Georgia Collards—All the growing Collard seed crop of Georgia was killed in last Jan. freeze. Not a seed will be saved this summer. Seed in 1900 will be double present prices, and will be wholly '98 crop. Anticipate your wants for 12 months. **Georgia Blue Stem, Georgia White Cabbage Collard** 10 lbs 35c; 50 lbs. 32c; 100 lbs. 30.

The few Ga. growers with '98 stock remnants are asking more than the above prices. Some say seed will go to \$1 00.

Ga. Ostrich Plume Mustard—A higher distinct type than Georgia Southern Curled. Our introduction. Finest mustard in the world. Resembles beautiful crimped ostrich plumes. Sold out present crop. List this this fall. Put in orders now. Will contract now for summer 1900 delivery. We have a big lot contracted for. Our '99 crop just gathered is an absolute failure. We have not 1 lb. to offer. We grew for 7000 lbs and have only 150 lbs, owing to the dry weather. 100 lb lots at 15c; 500 lbs at 13½. Future contracts.

Ga. Giant Southern Curled Mustard—Crop just gathered is only 1-10th crop. Have just bought up at more than double usual price every seed in Ga. in grower's hands. We offer same till stock sold at 30c., 100 lbs. Beware of spurious seed, there is much of it.

Ga. Chinese Mustard.—No '99 crop. We offer 1900 crop at 15c.

Ga. Cat Tail Millet.—To close out will sell 100 lbs. at 5½c and 500 lbs. at 5c.

Velvet Beans.—To close will sell f. o. b. Augusta at \$1.20, f. o. b. farm \$1.00 till sold. For 1900 we have largest contracts in south. Will sell now for spring delivery at 90c bush. f. o. b. farm in 50 bush. lots; 25 bush. 95c. 10 bush. \$1 00. Finest stock.

Ga. Okra—Long Green, Dwarf Green, Lady Finger. Will contract for Jan. 1900 delivery, 100 lbs., 11c; small quantity 15c.

Ga. Jackson Limbless Cotton—This cotton has been more exploited than any other cotton; gets now an extra boom by standing in '98 at top of list of 30 cottons at Ga. Experimental Station. 1 bush. \$2.00; 5 bush. \$1.85; 50 bush. \$1.75.

Other Ga. Cotton Seeds—(30 lbs. bushel)—Have furnished United States Government many years their cotton seed contracts. We do so this next year also. Augusta is the largest inland cotton market in the world. **Hawkins**—(of the well known cottons this stands next to Jackson Limbless); **King, Peterkin**, 5 to 10 bush. at 50c. bush; **Trutt Big Boll, Jones, Peerless, Texas Storm Proof, Drake's Cluster**, 5 to 10 bush. lots 60c.; **Doughty's Long Staple** (Augusta markets finest long staple) 75c bush.; **Sea Island Cotton** (42 lbs. bush.)—from South Carolina sea coast island; 5 bush. at \$1.25 bush.

S.) at 26c; **Rattlesnake** (genuine) at 28c.; **Kolb Gem** 26c; **Augusta Round White** (by 3 weeks earliest Augusta melon, an acquisition) 35c; **Eden Melon**, a new fine shipper, 30c; **Triumph Melon**, 30c. **Eutaw Melon** 30c. lb. Will make contracts fall delivery if addressed at once and amounts given of first class stock of **Bradford, Jones, Pride of Ga., Sweetheart, Lord Bacon, Sealy Bark**.

Ga. Nixon Canteloupe—Our sole market melon here. Very sweet 8 to 12 lb. melons. Fall delivery, present contracts, 50 lb. lots 30c. This a native production. The south wants large Canteloupes; these have grown to 17 lbs. this season. The best southern Canteloupe.

Ga. Seven Top Turnips—We are large contractors on these. 100 lbs. at 12c. We will exchange even on other well known A 1 Turnips.

Native Ga. White Winter Turnip—These are firm, fine fleshed, large, white, sweet, never killed—no matter how cold the winter. Turnips originating here. After January the tops put out the second time; these tops boiled make a slightly bitter pot liquor, much liked in the country by some. Present prices, 18c., Summer 1900 delivery, present contracts 12½c.

Ga. Spanish Pea Nuts—(Hand picked, 24 lbs. to bushel). **Ga. Big Pea Nuts**. To close out will sell stock at 90c bush. We are large dealers in Spanish Pea Nuts. Future contract made now, 90c. bush. Will gather 1000 bush.

Teosinte—To close out will sell at 40c. lb. Will contract in 25 lb. lots, Dec. delivery at 40c.

Ga. Upland Rice—(44 lbs bush.) 5 to 10 bush. at \$1.25. **Japan Rice** same price as Upland.

Ga. Winter Rye—Grown at Augusta. Different type from Mountain and all Rye north of us which trails on the ground. This Rye grows 5 to 6 feet high; quick grower; the best Rye in the world. Just gathered. 10 bush. at \$1.10 bush.

Bermuda Grass Seed. Tested. 75c lb. **Ga. Bermuda Grass Sets**.—25 bushels for \$3.50; 50 bushels for \$5.50.
