





Will Eisner died on Monday. I had a truly terrible night, hardly sleeping, racked by thoughts and the minor pains accumulated from a life badly led. Much of the time, whatever I've been reading or watching before I go to sleep becomes the tonal voice of my dreams. I had watched a Columbo episode from the recently released first season on DVD, so my dreams were drenched in that voice and attitude. It's not that I think I am Columbo or that I'm in a Columbo-esque narrative; it's the tone of the show permeating my dreams: one of questioning, of fictional naïveté, of answers being dodges, and of Falk's voice, a jumble more than a coherent mode. In a night that proved to be already tortured, I took a bath at about 4am, just to ease some of the aches. At about 6:30am, I went outside to get the papers. On the bottom of the front page of The New York Times was a Spirit cover, in color, from Nov. 2, 1941, above the headline "Pioneer of Comics Is Dead."

Now, Will Eisner was 87, and though he was consistently productive and often brilliant throughout the more than six decades of his career, his greatest work was clearly the 12-year run of The Spirit. At first, instead of mourning, I did as I always do when looking at Eisner's Spirit art: just enjoyed the color image, the always beautiful design, smart lettering, and inspired use of color. In a night drenched in my own failures, this was a moment of curative pleasure. Even before reading the headline, I knew when I saw the image it meant Eisner was dead, but that did not impact my pleasure.

Inside, there was an obituary, on page C14. The third paragraph began, "Comics fans called The Spirit 'The Citizen Kane' of comics for its innovation, its seriousness, and its influence." Further down, the obituary notes, "His seriousness helped bring mainstream attention to works like Art Spiegelman's 'Maus' and Marjane Satrapi's 'Persepolis."

"Seriousness!" "Seriousness" is a term they have to use, of course; they are referring to a man who wrote and drew (and edited and produced) comic books. They want to clue you, the general reader, into noting that there is something going on here. Something very important - not just comic books, but something serious! He didn't just create comic books, but did "serious" work. They make special note that Eisner coined the term for and birthed the form of the "graphic novel."

"Seriousness!" Rarely has a major American talent been done such a grave disservice in his obituary. "Deliriousness," perhaps! Whimsy, imagination, unbridled creative vision, visual innovation, mature comic-book innovation, stunning storytelling, unparalleled influential visual style, certainly! But seriousness – posh on that! That is a denigration of Eisner, a term appropriate to a comic-book creator a whole lot less important than he was. Don't bridle this great genius of the imagination with that

Even though he invented the term "graphic novel," let's stick to comic books here. Let us give genius its due; let us now

The Spirit debuted June 2, 1940, as part of a 16-page insert offered to daily newspapers to place into their Sunday editions. Similar to a comic-strip section but in the tabloid format of a comic book, it featured separate stories on three characters: The Spirit, Lady Luck, and Mr. Mystic. From the beginning, the team that produced the book included some of the most gifted comic artists of all time; Lou Fine and Bob Powell were there at the start, and at one time or another, the team included the truly great Jack Cole (Plastic Man), Jules Feiffer, and the gifted, tragic genius Wally Wood (though when I knew Wood he was more of a classic blond Teutonic legend, producing brilliant work and always surrounded by acolytes). The book lasted until 1952.

The Spirit was criminologist Denny Colt, who was thought murdered but who "returned from the grave" to fight crime behind a blue mask and a code name. He had no special powers, physical skills, or unusual intelligence. More than anything, outside of his usually goofy charm and unquenchable boyishness, he existed to drive the stories.

What dazzling stories they are. They are driven by only one rule: There are no rules. The stand-alone comics section had to open with an eye-grabbing page, and often on it the Spirit logo was writ large, with action occurring all over it and shrunk small, as a tale was told in a noir style. But sometimes Eisner set the story as a children's storybook tale, sometimes as a classic nursery rhyme or a science fiction escapade or a Western fable, or a horror tale that began with a close-up image of an eye more akin to the work of Dario Argento than any of Eisner's comicbook art contemporaries.

There are those who must be given their due. Jerry Siegel and Joe Shuster created Superman, changing the world of comic books forever. Bob Kane and (just as importantly) writer Bill Finger created Batman, and several decades later Frank Miller reimagined him and re-created comic-book storytelling at the same time. At Fawcett, editor Wendell Crowley, artist C.C. Beck, and writer Otto Binder tackled new frontiers of storytelling with Captain Marvel, while at Quality, Eisner's Spirit and Cole's Plastic Man - along with work by Fine and Powell, among others - graced comic books with unique imaginations. EC comics matured the vocabulary as no other company had. Joe Simon and Jack Kirby reinvented the visual narrative a number



of times, and then Kirby hooked up with Stan Lee (at the same time Steve Ditko and the gang were provided full front four support) to take comics to the next level at Marvel.

But Will Eisner and The Spirit drew the map that showed the way; they created the comic-book equivalent of Birth of a Nation and Citizen Kane, and nothing that came after was ever the same. In art, it really doesn't matter who was first but who was best, and Will Eisner stood alone.

But, mostly, the work was fun. I first remember reading The Spirit in two 1966 reprints from Harvey comics: Stories about why even master criminals shouldn't cross a witch, about a talking cockroach, a flying plate, a boy who could fly who then grew into a man and was accidentally shot dead while showing the world he could fly, and about a weatherman not from Earth. Stories that evoked the fatalism of Edgar G. Ulmer's Detour, the idiosyncrasies of love like Joseph Lewis' Gun Crazy, and the sheer lunacy of Frank Tashlin, all while pushing the panelstorytelling conventions until they burst apart.

The Spirit features the most stunning women on the sexier side of Milton Caniff (those familiar with that terrain know just how limited an area it is). Eisner's creation was a true heir to the greats, to Winsor McKay's Little Nemo in Slumberland and the surreal George Herriman's Krazy Kat, and except for Jack Cole's *Plastic Man*, stands alone among his contemporaries.

"Art" is a word so often misused - or used to marginalize people or condemn or separate. Here was truly great art in a comic book in the Sunday newspaper. Art of spirit and spiritual, of imagination and knowledge, of vision and love, art blessed by God's breath more than any religious ceremony I've ever attended.

The work has been reprinted again and again, by Warren comics (home to Creepy and Eerie), by Kitchen Sink Enterprises, and, most recently, a complete, multivolume reprinting of every Spirit ever in hardcover by DC Comics. I have nearly complete runs of all, as well as a few original editions: one from a Sunday, October 1946, Newark, N.J., Star-Ledger found at a flea market in Red Bank, N.J.; one from a Feb. 16, 1941 Philadelphia Record in a used bookstore in upstate New York.

In drunken frenzies at too many parties over the years, I've forced Spirit reprints on the uninitiated, people who should not live a day longer without knowing The Spirit (some of which were returned, some weren't). If you care about comic books, about great American art and great artists, if you believe that jazz and baseball are more important American contributions to the world than the assembly line and, maybe, even the Federalist Papers, read The Spirit. Eisner's graphic novels are great, but don't go there; they are, if anything, serious.

Read The Spirit. It is a comic book. It represents the best of this country and the best of people in seven- or eight-page stories. It changed my life. May it grace yours.

Thank you, Will Eisner, and goodbye.

#### **Cultural Tastes Contribute**

In his Dec. 31 "Page Two" column, Louis Black, lamenting how the Democrats have been labeled with the charge of elitism, reduces elitism to mere wealth. Were it only so simple.

While the two qualities often overlap, they're not necessarily connected. For better or worse, elitism in America is fundamentally a cultural phenomenon. It trades in irony, cleverness, cultural - not economic - superiority, and the world of ideas more than material goods. Consider contemporary art. Why is contemporary art often perceived as elitist? Not because rich people buy it, but rather because most people don't immediately understand it. It revels in ambiguity. That's the point - to be exclusive by way of calculated confusion - and the elites, whether rich or poor, like it that way. I like it that way.

Democrats are labeled elitist more often than Republicans because we tend to appreciate things like contemporary art. Embracing the spirit of ambiguity inherent in contemporary art, we do edgy things like perform exorcisms on Starbucks cash registers (performance art), form ironic clubs like "billionaires for Bush" (public art), and, yes, we are more likely to support cultural expressions that are experimental rather than romantic (a sure sign of our strong cerebral nature). Beyond the art analogy, we are also more likely to buy organic food, worry about trans-fat, breast-feed in public, hug trees, support homosexual rights, save mutts at the shelter, read The New Yorker, shave less often, and swear that David Brooks has devolved since the Times hired him.

Of course this portrait sounds like parody, but American politics is nothing if not parody. And while I have no clue why any of these stereotypes has a grain of truth, I am certain that it has little to do with wealth.

Here's the real problem, one that I think Louis Black downplays: the fact that Democrats are more likely to support policies that value economic justice over crass cronyism pales next to our predilection for cultural judgments that casually dismiss Clint Black, AM radio, and the Hummer as gro-

And sure, they are grotesque abominations. But until the Democrats - or at least the opinion-making forces within the party (i.e., Louis Black) - fail to acknowledge that our cultural tastes - genuine or parodied - contribute considerably to our perceived elitism, then popular perceptions are unlikely to change anytime soon.

Certainly not before 2008.

#### Beyond the Film

To the Chronicle,

Why do I get the impression that Marjorie Baumgarten doesn't like biopics? Or is it just Bobby Darin that she dislikes? In any case, her incoherent review of Kevin Spacey's Beyond the Sea is more telling of her personal taste than of the film itself [Film Listings, Dec. 31].

Her snide reference to "that Rat Pack nightclub style so out of date today" reveals her inability to appreciate Darin's music.

I don't know how Baumgarten separates style from performance, but I wonder if she'd have felt better if Spacey/Darin had sung fixedly or, alternatively, had slouched around, making malevolent gestures, periodically grabbing his crotch. The fact is that Darin had a vibrant stage presence, that his movements - the dancing, the finger popping, etc. - expressed his complete possession by the music itself. Rather than being superficial and out of date, Spacey's delivery captures the crisp energy of a Darin performance, perfectly suited to a singer of jazz and classic American repertory. Rod Stewart, reprising American standards, adopts a style similar to Darin's as a natural expression of his intimacy with the music.

By the critic's own admission, Spacey "so inhabits the body of Darin" with his "impeccable ... impersonation" that he reveals the sound and presence of the younger Darin. All the more puzzling that she indicts him for failing to capture Darin's "soul and ... drive."

But Baumgarten's entire critique is dismissive and unappreciative. Having conceded the accuracy of Spacey's portrayal, it seems bizarre that she should fault him for spending so much time enacting the role of Bobby Darin in a film about Bobby Darin. Also confusing is her complaint that the film "progresses through virtually every song in the Darin catalog." In fact, Darin recorded well over 300 songs, of which perhaps 15, each organic to the story, were selected.

Finally, I don't know how MB could fail to be moved by the story: a poor child from the Bronx, stricken with rheumatic fever and a damaged heart, is not expected to live past the age of 15. By virtue of his courage, determination, and talent, he fashions his own destiny, achieving musical greatness and recognition. The critic somehow can't see "why any of it matters." But it's not the movie that "fails miserably to make the case for Darin's importance" - it's the critic's unsympathetic heart.



Closer does not make for "fine drama." It lacks the writing to flesh out the motives of its characters; therefore it is a flawed drama. Why does Julia Roberts' character stray? Are we to assume she is just "damaged goods," and therefore, so are we? What does the last scene tell us? Leering men on a New York street, a teenaged looking girl's knowing expression, the film's slowed gait: Is this scene reflected reality or a commercial for deodorant? This isn't a "fractured fairytale," it's

## Austin Stories

- The AISD community was shocked when Bowie High School sophomore Robert Michael Plumlee collapsed of a heart attack during practice for a Fiesta Bowl marching band competition in Phoenix, Ariz., and died later that day. The 15-year-old had a congenital heart abnormality that caused his sudden death. Despite their loss, the band decided to go on with the show, winning Thursday's battle of the bands, and marching bravely along in Friday's parade. - Rachel Proctor May
- Drill bits and power tools remain available in abundance, but it will henceforth be much more difficult to get political contributions down at the Sears store, following the dismissal of the Travis Co. grand jury indictment against the company in the ongoing Texans for a Republican Majority PAC investigation. On Dec. 30, the indictment was dismissed pursuant to an agreement between Sears and Travis Co. DA Ronnie Earle, similar to an agreement concluded earlier with Diversified Collection Services Inc., another of the eight corporations indicted for illegal contributions to TRMPAC during the 2002 state legislative campaign. Under the agreement, Earle dismissed a single felony count of an illegal \$25,000 corporate contribution to influence a state election, and Sears agreed to cooperate with the continuing investigation and to fund a public education program - through UT's LBJ School of Public Affairs - on the responsibility of corporations in campaign financing. As he had in the earlier agreement, Earle described the illegal Sears contribution as a response to "false and misleading information provided by the fundraiser," presumably incorrect information from TRMPAC or its operatives that corporate contributions to political campaigns are legal in Texas. TRMPAC representatives under indictment - former Executive Director John Colyandro, Tom DeLay fundraiser Warren RoBold, and DeLay aide Jim Ellis were scheduled to appear in court this week concerning motions on their cases.

The legacy of Mack Kidd could fill a book, but friends and colleagues of the 3rd District Court of Appeals justice will remember him most as a "wonderful human being." Kidd, 63, died unexpectedly earlier this week. A progressive Democrat, the Austin resident was widely recognized as a legal whiz who did not let politics influence his decisions as an appellate judge, a position he held since 1991. "Justice Kidd was a great judge, a staunch Democrat, and most of all, a wonderful human being," said Travis Co. Democratic Party Chair Chris Elliott. "He had a keen sense of justice and applied that to his work on the court." Kidd continued on p.17

Or most of them, anyway. See the lists that follow for election highlights, media matters, and the police roundup.

1) For Whom the Road Tolls: They heard the state say all new highways have to be toll roads, so Central Texas obliged, provoking a firestorm that's lasted for much of 2004. At year's end, local leaders were poised to roll back some of the most controversial elements of the regional toll road plan, but not until the political damage had been done. A recall effort against three City Council members continues, the Lege has toll road reform on its (long) to-do list, and the state's highway strategy promises to be an issue in the 2006 governor's race.

2) The Train Finally Stops Here: After 19 years, Capital Metro finally has enough political capital to do what it was, in large part, created to do - build a railtransit system serving the Austin metro area. While the plan approved resoundingly by voters in November struck many supporters as too tame, the A-Train at least opens the door for a Central Texas

transportation system not entirely dependent on the automobile.

3) Hospital-izations: Local voters also finally approved creation of a Travis Co. hospital district - only to uncork a battle between the courthouse and City Hall over funding the new entity. Amid charges of city larceny and county ingratitude, the new district board had the thankless task of getting the thing up and running - a project still in progress - amid obvious signs that the local health care system is close to collapse.

4) Mueller's Perfect Landing: After 20 years of talk and eight years of action, the city and Catellus Austin consummated the largest real-estate deal in Austin history, the \$1.3 billion redevelopment of the city's shuttered municipal airport. Among the players - speaking of hospitals - is Seton Healthcare Network, which basically got Children's Hospital as a gift from the city, but then repaid the favor with plans for a bigger, better facility anchoring the Mueller project.

