per year.
- It must be an outright gift (Transfers to charitable gift annuities, charitable remainder trusts and donor advised funds do not qualify.)
- Transfers are only available for 2006 and 2007.

"This is an exciting opportunity to make a gift to Mount Olive College directly from your IRA and avoid paying the income tax due from your required distribution. Mount Olive College Alumni

Mount Olive College is proud of its alumni. Membership is open to all former students who were ever enrolled. The Alumni Board is made up of 38 members with 52% having FWB ties to the College with 6 of the 7 conferences represented.



2007 Convention Report

Greetings from **OFWB INTERNATIONAL**, **INC.** (Foreign Missions) to the Ninety-Fifth Annual Session of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

The chief purpose of the Board of Foreign Missions is to reach "the lost" with the Gospel. We are involved in many "helps" ministries, but all of these are designed to give our workers an opportunity to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Nothing is more urgent than winning "the lost."

MEXICO: During 2006, we ministered in Mexico through six Short-Term Mission Teams. Five teams were involved in several projects, plus Vacation Bible School and Women's Bible Studies.

A new church building was constructed in Ramos. This church was started three years ago and had grown sufficiently that a building was needed. Bro. Antonio Escobar is now in the process of starting another church in a different area.

The teams rebuilt the El Salvador FWB Church in Piedras Negras and finished the Good Shepherd FWB Church in Sabinas. One new house was constructed for a needy family and two houses were remodeled.

Through Vacation Bible School hundreds of Mexican children were reached with the Gospel. Seeds were planted in their hearts that will bring forth fruit in the future. Women's Bible Studies were held during each week and the women were strengthened and blessed.

Camp Morelos was a great blessing. One hundred-twenty people attended the Camp. Twenty-six teenagers came to trust Christ as Savior.

All of these activities were aimed at opening the eyes of the people to the love of Christ and the need to know Him as personal Savior. "The lost" must be the chief concern of the church.

PHILIPPINES: The work in the Philippines has spread to many areas throughout the country. Our main aim is to witness Christ and establish local churches. We have opened work on the following islands: Palawan, Cebu, Bohol, Leyte, and Mindanao. This year we plan to send a couple to Manila to begin a "church planting" ministry there. We have a Children's Home in Cebu that ministers to children who were homeless and had been abandoned by their families. A new building was constructed during 2006. There is a Bible College in Puerto Princesa City and kindergartens in every area where we have work. All of these ministries open doors for us to share the Gospel with "the lost."

In April of 2006, a Short-Term Medical Team traveled to the Philippines. Members of the team were: Dr. Don Ribeiro, Karen Ribeiro, Bruce and Debby Gray, Seth and Pat Cayton, Harold and Sandra Jones, Tim Stocks, Gwen Kennedy, and Tonya Tripp. Everyone on the team was involved in the clinics. Dr. Ribeiro saw approximately two thousand people during our time there. Many of the people had waited for weeks to see the doctor. They could not afford the cost of a doctor's visit, which cost 150 pesos. That is only 3 US dollars. This is hard for us to imagine, but this is the reality of life among millions in the Philippines. This clinic gave us a wonderful opportunity to witness the love of Christ and opened the door for our pastors to follow-up with a presentation of the Gospel. Many who came to the clinic were not Christians, but were listed among "the lost." Pray that they will receive Christ. If we cure the body of all diseases and lose the soul, what have we really done?

INDIA, NEPAL, AND BANGLADESH: <u>India</u> shares borders with Nepal and Bangladesh. These three countries are home to many of the un-reached peoples on earth. They are poor countries, where millions of people strive daily just to exist. In India we have established churches, schools, a Children's Home, and care for a leprosy colony.

The Children's Home is in Gujarat. In 2006 a new house was constructed for the children. The building only cost \$1,500. The floors and walls are covered with a mixture of mud and cow dung. This sounds repulsive to us, but it actually makes a very hard surface and is odorless. A deep well was also drilled at the Children's Home to provide clean drinking water.

We are in the process of opening new churches and schools in different areas. The men and women who work in this country are truly dedicated, even though they face many hardships because of their faith. They risk their lives daily to tell "the lost" about Jesus Christ.

Nepal experienced a communist insurgence from 1999-2006. In the spring of 2006, a truce was signed and peace came with great relief and joy. During the time of the insurgence, our work suffered. The pastors were threatened with death. Schools were closed for periods of time, and life was extremely difficult. They, however, survived and became even stronger in their faith. These dedicated workers are determined to continue to share the Gospel with "the lost" and build the church in Nepal.

Bangladesh is also a troubled country, full of political unrest. The predominant Muslim population is determined to control the country with Islamic Law. At the present time, there is a secular government that allows Christians to live and worship in the country. Evangelism has to be creative. We have established four elementary schools to reach the children and through the children we hope to reach their families.

A Reading Room has been opened that gives Muslims, Hindus, and others an open door to read the Bible and Christian literature. A correspondence program offers those who have an interest to study God's Word. We know that faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. Even though we are restricted in evangelistic effort, God honors His Word when it is shared with "the lost."

BULGARIA: We have seen the transformation of many Muslim Gypsies through sharing God's Word in Bulgaria. These people are among the poorest of the poor and are hated and mistreated by many Bulgarians. God loves them and we love them. These dear people have been the focus of the ministry in Bulgaria and God has honored this commitment. We have a large group of people in Balchik, Varna, Targoviste, and Bible studies in other areas where we hope to develop churches.

We minister to children through Bible classes several times each week. The women meet twice a week for Bible studies. There are Bible studies also for teenagers and young men. A feeding program helps provide food for them during the winter months when they have very little work. Medical treatment is also extended to those in need.

In January we helped Ishmail with an operation to remove several tumors from his face. This act of kindness has opened the door to witness to his father and others in the gypsy camp, where many remain among "the lost."

The combined population of these six countries is 1 billion, 436 million and yet the number of Christians in all of these countries would be less than 2%. Reaching these people with the Gospel should be the number one priority of the church. Did you know that every second of every day approximately 3 people die? The vast majority of these are non-Christians. If we believe that there is salvation only in Jesus Christ and all "the lost" spend eternity in torment, separated from God, our hearts should be broken and our total attention should be turned toward reaching them. When they die, it is too late! Can you name one thing more important than reaching "the lost"? If you cannot, then where should most of the money that comes into our churches be spent? Toward things for our selves or toward reaching "the lost"?

The COMMAND and THE FREE WILL BAPTIST are published to keep our membership informed about the activities of our ministries. These are your best sources for information about the things that are taking place in India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bulgaria, Mexico, and the Philippines. I encourage you to subscribe to these publications today.

The <u>BUILD ONE FOR THEM</u> program has been a tremendous blessing to all of our fields. We have been able to construct church buildings, parsonages, and houses for the needy. We need churches to consider the needs of others and join us in this effort. There are always needs, and we encourage you to sponsor one of these building projects.

IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER: The Board of Foreign Missions realizes that our strength and supply comes from a loving Heavenly Father. We set aside several days throughout the year as days of prayer. We meet together to worship, praise, and take our petitions before the Lord. We pray for revival, for we know for our church to survive and grow we must have revival. We encourage you to pray for this ministry daily and to pray for revival in our Church.

SHORT-TERM TEAM MINISTRY has been a great blessing to all who have been on a team and to our fields. If you are interested in joining a team in the future, contact our office.

Annual Report to the 2007 Convention of Original Free Will Baptists

Mission Statement

It is the purpose of The Free Will Baptist Minister's Program to serve the churches and ministers of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. It is our assertion that the minister can best meet the spiritual requirements of a congregation if he is unencumbered by the burden of financial insecurity. To this end we provide administrative services, information resources, and educational opportunities. These are designed to help the minister and the local church plan together a program of compensation and benefits designed to meet the minister's present and future financial needs.

Meeting Needs

Meeting needs is what the Minister's Program is all about. This program was brought into existence to help prepare the minister for the financial eventualities of life.

To do this, we try to help educate the church and the minister about the unique needs of the pastorate. Our goal is not to provide for the minister, that is the church's responsibility, but to help the church and the minister plan together so that at all stages of life the minister can serve without the burden of financial concerns holding him back.

The Minister's Program is an extension of the local church administering programs that the church could not provide on their own. We stand ready to assist the minister and the church in working together in a lifetime of financial planning. Ministers step out in faith to answer God's call. That faith is based on the belief that God will prepare them and provide for them.

We believe that God channels His provisions through the church and it is required of them to be good stewards as it relates to their care of the pastor. This does not apply exclusively to matters of compensation, but also to support, appreciation, and willingness on the part of the church to be led. Please consider areas in which the Minister's Program can assist you to help build a strong working relationship with your pastor.

The rough draft of A Guide for Pastor/Church Relations has been forwarded to the Executive Committee for review and we anticipate that it will be going to the printer very soon. This publication will address the issues that confront the pew and the pulpit.

The Year in Review

Retirement News The retirement plan was valued in 2006 by AON, a global corporation that provides services to some of the largest companies in the world. This valuation was completed and was reported to be funded at 102% of the plan's liabilities.

This valuation establishes the soundness of the plan and assures the participants that their funds are safe and will be available when it comes time to retire. This is done every 3 years so that those receiving benefits under the plan can be assured that the Minister's Program will continue to provide the oversight and management necessary to make sure that their retirement benefits continue to be paid as agreed. Those ministers that are currently preparing and planning for retirement have the satisfaction of knowing that their plan is well designed and is among the most advanced plans available for ministers. This program enjoys benefits that make it unmatched in the private sector. Also, beginning this year retirees will now have the option of having their checks directly deposited to their accounts each month thereby saving them the time and trouble of visiting their bank.

Does your minister have a plan for retirement? Churches should help their pastor prepare for the future by funding his retirement plan today. Contact the Minister's Program for any help you may need as you assist your pastor so that he can retire with the dignity and security that his calling deserves.

Christmas Cheer This program has been very well received by our ministers and churches since it was first implemented. For the third time since this program was started, the amount has increased (to \$150). Each year the Minister's Program sends a gift to all ministers age 65 and older. It is a gift from the churches of the Convention to men who have literally given their lives to the gospel ministry, and this program is a way of saying we remember you and we are grateful for what you have done. We encourage our churches to support this program and the response has been excellent. However we still have churches that do not give at all to this program and we would like to invite them to make 2007 the year they say "thank you."

The Minister's Widows Fund and Surviving Minister's Fund Another program we offer to our ministers and their wives is the Minister's Widows Fund and the Surviving Minister's Fund. For those who participate, this program provides a meaningful gift for fellow ministers or spouses during a time of loss. For the first time in 40 years, the enrollment fee has been increased to \$15. This has been done to increase the benefit received by the spouses of the participants. Every dollar of the new amount will be forwarded to the spouse when a participant dies.

Since the last seating of this Convention we have lost by death five members who participated in the Minister's Widows Fund: The Reverends Raymond Hardison, Joseph Ingram, C.M. Coats, Eldon Brock, and Don Venable. We are happy to report that the Surviving Minister's Fund has recorded no deaths since the last Convention.

The Minister's Program will continue to maintain a comprehensive plan whereby churches and pastors can work together, and we will make every effort to keep everyone informed in the areas of taxation, compensation, retirement, and financial planning.

What Can Your Church Do?

The only limit to the scope of this program is the level of support we receive from you, the local church. Your gift to us is a sacred trust and we make every effort to provide the greatest benefit to our ministers with a minimum outlay for administrative costs. We

hope that you appreciate this fact and that you will continue to support this program with your prayers and gifts. Last year our total gift support from churches was \$82,898. However, over a third of the churches of this Convention did not support the Minister's Program. Did your church give? Please tell us what we need to do to earn the trust and confidence necessary to receive your support.

Annual Report To the 95th Session of the CONVENTION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS May 22-24, 2007

"Called Out People of God - Go... Tell the Story"

Mark 16:15

"Go...Tell the Story" - what an awesome command! We are given the privilege to go tell the good news of salvation, to share about the abundant life Christ offers to the world. All of this is provided by a loving and caring Father. His gift, given to us through His mercy and grace, is we may be called the "children of God." We, through our childcare ministry, begin today, May 23, 2007, our 87th year of caring for His children, "telling the story." Glory be to His name!

Thank You

Thank you for each prayer you have prayed; through your prayers you continue to serve with us; and, may God bless you for what you do for His children. You are reaching out to His children and providing food, clothing, shelter, medical services, education, and most of all, the opportunity for spiritual growth.

The Report of Services Provided July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006 123 Children Served

Over the past few years, we have noted an increase in the requests from our County Departments of Social Services for more intense independent living programs for our teens. They have realized that by age thirteen our teens need to be on a track that teaches as many independent living skills as possible in the years they will have remaining in the system. As a result of these needs being identified, we have updated and revised two of our programs. Adolescent Development Program has been changed into our new Independent Living Skills (ILS) Program. This program has been revised to begin teaching basic independent living skills to our teens ages thirteen to fifteen. They will learn to organize and manage their time, prepare and serve nutritious meals, manage finances, as well as, come to understand the importance of health and medication management and the beginning competencies that will allow them to move into the more advanced skill levels of our other revised program. Our Preparation for Adult Living Program has been revised and renamed Real World Preparation (RWP). This program will emphasize the importance of continuing education; developing job search and employment skills; how to find affordable housing, and purchase a car; and the

other more advanced skills that will be needed by the sixteen to eighteen-yearold resident who will shortly leave to become truly independent.

The Independent Living Skills Program (ILS) has served a total of thirty-one children during this period. The residents have ranged in age from twelve to seventeen. Over the last year, we have served ten counties. The ILS Program residents all participated in the summer recreation program provided by a special contract with Nash-Rocky Mount 4-H Program. The residents enjoyed classes in cooking, embryology, photography, and new sports, such as archery. They planted and cared for a butterfly garden around the gazebo and made trips to the NC State Veterinary School of Medicine and several other places. Our end of summer trip was to Fort Fisher and the NC Aquarium. School started in August and the tutoring coordinator has organized this program and is working with both the teachers and the tutor to see that the residents are completing their assignments and receiving the help that is needed. Christmas was a huge success with the residents and staff organizing the Christmas program. One of our ILS cottages received a 98% and the other received a 99% on their cottage health inspections.

