Q We didn't think that we would make it to Toronto but the border let us get by real easy.

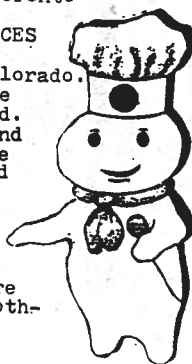
CON: HAVE YOU HAD ANY WEIRD OR WACKY EXPERIENCES

Time, my brother Joel, and Kooch. Bob doesn't really put a label on himself.

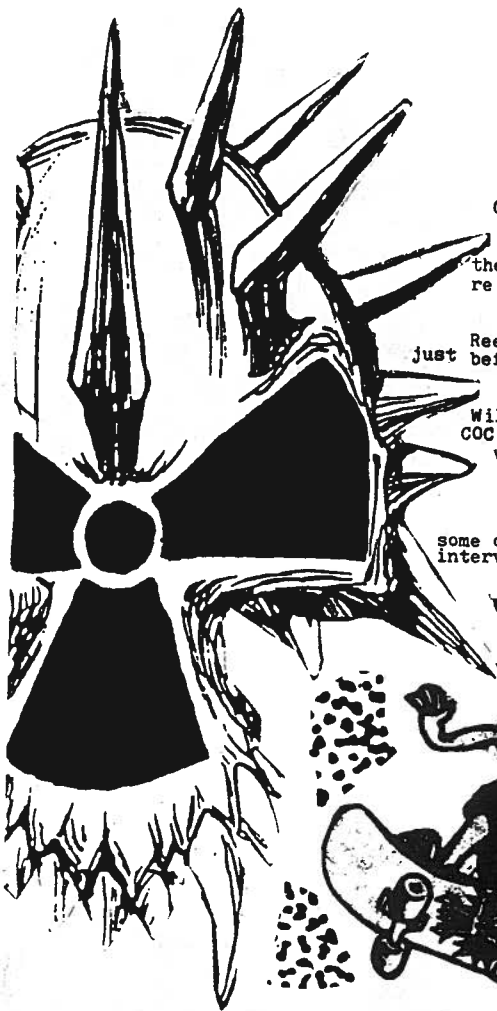
CON: SO I GUESS YOU THINK ALL THESE NEW

C.O.C. recently stamped into the elmo on Aug 1st. Dag Nasty was supposed to open the show, but someone, somewhere screwed up. Anyway Sudden Impact generously filled in. I shot the shit with Reed and Phil in their van just before their kiddy set.

Wildman Mike Dean has left COC, but Phil who is familiar with COC's sound is now strumming the 4 string righteousness. I just also want to say that the boys in C.O.C. are some of the coolest guys I've interviewed and have met.



PHIL: Certain industries have discovered...

REED: Coal. Yeah I think it's coal.

PHIL: Yeah, I guess you could call it a lot of vital natural resources on Indian land, which they're not allowed to touch. So the government is trying to find a way to fuck them out of their land.

REED: They are fucking them out of their land. The Indians have been so fucked over by the american people. They gave them all of these promises, shoved them on these reservations, stole all their land, raped them, killed them. What the americans did to the American Indians is pretty much the same thing the nazis did to the Jews in WW2. They practically erracticated a race of people.

CON: PHIL HAVE YOUR VIEWS/BELIEFS CHANGED AT ALL SINCE YOU'VE JOINED COC?

PHIL: My views were the same as they are now.

REED: Politically, I think your ideas are the same as ours.

PHIL: Yeah, pretty much.

CON: DID YOUR KNOW COC'S STUFF BEFORE YOU CAME TO THE BAND?

PHIL: Yeah.

CON: AHH BLUUUHAA, MILKING THE SICK FARCE. WHATS THAT ALL ABOUT?

REED: AHH Bluuuhaa, that's our heavy metal song. So many people are riding on this whole crossover thing, milking it for all its worth. Exploiting the whole idea of punk or hardcore. They aren't concitering it sacred, they are just using it as a comonity and they're discarding their roots and ideals.

CON: DO YOU THINK COMBAT'S DOING THAT?