- 5) **Westward Ho!:** The environmental wars shifted to the lawless hinterlands of western Travis Co., where new subdivisions are coming out of the ground faster than you can say "preliminary plat." The West Cypress Hills subdivision hammered pristine Lick Creek, and Little Barton Creek took a beating from the Shops at the Galleria project in Bee Cave. Much more is planned for out in the county, where regulatory oversight is virtually nonexistent. Aiding and abetting these endeavors is the Lower Colorado River Authority, an agency that's never rejected an invitation to extend water service to even the most environmentally sensitive areas.
- 6) Everyday Low/Lowe's Prices: As was the case in 2003, the term "big box" conjures two different but interrelated stories. One is a skirmish in the enviro wars, with star billing for Lowe's Home Centers, which spent all year fighting over its building projects in Sunset Valley and Bee Cave. The other is an economic story, with City Hall mangling its attempt to quantify the true cost to Austin of Wal-Mart and its ilk, and community advocates and independent businesses later coming in to sort out the pieces.
- 7) When the Music's Over: Turn out the lights for the Austin Music Network, everybody's favorite symbol of what they don't like (whatever that may be) about City Hall. After eight years and more than \$5 million, the star-crossed network finally gave up the ghost - at least in its city-sponsored form - in September, as City Hall cut a deal with a private-sector partnership to reinvent Channel 15 as a for-profit music and arts channel.
- 8) As the BUNZ Crumble: Former hometown-biz star Schlotzsky's Inc. was turned upside down midyear with the dumping of CEO John Wooley and his VP brother, Jeff. With former airline executive Sam Coats taking the helm, the struggling deli chain bumped through bankruptcy court on its way to the auction block, where Odessa oilman Bobby Cox picked up its assets for \$28.5 million – a fraction of Schlotzsky's value during the Nineties. Assuming all goes according to plan, Schlotzsky's will start the New Year as a privately owned company. Shareholders, alas, were left with nothing but the crumbs.
- 9) The Downtown Dominoes: One big piece of the city's long-cherished plans for reinventing Downtown - the new Austin City Hall opened its doors in November. After high-profile invitations to private-sector dance partners, two more dominoes - the adjoining Block 21 and the old Seaholm Power Plant are poised to fall soon. Combined with lots of new private projects, the dreams and fantasies of decades are actually turning into concrete.
- 10) The New West Campus: The Central Austin Combined Neighborhood Plan represented a watershed for the city's deliberate journey toward citizen-driven Smart Growth, mostly because of its University Neighborhood Overlay - a grand bargain wherein Birkenstock Belt neighbors traded massive increases in West Campus density for the right to keep their single-family neighborhoods stable. The UNO reverses decades of slow- and no-growth approaches to the UT area, offering the promise that students can once again actually live in a real campus neighborhood.



# **TOP 10 STATE STORIES**

1) **The Tomstown Scandal:** "Tom" is for U.S. House Majority Leader Tom DeLay, who set the scandal in motion by moving his corporate fundraising operation into Texas for the 2002 legislative elections; and "Tom" is for Texas House Speaker Tom Craddick, who was a conduit (he says unwitting) for freewheeling corporate cash while he set the electoral stage for the GOP House takeover and his own ascension to the speakership. In the current episode, Travis Co. District Attorney Ronnie Earle handed down a brace of felony indictments personal and corporate - for everything from illegal corporate donations to money-laundering. A couple of corporations have made deals with the DA, and the question for the new year

is: Who's the next domino? 2) The TRMPAC Lawsuit: It's a scam so juicy, it takes up two Top 10s! Four defeated Democratic House candidates sued the Texans for a Republican Majority PAC for illegal use of corporate campaign cash in the 2002 election. The resulting depositions (and initial legal hearings) have yielded a host of curious coincidences, along with evidence of possible collusion between TRMPAC and the corporate campaign for the Lege of the Texas Association of Business. The lawsuit is temporarily on hold pending the reverberations of the district attorney's criminal indictments. But the TRMPAC twostep promises more revelations in 2005, as we wait to discover whether the story will stop with the minor PAC and corporate players, or begin to move upward and outward. 3) School Finance on Trial: Texas school districts - rich, poor, and in-between brought suit against the state to demand more resources, greater equity, and an end to the desperate reliance on capped local property taxes for the bulk of school support. It was hardly the first such lawsuit - they stretch back into the Eighties - but for the first time most districts began to see their predicament as a common one in defense of the constitutional requirement for a fair and

equitable system. Year's end brought a landmark decision by Judge John Dietz and an opinion calling on the Lege to find more resources, a fairer tax system, and a method to address century-old inequities. The state has appealed to the Supreme Court - and in the meantime, the new Lege is charged with trying to find another way out.

4) Session Not-So-Special: Judging from the recent record, we shouldn't expect too much from the 79th lege session about to convene next week. Gov. Perry called in essentially the same group last April to address public-school finance - although he undermined the effort from the outset by making property-tax cuts and ending recapture ("Robin Hood") the priorities instead of adequate funding. After weeks of dithering, hallmarked by hapless proposals of topless bar taxes ("Tits for Tots") and a very public House rejection (126-0) of Perry's own plan, the session faded into futility - and despite numerous rumors and threats, never convened again. Welcome back.

5) Still Re-Redistricting: Although we may think of this as last year's news, the federal court decision upholding the post-2002 congressional re-redistricting (the ultimate reason for TRMPAC, see above) only came down last Jan. 6. It seemed to dash the Democrats' last hope and cement the hold of the GOP on the U.S. House - until the U.S. Supremes kicked it back to the lower court with the message "You can do better than this." It's not at all clear what happens next - a new decision, a new opinion, or more dithering on all sides (we'd bet the latter). In any event, millions of Texas voters (especially minority voters) have been told, "Your votes are not needed - better luck next decade." The political and social aftereffects will roll on for years.

6) Chipping Away at CHIP: The 2003 Lege reregulated the children's health-insurance program, cutting back coverage, raising copayments, tightening registration, and generally making it more difficult for working parents to insure their kids. The result? Thus far, 150,000 more kids are doing without threatening their educations, crowding emergency rooms, and increasing the already too-large burdens on local taxpayers. Conservatives respond that more kids are being covered by Medicaid - only confirming that the bottom is falling out of the safety net, and programs designed to build community security are being steadily undercut, nationally and locally. All sides are promising a fix in the new year - but nobody is saying where the money will come from.

7) Children at Risk: While we were all watching children's health insurance plummet, even more vulnerable children filled the headlines with the consequences of the crisis at Child Protective Services - neglect, lack of oversight, beatings, deaths. Overloaded caseworkers threw up their hands, turnover became epidemic, and the governor insisted something must be done - we'll get new administrators, might even spend some more money. Since Adult Protective Services is in similar shape, and (by the way) the schools, CHIP, Medicaid, etc., etc., all need help - it looks like a Neverending Story .

8) Slashing State Employees: Although it's happening slowly and therefore largely beneath the radar, the Health and Human Services "reorganization," mandated under 2003's HB 2292, proceeds - and what is billed as "re-org" inevitably becomes "slashing jobs." Several thousand positions, many of them in Austin, are at risk, while state leaders simultaneously shed crocodile tears over the understaffing at CPS and related agencies. The job cuts are a double whammy, because not only do they diminish services to the most vulnerable, they create a whole new group of at-risk folks - newly laid off professionals cut loose in a still-weak economy.

9) Ballots? We Don't Need No Stinkin' Ballots!: Election challenges, even in close races, are rare, as most politicians are content to ask for a recount and abide by the results. Not Houston Republican Talmadge Heflin, nor his GOP colleagues, Karnes City's Eric Opiela and Austin's Jack Stick - each of whom decided the Texas House should determine whether the people's vote really counted. (At press time, Stick had withdrawn his challenge.) This is a very fine note on which to end a contentious election season, and to begin a legislative one. Then again, what would the Lege be without imperial egos, avaricious pols, and sore losers? The circus is back in town.

10) Rick & Kay & Carole & ...: The undeclared war for the next gubernatorial election - thus far an entirely Republican affair - features an incumbent fixated on tax cuts and poured concrete, a senator considered simultaneously more popular than the incumbent and too "moderate" for hardcore GOP voters, and a comptroller whose ability to ride the political waves rivals that of a porpoise. No one has established a definitive advantage, but the new year promises wrestling, posturing, and mud-throwing galore amongst Perry vs. Hutchison vs. Strayhorn. We can only hope the political maneuvering brings some policy windfalls to ordinary Texans.

earned his legal stripes as a go-to personal injury lawyer who wasn't afraid to take on large corporations. The jurist was a former county Democratic Party chair and former president of the Texas Trial Lawyers Association. A service honoring Kidd's life will be held at 2pm today (Thursday) at the First Baptist Church, 901 Trinity. - Amy Smith

- On Dec. 23, members of the Austin Conscientious Objectors to Military Taxation publicly redirected a portion of their federal income taxes to Casa Marianella and Posada Esperanza, shelters for immigrants and refugees. In a statement released in conjunction with their donation, ACOMT members said, "As war tax resisters, we knowingly challenge federal law by redirecting our income taxes. At this time, most ACOMT members are experiencing collections efforts by the IRS, including bank account and wage seizures. However, when we compare our risks with those of Casa residents whose arduous journeys to the U.S. often have involved huge costs, or if we compare our risks with those of a U.S. soldier or Iraqi civilian, we are humbled." The resisters said they offer their donations publicly in order to "openly state our decision to channel our resources away from war and military occupation and toward the fulfillment of human needs." - In a two-sentence letter dated Dec. 20, Austin Community Access **Television** Executive Director John Villareal resigned effective immediately, saying only that he is "unable to perform his duties." Rondella Hawkins of the city's Office of Telecommunications and Regulatory Affairs told us she has no other information about the resignation as of yet, but that the ACTV board had appointed Pat O'Neil as acting director. City Auditor Steve Morgan said that his office began an investigation of ACTV financial matters "several weeks ago," but that he can't release any information about the investigation at this time. "We do an investigation when there is a possibility that a potentially illegal or unethical act has occurred, in order to determine whether it has occurred." In a press release, the ACTV Producers Advisory Committee said they had been told that Villareal had been suspended without pay just before the board learned of his resignation, but otherwise were given no further info. "I hope that the circumstances surrounding John Villareal will swiftly see the light of day," said Stefan Wray, chair of the Producers Advisory Committee. The board is scheduled to meet Jan. 11, with plans to discuss agreements worked out among board members, producers, and staff over the last several months, addressing pending ACTV restructuring proposals.
- The heavy-hitter law firm, Loeffler Tuggey Pauerstein Rosenthal LLP, home to many a state Republican pol, announced Tuesday that "Rebecca A. Klein" has been named managing partner of the firm's Austin office, aka "The Loeffler Group," the firm's government affairs practice. Name sound almost familiar? It should - until Nov. 5, she was "Becky Armendariz Klein" ("But it's 'Rebecca' on the ballot!"), GOP candidate opposing U.S. Rep. Lloyd Doggett in the newly drawn CD 25. Before that, at the Public Utility Commission, she was just plain Becky Klein, but her maiden name was brought out of mothballs to run in the majority Hispanic Austin-to-McAllen "fajita" district. Somehow we suspect we haven't seen the last of "Armendariz!" - M.K.
- Semi-Austinite actress Sandra Bullock has donated \$1 million to the Red Cross to help with tsunami relief efforts in Asia. That equaled an amazing one-thirty-fifth of the total aid promised by the Bush administration until it was shamed into upping its pledge substantially.

# Beyond City Limits

- Speaking of that TRMPAC investigation: How much ethics is enough? That was the question before the U.S. House Republican Caucus, which late last year voted to revoke its decadelong rule that a member must step down from a leadership position if under felony indictment - explicitly to protect Majority Leader Tom DeLay from possible indictment by a Travis Co. grand jury in the TRMPAC investigation. The bad PR from that vote caused grumbling in the caucus, and on Tuesday the leadership backed down, maintaining that rule and another against bringing discredit on the House. However, they did alter the rules of the House ethics ("Standards and Conduct") committee to require a majority vote for an investigation, effectively handing a veto to either party, and it is likely Republicans will replace Colorado Rep. Joel Hefley, seen as too independent after he concurred with last year's three admonitions of DeLay.
- Convicted former state prison head James "Andy" Collins is asking a judge to waive a court requirement that he earn court permission

before traveling out of state, the Associated Press reported on Dec. 31. Collins and co-defendant Yank Barry were convicted in 2001 on charges of bribery, fraud, money laundering, and conspiracy in connection with a multimillion dollar kickback scheme to distribute Canada-based VitaPro soy-based food products in Texas prisons. In 1995, when the scheme was introduced, Collins was serving as head of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and Barry was president of VitaPro Foods Inc.; Collins was found guilty of accepting bribes to push through a \$33.7 million contract for the soy food products, which were supposed to feed Texas inmates. A federal judge has yet to impose a sentence for either man and has not yet ruled on their 2002 request for a new trial. Collins has received approval for out-of-state trips, but complains that the process takes too long - his job as a software company consultant "requires freedom to make business trips on one or two days' notice, particularly because his employers anticipate enhanced marketing efforts in 2005," according to the AP. "This process has hampered me from being able to discharge my duties effectively," Collins wrote to his attorney. - Jordan Smith

- Calling itself a "mainstream" opposition group, a new political action committee has emerged to fight a proposed amendment to the state constitution banning same-sex marriage. Practice What You Preach seeks to call legislators' attention to the "real threats" to marriage in Texas - no-fault divorce laws and domestic violence, according to the group's president, Jason Stanford. "It is a bright and shining lie to say that HJR 6 would do anything to help marriage," he said of one of two House proposals that would add Texas to the list of states with constitutional bans on gay marriage. The new PAC plans a statewide campaign to fight the ban with grim statistics showing that traditional marriage faces a greater crisis, as evidenced by the state's 100,000 divorces and 900,000 victims of domestic violence reported each year. - In his 19th year-end report on the federal judiciary, U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice William Rehnquist tackled growing complaints of "judicial activism" and defended lifetime bench appointments. That constitutional measure "tries to insulate judges from the public pressures that may affect elected officials," he wrote, protecting "judicial independence not to benefit judges, but to promote the rule of law: judges are expected to administer the law fairly, without regard to public reaction." Rehnquist points out that some court decisions - like those affecting desegregation and voting rights - were roundly criticized at the time, yet were ultimately correct. Arguments regarding decisions and actions of federal jurists have "always been with us," Rehnquist wrote, but "have in the eyes of some taken a new turn in recent years." There have been bills requiring collection of information on individual judges, "suggestions to impeach federal judges who issue decisions regarded by some as out of the mainstream," and several bills that would limit federal jurisdiction in deciding challenges to certain government actions - notably, a measure by House Majority Leader Tom DeLay - all of which concern Rehnquist. "No doubt the federal Judiciary, including the Supreme Court, will continue to encounter challenges to its independence and authority because of dissatisfaction with particular decisions or the general direction of its jurisprudence," he wrote. "Let us hope that ... all of our courts will continue to command sufficient public respect to enable them to survive basic attacks on the judicial independence that has made our judicial system a model for much of the world." I.S.
- Weed Watch: In its biannual report on state court felony sentences, the U.S. Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Statistics reported that of the just over 1 million felony sentences handed down in 2002, more than 32% were for drug offenses: 12.1% for possession, 20.2% for trafficking, and 2% on marijuana-related charges. The BJS also reports that 17% of felons were sentenced for violent crimes, 31% for property crimes, and just over 3% for weapon-related offenses. Not surprisingly, 95% of charges were adjudicated through guilty pleas, including bargained cases. Nationally, of all felons convicted in state court in 2002, 60% were white, 37% were black and 3% were all other races. For the complete report, see www.ojp.usdoj.gov/bjs/abstract/fssc02.htm.