The Real World Preparation (RWP) Program has provided care for seventeen girls and two boys during this period. Residents in the RWP Program ranged in age from sixteen to eighteen and came from nine different counties. RWP residents always have an extremely busy schedule. In addition to all the holiday activities, the residents continued to participate in the Work Investment Act Program classes every other Saturday and were employed through this program during the summer. Several of the girls have had off-campus jobs, as well. The new RWP curriculum has included advanced studies on seeking employment, money and time management, and study skills. State Cottage also received 100% on its cottage health inspection.

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<u>Canaan House and Genesis House Emergency Shelter</u> have served seventy-three children from twelve different counties. There were forty-two male residents and thirty-one female residents in this group. The residents at Genesis House have worked on improving their social skills, goal setting, and improving school performance. Canaan House residents have continued to acclimate themselves to being on the main campus. Canaan House received a 99% on their health inspection and Genesis House received 100% on theirs.

<u>Therapy Programs</u> continue to include individual, group, and family work. Issues being addressed include separation anxiety, grief and loss, adjustment problems, anger management, decision-making, self-esteem, oppositional defiant disorder, impulse control, and disruptive behavior. The therapist currently sees nine residents for individual therapy. Therapy groups have continued for anger management and plans are underway for another intern to join the program in the future.

<u>Social Services Workers</u> have provided the following services during the period: file audits, program support, and school conferences. The Social Work Department has continued to work with the intern in the areas of case

management and basic social work skills. The social workers have reviewed all social work forms and have updated *The Social Work Manual*. Our social workers have spent a great deal of time working of the program changes for both ILS and RWP this year. Exit planning has begun for our RWP residents who will be graduating and moving on at the end of the school year.

<u>Plans:</u> We are currently participating in the Enrich Program, a Duke Endowment Wellness Project provided through the University of South Carolina. The emphasis of this program is promoting physical activity and nutrition. This is a two-year program that should help us teach our residents the importance of being physically active and introducing healthier eating habits. Both staff and residents should benefit from the program as they work to incorporate extra physical activity into their daily life and concentrate on adding addition fruits and vegetables to their diets.

We are currently investigating a staff certification program for our Children's Services Workers, updating and improving our in-house training programs, and working to establish regular monthly contact with the county DSS agencies we serve through personal contacts and program presentations and a monthly newsletter. Plans are also underway for a staff and resident Family Day this spring.

Goals

Please be much in prayer for us as we strive to accomplish the goals listed below. Reaching these goals will allow us to continue to provide quality care and continue to intensify our programs. We strive to strengthen our spiritual commitment; and

- To offer the best possible care for the children and families we serve;
- To offer religious training to help children strengthen their relationship with Christ;
- To organize and promote activities and events which directly benefit our children;
- To complete our accreditation self-study and prepare for our site visit in September 2007;
- To continue participation in the certified training program for direct staff and supervisors;
- To continue planning for future programs;
- To complete our paving project on our road on the west side of campus, accessing the recreation center, Whitley Center, and our maintenance building; and
- To continue participation in the Duke Wellness Project (2 years).

Recommendations

The following recommendations are submitted to the Convention:

- 1. This 2007 report to the Convention be adopted;
- 2. The Convention continue to designate May and November as Children's Home Months, and recommend our churches observe Children's Home Days on November 4, 2007, and May 4, 2008; and
- The Convention and representing churches continue to pray for our Children's Home ministry.

This report and these recommendations are respectfully submitted on behalf of the Board of Directors.

Church Finance has positioned itself to meet present and future demands for funding from our churches. We are also continuing to investigate a possible association with Voice of Liberty International College of Art & Theology in Nigeria, Africa. As you can see from this brief synopsis, God has blessed us with a tremendous opportunity to share in His plan for discipleship.

It is our privilege and our responsibility to teach the Word of God as the Word of God-just as God gave it. With so much confusion and almost daily questioning of the veracity of the Bible as the infallibly inspired Word of God, we feel it is important that emphasize our commitment to Article 8 of "The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists." That is to say that we believe and teach that God gave the very words of the Bible and that they are all we need (sufficient) as a rule and guide for all Christian worship and service.

Perhaps our position on the inspiration of Scripture needs an explanation. We believe that God, in His wisdom and foreknowledge, chose holy men, gave to them the very words of Scripture, using their background, their experiences, their personalities, and even their vocabularies and environment in such a way that every word written was the exact word that God wanted written. We believe and teach that when interpreting Scripture, since every word is inspired by God, every word should be taken at its historical and grammatical meaning unless there is justification in the text itself to interpret it otherwise. This approach makes interpretation linked directly to inspiration and allows us to understand what God is saying and not what man and culture want it to say. Since our main focus is teaching the Word of God, any other view of inspiration and interpretation would cause us to teach the "words of men" and not the Word of God.

Since our last Convention we have completed two semesters of classes. Both of which were very successful. Not only from the stand point of the number of students we had enrolled, but in the attitude of the students and the enthusiasm shared by the students and faculty in the study of God's Word. There is something wonderful about students who

have a passion to learn and whose sole purpose for coming to school is to fulfill God's call upon their lives. A Bible institute and seminary differs from a traditional college setting in that most of our students are older than the average college student and are only coming to school because they feel it is God's will and their responsibility that they be equipped to fulfill God's call upon their lives. This commitment to learn and the spirit of excitement and enthusiasm about studying the Bible have truly made these past two semesters joyous.

The Fall of 2006 was time for the five year review by our accrediting association.. We are accredited by the Accrediting Commission International, the largest non-government associated accrediting commission in the world. After a lengthy and detailed self-inspection and report was submitted to the Commission, the review and inspection team visited our campus and conducted their inspection. We are very pleased to announce that, not only did we pass inspection and have our accreditation renewed, but were awarded "Accreditation with Honors," the highest accreditation awarded by ACI. We give God thanksgiving and glory and account it His doings that we received this status and honor.

Our five year plan for advancement is proceeding on schedule. We continue to evaluated every aspect of this ministry and have set the following goals:

- 1. to continue to evaluate, improve, and expand the existing programs of study.
- 2. to diligently seek opportunities to enlarge the scope of our ministry.
- 3. to expand the library and other study and research facilities.
- 4. to seek ways of providing more opportunities to more students in an increas ingly technolo gical world.
- 5. to seek opportunities to provide more services to more people and Churches.

God is beginning to open doors to new opportunities of ministry. With your prayers and support we are confident the Lord will use Carolina Bible Institute & Seminary to accomplish an ever greater service for His Kingdom than ever before.

