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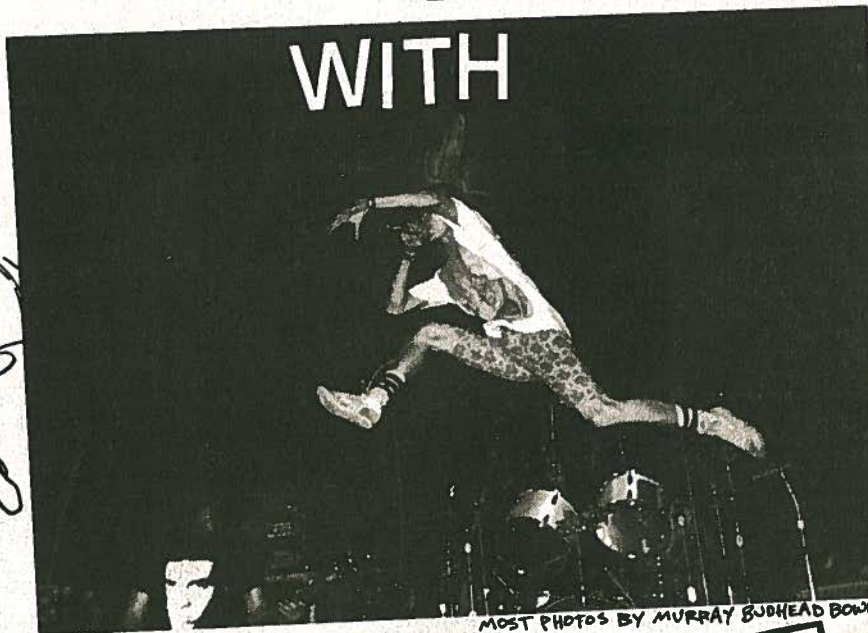

C - "I could be."

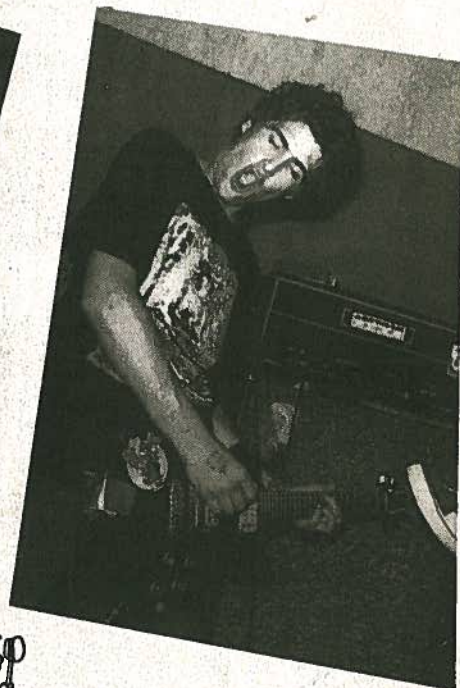
W - "If you are, I've got a bone to pick with you!"

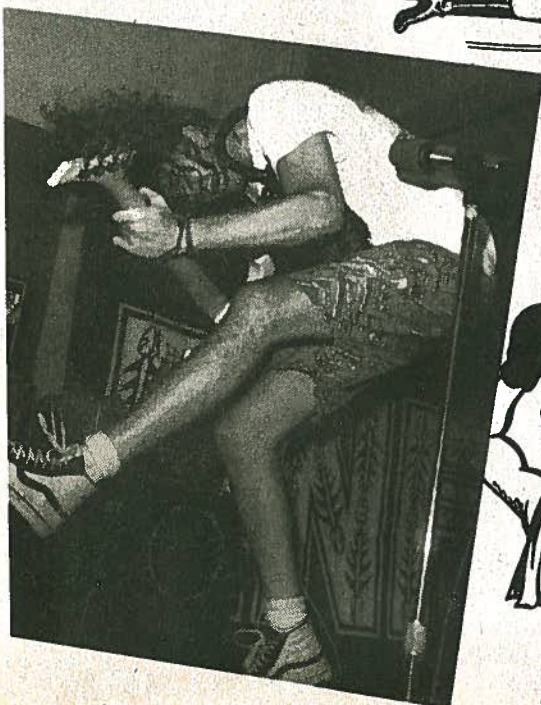
P is for politics.

W

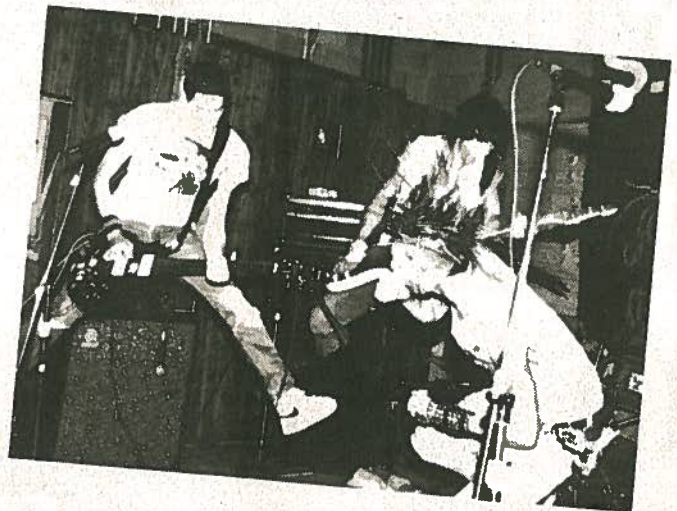
Is for wonked-out.