# **TOP 10 MEDIA STORIES**

1) **Statesman Numbers Do Lie:** As with 3) **F\*\*\* This:** In the wake of Janet Jackson's 2003's wannabee Barton Springs pollution series, the daily compiled dubious statistics and again manufactured a crisis that didn't actually exist. The paper's study of APD use-of-force incidents purportedly showed disproportionately greater levels of violence against minorities, but our study of their study showed that things just didn't add up - at least not to headline levels. (See also "Top 10 Law Enforcement Stories.")

2) Our Editor the Mayor: Forgetting ethics taught in high school journalism, Statesman Editorial Page Editor Arnold Garcia e-mailed golfing buddy Will Wynn, assuring the mayor he would "keep the lid" on a scoop and "shoot [him] a draft" of an editorial. Exposed by an open-records request, Editor Rich Oppel acknowledged to readers that the incident "reeked of editorial favoritism and a newspaper in cahoots with those in power."

exposing her breast during the Super Bowl, the FCC started handing out big fines for anything deemed remotely "indecent," prompting a wave of piety and fear among broadcasters. Corporate giants Clear Channel and Viacom announced zero-tolerance policies, which hit a new level of righteousness when Austin's Viacom-owned KEYE-TV fired sports anchor Robert Flores after he muttered the f-bomb on an outtake that accidentally aired at 5:30am.

4) Statesman's Ethics, Take 2: Just a few months after Statesman Editor Oppel, in the wake of Garcia's ethical boner, proclaimed, "We do not share news articles or editorials prior to publication," another staffer was caught in an overly cozy relationship with an official subject. This time it was veteran (and now retired) political reporter Dave McNeely, who allowed District Attorney Ronnie Earle's office to review five different drafts of a story on the district attorney's campaign-finance investigation.

5) Bad News Belo: The news just kept getting worse for Dallas-based Belo Corp. First there was the scandal about the cooked subscription books at flagship Dallas Morning News. Then it pulled out of its cable news partnerships. Next the axe fell on Texas Cable News. Now, from the Morning News to Austin's KVUE-TV, staffers are wondering, who's next?

6) The Beat Doesn't Go On: After a year battling Hot 93.3 for the hearts and minds of Austin's Usher and Eminem fans, KQBT-FM, "The Beat," once the city's hottest hip-hop station, ran up the white boxer shorts of surrender. Corporate parent Infinity wanted to create a slot for Howard Stern's show. Goodbye Beat; hello Howard. A few months later, in a fittingly ironic twist, Stern announced he was jumping to satellite radio.

7) Darn, Not More Homework: Declaring that local college students are "begging" for a more conservative paper, the former advertising director for The Daily Texan, Evelyn Gardner, launched The Austin Student, a new weekly targeting local campuses. A few weeks later the first editor was gone, and the new managing editor was UT campus rabble-rouser Brian Ferguson, who had unsuccessfully campaigned for the Texan's editor job in the spring.

8) **ACTV Blows Up:** The endgame maneuvers for the Austin Music Network (see "Top 10 Local Stories") ended up setting off a revolt among producers at Austin Community Television, after the access channel was tasked with babysitting AMN. As ACTV board members began to contemplate, unwisely and too publicly, fundamental changes to the nation's oldest access-TV operation, the channels' local stars - most notably the redoubtable Alex Jones - manufactured enough public outrage to, maybe, put the kibosh on such grand plans.

9) **Lefties Will Survive**: The Texas Observer and KOOP Radio celebrated 50- and 10year milestones, respectively, despite suffer-





#### A DOG LAW WITH TEETH

Before anyone starts growling, let's get one thing clear: The law the Travis Co. Commissioner's Court is drafting to address the issue of loose dogs in unincorporated parts of the county is not a "leash law." Rather, the kind of law the court wants to enact, largely in response to the December mauling of an 8year-old girl by a pack of loose dogs, is better described as a "containment" law. That is, the county needs a way to deal with dogs that menace the neighborhood when they roam around unsupervised, without cramping the lifestyle of responsible pet owners.

"We don't need to deal with people who are keeping their animals on their property," said Dorinda Pulliam, director of the Town Lake Animal Center, at a hearing the court held Tuesday. "But we do need to deal with people who aren't, and under the current laws we don't have a way to do that.'

Like most municipalities, the city of Austin has a leash law, which requires dogs to be confined or on a leash. The county has no such law; its only tool is a "dangerous dog" law that allows courts to force individual owners to keep specific dogs confined. But that law is as full of holes as a year-old chew toy. For one thing, Travis Co. has only 12 officially dangerous dogs i.e., the law is not being used. Also, it doesn't help the county deal with abandoned, ownerless dogs roaming in packs. And worse, a dog can't be ruled dangerous until after it has menaced a human - killing other animals doesn't count - and the human can't have "provoked" it, such as by trying to rescue poor Fluffy from its jaws during an attack.

'To think you're supposed to stand there and let your dog be killed is absurd," said Judy Grigsby. She was one of a group of neighbors from the Foothills of Barton Creek who testified that the current law had failed them. For years, they said, the neighborhood had been menaced by a lab-pit bull mix named Summer, who would run off its property to attack neighborhood dogs. Calling law enforcement was no help, she testified - the dog hadn't hurt a human, and it was always back on the owner's property when the officers showed up. Then, this past New Year's Eve, Summer killed Grigsby's miniature dachshund, and a few hours later attacked



another dog as it was being walked by its sitter. When the sitter tried to rescue the dog, she got bit in the face. While the human bite opens more possibilities for the neighbors to take action, Grigsby said they should have had other avenues before a person - and at least four dogs - were attacked. "We're tired of law enforcement agencies having no power to take action," she said.

While the commissioners agreed the current law was flawed, several pointed out the difficulty of writing a containment law appropriate for rural areas, where people often have large properties and no fences, and are used to letting their dogs roam around their land without incident. This sentiment was echoed by resident Gail Atwater, who said she had moved to the country for "personal freedom," and argued that the answer lies in enforcement, not more laws. "It's not a perfect world," she said. "We keep making laws and laws and laws, and it's still not perfect."

"What if we just substitute a good law for one that's not so good?" asked Judge Sam Biscoe. "We'd still have the same number."

That, Biscoe said, is the general plan. The court will finalize draft legislation on Jan. 18, which they will vote on after holding another public hearing in the following weeks.

# Wild Horses Into French Fries?

All righty Texans, prepare to get your dusters in a bundle. We all knew that the Bush administration, despite the photo-op Crawford "ranch," doesn't exactly champion federal protection for wildlife. But the mythological irony reached monumental proportions last month when the Cowboy President signed into law the federal appropriations bill that included a last-minute amendment ending three decades of protection for wild horses. That's right: not salamanders, not acres and acres of featureless Alaskan tundra, but wild freakin' horses. And we're not talking the kind of protection-gutting that simply opens habitat to drilling or development, and passes for innocuous to those who prefer not to look too hard. No, siree. Instead, the amendment (initially authored by Montana Republican Sen. Conrad Burns) opens the possibility, forbidden since 1971, that America's wild horses will be eaten. And eaten, most likely, by the French.

Most of the United States' 37,000 wild horses roam Bureau of Land Management land, which is also leased out to ranchers.

Because the horses compete with cattle for food and water, but do not vote or donate to political campaigns, every so often the BLM thins the horse herd. In previous years, that meant finding them adoptive homes, which had to meet certain criteria for the horses' care. But under the new language, anyone can buy the extra horses at auction, including meat producers who want to slaughter them for sale in European countries like Belgium and France, where folks think they taste good, and where their fat is considered an unparalleled medium in which to deep-fry potatoes.

Pass the Freedom Fries. In the meantime, horse advocates hope the publicity on the wild horses will help get some movement on a long-stalled bill like the American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act. The act would outlaw slaughter of both wild and domestic horses, the latter of which has been going on for years and, despite a legislative challenge last session and a pending federal court decision to shut down the slaughterhouses, occurs in exactly one state: Texas. Yee-haw.



# TOP 10 LAW ENFORCEMENT/ PUBLIC SAFETY STORIES

1) **Unequal Farce:** After a "comprehensive" analysis of police records, the Austin American-Statesman declared that Austin police have used force against minority residents at "significantly" higher rates than against whites. The findings "defied easy explanation," the paper reported - in part because the paper's methodology defied logical explanation. The Chronicle pointed this out a week later (and in so doing made our own stupid mistake - referring to stats of alleged worst cops as "mug shots"). The APD and the city grumbled and muttered but apologized, and the political reverberations continue.

2) Owens Shooting Unindictment: On Jan. 15, Travis Co. District Judge Brenda Kennedy tossed out the criminal indictment of APD Officer Scott Glasgow, who was brought up on negligence charges in connection with the 2003 on-duty shooting death of Jessie Lee Owens. In February, Knee handed Glasgow a 90-day disciplinary suspension for policy violations sustained in the wake of the shooting.

3) APD Don't 'Low No Music-Playing 'Round Here: In March, Sixth Street cops busted several members of the Los Angeles band Ozomatli after their SXSW showcase. According to the cops, the band disobeyed orders to take the beat back inside the Parish and one allegedly whacked a cop upside the head with a drum. Videos and other witnesses disagreed, and charges were eventually dropped.

4) (Fire)Fight for the Right: In May, city voters handed a victory to the Austin Association of Professional Firefighters with collective-bargaining rights in future labor negotiations with the city. The new negotiating scheme - which offers public access to the process – will be used in the next round of city negotiations, in 2005.

5) **Evidence, Schmevidence:** The midyear discovery by the Houston Police crime lab of hundreds of boxes of untested evidence resulted in numerous officials - including HPD Chief Harold Hurtt - calling for a moratorium on executions for Harris Co. defendants pending evidence review. Harris Co. District Attorney Chuck Rosenthal and Gov. Rick Perry insisted that the lab's ongoing problems couldn't possibly have thwarted justice for any of the condemned. In short, the Texas death machine didn't even stutter

6) Questioning the Reaper: While the state seemed reluctant - at best - to question the Texas death penalty, the U.S. Supreme Court intervened. Last month the Supremes heard the appeal of Thomas Miller-El on grounds of race-based jury selection, tossed the capital conviction of Delma Banks Jr. (prosecutorial misconduct), and returned the case of Robert Tennard (mitigating evidence). In December, the court agreed to hear the case of a Mexican national who says Texas violated international law. Nevertheless, the Texas death machine rolls on – at 23 for 2004, we're still No. 1 with a needle.

7) **Still Bleeding Bad:** In June, the city lost its bid to dismiss a whistle-blower suit brought by APD Detective Jeff White in connection with the infamous Mala Sangre drug trafficking case. During the two-year wrangling, all the city managed to accomplish was to damage its own case and disqualify its chief Mala Sangre lawyer, Lowell Denton. The road is now clear for a trial maybe in 2005.

8) There's a New Sheriff in Town: On Eday, Democrat Greg Hamilton beat out GOP opponent and APD Cmdr. Duane McNeill for Travis Co. Sheriff. Hamilton, who this week became the county's first African-American sheriff, gained early support from outgoing Sheriff Margo Frasier.

9) Officer Down: The APD lost four of its own last year - all in vehicle accidents. In April, Cadet Trina Kay Andretti was killed on her way home from the academy on Highway 183. In October, rookie Officer Amy Donovan was killed by the patrol car

driven by her partner pursuing a suspect. In December, Cmdr. Shauna Jacobson and her husband, retired Detective Malcolm "Kurt" Jacobson were killed when their motorcycle struck a guardrail on Highway 71 - toxicology results reported legal intoxication.

10) Troopergate: On Dec. 15, the Texas Department of Public Safety was slapped by a Travis Co. jury for rigging a 2001 promotional exam to promote a group of good ol' boys, for gender discrimination, and retaliation. The case was brought by 16 DPS lieutenants passed over despite strong written exams. The jury awarded two plaintiffs more than \$200,000 each on the gender discrimination and retaliation claims and awarded all 16 plaintiffs more than \$600,000.

# **TOP 10 DRUG-WAR STORIES**

1) Please Eat the Hemp, the Conclusion: The Hemp Industries Association won its fight against the feds' proposed new rule that would've made it illegal to sell foods containing hemp seed and oil. In February, the U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals sided with the HIA, and in late September the feds declined to appeal the case to the U.S. Supreme Court.

2) Pretty (and Stoned) as a Princess: In April, the Texas Department of Public Safety kicked off a statewide program designed to put an end to illegal drug use at "organized rave parties." The DPS campaign aimed to educate the public about the dangers of "club drugs" like Ecstasy, and issued a watch list of items commonly identified with ravers - like "colorful, beaded bracelets" and "princess" costumes.

3) Doctors Back Medi-Pot: During its annual state convention in May, the Texas Medical Association (the country's largest state medical association) unanimously adopted a new policy recommendation supporting the right of doctors and patients to discuss medi-pot as a viable treatment option, without fear of legal recrimination. TMA delegates also reaffirmed the association's call for further research on the use of medicinal pot.

4) So Does Kerry: Democratic Presidential nominee John Kerry scored an A- on the Marijuana Policy Project's medi-pot candidate scorecard by pledging to end DEA-led raids on medi-pot patients. In Oregon, Kerry said the feds should likely butt out of medi-pot matters, though he did not pledge support for the state's Proposition 33, expanding the state's medi-pot law. Both Kerry and Proposition 33 bagged out on Eday, while the medi-pot fight slogs forward. 5) **Istook Mistook:** In June, a federal judge struck down the Istook Amendment, which would deny fed dollars to any transit authority that accepts advertising advocating medipot, marijuana legalization, or dope decriminalization. The court said that the amendment violated congressional spending power and constitutionally protected free speech.

6) Medi-Pot's Supreme Test: California medi-pot patients Angel Raich and Diane Monson went to the U.S. Supreme Court to

argue that the feds should stay out of intrastate use of medicinal marijuana. The feds say medi-pot inevitably affects the black market in illegal drugs; Raich and Monson say their use is noneconomic and wholly contained within state borders. A decision is expected this spring.