REED: Combat, Metal Blade, I mean all those, they're just trying to...

CON: MAKE A LOT OF MONEY.

REED: Yeah! And a lot of bands are going for it.

PHIL: They didn't really give a shit about punk rock if you will, until it started to make money.

REED: AHH Bluuuhaa is our death metal song. It's just making fun of the whole thing.

CON: I KNOW YOU'VE PROBABLY BEEN ASKED THIS SEVERAL TIMES, BUT WHY DID MIKE DEAN LEAVE COC?

REED: Basic cliché musical differences kind of thing. We were going in different directions. He started really getting into stuff like The Grateful Dead, which is cool, whatever floats yer boat. We just weren't into it.

CON: DID YOU ASK HIM TO LEAVE OR DID HE LEAVE ON HIS OWN?

REED: It was both. I think he would've wanted to continue if we would've made the changes he wanted to make, but we wouldn't. I think he's happy though. For awhile he played with Greg Ginn and now I think hes playing with Neon Christ.

CON: WHY ONLY 5 SONGS ON TECHNOCRACY? WHY NOT A FULL LP?

REED: Technocracy was just to finish up our contract with Death Records. We didn't want to put out anything, we didn't want to put out Technocracy. Man is that thing ever tall. (the CN Tower) Due to our contract, they said we had to put out one more record. We definately didn't want to do an album, so we came to the compromise to do an EP. Ya see when we signed our contract with Death Records, we signed a bad contract, well bad for us, good for them.

CON: WHY DIDN'T YOU GUYS WANT A COMBAT LABEL ON THE BACK OF TECHNOCRACY?

REED: Combat has a sort of a skinhead spitting image to it. CON: HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT THE WHOLE SKINHEAD THING?

PHIL: There's people with no hair and then there's skinheads. People with facist attitudes, well...suck. I just don't dig people with facist ideas, wheather they have a shaved head or they're black or white.

CON: MOST OF THE SONGS ON TECHNOCRACY DEAL WITH ENVIRONMENTAL SUBJECTS....

REED: The song Technocracy does. Happily Ever After deals with relationships. Crawling is about yourself and emotional despair....

CON: I SORT OF GOT THE IDEA THAT CRAWLING WAS ABOUT IMPRISONMENT WITH YOURSELF.

REED: Yeah, sort of. Mike Dean wrote most of the lyrics to that.

CON: YOU ALSO DEAL WITH INDIANS. WHAT'S THE BIG MOUNTAIN DEFENCE COMMITTEE ABOUT?

REED: From what I know about Big Mountain, it's a group of people that have been or are getting kicked off their mountain which they have been living on for hundreds of years.

CON: DIDN'T YOU GET CHARGED FOR SOME THEFTS IN RALEIGH?
 REE: Yeah! We were just driving through this neighbourhood dropping this guy off. It was a nice area and there had been some break and entrys in the neighbourhood. Our van was really graffitied and the cops were just trying to pin something on me. They tried to get me for all these B&E's and the district attorney in our area was sure it was me who was doing it. He thought that I was this big mastermind schemer. I had to hire this big fancy lawyer to get me out of it.

CON: WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THIS OLLIE NORTH-CONTRA THING?

REE: He's a good liar. Pointdexter is going to take all of the spears, because Oliver North is to low on the ladder. Pointdexter is going to take all the blame, and Oliver North is going to be president.

PHIL: Along time ago there was this guy called Eugene Has-snaus who was caught in S. America working for the C.I.A sending arms to the contra's. This was only weeks after congress had voted on no military aid to the contra's, but humanitarian aid, medical supplies and shit like that. STRAIGHT AHEAD ~~~~~ STRAIGHT AHEAD ~~~~~

Straight Ahead recently broke up, but Confuzed talked with Craig, Tommy, and Armon after their show at Ildikos in April.

CON: GIVE OUR READERS A BRIEF HISTORY OF S. AHEAD.

C: We started out Feb. 86, just a little over a year ago. We have Arman on drums, Tommy sings Rob plays guitar, and I play bass. Basically we'd play around New York, because none of us drove, but now we do, so we're going to tour here, and play there. We've got some songs on a couple of comps. We broke up at one point for about for months, now we're back together and we are here to play.