Please consider becoming a partner with this ministry in providing the finances to do this great work, either as individuals or with your Church including us in their budget. Chaplains Commission Report

The Chaplains Commission has the task of recruiting and commissioning chaplains to the United States Armed Forces. Military chaplains are required to have a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university and a Master of Divinity (90 semester hours of credit) degree from an accredited seminary or divinity school plus two years of active ministry. Armed forces chaplains provide ministry to men and women of our armed forces and their families. Chaplains enter their branch of service as a commissioned officer, 1st Lieutenant (Army, Air Force, and Marines) or Lieutenant Junior Grade (Navy and Coast Guard), and they are promoted based on performance and need. They train as military officers in order to minister in a hostile environment or in peace. They train to provide counseling to families of deployed military personnel and to provide marriage and family counseling to families in very difficult circumstances such as long separations. Military chaplains are never required to participate in religious services outside their own faith group, and in worship, they are never denied the privilege of praying in the Name of Jesus or proclaiming Christian doctrines. In public ceremonies, however, each chaplain is cautioned to be sensitive to people of other faith groups in their prayers or speeches. If any of our ministers meet the educational requirements and are interested in serving as a military chaplain, please see anyone on our Chaplains Commission. The Convention of Original Free Will Baptists now has only one chaplain in the military – he is CH (CPT) Richard Holmes of the US Air Force. He is serving at Lakenheath Air Force Base, England.

Professional chaplains serving in hospitals and prisons also must be endorsed by their denominations to serve as chaplains. The educational requirements in these areas are very similar to military chaplaincy plus Clinical Pastoral Education in varying units. We have no professional chaplains serving in hospitals, but we have two serving in the NC Department of Corrections. They are Chaplain Harry Grubbs at Maury Correctional Institution, a 1000 bed close custody adult male prison in Greene County, and Chaplain Philip Wood at Eastern Correctional Institution, a 480 bed medium custody adult male prison in Greene County.

Several of our ministers serve as volunteer chaplains for police and fire departments, Civil Air Patrol, or in hospitals. They are not required to be endorsed, but if you are serving in a volunteer capacity, the Chaplains Commission would like to know who you are and in what capacity you serve. A BRIEF PROFILE OF THE FOUNDATION

The North Carolina Foundation For Christian Ministries is a non-profit body chartered by the state of North Carolina to which individuals, families, churches and related organizations may make charitable gifts and establish endowed funds. Its distinctive mission is to provide for Original Free Will Baptists a means, heretofore not available, to advance the work and mission of our church.

The Education of Ministers

Because of the critical need for pastors who can provide the quality of services our churches need and deserve, a priority of the Foundation is to make scholarships available for both licensed and ordained ministers who wish to equip themselves for excellence in Christian ministry. To this end, the Foundation has established an annual "Fund for the Education of Ministers" to which churches and individuals may make gifts. Through this fund, the Foundation is providing approximately \$18,000 to nine ministers during the current academic year.

In addition to the annual fund, the Foundation has established an endowment goal of \$1 million for the education of those preparing for Christian ministry. An endowment in this amount will yield approximately \$50,000 annually for scholarships. A major objective of the Foundation is to help make inadequate preparation for the ministry a choice – not a necessity.

Endowments For Churches And Ministries

A distinctive service of the Foundation is to provide an opportunity for those who have the vision to establish endowments. An endowment is a permanent fund, which is not spend but invested. Each year income from the fund can be used to support Christian work, including a local church, ministries of Original Free Will Baptists and other charitable purposes.

For most church members, when their hearts stop, their support of their church and its work stops. It does not have to be that way. Through a program of professional managed endowed funds, the Foundation provides a means whereby our works can continue beyond our lifetime. Establishing an endowment does not require wealth as much as it does a plan. An endowment can be our footprint to future generations.

The foundation will work with the donor's financial advisors and legal counsel to properly structure their endowment and to assure that the agreement conforms to the Internal Revenue Code.

PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Fifty-second Annual Session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists (OFWB) convened at Smyrna OFWB Church, Meadow Community, North Carolina on November 14, 2006.

The congregation opened in singing 'Trust and Obey', *Towner*, led by song leader, Brother Peyton Lee. A man came to the cross who called himself Jesus, the Son of God. The High Priest ordered for a superscription to be placed above that cross to read "KING OF THE JEWS." The name was an indictment and charges for all to see. It exclaimed Jesus as the King. It was an exhibition of God's Word and exultation that Christ is King. The men on to the cross to the right and to the left deserved to be there, but Jesus did not. We should bow to our 'King' Jesus!"

Moderator asked the conference if the written report of the executive committee should be read to the conference. Motion was made to accept the written report of the executive committee as given. Motion was carried.

The blessing was offered by Pastor Whitman and the conference went to lunch.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session began with the congregation singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms", *Showalter*. 'Scripture and Prayer' was offered by Licensed Minister, Tina Penny, from John 17:20-23. She commented that "God sent His Son and loves us just as much."

The following reports of the Standing Boards were received by the conference (see attached reports of the Standing Boards). The Cape Fear Minister's Association report will be submitted at a later date. The Cape Fear Youth Fellowship and the Christian Board of Education reports were given by Chairperson Martha Parsons. Motion carried to accept these reports.

The written report of the Ordaining Board was submitted to the conference by Chair Sam Weeks. Motion was made to receive the report. Motion was made to amend, to remove the portion of the report that reads "The following have been added to the list of licensed ministers since our last conference: Tina Webster Penny – Johnston Union Church – January 23, 2006." The motion to amend was ruled 'out of order' by the moderator. Motion to sustain the ruling of the chair was defeated by a vote of 32 to 20. Motion to amend the Ordaining Board report moved forward with a second. Discussion of the matter followed with a personal testimony from Licensed Minister, Tina Penny. 'Point of Order' was called by the Reverend Otis Hamm, stating that "since the conference has ordained women in the ministry in the past, precedence has been set. Therefore, a two-

thirds vote must be received in order to carry the motion to amend 'said portion' of the Ordaining Board's report." The Chair sustains the 'point of order' and 'question' was called for the vote. The motion to amend was then defeated by a vote of 33 to 27. Motion to accept the written report of the Ordaining Board was then carried 34 to 28.

The following reports of the Temporary Committees were then received (see attached reports of the Temporary Committees). The Temperance/Resolutions Committee had one resolution that was read and a motion carried to accept. The Obituary Committee reported the deaths of two of our ministers this past year. The Credentials Committee gave a report of the Annual Conference's attendance. The Nominating Committee made its recommendations to the conference and it was voted by acclamation to accept the committee's recommendations.

Proceedings

The Central Conference, being the continuation of the General Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened in its 258th annual session with Marlboro Free Will Baptist Church of Farmville, North Carolina, on Thursday, November 9, 2006, at 9:30 a.m.

The Conference opened with the hymn, "Majesty." Opening scripture and prayer were offered by Rev. David Allen.

The Reverend Brad Williamson, clerk, called the 258th annual session to order. The Reverend Ronnie Mohn, pastor of the host church, extended a cordial welcome to the Conference.