7) Don't Study the Hemp: In December the DEA denied a proposal by University of Massachusetts researchers to grow pot for research, effectively extending the bureaucratic blockade that has kept research that could result in the drug's reclassification under federal law and enable doctors to prescribe pot. Horror of horrors, how would the drug companies ever make money off the weed?

8) Sensenbrenner's Minimum of Good Sense: Despite growing opposition to federal mandatory-minimum sentencing, U.S. Rep. James Sensenbrenner, R-Wisconsin, offered a bill to lengthen and strengthen man-min sentences. Under a fuzzy bunny title ("Defending America's Most Vulnerable: Safe Access to Drug Treatment and Child Protection Act of 2004"), Sensenbrenner wants a 10-year minimum for anyone convicted of selling or conspiring to sell any amount of pot to a minor. Keep your fingers crossed - at press time, the bill still hadn't made any headway.

9) John Ashcroft, Ghostwriter: Outgoing Attorney General John Ashcroft also entered the man-min fray, with an AstroTurf campaign using the Justice Department to churn out prewritten op-ed pieces supporting man-mins but bearing the signatures of local U.S. attorneys. Unfortunately for Ashcroft, his dishonest scheme was outed in August by the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers and Families Against Mandatory Minimums.

10) Medi-pot for Texas?: In December, officials with Texans for Medical Marijuana announced that Austin State Rep. Elliott Naishtat had agreed to author the state's first medi-pot bill. The annual Texas Poll showed overwhelming support - whether that'll be enough to push the bill through remains to be seen.



To get the giant corporation to choose Austin, state and local officials approached it in the professional manner that corporations now expect: by frantically hurling huge sackfulls of taxpayers' money at them, desperately hoping that our sacks are fuller than those being hurled by other cities. In this case, our sacks contained more than \$30 million, and - lucky us! - Home Depot grabbed them.

Our public officials are high-fiving each other and peacocking around over this deal, bragging that they're delivering 500 jobs to We the People, averaging \$58,000 a year in pay! Actually, though, you wouldn't get one paying 58K. That average includes the salaries, bonuses, and such of those up in the new data center's executive suite. Averages, you see, are tricksters - if you are paid \$20,000 for example, and the top dog gets \$200,000, you're averaging \$110,000 each.

Home Depot's package includes nearly \$6 million in a special tax break from the Austin school district. Yes, that means that \$6 million that should go to the education of schoolkids will not, for district officials have given this corporation an exemption from paying its school taxes. Yet, the Austin school board is trying to pull a fast one on us by asserting that the state reimburses school districts for any revenue they lose when they dole out tax breaks to corporations. As one board member put it: "There is no cost to the

Earth to school board: The Austin taxpayer is also a state taxpayer! The tax giveaway to Home Depot still comes from our pockets, and it's still \$6 million that could have been added to education ... but now won't be.

Home Depot is a superrich corporation. Why shouldn't it pay its taxes, like our homegrown businesses do?

# RIDING WITH SANCHO PANZA

The late Jacques Derrida made a good living and confused multitudes by inventing an abstruse vocabulary that pretended to discover what actually is an ancient concept: paradox. Derrida's "deconstruction" philosophy was ably summarized in The New York Times by Edward Rothstein: "Any attempt to explain or reason or demonstrate or communicate already contains the seeds of its undoing; any statement must conjure up its opposite. Pay close attention and it becomes clear how much energy is being expended on pretending to make clear what really cannot be. Look even more closely and there is always a small point in the text ... that when properly probed can undermine the pretense, pull aside the curtain of ideology and show what indeterminacy and uncertainty lie beneath the surface." This is old news to Buddhists and Taoists, as it would have been to Shakespeare and many another great writer, chief among them: Miguel de Cervantes.

This month celebrates the 400th anniversary of Cervantes' Don Quixote, the first great novel of Western literature and the most prophetic, in which deconstruction, postmodernism, and "literary theory" wind up bumping into one another and falling

From the first page, you can't be sure what book you're really reading, what the name of its protagonist may be, nor exactly where he's from. (Quotes are from Samuel Putnam's translation.) Cervantes begins, "In a village of La Mancha, the name of which I have no desire to recall." It would have been easy to name a village, or invent a name, to assume the literary illusion of certainty, but Cervantes is setting off on a journey into "the midst of all this hubbub and labyrinthine chaos" of daily life, where certainty is both impossible and beside the point. His Don Quixote comes both from La Mancha and nowhere. Cervantes quickly reveals that he's not even writing this book, not really; he claims he's translating from an account in Arabic by "Cid Hamete Benegli." So his is a kind of mirror image of a book. As for the name of his central character, Cervantes says that others "will try to tell you that his surname was Quijada or Quesada ... but according to the most likely conjectures we are to understand that it was really Quejana. But all this means very little so far as our story is concerned, providing that in the telling of it we do not depart one iota from the truth." But what truth? He tells us the most likely name is Quejana, but insists on using Quixote. And doesn't say why. A mere two paragraphs have gone by and already we're in a hall of mirrors.

Volume one presents Don Quixote (or whatever his name is), the Knight of the Mournful Countenance, a humble squire of the then-advanced age of 50-ish. The man has read so many books of knightly romance that he's obsessed with the notion of embarking on a knightly quest, though the era of knights (real or imagined) is centuries past. Ah, but a knight must quest under the banner of the chaste honor of a great lady. There are none about, so Don Quixote invents one: Dulcinea del Toboso! "And so he went on, stringing together absurdities." He will defend her honor in many a comic scrap, but he never claims

that she really exists, saying, "God knows whether or not there is a Dulcinea in this world. ... I contemplate her as she needs must be." And, "I am content to imagine that what I say is so and that she is neither more nor less than I picture her and would have her be." And: "I have never in all the days of my life laid eyes on the peerless Dulcinea. ... God knows whether or not there is a Dulcinea in this world or if she is a fanciful creation. This is not one of those cases where you can prove a thing conclusively." But the risks he takes are real (in the context of the story, of course); he will risk his life again and again for an ideal that he has pictured as a woman. If Dulcinea were "real" in any way, then Don Quixote is merely a madman, and not a very bright one, for his antics would in no way impress a great lady. But if she does not exist and he knows she does not exist - as Cervantes makes clear - then Don Quixote is a poet-in-action and a sacred clown, imparting mysterious gifts, not the least of which is the gift of laughter.

"Now," Cervantes writes, "everything that this adventurer of ours thought, saw, or imagined seemed to him to be directly out of one of the storybooks he had read, and so, when he caught sight of the inn, it at once became a castle." If he kept his fantasies to himself he would be harmless, but he treats the innkeeper like a duke, insists the serving girls are wronged ladies, tries to right their wrongs (which don't exist), and, in the process, causes great chaos, mayhem, and comedy. Never does he fight anyone who's actually a bad guy, never does he right a grievous wrong in the real world (of the novel) - never, in fact, does he do anything but cause all in his vicinity a lot of hassles and laughter. He hardly ever wins a fight, always getting bested by unworthy beings (windmills, sheep, escaped convicts, drunks), and always blaming his defeats on magicians who have changed real giants into fake windmills. But it is he who is the true magician – for wherever he goes, and as long he stays, life is livelier.

What is real is his courage and his goodness, his incorruptibility and his honesty. And, too, his intellect: "Have I not told you that I mean to imitate [the fictional knight] Amadis by playing the part of a desperate and raving madman?" "While the truth may run thin, it never breaks." "Where the truth is, there is God." "Fortune always leaves a door open in adversity as a means of remedying it." "What one door closes another opens."

And what of Sancho Panza, Don Quixote's loyal squire, equaled for comic wisdom only by Shakespeare's Falstaff and Fool? Sancho knows from the git-go that Don Quixote is trouble, but he doesn't care because Don Quixote is also a lot of fun. To Sancho, who "doubts everything and believes everything," fun counts. Together they endure the funniest vomiting and bowel movement scenes in literature, and many a misadventure. Says Sancho, "It's a fine thing to go along waiting for what will happen next. ... Nothing in life is certain.'

Though Spain's intellectuals disparaged Don Quixote as pop drivel, people loved it, millions read it. (Mostly in pirated edi-




tions. In spite of his success, Cervantes lived and died poor.) Then one Alonso Fernández de Avellaneda wrote a spurious sequel in 1614. Infuriated, Cervantes wrote volume two in 1615. Now a hall of mirrors becomes a labyrinth of mirrors.

Both volume one and Avellaneda's imitation function as characters in Cervantes' Don Quixote volume two. Our knight and Sancho set out on another quest, and everyone they meet has read either volume one or Avellaneda or both - thus Don Quixote is the first "media hero," and he meets his reflection in others wherever he goes. He must insist on his reality in the face of their images of him - though his reality is also a dream. Prescient Cervantes anticipated the existential dilemmas of the 20th and 21st centuries - in 1615. (So much for the "modern" in "postmodern.") Our knight even goes into a bookstore in Barcelona where both previous books are for sale, infuriated that the "real" book and the "unreal" book are given equal value. And Sancho answers a question about their recent adventures, "That happened only six or eight days ago so it's not in the story yet."

Given the level of un-education in this country, I'm confident most Ph.D.s out there haven't read Don Quixote, so I won't reveal how he meets his end. Best you make that journey for yourselves. Suffice it to say that Dostoyevsky (another who would yawn at Derrida's supposed innovations) called Don Quixote "the saddest of all books." Also the funniest. And that is paradox. (Kierkegaard would and did chime in: "A philosopher without paradox is like a lover without passion - a foolish fellow.") Don Quixote said of the human enterprise: "Even though everything should go contrary to what I expect, the honor of having undertaken such an exploit is such as no malice could dim."

Ah, students, do not stand on politeness, but when you meet a Literary Theorist make swiftly for the nearest exit before he/she ruins your love of reading. You know or at least suspect that you're living in a capital-T Trap. Measure a work of literature by one question: Does the book give you a key to unlock the Trap? Or the means to make or steal the key? A nail file, even? A ruse to con the guards? Does it do anything to get you out of the Trap? Or is it just a way of passing your time within the Trap?

As Don Quixote says to a gaggle of his tormentors, "I know who I am, and who I may be, if I choose."



# **NEVER SAY DIE!**

AUSTIN'S ARTS SCENE PLAYS 'THE COMEBACK KID' IN 2004

At the end of the second act, things don't usually look too good for the traditional dramatic hero. That's the point when he routinely suffers a reversal of fortune or encounters a new obstacle that makes it even tougher to reach whatever goal he's been chasing since act one. And that's pretty much where the Austin arts scene was at the end of 2003. Beaten down by the economic tempests of the previous few years, it had seen ambitious cultural construction projects delayed or abandoned; artistic companies and organizations cancel projects, fire staff, and even fold their tents; city arts funds diminish by dangerous levels; and the process for distributing those funds fall into disrepair.

Still, the curtain hadn't fallen on this drama, and 2004 saw the third act open with the cultural community picking itself up off the mat. All through the year, arts organizations kept fighting their way back toward that dream of a new city, culturally revamped, envisioned in the late Nineties. The Long Center, forced to scale back its grand vision of a four-theatre performing-arts complex into one with two venues, unveiled a new design from local heroes TeamHaas and renewed its push to build it. By year's end, the center still hadn't broken ground, but it had raised almost \$10 million in its comeback charge and had new blood - director Cliff Redd, hired in July - at the helm. UT's Blanton Museum of Art, meanwhile, saw its new facility steadily taking shape at Speedway and MLK and moved within \$12 million of the \$87 million needed to complete the project. Over on Congress, another visual-arts institution, the statewide association Arthouse, announced a major step in its growth: establishment of the Texas Prize, a new biennial award for an artist living or working in the Lone Star State that comes with a cash prize of \$30,000. The city's arts-funding process, which all but imploded in recent years, received an initial overhaul, led by new Cultural Arts Program Manager Vincent Kitch. For the first summer in ages, the cries of unfairness and conflict of interest accompanying the annual process were muted. In the end, the effectiveness of the reforms was muddied by the new funding formula's application to the still badly depleted pot of bed tax money, which left many arts groups facing funding cuts upward of 45% and prompted City Council to intervene with an alternative funding scheme. But Kitch is back at the drawing board, working with local artists and administrators to refine the reforms. Then there was Tapestry Dance Company, which faced a financial crisis nearly as life-threatening to its season as the health crisis to Artistic Director Acia Gray the year before. Showing a fierce resolve to survive, the troupe raised \$30,000 in just over two weeks, and the show did go on.

Granted there were undeniable losses during 2004 - the most heartbreaking of which was easily the murder of UT piano professor Danielle Martin by a student and friend with mental problems - but in large measure the spirit of the year was "never say die," with the Austin arts scene in the role of comeback kid. Whether the drama of "the kid" will end in triumph or tragedy is still in question and may take a few more years to play out. But you can be sure that whatever happens, he'll keep swinging, and the artists and companies of this city will continue to produce memorable creative works. The lists in the following pages are testament to that.

# **TOP 10 PERFORMANCES** THAT TRANSPORTED ME IN 2004

1) Where Nothing Falls II (Blue Lapis Light) Sally Jacques took her 2003 exploration of grief and comfort to a new site and a new level, the vastness of the Domain complex warehouse giving the work a monumental scale that inspired awe. Watching the dancers run, glide, and swing among a forest of towering pillars on a broad concrete plain heightened our sense of human isolation and fragility, and as the beauty of the visuals grew more epic and emotion of the score more sweeping, with the performers' courage never yielding, it tore our hearts.

2) Hamlet (Ballet Austin) In the inspired hands of BA Artistic Director Stephen Mills, the Bard's melancholy Dane became a fierce man of action, his forceful movements revealing his torment and rage for revenge. Desmond Richardson made a powerful prince, but across the cast, the dancers communicated the anguish of their characters in every impassioned gesture and step. Moving drama, in every sense of the words.

3) Midsummer Night's Renaissance (Conspirare) In a broiling June, no more divine haven from the heat could be found than Central Christian Church, cooled by the exquisite, tightly bound voices of this Austin ensemble at play in the fields of 16th-century choral music. My first Conspirare concert, definitely not my last.



4) Omnium Gatherum (Zachary Scott Theatre Center) Through an elegant dinner party that gave way to a gripping confrontation with the legacy of 9/11, director Dave Steakley and a sharp, committed cast gave us the end of the world as we knew it – and the year's most visceral. stimulating experience in the theatre.

5) Death of a Cat (Salvage Vanguard Theater) Death and laughter walked hand in hand down the dark halls of this new American Gothic by Austin's C. Denby Swanson, realized in deliciously creepy fashion by one of SVT's finest creative teams, notably actors Jeffery Mills and Jenny Larson as hysterically furious feuding twins.

6) Tina Marsh and Eddy Hobizal, Umlauf Sculpture Garden (Creative Opportunity Orchestra) Summer twilight, the open air, and the extraordinary voice of one of our most gifted, innovative vocalists. Abetted by jazz



standards with such tenderness and ferocious passion, it made our ears weep.