CON: WE'VE HEARD SO MANY STORIES ABOUT THE N.Y. SCENE, CAN YOU GUYS SET THE STORY STRAIGHT?

T: Right now it's really good. As for crowd reaction in regard to S. Ahead it's big. Now we are getting up to 600 people a show. In turns of the scene, it's good. There's always a new generation of people coming, and going. In general it's cool, everything moves on, but we get a good crowd at shows, it's tight.

CON: SO THERES NOT THAT MUCH VIOLENCE?

C: No, its just like any other scene, if people don't like eachother, they're going to fight. Of coarse there's going to be more fights, because it's one of the biggest scenes. NY city is different, everybodys more uptight. I've noticed that out of town, more people are laid back. A little scene = less violence, and a big scene might mean more violence.

MY PROBLEM

CON: AREN'T SOME OF THE CLUBS IN N.Y. UNDER A ZONING AGREEMENT?

T: Ya, the clubs we play at are either next to empty warehouses, abandend buildings, garages, or low budget hoyels. It's all in a zoned area.

CON: A LOT OF PEOPLE ARE SAYING SOME BANDS ARE SELLING OUT, BECAUSE THEY SIGNED WITH MAJOR LABELS, HOW DO YOU GUYS FEEL ABOUT THAT?

C: Really the bottom line is, say what ya got to say, and play the music you like.

A: If the band actually makes money doing what they want to do, I think that's good. If a band does sign with Profile or Combat Core, and they get a decent amount of money, albums put out, and they get tours booked for them.....

C: The independent thing is great, people doing it themselves. But it's also just as bad, if you think about it. We put out a 7", we book our shows, and we do our own tour promotions. It's great independance, but people get fucked around and people get ripped off. Theres 2 things, the thing you want to do and there's the thing that sells.

T: If you do the thing you want to do, and it sells, then it's good.

CON: DESCRIBE S. AHEAD'S SOUND.

A: It's stylish.....

C: It's aggressive music. What we say and what we play is what we feel.

A: We don't limit our sound. We play what we feel.

CON: WHO WRITE'S THE LYRICS?

T: I wrote the lyrics up to now. Before Rob and Arman joined the band, me and Craig wrote everything. Since we broke up, we never really had time to do. But right now we're all doing the same thing, everyone is going to contribute.

CON: WHAT DO YOU WRITE ABOUT?

T: At first we went through unity, and we still are. It's really hard to start off, to think of what to say, that hasn't been said before. People critise, so we just wrote. Some of the songs are a bit generic, but you have to progress, and are lyrics are getting better and better. You just can't come off and write the best lyrics. You're going to look back on them and you're going to say those lyrics were no good. Same thing with music or whatever you do, it's life.

C: When you start something new, you're of coarse are going to follow, a tradition. You don't know your own style yet, and after awhile, what was said was good.

CON: WITH A NAME LIKE STRAIGHT AHEAD, A LOT OF PEOPLE LABEL THE BAND A STRAIGHT EDGE ONE, BUT THIS ISN'T TRUE IS IT?

A: Straight Ahead is not a straight edge band. A lot of people think that because of the name.

CON: SO IT'S MORE LIKE A DIRECTION IN LIFE?

A: Yeah, it's the way you should be

thinking, it's progression, not taking a step backwards. It's the total opposite.

T: Not staying in the same spot, if we don't progress we aren't going to be a band anymore. S. Ahead means keep moving forward. We are not going to limit ourselves to one spot and play HC all our lives. We feel if we just try to please people, instead of doing what we want to do, we're going to regret it.

CON: WHAT DOES YOUR MUSIC GIVE YOU?

T: Our music gives me a good feeling inside, and when I feel good inside, I feel good about people and life.

C: It's like medicine, it's also an outlet.

CON: WHAT'S S. AHEAD'S PLANS FOR THE FUTURE?

T: We're just starting a tour now, and an album should be out soon.

CON: WHAT LABEL DO YOU THINK YOU WILL SIGN WITH?