The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, shared several points using 1 Samuel 2:35 as his text. The Reverend Hobgood reminded the Conference that the priest Eli has failed in his duties and that God was going to clean house. God would not do away with the office of priest, but He would choose someone who is faithful. The text tells that this faithful servant would do what God wanted to be done. The Reverend Hobgood stated that we must be careful to carry out the work of our Lord. It must be His work because it is His Church. He exhorted us to keep this in mind as the Conference meets; that our desire would be to faithful to carry out His work. He exhorted us to do God's will God's way.

The roll of churches was called with 35 churches responding with delegates.

14 visitors were recognized and welcomed by the moderator.

The report of the Executive Committee was read by the clerk. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The report of the Board of Ordination was read by Reverend Tony Glass. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, along with the Conference extended a welcome to membership in the conference to Reverends David Allen, Marc Boswell, Bobby Jones, and Arnold Price as ordained ministers. Welcome was also extended to Devlyn McCreight, Bryan Perry, and James Wiggins as licensed ministers.

At 10:15 a.m. the Conference business was set aside for the worship service. The service was opened with a responsive call to worship led by Reverend Ronnie Hobgood. The prayer

of invocation was given by Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett. The congregation was then led by Reverend Philip Boykin in the singing of "Praise Him! Praise Him!", "Praise the Name of Jesus," and "Let's Just Praise the Lord." The offering for the conference was then received and the offertory prayer was given by Reverend Kevin Jackson. Special music was presented by the Reverend Grady Tucker. The Reverend Phillip Boykin led in the morning prayer. The congregation was then led by Reverend Boykin in the singing of "Sanctuary." The Reverend Johnny Sullivan delivered the conference sermon entitled. "Enabled by the Spirit." His text came from Isaiah 41:8-13. Reverend Sullivan stated that every minister of God must be ready to face the spiritual battles around. However, we have hope knowing that God will be with us every step of the way. We must look to God knowing that He is the One Isaiah spoke of concerning Israel's safety. We must rely upon the Spirit of Almighty God to enable us everyday to minister in the local church. He stated that God is able to do all things, but we must make a commitment to surrender everything to His will. The text of Isaiah shows us several promises that we can claim as our own as we serve the Lord. Christians must be students of prayer and Bible study, and young and old alike must make the most of the opportunities given to us. Reverend Sullivan exhorted the Conference to be a people of vision trusting that God will bring His plans to completion. Christians must take a stand for the things of God and rely upon the Bible as we operate under God's care. If the Church has been enabled by the Spirit, then let us be proactive. Since we have been enabled by God's Spirit we have nothing to fear. Reverend Sullivan stated that he sought to encourage the Conference and remind the Conference what an Awesome God we serve. He also stated that now is the time for us to move forward for Christ.

The worship service concluded with the singing of "Breath on Me" and a corporate reading of an affirmation of faith based on our Articles of Faith.

The service closed in prayer by Reverend Brad Williamson.

In II Timothy 4:6-8, Paul says, "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only but unto all them also that love His appearing".

In our memorial service today, we want to remember those who have faithfully served the Lord through the Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptist. We have had one of our ministers to enter his eternal reward along with many brothers and sisters from our local churches. We thank God today for the lives and influence of these individuals.

We remember the Reverend Billy Ray Jordan.

The Reverend Billy Ray Jordan was born March 27, 1941 and passed away on March 15, 2006. He was a native of Wayne County. He graduated from Nahunta High School, attended Mount Olive College and received an associate degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1966. He accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at the age of 14. He was licensed to preach at the Union Grove Free Will Baptist Church and was ordained by the Western Conference on October 17, 1962. He later transferred to the Central Conference.

Among the churches he served were Northern, Trinity, Shiloh, New Sandy Hill, May's Chapel, Community, Spring Branch, Piney Grove (Albertson) and Indian Springs.

Reverend Jordan is survived by his mother, Annie Talton Jordan, two sisters, Roseitta Holland and Lillian Starling and several nieces and nephews. (Information taken from Reverend Jordan's personnel resume, information in the Historical Collection at Mount Olive College and friends.)

Report of the Church Growth Committee

This past year we were able to assist Central Conference Churches as follows:

- 1) Elm Grove OFWB Church requested \$491.70 for the purchase of 300 God's Sacrifice for You books to pass out during the Lenten Season. Church members were encouraged to pass out the books to those who do not attend church and who do not know Christ as Savior. The books are written by Billy Graham and Max Lucado. They are divided into small chapters; the first dealing with the need for salvation, then the sacrifice that Christ made, how one can be saved, and what it means to be saved.
- 2) Friendship OFWB Church requested \$500.00 toward a Hispanic Revival in Walstonburg, May 11-14. The money was used to assist with outreach, music, speakers, and materials.

- 3) Rose Hill OFWB Church requested \$500.00 to assist with a family outreach program in August. The funds were used to reestablish the family unit at Rose Hill. Activity equipment was rented and information was mailed into the surrounding community. The hopes of the project were to connect the past, present, and future church together. - 4) Free Union OFWB Church requested \$500.00 toward its annual trip to Winter Xtreme in Gatlinburg, Tennessee. The program is geared toward teenagers and the challenges they face in their personal evangelism. The leaders of the conference include Johnny Hunt, Josh McDowell, and Dave Edwards. The youth have been blessed during the past two years and have come back motivated toward deeper Christian service and outreach. Last year 2 youth made first time decisions and 13 rededicated their lives from Free Union.

We would like to encourage our churches to take advantage of this opportunity for assistance. The limit is one request per church per quarter. Up to \$500.00 may be requested to assist with church evangelism projects.

Report of the Continuing Education Committee

Continuing Education Units

The purpose of the Central Conference Continuing Education Program is to help our ministers with the practice of life-long learning. By continuing their education Central Conference ordained ministers will continue to grow in their spiritual walk with Christ and as they grow they will be better equipped to serve the churches of the Central Conference. As the leadership of the churches grow the church itself will grow, therefore the growth and continuing education of the ministers is vital to the growth of the church. It is imperative that the ministers of the Central Conference follow the advice given to Timothy by Paul when he said, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Guidelines

Continuing Education Units (henceforth referred to as CEU's) will be based on educational opportunities. These would include reading a book, attending a seminar or class, or taking a college or seminary class. Books that are read must be submitted with the following information: name of book, author, publisher, dates the book was read and a typed 150-word summary and application of the book. Seminars must be submitted with the following information: organization that sponsored the seminar, presenter's name, length

of seminar, and a typed 150-word summary and application of the seminar. College or seminary courses must be submitted with the following information: College or seminary where class was taken, professor's name, copy of the syllabus, and typed 150-word summary and application of the class.

Credits

CEU credits will be given according to the following scale:

Books: up to 200 pages ½ CEU; 200-400 pages 1 CEU. Books over 400 pages will be considered on an individual basis.

Seminars: 3-5 hour seminar ½ CEU; 6-10 hour seminar 1 CEU. Seminar over ten hours will be considered on an individual basis.