7) The Philomel Project: we are all transformed to birds (Refraction Arts Project)/ Metamorphoses (Mary Moody Northen Theatre, St. Edward's University) Myths for moderns - two shows that revived ancient Greek tales of supernatural transformation for contemporary souls. At MMNT, director Christina Moore and company presented Mary Zimmerman's much-lauded setting of Ovid in a swimming pool with simplicity, understated feeling, and, yes, fluidity, letting the tales' timeless resonance wash over us. Refraction's all-female ensemble, led by Julia Smith and Sonnet Blanton, took a bolder tack, getting in your face with ribald jokes, sexy dance moves, and wrenching confrontations that punched home the power of Philomel's story now. Bravely performed and terrifically engaging.

8) Ann Hampton Callaway (Austin Cabaret Theatre) Romance, romance, distilled into one gorgeous, impossibly supple voice. For her long-awaited return to town, this diva of the cabaret delivered a deeply intimate affair, rich with three-minute songs of love that she infused with the emotional complexity and heft of three-act plays.

9) The Drawer Boy/Blue Surge (Hyde Park Theatre) HPT Artistic Director Ken Webster scored big with these two small comic dramas about tangled relationships that never quite go where the people in them want. Despite the study in contrasts storywise – urban Surge concerned the blossoming romance between a Chicago vice detective and a massage parlor worker; rural Drawer followed a young actor's intrusion into the lives of two Canadian bachelor farmers - Webster found common ground in their wit, smarts, and rich characters, coaching splendid performances from all his actors, but especially Michael Stuart in a career turn as Drawer's Angus, the genial farmer with no short-term memory.

10) In the Pocket (Tapestry Dance Company) A jazzy, joyful comeback from death's door for both the multiform troupe (financially) and Artistic Director Acia Gray (physically), with every syncopated step, stamp, caper, and spin showing how happy these dancers were to be alive. As were we.





- 6) David Stahl in Nightswim (State Theater Company) Stahl's precision and strength of heart were profoundly honest and tear-jerking.
- 7) Lee Eddy in Ladee Leroy (Mary Moody Northen Theatre) It's easy to steal the stage with only one person up there, but Eddy did it by being bold, funny, and surprisingly sweet.
- 8) Joni Jones/Iya Omi Osun Olomo in sista docta Jones was scathingly candid, elegant and imposing, and hauntingly accurate.
- 9) Jill Blackwood in Cabaret (Zachary Scott Theatre Center) Blackwood's posturing and vibrant voice impeccably captured Fraulein Kost, delivering one of the best performances I've seen of an easily misinterpreted character.





1) Jenifer Thyssen (Le Muse Giocose) continues to offer glimpses of what the good life must have been like in Medieval and Renaissance times - if you were lucky enough to have such an engaging chanteuse in your midst.



- 2) Conspirare, the stand-out vocal group, continues to achieve crystal clarity in song; its Midsummer Night's Renaissance concert was yet another example of the group's amazing sound.
- 3) Peter Bay (Austin Symphony) showed up all over the place this year: conducting for the ballet, the Lyric Opera, and numerous chamber groups as well as the symphony. 


# THE YEAR IN BOOKS, 2004 BY SHAWN BADGLEY




1. Cloud Atlas by David Mitchell (Random House, \$14.95, paper): "Spent the fortnight gone in the music room, reworking my year's fragments into a 'sextet for overlapping soloists': piano, clarinet, 'cello, flute, oboe, and violin, each in its own language of key, scale, and color," writes the troubled young composer Robert Frobisher in an Oct. 21, 1931, letter to friend and former lover Rufus Sixsmith. He is describing his Cloud Atlas Sextet, which he goes on to call "lifetime's music, arriving all at once. ... I don't know where it came from. ... Will never write anything one-hundredth as good," and, through him. Mitchell is describing this churning, challenging novel, the third of his three (Ghostwritten, number9dream) to be nominated for a Booker. The author's strings and wind here are any author's - his characters, his characters' encounters - and beside Frobisher's epistolary sets are notary Adam Ewing's journal entries from a late-1840s Pacific voyage; a meta-noir concerning the exploits of Luisa Rey, a reporter uncovering an American enviro-crime scandal in the Seventies; the aging, very unlucky publisher who receives that manuscript in London; the transcribed interrogation of an insurgent "fabricant" in a 22nd-century Korean "corpocracy"; and a campfire-side chat with one Zachry the Cowardy about getting by Hawaiian-style after the apocalypse. How they buzz and clatter across time is a thing of alloyed beauty, chaos theory, and a comet-shaped birthmark. Mitchell is experimenting here - the subject, as it turns out, is everything - and Cloud Atlas is a centrifuge of identity, destiny, belief, despair, race, sex, memory, love, and hate. Like Davies or Lessing or Pynchon (each a notable influence), he's not writing because he has to write. He's writing because he has to know. Few hear a higher calling, and far fewer translate with such grace.







2001, "is an invigorating obstacle course for the eyes. It's a workout for the reader's mind, too, as the artist has ditched his recent straightforward narrative style to return to the more complex architecture of his days as an underground car-




toonist. Of course, it's not that Spiegelman was bored with comix-as-usual; it's that he was - and still is - jarred by his WTC experience; and the overlapping narratives, the fractured panel layouts and stylistic contrasts ... work to similarly jar the reader. They also jar the deep history of New York newspaper comics: Characters from the past are mixed into the artist's response, as if they - Happy Hooligan, Ignatz Mouse, the Katzenjammer Kids, and others - had to deal with the towers crashing into their reality."

10. Dancing on Main Street by Lorenzo Thomas (Coffee House Press, \$15, paper): "Lorenzo Thomas of Houston is a thinking-man's writer," asserted our Dave Oliphant in December. "Laced with unusual metaphors ('Mocking as a sunrise/To insomniacs'), jazzy language ('It's tough being enough'), and witty love talk ('Still/If we have nothing left/But carnal beauty//Well, I can live with that'), Thomas'

book is more than the sum of its varied parts, since individual poems rise above even the best of his jivey, swinging pieces. ... Thomas' poetry brims with 'dangerous' thoughts, expressed in phrases and images that are his alone."







# **VIRGINIA B. WOOD'S BEST BITES OF 2004**

- 1) Lemon Curd: My friend Suzann Dvorken gave antique apothecary jars of this rich, tangy spread for Christmas gifts, and I was lucky enough to get some. I've been spreading in on toasted scones every day.
- 2) Dolce al Formaggio Che Crollare: a creamy, elegant lemon dessert that was the crowning glory of my visits to TinTinNio.
- 3) Upside Down Apple Pie: Crisp apples under a buttery caramel crust make up this signature dessert from the McCormick & Schmick's chain. It's topped with a huge scoop of Amy's cinnamon ice cream when they serve it here – an Austintatious match.
- 4) Peach Gelato: Matt Lee of Teo's whipped up my favorite summer flavor to complement my birthday feast.
- 5) 365 Natural Italian Sodas: Tangerine and Lemon flavors helped chill out the summer, and the Cranberry added some sparkle to the holidays. Splendid refreshers from Whole Foods.
- 6) Bat Creek Farm Apple Cider: Fresh pressed cider was the highlight of a fall visit to the Downtown Farmers'
- 7) SXUL Chocolate: Rick Bristow's voluptuous goldflecked bonbons are truly divine.
- 8) Kakawa Pure Whole Bean Chocolates: Tom Pedersen roasts the finest cocoa beans, then dips them in chocolate and rolls them in cocoa - chocolate candy at its most basic and distinctive.
- 9) Pure Simple Shortbreads: Vespaio pastry chef Barrie Cullinan's crisp, buttery shortbreads were my cookie addiction this year in plain, dark chocolate, spice, and cherry almond.
- 10) Mary Lou Butters' Brownies: Mary Lou makes many different flavor combinations, each one more decadent than the last. Bring on plenty of good coffee or cold milk.

- 1) Dinner at the Roger Mollett benefit: Everything from Amuse Bouche's appetizers and Salad Lyonnaise, Larry Perdido's Bouillabaisse, assorted pâtés from Le Marseillais and the marvelous stinky cheeses chosen by Ike Johnson, an exquisite salmon fillet with Dupuy lentils prepared by Aquarelle, to the creme caramel from Marta's Desserts and petite sweets from the Texas Culinary Academy came together to make a truly remarkable meal and an unforgettable evening.
- 2) My birthday feast at El Meson: We braved the summer heat and devoured huitlacoche quesadillas and unique rellenos. Que magnifico!
- 3) Panisse With Smoked Salmon, Capers, and Anchovy Mayonnaise: My visit to Cafe Caprice was very early in the year, but the taste memory of the delicate fried batons of chick-pea flour, the cool salmon, and tangy mayo still lingers.
- 4) Crawfish Pie: This delicacy from Cajun Creative Specialty Foods in Jennings, La., offers rich crawfish étouffée in an incredibly flaky crust - mighty good
- 5) Saffron Risotto With Petit Veal Osso Buco: A sprinkling of orange zest was the perfect grace note in this deeply satisfying dish at TinTinNio.
- 6) Sauces at TinTinNio: Whether it was the mustard cream sauce with the mussels, the marinara served alongside the fried artichokes and risotto balls, or the elegant brandy and peppercorn reduction that bathes the veal ravioli, the sauces here are very impressive.
- 7) Wagyu steaks: Luxuriously marbled and packed with flavor - really excellent beef - available at Henry's Butcher Block and the Westlake Farmers Market.
- 8) SpiceBurst flavored salts: The garlic is great on grilled meats, the chipotle salt adds zing to corn on the

cob, and the orange variety enhances steamed, sautéed, or roasted veggies. Look for them at Grapevine Market.

- 9) Deviled eggs with smoke-dried tomatoes: Chronicle contributor MM Pack whipped up a batch of these for a wine dinner at Spicewood Vineyards, and they disappeared in a flash. (I'm keeping my fingers crossed that the Boggy Creek Farm tomato crop makes it this year, because my stash of smoke-dried tomatoes is officially gone now.)
- 10) Gulf Shrimp and Rio Star Grapefruit Salad With Avocado Sauce: Joy Peppers (www.joypeppers.com) were the secret ingredient in the sauce that made this salad such a hit at the same wine dinner.

### MICK VANN'S TOP 10 CAMPUS-AREA EATERIES

My day job is at the university, in the School of Biological Sciences, and during the past 11 years I've become intimately familiar with every eating venue anywhere close to campus. I've developed a short list of my favorites over time, and because I trust you with this valuable information, I now divulge:

- 1) Madam Mam's Noodles and More (2514 Guadalupe, 472-8306): Truth be told, I eat here about 90% of the time. At Mam's, you'll find the most authentic Thai food that I've eaten outside of Thailand. They present a widely varied menu of dishes made from fresh ingredients, in big portions, at very reasonable prices. I spend most mornings trying to decide what I'll order that day. Excellent!
- 2) Kismet Cafe (411 W. 24th, 236-1811): Kismet offers a somewhat limited menu of authentic Middle Eastern cuisine, heavy on the pita wraps and salads. It's all great, and you have to try really hard to spend more than 10 bucks. Greek salad with chicken, hummus, chicken schwarma, falafel: yummm.
- 3) Burger Tex II (2912 Guadalupe, 477-8433): Sometimes nothing but a burger will do, and this Koreanrun spot has the best. Exceptional burgers, bulgogi burgers, and tempura onion rings. An added plus, you get to dress them just the way you like from the toppings bar.
- 4) Veggie Heaven (1914-A Guadalupe, 457-1013): You'll be packed in like a sardine, but the large menu of vegetarian and vegan offerings is a delight. Authentic Chinese flavors, low prices, and nice portions. I generally dislike veggie options, but these folks yield assertive tastes.
- 5) Oma's Kitchen (Dobie Mall, 472-8018): For Korean diversions, Oma's is the real deal. Mother and daughter cook up a storm at this small street-vendor-style paradise in the food court of Dobie Mall. Stick to the Asian dishes and you can't go wrong.
- 6) **Hoover's Cooking** (2002 Manor Rd., 479-5006): When you need some Southern soul food comfort, Hoover's is just a short jaunt down Manor Road. Plate lunches to die for, and it's easy on the budget for big portions of satisfying goodness. Top it off with a slab of cobbler and try to resist the nap
- 7) Niki's Pizza (Dobie Mall, 474-1876): Most Austinites don't even know this bona fide New York-style pizza joint is here, but they have dynamite thin crust slices and whole pies that are just as good as those from the Big Apple. The eye candy is a plus.
- 8) Sampaio's (2809 San Jacinto, 469-9988): Brazilian hits the spot when you're in a quandary for something a little different. Genuine flavors from Rio and Salvador gimme those cheese bolinhos, the moqueca, and a steaming platter of feijoada. We love those crazy siganos Brasilenos!
- 9) Yen Ching (2910 Guadalupe, 472-4754): My favorite comfort Chinese dish is ma po dofu, loosely translated as "Mrs. Po's Pocked Bean Curd." It's really Szechuan-style spicy bean curd with pork in hot bean paste, and these continued on p.38





10) John Mueller's B-B-Q (1917 Manor Rd., 236-0283): When you have a hankering for a slab of smoked ribs, Mueller's is the place. The sides are a tad pedestrian, but the barbecued meats hit the spot. You may have to fight your way through the business lunch crowd to get in, and you'd best go early.

### **CLAUDIA ALARCÓN'S TOP 10 GASTRONOMIC DISCOVERIES** AND DELIGHTS

1) Uchi: I've tried so many outstanding dishes at Uchi that I can't mention just one. Every single time I eat there, chef Tyson Cole wows me with something exquisite, unique, or completely new to me. His understanding of food is tremendous, and every combination he dreams up is a winner. I love adventurous dining, and, in my opinion, this is the best place for it in Austin.

2) Le Marseillaise: Some of the best reasons to visit the Westlake Farmers Market are the fabulous pâtés, vinaigrettes, tapenades, and other French culinary specialties from chefs Eric and Martine Pellegrin. Not only am I addicted to these products, but their "supper club" was one of the finest dining experiences I have ever had. I can't wait until they open a permanent location.

3) Batabing Martini at the Stephen F. Austin bar: My vote in the Official Drink of Austin contest went to this inventive and tasty cocktail made using local products. Straight-up, ice-cold Tito's vodka with a dash of Sgt. Pepper's Chipotle del Sol hot sauce and a touch of tequila, served with a side of spicy sangrita made with other local ingredients, including a splash of Live Oak Pilz beer. Lively and zesty, like our city!

4) Antipasto case at Vespaio: While this is nothing new, one of my favorite things to do in Austin is sit at Vespaio's bar in the early evening to munch on the wonders from the antipasto case while





drinking a glass of wine. I love the roasted tomatoes and goat cheese, and this summer the fresh Texas melon slices with paper-thin prosciutto and a glass of prosecco was my favorite combination.

5) Brazilian fruits: I certainly traveled for food in 2004, and while my gastronomic discoveries in Brazil were many, it was the flavors of the unique fruits of the state of Bahia that captured the essence of my trip. I sampled ice creams and cocktails made from tropical treasures such as caju, cajá, jaca, cupuaçu, jenipapo, and mangaba. Send some to Austin, please. I need a fix.