C: None so far, but we've been talking, things are in the works.

A: We're going to record within the next couple of weeks, for a demo. We are going to give it to different labels, so hopefully one will pick us up.

T: I'm looking for something that will be good for us, and not get us screwed over at the same time. We're looking for something that we deserve, because we've put a lot of time into this. We just want to get paid back, there was just too many things where we lost money and played for free. A band should get what they deserve.

CON: SO WHAT DO YOU THINK OF TORONTO SO FAR?

A: A nice looking city, friendly people. I'll tell you it's a lot better than playing in the boonducks.

C: I've been here before, and it's a cool town, but the only thing is that the club is too hot.

CON: ANY FINAL COMMENTS?

C: Don't worry about what other people think, do what you want to do, be yourself.

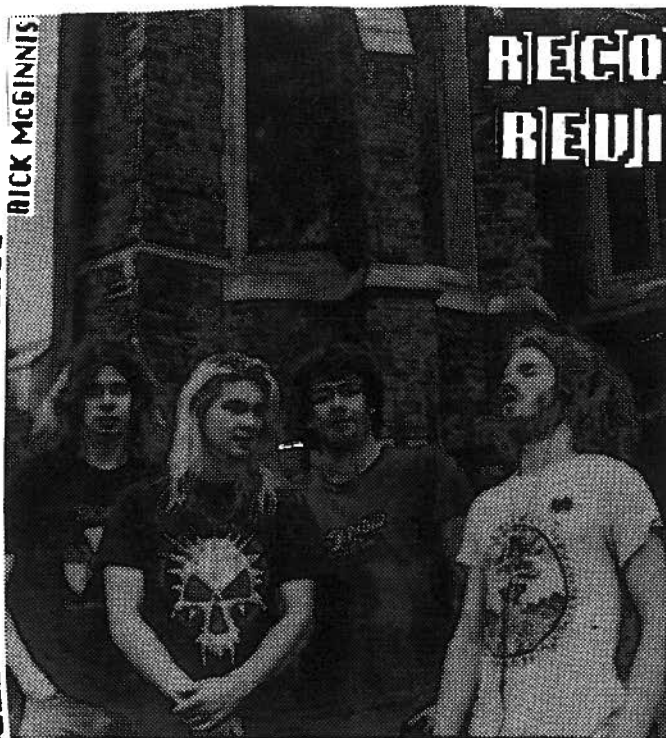

LEEWAY- Live at CBGB's (3-22-87)

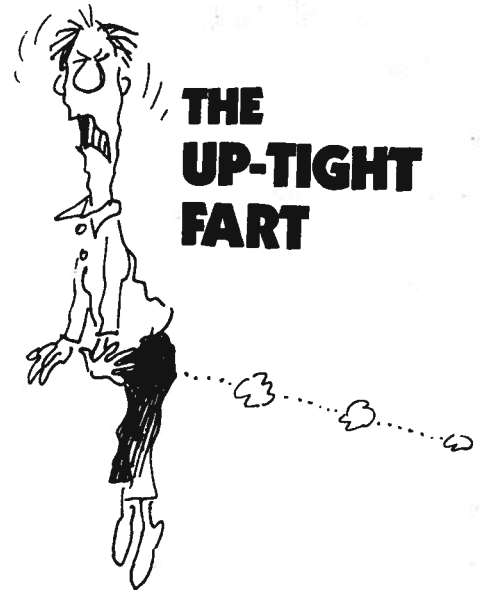
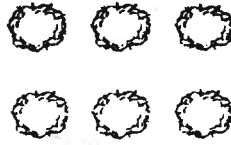

