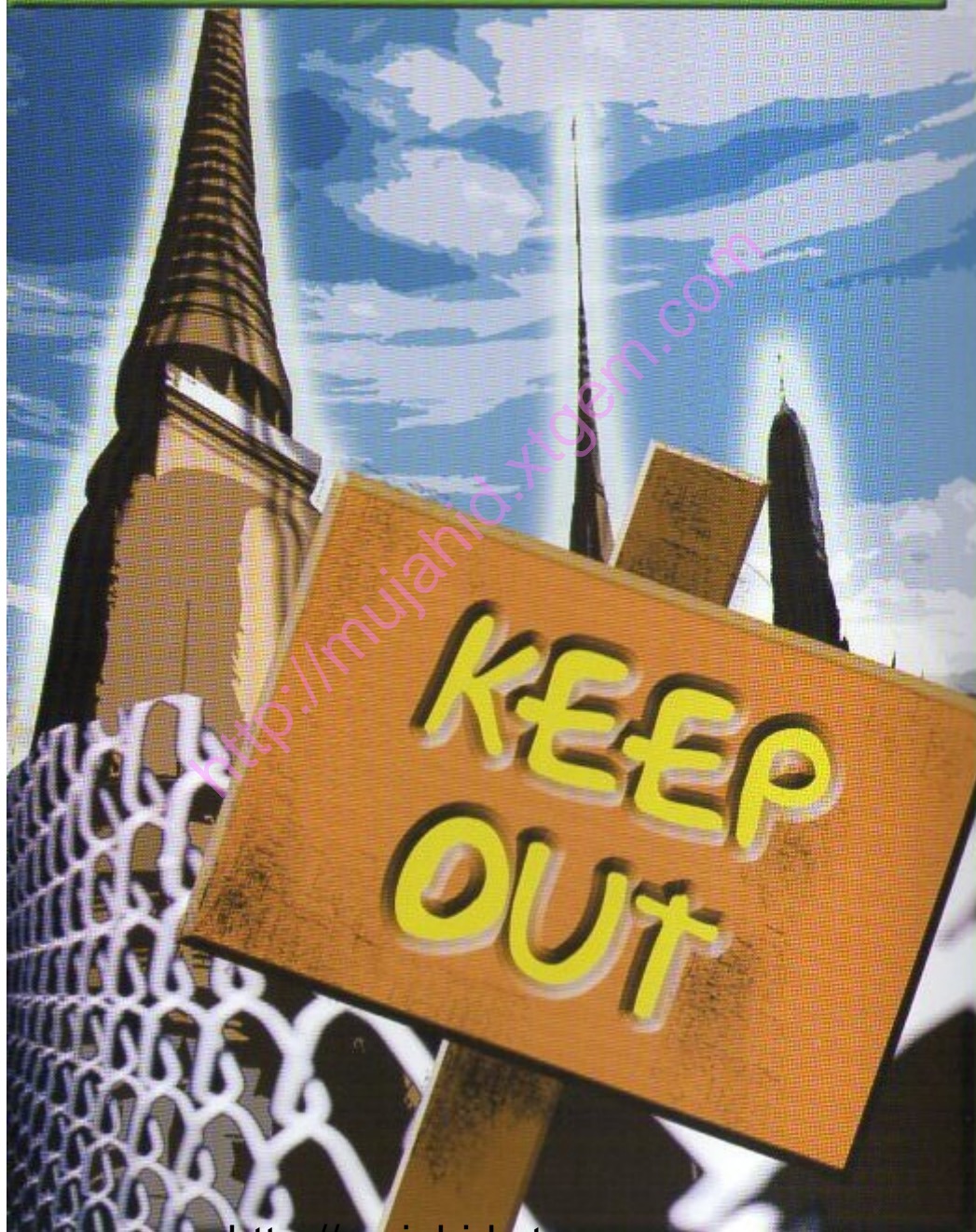

In a faraway land there lived a very powerful King who built himself a beautiful palace. He liked it so much that he would not let anyone near it.