6) Roy's anniversary party: This unique event, complete with Hawaiian dancers, great wines, and sublime food, exceeded all of my expectations. Each of the five courses served was created by a different chef, including Roy's founder Roy Yamaguchi,

Roy's of Austin chef Bill Treviño, and guest chefs Tyson Cole and David Apthorpe, and each shone in its own right.

7) Meats from Cooper's Meat Market: I tasted two fabulous custom-cooked meats from Cooper's Meat Market in 2004. First, during the Hill Country Wine & Food Festival, the roasted whole suckling pig was a showstopper: falling-apart tender, almost sweet, unbelievably delicious. Then, for Thanksgiving, the smoked turkey was absolutely the best ever. Kudos to Lee and her crew!

8) Patricia Quintana's Izote: OK, now I am bragging. But dining at Patricia Quintana's Izote restaurant in Mexico City was the highlight of my trip back home last fall. From the tequila shots served in an icecoated glass to the miniature shrimp sopes, the exquisite squash blossom broth, and the fish in huitlacoche cream, every dish was superbly executed and elegantly served.

9) SXUL Chocolate: I got some of these luscious, rich, and decadent local handmade chocolates as a wedding gift and found that they are the ultimate treat for the chocoholic: a dark chocolate shell filled with double-chocolate ganache that melts in your mouth. The extra endorphins don't hurt, either. Almost too good to be true.

10) Dim sum at Marco Polo: If it's Sunday and there's no football to watch, I can be found at Marco Polo having dim sum with friends. We love the fried eggplant with shrimp, the pork and leek pan-fried dumplings, the shrimp toast, and those awesome crispy pork ribs. We chase them down with a cold Tsing Tao or a cup of hot chrysanthemum tea.

### MM PACK'S 10 BEST **AUSTIN FOOD EVENTS**

1) The Saveur Texas Hill Country Wine & Food Festival is the third-largest food and wine festival in the U.S. Held every April in Austin, it is a four-day gastronomic blowout, with a focus on the local bounty of Central Texas. 2005 will be its 20th year.

2) The Green Corn Project, whose mission is to educate and assist Central Texans in growing organic home food gardens, holds a fundraiser every October at Boggy Creek Farm. The celebration embodies the Project's motto, "Cook globally, grow locally," with cooking demos by local chefs and terrific tastes prepared by premier Austin restaurants and caterers.

3) The Austin Chronicle Hot Sauce Festival has been the premier pepperfest in Central Texas for 14 years. Appropriately held in blistering August in Waterloo Park, it's an opportunity to hear local music, swill cold beer, and taste entries from very serious sauce makers, both commercial and amateur.

4) Spamarama, the biggest potted-pork party on the planet, is sponsored each spring by News 8 Austin in Waterloo Park. Where else can you enjoy green eggs and Spam, fried Spam, and Spam queso and chips? And don't forget the Spamalympics and Spam sculpture contest.

5) Thai Cultural Day, sponsored by the Thai Association of Central Texas, is held every spring at Fiesta Gardens. It opens with a Buddhist ceremony and features terrific vendor food, cooking and vegetable carving demos, Thai music, and dancing.

6) Each March, a signature piece of the Star of Texas Fair & Rodeo is the Cowboy Breakfast at Auditorium Shores. Beginning at 6am, they serve up cowboy coffee, sausage, doughnuts, pigs in a blanket, steak sandwiches, breakfast tacos, hot pancakes, flaky biscuits, and groovy gravy. Also, the newly annual Chuckwagon Cookoff features old-style trail wagons authentically restored or replicated, right down to the cookbox and dutch ovens. As part of the competition, wagon owners prepare trail food over open fires all day and serve up the delicious results to the hungry hordes.

7) The Philippine-Pacific Island Festival and Friendship Day, sponsored by the Austin Filipino-American Association, takes place in October at Fiesta Gardens. Free to the public, it showcases Philippine and Polynesian foods, music, dances, and crafts. Get your lumpia here, folks.

8) For the past seven Februarys, Project Transitions has held the Guess Who's Coming to Dinner? fundraiser. Volunteers host elaborately themed dinner parties around the city, ending with everyone converging for a champagne and dessert gala.

9) Each April, the Austin Museum of Art hosts La Dolce Vita on the grounds of Laguna Gloria, a hedonistic, gastronomic fundraiser with fabu food provided by Austin chefs and restaurants. Wine flows under the stars and twinkling lights, and Austin shows off its party clothes.

10) St. Elias Orthodox Church has hosted the Austin Mediterranean Festival for an amazing 72 years. Held each October on the church grounds near the Capitol, the two-day event features locally handmade Greek food and appetizers from around the Mediterranean. It's all accompanied by appropriate music and the requisite bellydancing. Opa!

### **RACHEL FEIT'S TOP 10 RESTAURANTS TO WHICH** TO TAKE A 4-YEAR-OLD

1) Central Market North (4001 N. Lamar): Still the undisputed best place in town to take your small children. Central Market absolutely buzzes with activity all days of the week. The cafeteria offers a wide variety of dishes guaranteed to please not just little palates. Great wines, live music, and one of Austin's loveliest outdoor porches make it easy for both you and your kids to relax, eat, and take in some music. Once the little ones are done, you can relax some more while they play with 50 of their new friends on the adjoining playground. Kids eat free on Tuesday nights.

2) Waterloo Ice House (6203 Capital of TX Hwy. N. or 1106 W. 38th): With a menu that kids love (hamburgers, french fries, chicken strips, quesadillas), occasional live music, and a casual, kid-friendly environment, Waterloo is quickly becoming a regular on our rotation list. The Waterloo on Loop 360 has a huge outdoor play-ground in a fenced yard. The one on 38th has arcade games (one from the prevideo era) that keep the kids entertained.

3) EZ's (3918 N. Lamar): They have all the things that little kids love, from hamburgers and fries to pizza and pasta to roasted chicken. The fast-paced, noisy environment guarantees that your child won't be too much of a menace when they use outside voices.

4) Marimont Cafeteria (623 W. 38th): Quick, cheap, and good. Kids will love being able to see it first, then pick out what they want at this Seventies-style cafeteria. The place is usually full of blue-hairs who will ooh and aah appropriately over your little angel.

5) Frank & Angie's Pizzeria (508 West Ave.): Almost all kids love pizza, and this is the quintessential crowded, noisy pizza joint that serves great New York-style pies. Don't forget to order a chocolate chip and dried cherry cannoli for dessert.

6) Austin Diner (5408 Burnet Rd.): Probably the best place in the city to enjoy an American-style breakfast. Fantastic pancakes, French toast, biscuits and gravy, and iced cinnamon rolls. They have a whole wall of toys to entertain kids during the meal. My son begs to go there for breakfast on weekends.

7) **Dim sum** (anywhere): This is a fun way to expose your kids to new flavors. They can choose little portions of what they want from the carts that go by. My son loves the sticky rice in a lotus leaf and the fried radish cake (smothered in sov sauce). The fortune cookie at the end is like a little present. Restaurants that serve good dim sum include T&S Seafood, Golden Bay, Tien Hong, and Marco Polo.

8) Hang Town Grill (701 Capital of TX Hwy. N.): Burgers, pizza, kids' combo meals, and blaring TVs make this a stellar restaurant for a family night out. Kids under 12 eat free on Monday nights.

9) Rudy's on Loop 360 (2451 Capital of TX Hwy. S.): Their huge, grass-covered back yard makes it easy to enjoy Rudy's killer chopped beef or smoked pork loin while the tots run around and play.

10) Upper Crust Bakery (4508 Burnet Rd.): OK, so this is specific to my 4-yearold. He's addicted to the UC's cinnamon rolls, as am I, and apparently so are plenty of other families. The place is packed with couples and their small children on weekend mornings. The staff is very patient with kids.







### WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM HIS FRIENDS

### CHILDREN'S AUTHOR TREVOR ROMAIN TRIES OUT DVD

If you're not a school-age kid, a member of Parent Council, or a regular reader of School Library Journal, the name Trevor Romain probably means nothing to you. Romain is the based-in-Austin brains behind Cliques, Phonies, and Other Baloney, True or False? Tests Stink!, and other motivational books, brimming with goofy gags and puns, for the primary grades.

If you are a school-age kid, a member of Parent Council, or a regular reader of

School Library Journal, the name HorseBack Salad probably means nothing to you. Former code monkeys who turned their severance pay from Sapient into a thriving animation business, HBS has inked videos for Patty Griffin ("Rain") and Riddlin' Kids ("I Feel Fine") and are the creators of Question Authority, a trivia game screened at the Alamo Drafthouse Village.

Combine the two, and you get three straight-to-market videos for the family: Bullies Are a Pain in the Brain, How to Do Homework Without Throwing Up, and What on Earth Do You Do When Someone Dies?

The videos' stars are Skye (voiced by Anna Reyes) and Jack (Eli Black, son of Chronicle Editor Louis Black), best friends and students at James Tovar Junior High - named for HBS co-founder Jimmy Tovar. Tovar and colleague Yehudi Mercado are among the animation team, a local who's-who that also includes Cinematexas alums Shea McFarland ("Cat Fight") and Max Porter

("Red Things"), Samantha Harte and Dominic Vitucci (co-instructors at the Center for Young Cinema), and Korey Coleman (film commentator and creator of Eddie the Albino Squirrel). In a playfully slapdash style, Jack and Skye contend with schoolyard toughs, geometry homework, and the loss of loved ones. A live-action Trevor Romain plays God around them, tossing out advice and scribbling helpful maxims ("Start with the hardest assign-ment!"

and "Keep a journal!") amid the scenery.

Didactic? Quite. But the series maintains Romain's cornball bonhomie - booger jokes being a hit with the 10and-under crowd – and the animators sneak little touches of offbeat visual humor here and there. The homework episode is particularly ambitious, following Jack and Skye on a jungle

adventure whose musical montage interlude (to Darin Murphy's "Finish Line") recalls the madcap heyday of "Scooby-Doo, Where Are You?"

Elsewhere, you'll hear Lisa Tingle and Donnell "Overlord" Robinson, and local producer Carl Thiel kicks in the peppy score. Additional voices are "The kids at the Dougherty Arts Center," and how cool is that?

DVD and VHS editions go on sale in stores March 8. Until then, they're available at Romain's Web site, www.trevorromain.com. – Marrit Ingman

Despite a forlorn fall. Austin racked up its second-best film year ever in 2004, and, cross your fingers, 2005 is starting off strong. The rest of Texas? That's a different story. The Texas Film Commission estimates \$209.9 million in combined budgets for film and television projects shot in the state in 2004, with three-guarters of that or \$151.2 million roosting here. In the past 10 years, Austin has raked in a cool \$787.4 million, half of which is believed to go directly into local coffers.

Is it any wonder that the 2005 mantra will be "incentives," as in what Louisiana and New Mexico have been offering of late to grab more big-budget flicks? Look for the Texas Legislature to make a resolution to consider a film incentive program that has been quietly formulated in recent months. "Everyone is poised and holding their breath," says Rick Ferguson, head of the Houston Film Commission, whose city came in second in 2004 with \$10.5 million in film projects. "Now that it's starting to affect Austin, the red light should be flashing.'

Austin's 2004 saviors continued to be the usual suspects: Richard Linklater with A Scanner Darkly and Robert Rodriguez with Sin City and The Adventures of Shark Boy and Lava Girl in 3-D. Add to that Mike Judge's still-untitled futuristic comedy, the University of Texas' Burnt Orange Productions with Dot, and the totally Texas tale Friday Night Lights, and what could have been a hangover year after bingeing on 2003's \$90 million The Alamo (and a total of \$192.8 million in Austin film projects that year) is instead a sober success. "If we'd had an Alamo, it would have been our biggest year ever," says Gary Bond of the Austin Film Office. "For the last five years, it's been all Austin. But I have a problem with beating our chests about it, because what's swung one way can swing again."

Austin will start 2005 with a full plate: This week sees the start of the spooky Revolver, starring Sarah Michelle Gellar, and the lowbudget Deadly Drug is already in place. When Sandra Bullock and friends arrive for Truman Capote biopic Every Word Is True in February, every nook and cranny of the Austin Film Society's Austin Studios will be occupied. Plus, the preguel to The Texas Chainsaw Massacre remake shot here in 2002 is lurking, and Tim McCanlies is talking about directing a followup to Secondhand Lions.

And don't count out the boob tube, particularly with The Real World bringing MTV back to town to relive its ill-fated Austin Stories days. Last year, two major pilots shot in Texas: Jack and Bobby in Austin and HUB in Dallas. The latter was renamed LAX, and both ended up moving to Los Angeles. It was a bigger blow to once-upon-a-time Texas film biz bad boy Big D, which saw a paltry \$5.1 million in 2004 film and TV bucks, putting it in fourth place in the state behind El Paso with its \$8.2 million.





# ANYBODY'S HOME?

THE TEXAS DOCUMENTARY TOUR: LIZ LAMBERT'S 'THE LAST DAYS OF THE SAN JOSÉ' BY ANNE S. LEWIS

In 1995, Liz Lambert bought South Congress' seamy, trashed-out San José Motel - where both the street trade and those permanently or temporarily down on their luck lived for \$225 a week (or \$30 a day) - with the intention of transforming the vintage 1936 Spanish Colonial-style tourist court with a checkered, if colorful, past into the chic SoCo destination spot it is today: the Hotel San José. Alas, the financing for what was eventually a \$3 million project took three years to come together and, in the interim, Lambert left her job as an attorney for the state attorney general's office to manage the motel's day-to-day, sitting behind the motel office window, renting its 25 rooms by the night, week, or month to those who lived in those increments. Collecting rent, listening to excuses and promises and simply observing, Lambert found herself increasingly stirred by the edgy existences of those who'd been living some kind of life at the motel long before she'd entered the picture. Through the lens of the camera that Lambert set next to her (at the time simply for purposes of documenting the motel life she was experiencing, only later deciding to turn it into a documentary), we step into the world of the motel before its transmogrification - right up to that moving day in 1998 when the old were packed up and moved out to make way for the motel's next incarnation – as a hotel.

So, in The Last Days of the San José, what we have at the skeletal level is a 90-minute long, Decameron-esque tale of the human underbelly of a real estate deal's unexpected detour, one that ultimately contributed hugely to the gentrification (the "SoCo"-ization, if you will) of South Congress. (Lambert notes that at the time the renovation finally began, the gentrification of the area was well under way, to the point that people were actually complaining that the motel was an eyesore.) On the surface, a seemingly straightforward tale, but oh, the wash of contradictory emotions this doc sets in play and the layers of knotty, unanswerable questions - moral, ethical, sociological - and city planning



pling with their forbidden love, she of upper-crust lineage, he, pierced, tattooed, and suicidal – and definitely not on her parents' short list.

Austin Chronicle: So, how did you segue from lawyer to hotelowner-with-a-design-dream to motel manager/landlord and onto documentary filmmaker?