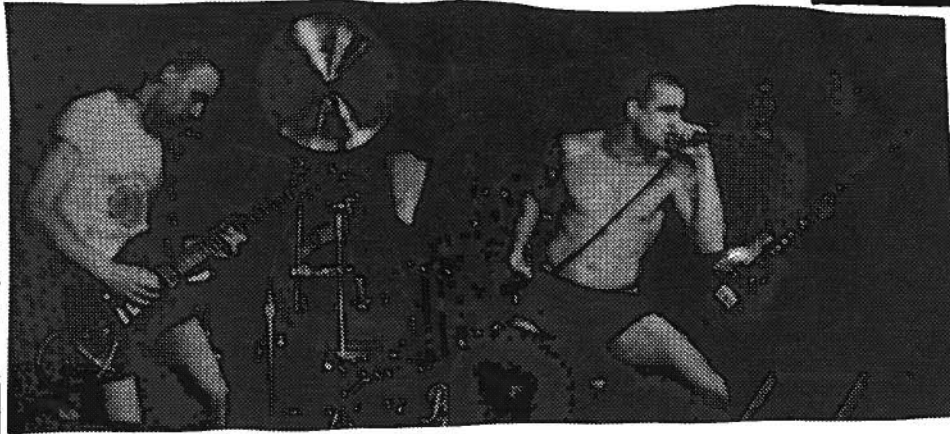

HENRY: Tanya Tucker coming to one of our shows and getting all fucked up and yelling all kinds of regressive shit. A real nice gal.

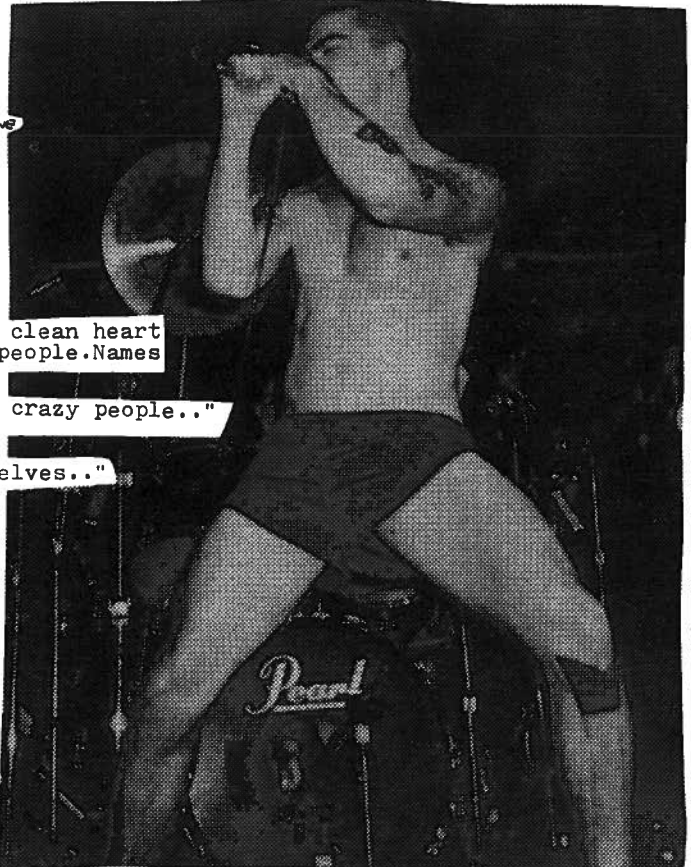

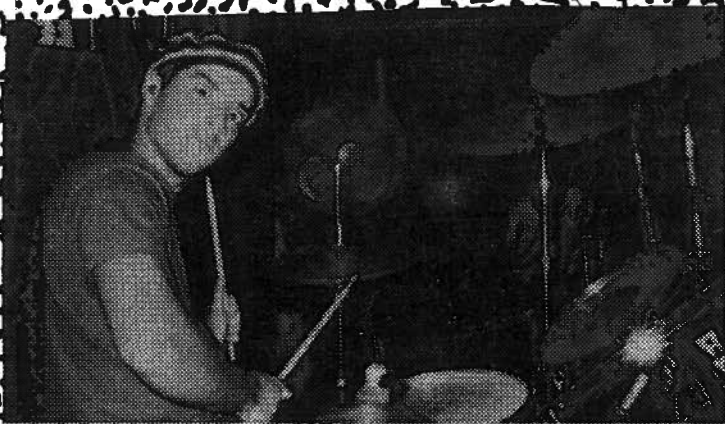
CON:HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT OUR FEARLESS LEADER BRIAN MULRONEY?

