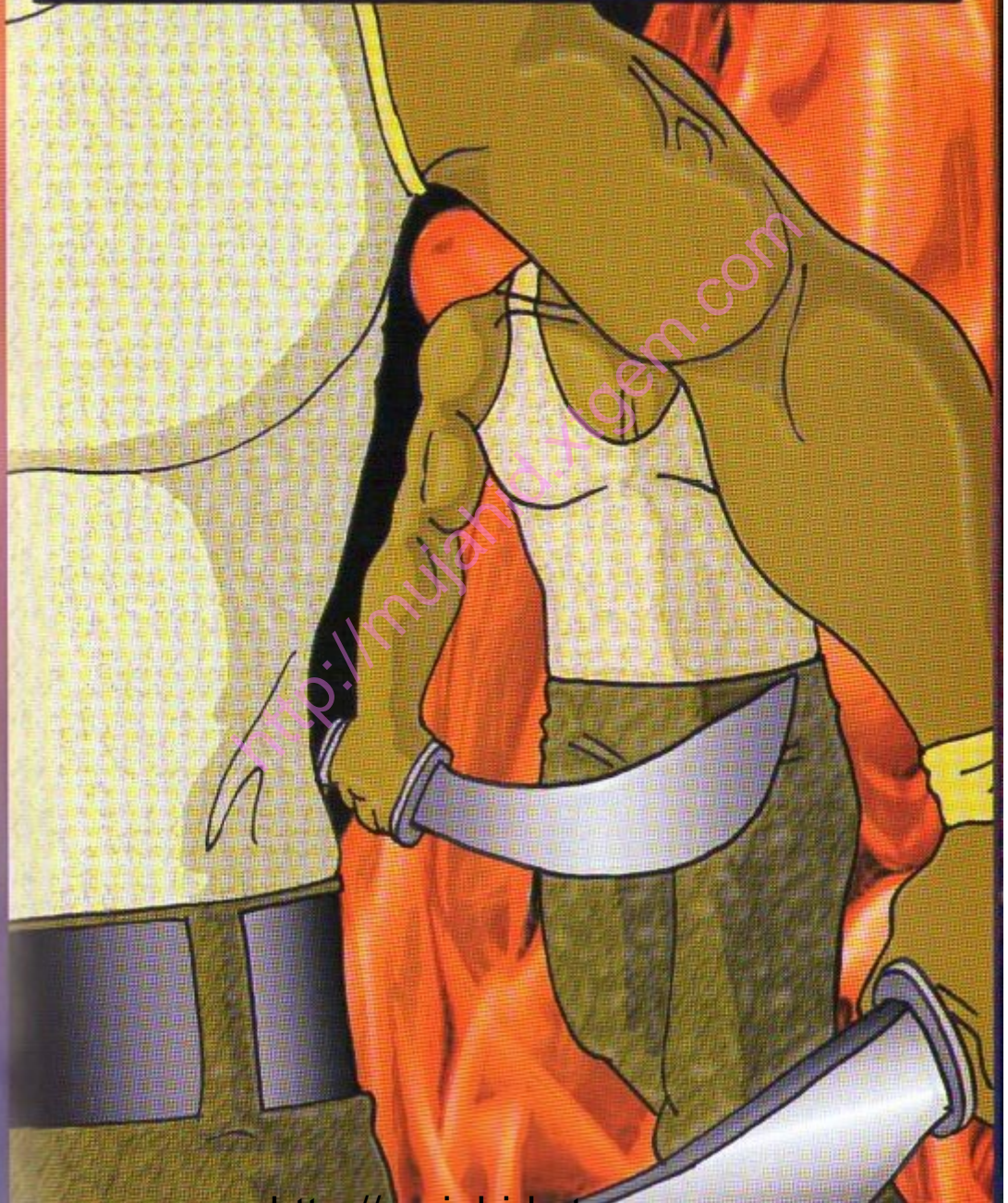




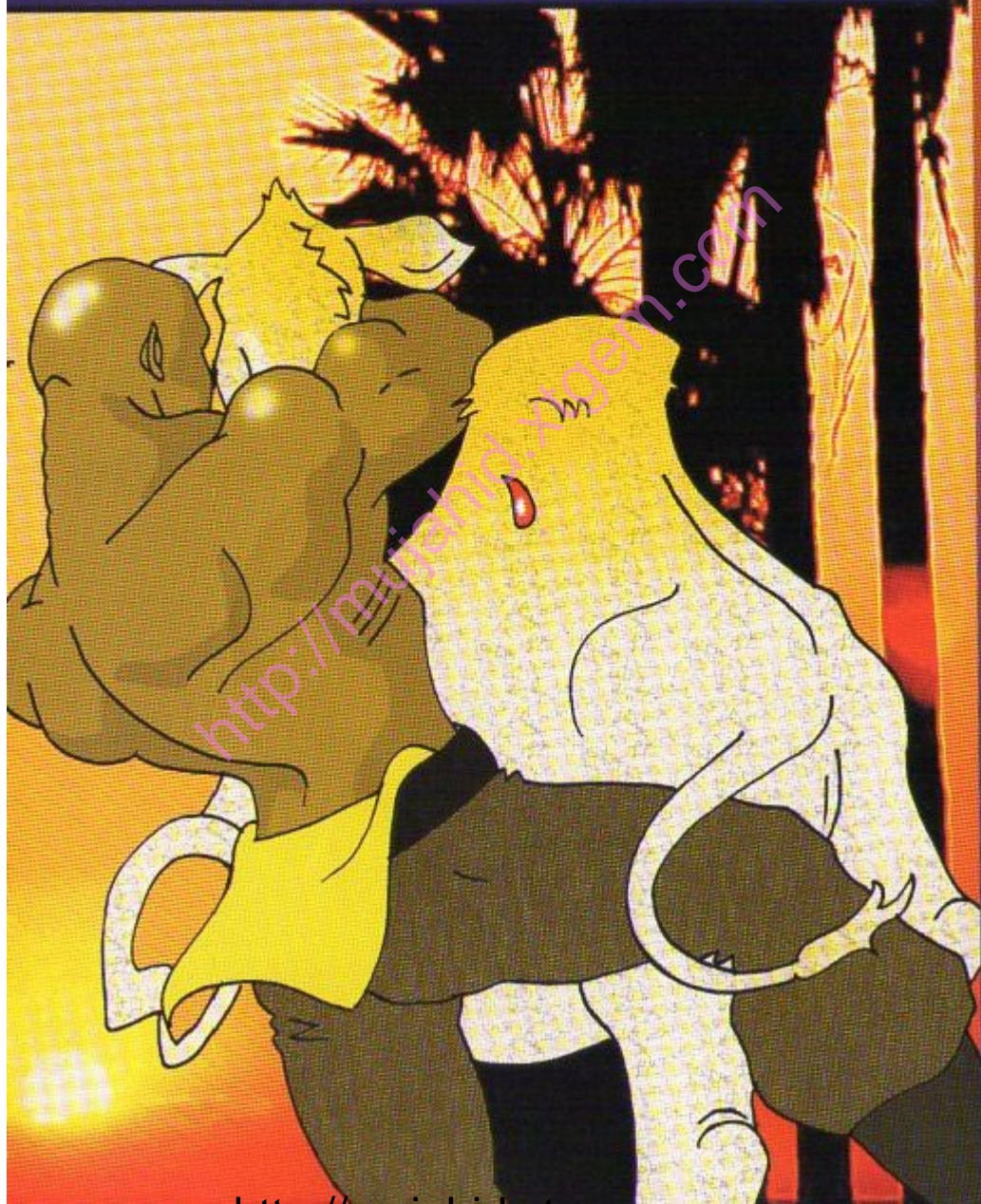
“If you

The two men fell into the trap, very anxious to receive their reward. They quickly gathered seven men to help them in their task.