College or Seminary Class: If the class is taken from an accredited institution (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada) one will receive 4 CEUs for each credit hour. (Credit hour equals one hour per week in class for sixteen weeks; for example if you take a 3 credit hour course you will receive 12 CEUs.) If the course is taken from an institution that is not accredited by SACS or ATS, then it will be considered on an individual basis.

Areas of Study

Biblical Studies: This includes any area of study from the Bible such as books of the Bible, themes, authors, or historical information from the Bible.

Historical Studies: This includes History of the Christian Church, Free Will Baptist Denomination, or Local Churches.

Theological Studies: This includes areas of studies from the following: Prolegomena, Bibliology, Theology Proper, Christology, Pneumatology, Anelology, Anthropology, Soteriology, Ecclesiology, Eschatology, etc.

Practical Studies: This includes area of studies concerning the working and growth of the local church, pastoral care, counseling, leadership, administration, evangelism, preaching and worship.

Spiritual Formation Studies: This includes area of studies concerning maturity of Christians.

Procedures

To receive credit work must be submitted to the Continuing Education Committee. Proper documentation must be submitted along with the Continuing Education Committee Form. The committee will review all work and the committee will send notification to the one who submitted the work and also the Board of Ordination.

FOR GENERAL INFORMATION

Churches are reminded that they are to call ministers from the list of ordained OFWB ministers. Those ministers who are members of sister conferences must be cleared by the Eastern Conference Examining Board **before** being extended a call by the local congregation.

Eastern Conference ministers are reminded that they are **required** to properly register and attend the annual sessions of the Eastern Conference and the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. Letters requesting excusal must contain the Conference registration fee (waived for retired ministers). Ministers who fail to attend two consecutive years without reasonable excuse are subject to censure and/or the revocation of their ministerial credentials.

We remind our churches that licensed ministers are not to hold offices in the Church or Sunday School of which they are a member so that they may have opportunity to preach and

visit other churches. Licensed ministers may do short-term supply work in a church, limited to ninety days. They are encouraged to work as student ministers with experienced ministers to learn the work of the ministry. They may not officiate at weddings or administer the Ordinances of the Gospel. They may preach as they have opportunity, and they may officiate funerals. The license period is a one-year term, with a five-year limit to complete the requirements for ordination. If at any time the licensed minister allows his license to lapse, the entire process must be restarted beginning with the recommendation of the local church to the Ministerial Examining Board.

The location and date for the 2007 Eastern Conference Basic Education Seminar will be announced when confirmed. While required for licensed ministers, others may choose to attend for fellowship, inspiration, and continuing education. Advanced seminars are available upon request by a sufficient number of registrants. For more information contact Adrian Grubbs.

The Examining Board reminds all ministers licensed after October 19, 2001 of the requirement to attend annually at least one continuing education workshop/seminar (such as those provided by the Sunday School Board) each year they are licensed.

The Ministerial Examining Board meets at the Conference Office in Kinston on the Monday following the second Sunday in the months of November, January, March, July, and September. These dates are subject to change. Individuals with business to be brought to the Board are requested to contact the secretary so that a time may be scheduled.

 Clear and convincing evidence does not exist to substantiate the charges stated in the February 7, 2006 letter from members of the Pleasant Meadow Original Free Will Baptist Church;

 of the church, its membership, and its pastor, <u>Pleasant Meadow Original Free</u>
 <u>Will Baptist Church</u> shall be under the watchcare of the Executive Committee for
 a period of one year beginning April 13, 2006 and ending April 30, 2007;
- 3. The <u>pastor</u> (Rev. Wadus Earl Clewis) shall be under the watchcare of the Ordaining Council Committee for a period of one year beginning April 13, 2006 and ending April 30, 2007, during which time he is expected to fulfill all ministerial and pastoral duties;
- 4. Members of the Executive Committee and the Ordaining Council must be invited to and must attend all conferences (regularly scheduled or called) beginning April 13, 2006 through April 30, 2007. It shall be the responsibility of the church clerk or the pastor to contact the Executive Committee clerk, Dr. Danny McPherson (910 642-5664) to arrange for representatives to attend the conferences;
- 5. Church members who willfully disturb and/or interrupt worship services or church proceedings shall be censured and immediately placed on probation for a period of no less than one year beginning at the time of disturbance; and
- Other measures may be implemented as deemed necessary by the Executive Committee.

In other business, the Executive Committee (by consensus) selected Rev. Edward Spivey to preach the Association message.

3. Ministers Ordained since the last Conference:

4. License Period:

There is a one-year term on the license to preach the gospel with a five-year maximum on the amount of time allowed to preach under license in preparation for ordination. If at any time the *licensed minister allows the license to lapse*, the entire licensing process must be restarted beginning with the recommendation of the local church to the Board of Ordination.

5. Ordination Requirements:

We commend to our member churches and to all of our licensed ministers the attached *Requirements for Ordination*. This document will serve as a checklist for our licensed ministers as they move toward ordination. This document will also aid our churches in answering initial questions that a candidate might have in regards to the requirements for ordination.

6. Conference Attendance:

- A. Any minister, licensed or ordained, holding membership in the Western Conference, who fails to attend the annual session of the Conference for two consecutive years or fails to send a letter showing reasonable excuse for non-attendance, is subject to censure and/or the revocation of his credentials of ordination.
- B. All ministers, licensed or ordained, serving in the Western Conference in any pastoral position are required to register and attend the annual session of the Western Conference. Pastoral positions include but are not limited to pastors, associate pastors, and youth ministers. Failure to attend two consecutive years or failure to send a letter showing reasonable excuse for non-attendance will subject the minister to censure and/or the revocation of his credentials.

7. Annual Convention Attendance:

Any minister (licensed and ordained) holding membership in the Western Conference is required to register and attend at least one day of our annual two-day Convention of OFWBs, which meets Wednesday and Thursday following the third Sunday in May. A letter stating a reasonable excuse will also be accepted in lieu of this requirement. It may be sent to either the Clerk of the Board of Ordination or the Clerk of the Conference.

8. Ministers Transferring into the Western Conference:

A. From Sister Conferences: These ministers must be cleared with the Western Conference Board of Ordination *prior to assuming* the pastorate to which they are called. This is the responsibility of the church calling the minister; however the minister should be sure it has been done *prior to* beginning the prospective work. This is a simple procedure designed to protect our churches from harm. Our churches are not independent of the Conference as is true in some other denominations and groups.

B. From other Denominations: For this information you are referred to page 89 of our Articles of Faith & Principles of Church Government.

9. The Christian Flag Service for Ministers:

The Board of Ordination will serve as the Conference Christian Flag Committee. Any minister serving in the Western Conference at the time of his death will be given the Christian Flag Service if the minister has so requested or the family so desires. The flag will be purchased by the Conference.