Liz Lambert: I bought the San José because I was always interested in design and because I was tired of being a lawyer. When the financing for the renovation was delayed, I had to become a full-time motel manager and concentrate on finding money. I even audited a few classes in the business school. I certainly didn't go into this with the intention of making a documentary. I would tell people about the incredible things that were happening at the motel [while waiting for our financing to come through] and someone suggested I should write about it. Instead, I bought a camera, solely to document the experience, not to be making a film. It was only when I saw my friends' interest in the footage I showed them that I decided to make a documentary. I didn't know anything about using a camera, so I

issues it raises. All of which are subtly, and hence artfully, conveyed by Lambert in this really terrific film.

We watch Lambert confront the quotidian travails of providing a roof over the heads of her South Congress clientele: the filth, squalor, in-room campfires, crack pipes, cops, and the occasional bloody remains of a transient's brief residency. But the camera lingers on the more stable but still shaky existences of several longer-term occupants: the articulate, tell-it-like-it-is teen with dreams of law school, who works at the motel as a housekeeper in exchange for a few bucks and free rent for himself and Dad, who fell on hard times, and has not been much of a father for some time now; Gerry Van King, familiar to Austinites as the guy who plays R&B bass in front of Jazz on Sixth Street, who we see waiting for his big music-business break; the single mom with the acrylic nails who manages to hold things together for herself and her 16-year-old son; and the young renegade couple, grapmade some big mistakes - there's some great footage that's totally unsalvageable - and once during a really great scene, the camera battery died right in the middle. But my goal, once I'd decided to make the film, was to follow Frederick Wiseman's notion about making a movie where the place is the star and try to give a sense of some aspect of community life without simply following one person.

AC: The music is really outstanding in the film - you've got an original score by Stephen Barber, songs by k.d. lang, Lucinda Williams, music by the Tosca String Quartet, and Charlie Sexton, to drop just a few names. How did you pull all of that together?

LL: We went around and around about the music: We got the rights to the Dylan songs, Lucinda and k.d. gave me the rights to their songs, Sly Stone was easy. The Tosca Quartet girls came in and put down the strings, and Charlie Sexton came in and just played for a few hours, stuff he made up



on the spot. The original score by Stephen Barber made up probably half of the music, and it worked really well.

**AC**: And now for your thoughts on the big issue hovering over the film: the gentrification issue.

LL: I think that one of the most interesting things about the documentary is how the issue of gentrification plays. You see in the film that all of the residents of the motel - and there were some people who had lived there for years completely understood why I would want to shut the place down and renovate it. They didn't feel like I was the evil landowner throwing them out on the street; it was just that I was trying to make something better, to improve it – and, of course, I should seize that opportunity if I could. It made sense to them. People at the motel would talk to me about whether I was going to paint it (I was sad to lose the seafoam green, so I'm glad that it's preserved on the film), and where the pool should go, or whether or not to have HBO (decidedly yes). Austin Fontenaut had lived there for eight years, and on closing day he brought me a cake that said, "To Liz, To the San José, To the Future." Henry Prince brought me flowers. On the other hand, people who knew nothing of the motel would talk to me about how I was displacing people and how horrible it was. Sort of the white, liberal knee-jerk reaction. But the truth is, that motel needed to be shut down. It was in horrible condition, held together with gum and duct tape. When I'd buy new sheets, they'd be stolen or burned or bled on. I tried to make sure that everyone had a place to go when we closed down.

I was really conflicted when we shut down, but it wasn't because I had thrown people out of their homes - I would venture to say that almost all of them moved on to better things - it was because a community had formed there, and those were the people I lived with day to day, and suddenly they were gone and I missed them and the funkiness and unpredictability of it all. But, at the same time, I had been working toward that day for years - and it was exciting, the beginning of a new project - and I wasn't going to have to snake drains or collect crack pipes anymore.

AC: And now you're opening a second motel in Marfa. Are there parallels between the SoCo Hotel San José and the Marfa project?

LL: First of all, I hate the term "SoCo," but, yes, there are similarities in the sense that I am working with the same design team and the lines are clean and it feels calm.

The Last Days of the San José screens as part of the Texas Documentary Tour on Wednesday, Jan. 12, 7pm, at the Alamo Drafthouse Downtown. Liz Lambert will conduct a Q&A after the screening. Tickets are \$4 for current Austin Film Society members and new members joining before the screening, as well as students, and \$6 for nonmembers. They are available through the Austin Film Society (www.austin ilm.org) or at the venue one hour prior to screening.

### 2004 ON THE FLOOR

Last year was an especially rough one for the local music scene. Here's one last spin through the headlines before whatever havoc 2005 wreaks.

- The Ozomatli (above) riot at SXSW embarrassed the city of Austin so much it not only dropped all charges against the L.A. Latino rockers, but practically adopted them, hosting two more shows last year and another this month.
- Joe's Generic Bar owner Joe Bates' still-unsolved October murder also sounded the death knell for live blues on Sixth Street.
- Suffocating heat at the ACL Music Festival didn't prevent crowds from smashing attendance records - or organizers from scheduling the 2005 edition for the exact same weekend.
- Local radio welcomed looser classic rock formats at 103.5 and 102.3FM, at the expense of live deejays. Two urban stations in Austin were one too many, and Beat 104.3 became the all-talk "Coyote."
- Punk mainstays **Ignorance Park** somehow managed to play more local gigs after two members were busted for trafficking marijuana in Missouri than before.

### **DO THEY KNOW IT'S WILLIE?**

Sunday's benefit at the Austin Music Hall for victims of the Southeast Asian tsunami sold out in six hours Tuesday reports its organizer, Texas Monthly senior editor and Wild Seeds head man Michael Hall. The lineup, Willie Nelson, Ray Price, Joe Ely, Alejandro Escovedo, Spoon, Bruce Robison & Kelly Willis, and Patty Griffin, has been well publicized, but the special guests have not "I'm certain Willie will have



guests," assures Hall. "He's calling Bill Clinton, so you never know. Maybe [Clinton] will get up there with his saxophone." - Alejandro Escovedo beat back his hepatitis C enough to play enthusiastically received sets at the Continental Club during SXSW, the Texas Union Theater in October, and November's Por Vida tribute at the Paramount.
- Thirty Three Degrees and Tower both shuttered, leaving Waterloo, Cheapo, Music Mania, and the new Sound on Sound as the chief non-big-box music stores in town. Downloaders hardly noticed.
- ☐ Though amended to the point of being completely ineffectual, the smoking ordinance refused to die, and still won't. If anti-tobacco forces can ban smoking in British pubs, they can certainly find a way to do it here.

### THE YEAR IN MUSIC 2004 BY RAOUL HERNANDEZ

- "Apeman Hop," the Ramones, Animal Boy

The two best box sets of 2004 were both Austin born, the Faces' Five Guys Walk Into a Bar and Albert Ayler, Holy Ghost. In the year rock & roll was clocked at 50 via Elvis Presley's "That's All Right Mama," having a perennially glowing rock (star) from the British Invasion Big Bang assemble the Faces' storied musical swagger from his home here in Austin only glorified our Holy Land. Ian McLagan's own local release, Rise & Shine!, was a pub on that same road to Damascus.

Music is religion, after all, primordial. It's existed since the first drumbeat, and in that sense, the first heartbeat. Feel that same pulse in the beautiof Austin's Eliza Gilkyson, from the retro metalisms of ATX's Young Heart Attack to Sweden's the Hellacopters, and not forgetting the Brooklyn/A-Town bridge between Antibalas' Afrofunky Who Is This America? and River City's Ocote Soul Sounds & Adrian Quesada, El Niño y el Sol, musically, Austin mirrored most trends. The split: Euro rock (Libertines, Franz Ferdinand, U2) vs. honky-tonk (Dale Watson, Kevin Fowler, Willie Nelson). Fittingly, both continents of origin devour the other's indigenous delights - just as Austin continues consuming West Texas root beer like Li'l Cap'n Travis.

Back to Austin we raced Labor Day Sunday morning, 2004, leaving Lubbock and Buddy Holly, Waylon Jennings, and Sonny Curtis for home - Tommy Hancock, Joe Ely, Monte Warden.



ful chaos of Holy Ghost, one of jazz's dead sea scrolls uncoded through the sponsorship of Dean Blackwood and Austin preservationists Revenant Records. "[John Coltrane] was the father. Pharoah [Sanders] was the son. I was the holy ghost." So pronounced Cleveland sax specter Ayler, his tiered analogy ready-made for Johnny, Dee Dee, and Joey Ramone.

On Sept. 15, 2004, when Johnny became the third and last of the Ramones' holy trinity to die in just over a three-year span, rock & roll lost another Beatle. Comeback of the young millennium, the Pixies are forever credited with paving the way for Nirvana, contextualized as the crossroads of pop and punk, yet one pogo through the Ramones' "She's the One" and the Beatles' "She Loves You" never sounded so punk. End of the Century and Ramones Raw, halves of the same cinematic whole, document the band's (un)happy family while further slivering the digital line between CD and VH1.

A political cartoon from the Ramones' unreissued Animal Boy (1986), "My Brain Is Hanging Upside Down (Bonzo Goes to Bitburg)," aimed at the second Reagan administration, is but one precedent for Green Day's '04 tour de force, American Idiot. From the socially lyric conscience of Berkeley's punk spawn to the protest songcraft We were "Wild-eyed and Wound Up," flooring car and stereo to the ramrod tune of the True Believers. Alejandro Escovedo's words rang out por vida, like the marching guitars of his and brothers Javier Escovedo's and Jon Dee Graham's:

Wild-eyed and wound up, looking for a way out, I need a rock jet to leave this town. Don't try and stop me, you better have an army. Can't you hear the drums a-beating like a big red sun?

Sometimes it seems your breaks keep breaking. And those who've got, they just keep taking. They'll try to tell you, you just can't win. Don't let 'em sway you, 'cause it's hard. It's hard.

It's hard losing Johnny Ramone. Harder still, perhaps, losing Austin's holy ghost jazz trumpet Martin Banks, and Red River free spirit Wade Longenberger. Losing elections is no picnic either. To the salvation of many, that primal beat, music's holy spirit, lives on in every Green Day, Eliza Gilkyson, and Albert Ayler fan modeling a Ramones T-shirt.

### **LEAD STORY**

Some well-off taxpayers in Washington, D.C., are picking up an easy \$30,000 or so from the U.S. Treasury, courtesy of a 1976 "historic preservation" tax-code deduction, according to a December Washington Post investigation. About 900 properties qualify, and owners get the deduction merely by forgoing the right to alter the building's facade (which D.C. law restricts, anyway). Giving up this "right" "earns" them an 11% tax deduction, and the average value of qualified buildings (according to the Post) is \$1 million (historic facades are not often found on downscale homes), meaning that a claimant in the middle tax bracket would get about \$30,000.

### **SCENES OF THE SURREAL**

1) In November, mind reader the Amazing Kreskin wrote to the acting governor of his home state of New Jersey that he wanted to help the state shed its image of unethical deals and thus volunteered to sit in government meetings and identify which officials are secretly up to no good. 2) Stephen J. (and was offered about \$800) (November).

inserting three rice-sized grains of 24-karat gold against patients' prostates. The pellets (cost: about \$300 each) graft permanently onto the gland and help doctors aim the radiation with more precision.

### **QUESTIONABLE JUDGMENTS**

Citing a police press release, the German news organization Deutsche Welle (DW-World) reported in November that the reason that motorist Julia Bauer of Bochum, Germany, lost control and smashed into a parked car and a lamppost was that she was preparing cereal and milk on the passenger seat while driving to work and tried to catch her bowl as it was falling to the floor. The cost of her breakfast (in damages) turned out to be about \$27,000.

### **CULTURAL DIVERSITY**

- · Sex-despondency among women is apparently such a problem in Japan that business is booming for counselor Kim Myong Gan's 4year-old company of trained male professionals who invigorate them, according to a November Agence France-Presse dispatch from Tokyo. Kim charges the equivalent of \$190 for the initial consultation and scheduling, and his men provide hands-on assurance to the clients of their attractiveness and desirability. Most clients are either middle-aged virgins or wives whose husbands have grown to treat them as
- Zimbabwe, facing a severe food shortage, is considering an unlikely program to bring rich foreign visitors to the country, according to a government announcement in November. The information minister proposed an "obesi-

ty tourism strategy," in which overweight visitors (especially Americans) would be encouraged to "vacation" in Zimbabwe and "provide labor for (government-confiscated) farms in the hope of shedding weight." Americans, the proposal noted, spend \$6 billion a year on "useless" dieting aids and could be encouraged to work off pounds and then flaunt "their slim bodies on a sun-downer cruise on the Zambezi (River)."

### LATEST RELIGIOUS MESSAGES

In November, a Hindu seer in India's Orissa state drew large crowds, inspired by his calmness in the face of his announced, spiritually induced death, which was to come before noon on Nov. 17. At noon, however, he was still alive, and, according to Asian Age newspaper, the crowd of 15,000 suddenly turned ugly, berating him for not dying, and police had to intervene. The man, who is chief cleric of Srignuru Ashram, told reporters, "I wanted to leave my mortal body, but I could not. Please forgive me."

### **PEOPLE WITH ISSUES**

Mr. Mount Lee Lacy, 21, was arrested for animal cruelty after his girlfriend's mother sent police to his apartment in Gainesville, Fla. Lacy's aggressive mastiff kept the officers at bay momentarily, but once inside, police noticed another dog, a Jack Russell terrier, that had a bloody paw, and eventually Lacy cheerfully told them that he routinely bit the dog. According to a police sergeant: "[Lacy] said that biting the dog was good punishment and that's how you train them, that dogs bite [and] so that's what they understand."

### **LEAST COMPETENT CRIMINALS**

Criminals who accidentally leave identification at the scene of the crime are (according to "News of the Weird") "no longer weird," but it was nevertheless remarkable that on the night of Nov. 4, in Rapid City, S.D., two burglary suspects, in separate incidents, left ID behind. Both of them, Daniel P. Ader, 25, and Brian W. Crawford, 26, had apparently removed their pants, for different reasons, leaving their wallets. (Evidence suggested that the reason Crawford had removed his pants, after breaking into a law office, was to photocopy his genitals on the office copy machine.)








Looking back at 2004, it was a crazy year with snow falling along the coast and pagan rock calendars being built in West Texas.

You had to be quick to ski the slopes of South Texas. The snowstorm on Christmas Eve dumped a record 13 inches in Brazoria County. The residents of Victoria who dreamed of a white Christmas woke up to 11 inches of the stuff. For much of the area it was the first measurable snow since 1895, but it didn't last long as temperatures during the day rose into the 40s.

Meteorologists like to say, "Climate is what you expect and weather is what you get." Whether or not there has been a change in the climate, it was an unusual year for weather in Texas. We saw fewer days than normal with the temperature above the century mark. Record amounts of rainfall across the state kept the rivers and creeks running.

The increase in mosquitoes need not be an image problem for Houston. A local marketing firm designed a campaign to promote the Bayou City as it is. "The flying cockroaches. The mosquitoes. The construction," reads the Web site (www.houstonitsworthit.com) and concludes that "it's worth it" in spite of the inconveniences. Houston got to show off its better side when the Super Bowl came to the new football stadium in February.