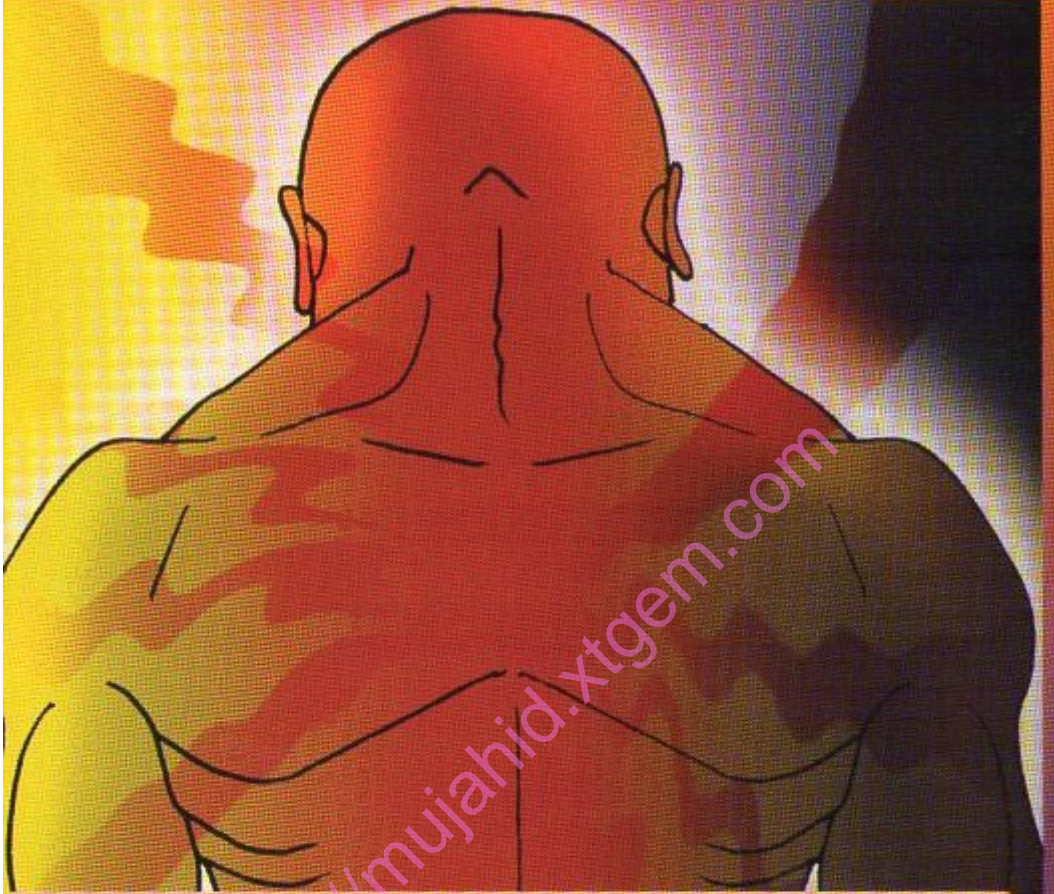
One day they hid waiting for the She-Camel as it returned from the well with its little one. Masra shot an arrow while the others pounced with their swords and attacked it till it was no more.

The seven men then plotted to kill Prophet Salih and his family at night while they were all asleep. But Allah saved Prophet Salih and the seven men were crushed by a stone.



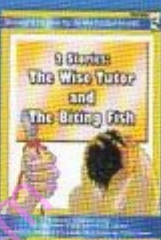

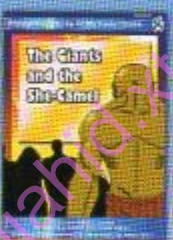
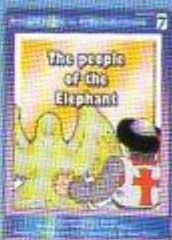