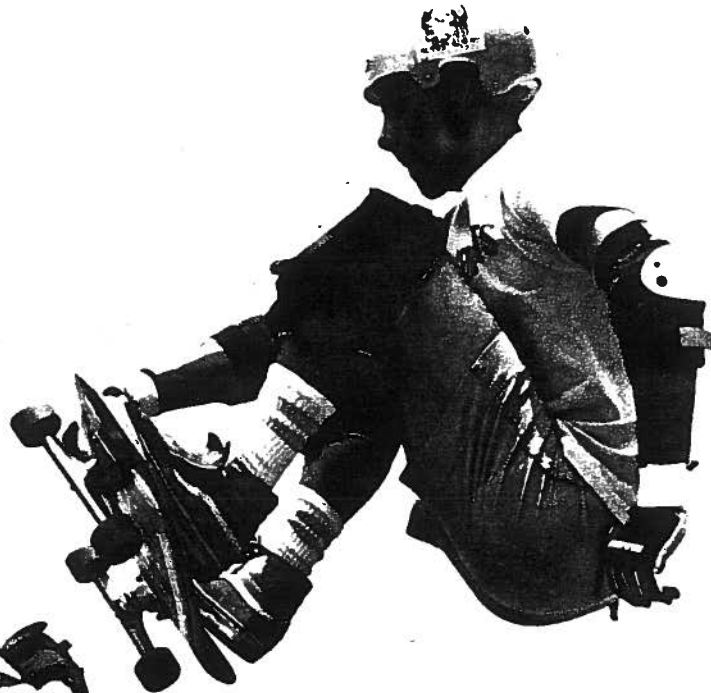
CON: DID YOU GO TO EXPO THIS YEAR?

CON: LEAVE US WITH A JOKE..