10. Items for Praise:

- 1. Our newly ordained minister
- 2. Our newly licensed ministers
- 3. Our new members by baptism or transfer into the member churches of the Conference

11. Things a Licensed Minister Can and Cannot Do:

- 1. A licensed minister cannot be called or hired as pastor of any church.
- 2. A licensed minister can serve a church on an interim or supply basis under the supervision of his Board of Ordination Advisor or another ordained minister as directed by the Board of Ordination. This service is to be limited to six months in any one church. If the church wishes an extension on the services of the licensed minister, the church must appeal to the Board of Ordination.
 - 3. A licensed minister cannot administer the ordinances of the Gospel.
 - 4. A licensed minister cannot perform wedding ceremonies.
- 5. A licensed minister *can* conduct worship services, preach, and teach as the opportunities are afforded to the licensed minister.
 - 6. A licensed minister can officiate in a funeral service.
- 7. A Licensed minister can be elected to serve as temporary chairman of a business meeting with the exceptions as outlined on pg. 74, paragraph 2 of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government*.
 - 8. A licensed minister can vote at the annual conference.

12. Recommendations to the Conference:

- 1. The minister ordained since our last conference, the Reverends Heber Dick Singleton, Michael L. Lewis, and Nelson Ray Rollins, be extended the Right Hand of Fellowship by the Moderator and their names be added to the list of duly ordained ministers of the Western Conference by the Conference Clerk.
- 2. The newly licensed ministers, James Roger Pearce, John Joseph Davis, William (Bill) Dauphinais, Justin Donald Smith, Williams Cameron Ash, and William David Currie, be added to the list of licensed ministers by the Conference Clerk.
- 3. That all our ministers, both ordained and licensed, continue to abide by our *Ministerial Code of Ethics*.
- 4. That our churches not call ordained or licensed ministers from other denominations to serve as interim or to do supply work.
- 5. That this report in its entirety be received by the Conference and that these recommendations be adopted by the Conference as submitted.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

Convention of Original Free Will Baptists

PREAMBLE

We, the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists, assembled in order to advance, promote, and increase the cause of Jesus Christ, do establish and ordain this constitution and these bylaws.

CONSTITUTION

Article I

Section 1: This assembly shall be known as the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

Section 2: This Convention shall hold an annual session commencing on Wednesday after the second Sunday in May of each year; the place of such meetings to be determined by the Convention or the executive committee. Special sessions may be called by the executive committee in the event of the existence of needs of sufficient urgency.

Article II

Section 1: The officers of this Convention shall be a president, vice-president, recording secretary, and treasurer. No more than 2 officers of the Convention shall be from the same conference.

Section 2: The Convention shall be composed of the general officers, members of standing boards, committees or commissions, all ordained ministers, and heads of ministries who are members of churches of conferences or associations that are affiliated with the Convention, and who personally subscribe and adhere to the Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage); one delegate from each church in good standing for every one hundred members or a fraction thereof, and one delegate from each union meeting, conference, or association in good standing for every five hundred members or a fraction thereof.

Section 3: A denominational ministry of the Original Free Will Baptist Church is an institution or enterprise that provides Christian Ministry on behalf of and at the direction of the Convention and the governing body is elected directly or indirectly by the Convention or its member churches. These denominational ministries being: (1) Free Will Baptist Children's Home, (2) Free Will Baptist Board of Home Missions and Evangelism, (3) O.F.W.B. International (Foreign Missions), (4) Free Will Baptist Minister's Program, (5) Free Will Baptist Retirement Homes, Inc., (6) Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, Inc., (7) Church Finance Association, (8) Cragmont Assembly, Inc., (9) Mount Olive College, (10) Free Will Baptist Sunday School Board.

Additional denominational ministries may be created by a 2/3 vote of the Convention in a regular session, upon meeting the preceding requirements.

Section 4: Associate membership in the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists shall be extended to denominations, foreign Conventions, conferences, or organized groups of like faith recommended by the Executive Committee and approved by the Convention.

BYLAWS

Article 1

Section 1: The work of this Convention shall be departmentalized, with a board of control over each department. Each board shall be governed by rules set forth by the Convention. It shall be the duty of the Convention to solicit the cooperation of the conferences and associations in promoting the work of these departments.

Section 2: All members of the Convention shall have a right of voice and vote on any issue before the body, providing they have been properly recognized by the presiding officer. They shall serve the Convention in any capacity when called upon by the proper authority. Before membership in the Convention is established, all ministers and delegates must be properly registered.

Section 3: Associate members may send representatives to the Annual Convention. Duly appointed representatives shall be extended all the privileges of members, except voting.

Article II

OFFICERS, BOARDS, COMMITTEES, AND THE MANNER OF THEIR ELECTION

Section 1: President: The president shall be elected for a term of two (2) years.

Section 2: Vice-President: The vice-president shall be elected for a term of two (2) years.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: The recording secretary shall be elected for a term of two (2) years.

Section 4: Director of Convention Services: The Director of Convention Services shall be employed by the Convention under such contract as may be agreed upon by himself and the executive committee. The Convention's executive committee shall be the directing and governing authority of this office.

Section 5: *Treasurer*: The treasurer shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. A positional bond of not less than \$5,000 shall be continuously maintained.

Section 6: Children's Home Board: The Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home, Middlesex, shall be composed of twelve (12) members including two (2) ladies, one (1) alumnus of the Children's Home that was a child at the Home, and a cross representation of the Convention, with terms of three (3) members expiring each year, the vacancies to be filled by the Convention. No person is eligible to serve on this board for more than three (3) consecutive four-year terms.

Section 7: Board of Minister's Program: The Board of Minister's Program shall be composed of five (5) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 8: O.F.W.B. International: The O.F.W.B. International shall be composed of five (5) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 9: Board of Trustees: The Board of Trustees shall be composed of three (3) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 10: Representatives of Cragmont Assembly Stock: The stock held by this Convention in Cragmont Assembly, Inc., shall be represented by six (6) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 11: Representatives of Convention Membership of Free Will Baptist Press Foundation: The memberships held by this Convention in the Free Will Baptist Press shall be represented by one (1) member elected annually by the Convention.

Section 12: Representatives of Church Finance Association Stock: The stock held by this Convention in the Church Finance Association, Inc., shall be represented by one (1) member elected annually by the Convention.

Section 13: *Historical Commission*: The Historical Commission shall be composed of three (3) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 14: Executive Committee: The Executive Committee shall be composed of the president, vice-president, recording secretary, treasurer, and one representative elected by the Convention from each member conference. The representative from each member conference shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. The recording secretary and treasurer, and half the conference representatives shall be elected on odd numbered years and the president, vice president, and half the conference representatives shall be elected on even numbered years. In the event of an uneven number of conference representatives, the simple majority shall be elected on odd numbered years.

Section 15: Board of Trustees of Mount Olive College: The Board of Trustees of Mount Olive College shall consist of a maximum of thirty (30) members, each elected by the Convention for a term of six (6) years, with the term of five (5) members expiring annually. No member shall be removed from membership during any unexpired term without due process as prescribed by the Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists. It is expressly provided that a minimum of sixty percent (60%) of the members shall hold membership in churches affiliated with the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. Members shall assume office on December 1 following their election at the annual session of the Convention in May.

Section 16: Commission on Chaplains: The Commission on Chaplains shall be composed of five (5) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 17: Layman's League Board: The Layman's League Board shall be composed of twelve (12) members with the terms of four members expiring each year; the vacancies to be filled by the Convention.

