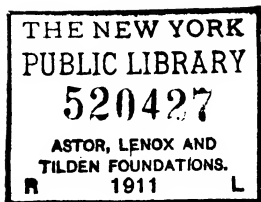

JANUARY.

MONTH OF THE HOLY CHILDHOOD.

FEAST OF THE CIRCUMCISION.

January 1st.

The Novena preparatory to this Feast will commence on December 23d, and terminate on the 31st.

PRAYER.

OH! most sweet Infant Jesus, who at the expiration of eight days didst submit to be circumcised, receiving the holy name of Jesus, and becoming, in virtue of that name and by the shedding of that blood, the Saviour of the world, I prostrate myself humbly before Thee, and thank Thee with all my heart for

this Thy great mercy and love to me and to all poor sinners. The sight of this Thy blood reminds me hopefully of the source whence flows every grace, every grace which will be imparted to me during the year; and also of the asylum where I will seek shelter and aid in every tribulation. It is Thy heart, dear Lord, which was opened to me in this first shedding of Thy blood. Therefore I devote to thee, Oh! sweetest, dearest Heart, every word and deed, every throb of my heart, all, all that I do or suffer during this year. Accept my offering, and strengthen me with Thy grace; enlighten and shield me, and grant me in virtue of Thy name, that most holy, most efficacious name of Jesus, this my request Hear me, oh! Jesus, for the sake of this Thy name and of Thy loving heart! Amen.

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY.

January 6th.

This Novena commences on the 28th of December, and ends January 5th.

PRAYER.

I SALUTE Thee, O divine Heart, with the three Magi who offered their homage to Thee. Regard me, I beseech Thee, with the same love and kindness with which Thou didst receive them, that I may offer with my heart, gold, frankincense and myrrh; that is to say, my intellect, my memory and my will, in complete subjection to Thee, in faith, hope, charity, in thought, word and deed. Accept my offering, accept my heart, and grant that I may live and die thanking Thee for the invaluable favor of being called to the true faith. Hence, I beg

of Thee, by the joy which filled Thy heart, when Thou didst see the first of the Gentiles at Thy feet, to hear my prayer and grant the request I make in this Novena. Amen.

FEAST OF THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS.

This Feast falls on the second Sunday after Epiphany.

PRAYER.

O MERCIFUL Jesus! who didst in Thy early infancy commence Thy office of Saviour, by shedding Thy blood and assuming that name which is above all names, we thank Thee for such early proofs of Thy infinite love, and we venerate Thy sacred name with the profound respect of the angel who first announced it to the earth.

Animated with a firm faith in Thy unerring word, and penetrated with confidence in Thy mercy, we now most humbly remind Thee of the promise Thou hast made, that whatever we ask of the Father in Thy name should be granted; therefore we implore through that adorable name, and in virtue of that promise, the particular favor we petition for in this Novena.

O blessed Mother of our Redeemer! who didst participate so sensibly in the sufferings of thy dear Son, when He shed His sacred blood and assumed for us the name of Jesus, obtain for us, through His most holy name, the grant of this our petition. Amen.

O MOST holy Mother, who, though a pure Virgin, didst humbly submit to the requirements of the law, going up into the Temple to be purified, we beseech thee, through the joy that filled thy Immaculate Heart when thou didst present thy Divine Son to the Eternal Father, and through the sorrow that pierced thy soul at the prophecy of holy Simeon, to obtain for us

Hear our humble prayer, O loving and beloved Mother; and obtain for us Help us in our bodily needs and spiritual infirmities; may our gratitude for thy favors make us still more careful to imitate thy virtues during all our life, that so we

may one day come to share with thee in the glory of heaven. Amen.