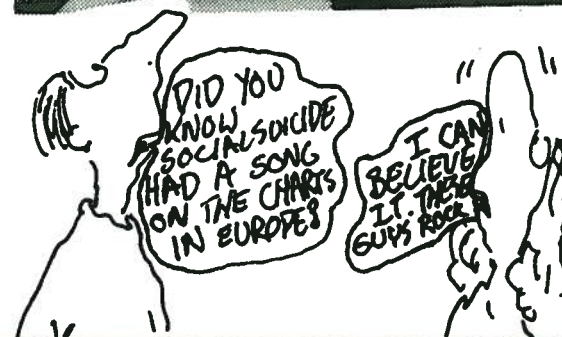

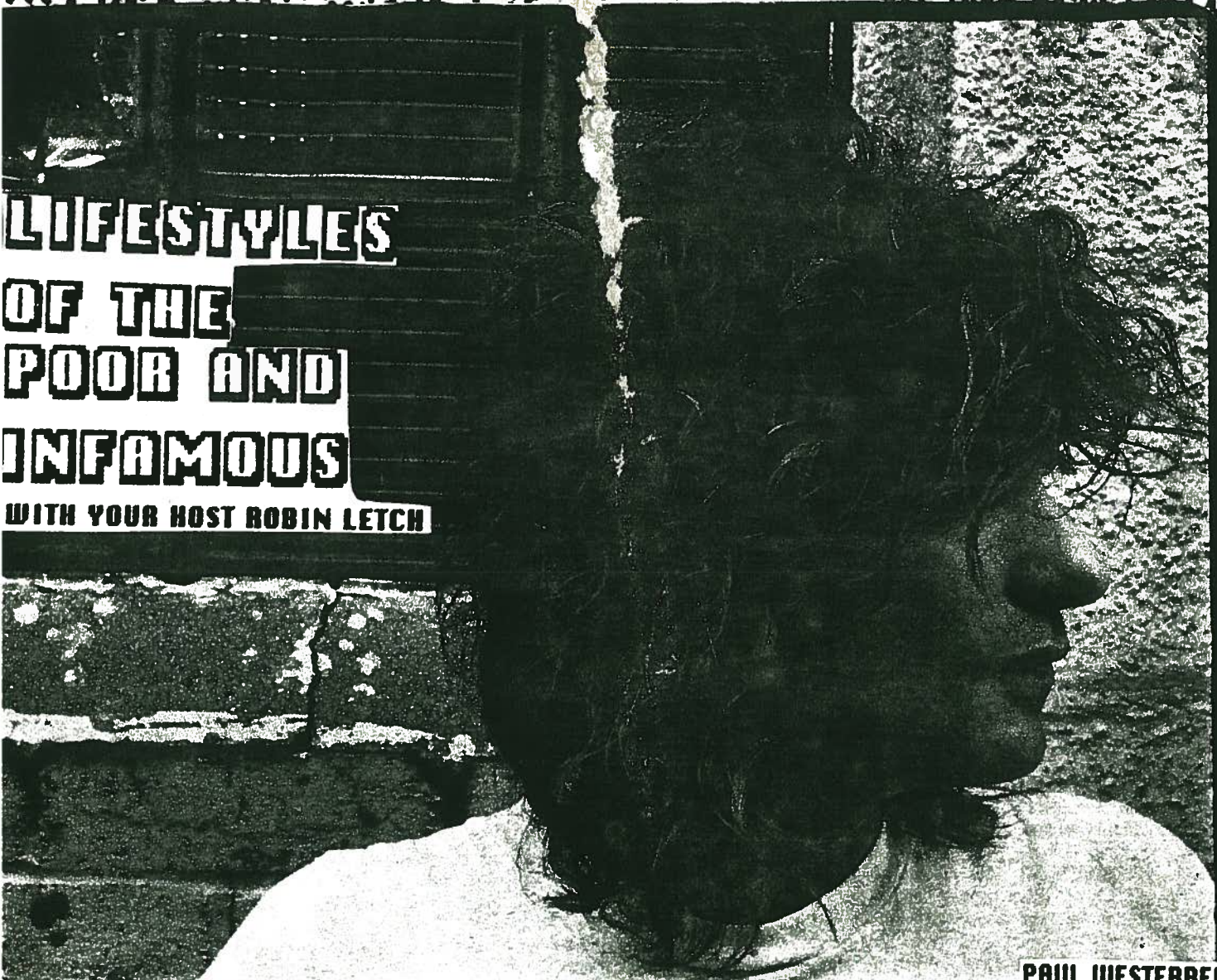


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LIFESTYLES OF THE POOR AND INFAMOUS

Now, it was nothing unusual for a "Mats" show, as they like to call themselves. Fans were jumping into the spotlight to sing lead, band members switch instruments they couldn't play, then wacked out any that struck their chords. The Replacements smiled snidely and looked scruffy, circling and slinking around the stage; they screeched out "Do The Clam", but nobody ever mentioned poor Elvis.....Join me, Robin Letch, your host as we travel the world in search of the Lifestyles of the Poor and Infamous.

Paul, Jim Baker ex-president of the million dollar PTL Club wants to know: "Mr. Westerberg why did you kick Bob Stinson out of The Replacements?"

PW: "I think he enjoyed touring, because of the 'fringe' benefits aspect of it, but he really wasn't willing to work for it anymore. We got tired of it, cause it got to be kind of like a dead weight. We gave him chances. For a long time we were saying, 'Bob, c'mon, get your shit together,' and we tried to help him and have patience, but it got to the point where he'd miss practice or he'd show up in a state not ready to work or play."

Then we travel to L.A. to chat with mobster, I mean legendary singer Frank Sinatra. He wants to know: "Why don't you guys make a fucking proper video like all of mine?"

PW: "But if you see our video, it's not going to be anything you've seen before. It's gonna be something that isn't at all like the spirit of the band. The 'Bastards of Young' video was the attitude of the band, but the spirit of the band together is something that shouldn't be filmed. From there we went to the face lift queen herself Phyllis Diller: "I always wanted to know what the Replacements were afraid of?"

PW: "We definatly had a fear of success. We had a fear of everything. We were all very paranoid, and I think that goes hand in hand with the excessive drinking thing. We'd get drunk because we were basically scared shitless, and snowballed into an image."