Section 18: Board of Home Missions and Evangelism: The Board of Home Missions and Evangelism shall be composed of seven (7) members with the term of one member expiring each year; the vacancy to be filled by the Convention.

Section 19: Retirement Homes Board: The Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Homes shall be composed of ten (10) members elected by the Convention for a term of five (5) years with the term of two members expiring each year. Each conference shall be represented on this board with one member per fifty churches or fraction thereof.

Section 20: Sunday School Board: The Sunday School Board shall be composed of nine (9) members, with at least one member from each of the conferences of our denomination. The members of this board are to be elected to three-year terms with the term of three (3) members expiring each year.

Section 21: No persons shall be eligible to serve on the Executive Committee while they are a member of any other board, standing committee, or commission of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists or any of our denominational ministries (institutions and enterprises).

Section 22: *Term Limits:* No person shall be eligible to serve as a general officer for more than two (2) consecutive terms except the treasurer who may serve no more than four (4) consecutive two (2) year terms.

Article III

Duties and Responsibilities

Section 1: *President*: It shall be the duty of the president to preside over each session, preserve order, govern the body according to established parliamentary usage, and to work with a subcommittee of three from the Executive Committee to appoint all temporary committees. He shall have power to declare any office of the Convention vacant, temporarily, subject to the approval of the Convention or the executive committee. He shall have authority to call meetings of the executive committee, when such is needful, and preside over said meetings.

The president shall be *ex officio* member of all boards, standing committees, and commissions of the Convention.

Section 2: *Vice-President*: The duties of the vice-president shall be the duties of the president when that officer is not present.

Section 3: Recording Secretary: The recording secretary shall keep an accurate record of the transactions of the Convention and preserve the same, keep all valuable documents, and shall secure and maintain all bonds required by the Convention, and surrender the same to his/her successor in office.

Section 4: *Treasurer*: The treasurer shall hold all money belonging to the Convention. He shall pay all bills ordered by the Convention or the executive committee; other bills paid must be approved by the president and recording secretary. He shall give an annual report to the Convention; also make reports to the executive committee when called for.

Section 5: *Children's Home Board*: The Children's Home shall be responsible for the management and control of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home at Middlesex. It shall give an annual report to the Convention setting forth its progress, needs and achievements.

Section 6: Board of Original Free Will Baptist Minister's Program: It shall be the purpose of this board to organize and unify all superannuation work throughout this Convention. They shall seek to provide for our aged, retired, and infirm ministers in some form of a superannuation program; also seek to offer to our active ministers some program whereby they may help to provide for their future security and retirement.

Section 7: O.F.W.B. International: The O.F.W.B. International shall regulate and supervise all mission work under the control of the Convention outside of the continental United States. However, the board shall have the right and authority to establish a business office and own such property and assets in the United States as is necessary to the operation of a foreign missions program. Furthermore, they shall have the responsibility to promote the cause of foreign missions, raise funds, and supervise the expenditure of these funds.

Section 8: *Board of Trustees*: The Board of Trustees shall hold title of all properties belonging to this Convention and not assigned to other bodies. It shall have the power to convey such properties when authorized by the Convention.

Section 9: Representatives of Cragmont Assembly Stock: The representatives of the stock held by this Convention in Cragmont Assembly, Inc., shall work jointly with representatives of other auxiliaries holding stock in said institution.

Section 10: Representatives of State Convention Membership of Free Will Baptist Press Foundation: The representatives of the membership held by this Convention in the Free Will Baptist Press shall meet annually, or as often as called upon, with the representatives of the Press at Ayden, N.C., to transact any business that may come before them.

Section 11: Representatives of Church Finance Association Stock: The representatives of the membership stock held by this Convention in the Church Finance Association, Inc., shall meet annually, or as often as called upon, with the stockholders of the corporation for the purpose of transacting any business that may come before them.

Section 12: *Historical Commission*: The Historical Commission shall make research, compile same, and record historical events of the denomination to date; these documents become the property of the Convention and shall be held by the recording secretary.

Section 13: Executive Committee: The work of the Executive Committee shall be that of the Convention when the Convention is not in session. It shall call as many sessions as necessary between the annual sessions of the Convention to transact business. It shall have the authority to suspend any officer of the Convention when such officer proves a failure in duties, is non-Christian or detrimental to the cause of Christ, and appoint another to fill the vacancy, also fill vacancies by any other cause.

The executive committee shall supervise the work of the promotional department between the annual sessions of the Convention as most practicable to our Convention work and in keeping with the expressed will of the annual session of the Convention.

A report of all transactions of this committee shall be made to the Convention in annual session.

Section 14: Board of Trustees of Mount Olive College: The governance of Mount Olive College shall be vested in the board of trustees elected by the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. The board shall have power to organize at will and to create such bylaws as may be deemed essential for its governance, consistent with the charter of the College. All amendments to the charter of Mount Olive College shall be approved by the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

Section 15: *Commission on Chaplains*: The responsibilities of this commission will be to formulate policies and procedures relative to the endorsement and supervision of Original Free Will Baptist ministers for the chaplaincy of the United States Armed Services and all other institutions and organizations using such services in the U. S. A.

Section 16: Layman's League Board: It shall be the responsibility of this board to perpetuate the Layman's League organization on a local and Convention level, and in cooperation with the Free Will Baptist Press provide programs and other such literature as may be needed for the advancement of this organization.

Section 17: Commission on Free Will Baptist College Student Fellowships: It shall be the responsibility of this commission to direct the work among Free Will Baptist college student fellowships throughout North Carolina.

Section 18: Board of Home Missions and Evangelism: The Board of Home Missions and Evangelism shall supervise all missionary and church extension work within the United States. They shall also oversee the formulation and promotion of church sponsored scouting programs and the God and Country Award of Original Free Will Baptists.

The Board of Home Missions and Evangelism shall have the right and responsibility to promote evangelism and home missions and oversee the scouting programs, raise funds and supervise the disbursements of these funds of home missions and evangelism and scouting programs.

Section 19: Retirement Homes Board: The Retirement Homes Board shall be responsible for the management and control of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries. The scope of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Ministries is to own, operate, and maintain apartments, rest homes, skilled nursing care, day care and all other facilities and services necessary or incidental to the operation of such retirement ministries and to do all other things usually done in the conduct of such ministries for the care of elderly and indigent persons.

Section 20: Sunday School Board: The Sunday School Board will be responsible for promoting the overall improvement and growth of the local Sunday Schools throughout our denomination and the interest of Christian education in general. To this end, the Board will make available to the churches of our denomination qualified resource persons, practical learning opportunities and materials to enable and equip people to respond to God's call through an understanding of teaching and learning for all.

AMENDMENTS

The constitution and these bylaws shall not be changed or altered except by a two-thirds vote of members present in a regular session. All amendments shall lie on the table not less than six hours prior to adoption and shall during that time be read not less than twice in open Convention.

Constitution and Bylaws were updated following the Convention of May, 2006.