Odessa has suffered from an image problem for years, especially since the oil wells began to dry up. Now the University of Texas of the Permian Basin has installed a replica of Stonehenge on campus. The limestone astronomical calendar is the exact horizontal dimensions and is 70% of the height of the British original. On the university's Web site, a supporter of the project said, "The replica would be a classroom tool for teachers ... [and] give students the opportunity to see an extraordinary creation by an ancient culture."

The town of Golden, about 80 miles east of Dallas, didn't have any trouble with their image after Oprah Winfrey included the town's sweet potatoes on her "Best of Everything" list. The town of 150 hosts the Golden Sweet Potato Festival every October.

The World Birding Center at Bentsen-Rio Grande Valley State Park opened in October outside of Mission. A joint project of the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, the center is the headquarters for a 120-mile-long network of birding sites and wildlife management areas along the Rio Grande. Two major bird-migration routes funnel through the region, making it one of the top birding destinations in the U.S.

Also in October, the Museum of the Coastal Bend opened at Victoria College in Victoria. The museum is part of a collaborative effort to display



artifacts from Belle, a 17th-century ship belonging to French explorer Robert Cavelier, Sieur de La Salle, which was found at the bottom of Matagorda Bay in 1996. Eight museums around the bay and the Bob Bullock Museum in Austin tell different aspects of the story of the French occupation of Texas. For a complete list of participating museums, go to www.museumofthecoastalbend.org/lasalle.html.

Milestones reached this year include the Elite Circle Grille in Waco celebrating 85 years of serving Southern comfort food. Texas Highways magazine turned 30 years old this year. Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge, along the Rio Grande just south of the Alamo, entered its 60th year.

This year we lost "Sheriff" Marge Mueller, 69, the face of Luckenbach to many. Mueller served cold beer to a loyal clientele for nearly three decades. The Turkey Shop cafeteria off I-35 in Abbott, Willie Nelson's hometown, closed after more than 20 years of service. New owners say it will reopen, but no word on a schedule.

From the "Who left the gate unlocked?" department: According to the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, guitar thrasher and hunting activist Ted Nugent purchased a ranch northwest of Waco near Crawford. The Michigan native and President Bush neighbor says he plans to get a Texas driver's license and maybe even run for office in his adopted state. No word on when the Bushes will have him over for tea.

DiG!

D: Ondi Timoner. (NR, 115 min.)

It's 1995. Anton Newcombe, the brains and heart behind the band the Brian Jonestown Massacre, is unspooling a tape by his friends, fellow 1960s pop-rock revivalists the Dandy Warhols. "We're going to take over the world," he grins into the camera. For the next seven years, director Timoner followed both groups on this so-called revolution: from crash pads to signing parties; from video shoots to pot busts in Homer, Ga.; and from innocence to experience. It's a gripping journey, one that exposes the mercurial mercantilism of the music business and the perils of genius and egomania. When he's not snorting china white and pouring dishwashing liquid into his butt, Newcombe makes music at a

furious pace, releasing as many as three self-produced albums in a single year. He torments his bandmates just as frenziedly, literally brawling with them and firing them onstage. ("I don't do anything wrong," he tells sideman Matt Hollywood. "That's why I never say I'm sorry.") While BJM plays a 10-hour set at the Communist Party headquarters in Cleveland, Capitol Records signs the Dandys

and sinks \$400,000 into a video for their supposed hit single "Not If You Were the Last Junkie on Earth." And then the shit really hits the fan. Timoner follows the groups' divergent paths diligently but is clearly riveted by Newcombe, who seems to have dissociated himself from the production - along with perhaps everything else - after photography. (Courtney Taylor of the Dandys narrates.) Newcombe's downfall, so obviously engendered by his uncompromising approach to musical expression, is captured in painfully, horribly intimate detail. The film is so candid and real that it's like watching a friend slip into the morass of addiction, obsession, and pig-headed self-absorption. Unsurprisingly, it gets a little raw at times (watch for the boom

dipping into the shot), despite slick postproduction and savvy editing that set the film to the head-rush pace of "Every Day Should Be a Holiday." What's best is that even though the story is set among tragic hipsters - behold Joel Gion, BJM's mutton-chopped, photogenic tambourine man - its take on friendship and ambition is without irony. Taylor seems to like being filmed, but nobody's really posing here. There's a genuine sense of loss when dreams go unrealized, and in these moments DiG! transcends the typical "rock movie" format and aspires to something greater: an examination of why we create and what we receive from art. The film received the Documentary Grand Jury award at the 2004 Sundance Film Festival. (Tuesday-Thursday - Marrit Ingman only.)

### New Reviews

**RED LIGHTS** 

D: Cédric Kahn; with Jean-Pierre Darroussin, Carole Bouquet, Vincent Deniard. (NR, 105 min., subtitled)

Leave it to the French to fashion an anguished psychological thriller that, in its last moments, also turns out to be a tender love story. Based on a novel by crime writer Georges Simenon, Red Lights is an atmospheric study of a married French couple on a long drive to retrieve their children from summer camp. On the surface, everything seems fine, but it soon becomes clear that there are some hidden resentments festering. Just as the road before them becomes quickly snarled with weekend traffic and accident tie-ups, this marriage's clogged arteries have also reached an acute stage. Antoine (Darroussin) is an undistinguished accountant who feels less important than his wife, Hélène (Bouquet), a much-indemand corporate attorney. After sneaking a few whiskey shots before departing, and then again at his frequent rest stops along the way, the schluby Antoine grows more bellicose by the mile. He rails at his wife (unfairly, as far as we can tell) about her emasculation of him and his general feeling

of emotional derailment. We see the road from his point of view - a dreamy expanse of steady white lines or ubiquitous car bumpers. The mood and the visuals are slightly surreal, and for the first half of the movie it's hard to tell where this road is leading or whether anything of consequence will ever occur. At one rest stop, Antoine returns to the car to find a note from his disgusted wife saying that she would take the train instead and meet him at the summer camp. He races to catch the train to no avail, and retreats into another bar and picks up a hitchhiker (Deniard), who may or may not be the prison escapee for whom roadblocks have been erected on the highway. On a back road, Antoine and the hitchhiker get into a row when they stop to fix a flat tire: It might be the result of Antoine's drunken need to prove his manhood, and it's possible the whole incident might be imaginary. Nevertheless, Antoine wakes up the next morning beside his broken-down car and sets about the task of sobering up. In a small cafe Antoine enacts the movie's showpiece sequence, in which he dials a series of numbers with increasing franticness, trying to ascertain his wife's whereabouts. Character actor Darroussin (who is in virtually every scene) comes through brilliantly as the story's leading man, believably shifting from placid office drone to wounded maniac. Director and co-writer Kahn's music choices also provide an able assist, shifting back and forth between the dreamy Debussy selections on the soundtrack and the increasingly boisterous rock riffs in the bars. Kahn creates a mood that calls to mind the thrillers of Hitchcock and Chabrol, the French roadways of Godard's Weekend and Denis' Friday Night, the surreality of Lynch's Lost Highway or Sluizer's The Vanishing (his first version, not the remake). The slowness of the film's first half will be off-putting to many, but the film's turns and final twist will reward the patient. - Marjorie Baumgarten ★★★ Arbor

### **WHITE NOISE**

D: Geoffrey Sax; with Michael Keaton, Deborah Kara Unger, Ian McNeice, Chandra West, Sarah Strange, Nicholas Elia, Keegan Connor Tracy, Amber Rothwell. (PG-13, 101 min.)

There's not much more to this poorly scripted thriller than exactly one well-done shock moment and Michael Keaton's eyebrows, but, to be fair, Keaton's brows have carried three Tim Burton films nearly on their own, so don't let this dissuade you from seeing the film. It's much ado about nothing, actually, or very little: that being the oftdebunked psychic friends rigmarole known in the spook hunting biz as EVP, or Electronic Voice Phenomenon, the pseudo-science of recording the voices or images of the dead on electronic equipment. This is what global-

ism has done to the mediums: Once content to envisage the Virgin Mary on a tortilla, they now have to hang around the local Circuit City and hope Sony slashes the prices on their ectoplasma televisions before they can get in touch with Auntie Mame to discover that she never really loved them after all. That's progress. Keaton plays architect Jonathan Rivers, who lives with his novelist wife, Anna (West), in the sort of neo-Soviet concrete-and-steel monstrosity that passes for hip in certain architectural circles these days. On the same day that his wife joyfully announces there may be a child on the way, she goes missing and stays missing for some six months. In the interim, Jonathan is approached out of the blue and led into the black by portly EVP fan Raymond Price (McNeice), who has been receiving Anna's monosyllabic messages from beyond both the grave and the pale. As it turns out, Anna is indeed dead, and thus her grieving husband immediately makes that dread, pricey journey to Circuit City and refashions his rumpus room to resemble something akin to the Lone Gunmen's X-Files hideaway: He wants to grieve. There, with the assistance of EVP booster and recent widow Sarah Tate (Unger), he struggles to comprehend why his dead wife is telling him to go to places he's never heard of and if, perhaps, a high-definition set might have been a better choice for the money. White Noise has an interesting premise and one that would have worked had someone other than Niall Johnson penned the script, but that's not the case. The film moves from romantic, Ghostlike ennui to overt Scooby-Dooisms about midway through, right about the time three shadowy figures begin stalking Jonathan for no apparent reason whatsoever. (If there's one thing you'd think we'd have learned from the Mystery Inc. gang, it's that meddling isn't for amateurs.) Despite the frequent and inexplicable plot errors that riddle this film like the holes in Charlie Brown's Halloween costume, the film has a certain creepy flair,

thanks in large part to cinematographer Chris Seager, who's clearly been studying the urban anti-flair found in the recent wave of technology-oriented Asian horror films like Byeong-ki Ahn's Phone and the videocentric horrors of Hideo Nakata's Ringu series. That beauty is only skin-deep, however, and snazzy cinematography aside, White Noise is little more than a droning nonsensical buzz that makes even less sense at its end than it does at its beginning. ### ANDREW LLOYD WEBBER'S THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA

D: Joel Schumacher; with Gerard Butler, Emmy Rossum, Patrick Wilson, Miranda Richardson, Minnie Driver, Simon

Webber's plodding stage musical comes to the big screen, its relentlessly bombastic score intact with a vengeance. Given the polarizing effect of Webber's work, it is unlikely that the film adaptation will affect any existing opinions about the artistic merits of *The Phantom of the Opera*. It must be said, however, that the screen version is an improvement over the stage production, largely because the grandiose emotions of the latter are now on a more human scale, thanks to the power of the close-up. As far as production values go, it looks like a hundred million bucks: Cinematographer John Mathieson (along with Schumacher, a so-so director with a good eye) gives the movie a bold, painterly look that is often ethereal in its beauty. But then again, there's that infernal music to bring you down to earth and below. Even Rossum's excellent performance can't salvage the film from Webber's influence. (12/24/04) Steve Davis

### THE AVIATOR

D: Martin Scorsese; with Leonardo DiCaprio, Cate Blanchett, John C. Reilly, Kate Beckinsale, Alec Baldwin, Alan Alda, Ian Holm. (PG-13, 166 min.)

Scorsese's exhilarating rocket of a biopic focuses not on the decline of Howard Hughes (although the twitches and tics that finally brought him fully into the grip of lunacy escalate throughout), but on the man's rise and eventual plateau, his loves won, lost, and discarded, and the indomitable blue-steel drive that made Hughes Aircraft the flawed juggernaut that it was. The film has the glossy look and dynamic feel of one of Hughes' hyper-aerodynamic aviation

prototypes. When Scorsese opens up and fires on all cylinders, *The Aviator* captures the seat-of-your-pants thrills of a true pioneer. DiCaprio is clearly at the top of his game as Hughes. John Logan's script makes much of Hughes' mother's-milk fixation, but the pop psychology takes a backseat to Hughes' far more palatable will to power. This isn't Scorsese's best work, but it's a clear return to form after the last decade's occasionally self-indulgent stumbles. The Aviator is bravura, classic Hollywood filmmaking.

### **BEYOND THE SEA**

D: Kevin Spacey; with Spacey, Kate Bosworth, John Goodman, Bob Hoskins, Brenda Blethyn, Greta Scacchi, Caroline Aaron, Peter Cincotti, William Ullrich. (PG-13, 121 min.)

This movie based on the meteoric life of pop singer Bobby Darin is a Kevin Spacey rush: Not only does Spacey star in, direct, and write this show-biz biopic, he also does all his own singing (an impeccable Darin impersonation) and dancing (game but kind of stiff). This near-total Spaceyness is both the movie's strength and weakness. At first, when Spacey as Darin is singing and swinging, Beyond the Sea is vibrant and razor-sharp. However, the mimicry phenomenon soon becomes worn and repetitive. That's because the film's narrative flashback structure is unnecessarily convoluted and unwisely selective. Furthermore, the movie's strategy of having the childhood Darin appear in the flesh and talk to the adult Darin as he hits narrative road bumps in the telling of his life story in the film within the film is awkward and annoying. Beyond the Sea is much more "Splish" than "Splash." – Marjorie Baumgarten

### **BIRTH**

It's a spooky movie without anything really scary in it, a ghost story without any spirits, a romance that displays scant affection, a reincarnation tale that never uses that particular word nor engages in anything terribly transcendental. Despite what seems like the best intentions, Jonathan Glazer's Birth has gone awry. His film feels enervated and lifeless, as though fearful to push too hard in any one direction and, as a result, shortchanging all the film's rich possibilities. Granted, Birth's storyline about a woman's young husband dying suddenly and reappearing years later in the body of a 10-year-old boy is touchy material. It's a credit to Kidman's skill that there is nothing salacious or indecent about her scenes with the child. The movie never creatively engages the metaphysical questions the story inherently raises Perhaps Birth needed a little longer to gestate. - Marjorie Baumgarten



There are many reasons to dislike this third and hopefully final entry in the Marvel Comics-adapted series about Wesley Snipes' high tech vampire slayer, but of all the missteps made and absurdities offered, the most glaring is the casting of what appears to be a steroidal Eurotrash pimp as no less than Dracula (Purcell). With his chiseled jaw, wide-set eyes, and prominent brow, Purcell is hopelessly miscast, exuding none of the iconic fear and loathing the prime exsanguinator should. When Blade (Snipes) finds himself framed by his nemeses for offing innocent humans, the fearless vampire killer is drawn into an elaborate plot mainlined by indie film icon Parker Posey. Director Goyer strips down this sequel to the bare bones as far as style and substance, resulting in a choppy mélange of straight-to-video editing and a surfeit of disintegration effects. 


### **FLIGHT OF THE PHOENIX**



### THE GRUDGE

### THE INCREDIBLES

#### OCEAN'S TWELVE

Let's be honest: With a cast like this, it doesn't matter too much what the characters are doing onscreen, or if it makes about as much sense as a monochrome rainbow. Soderbergh knows this, and it's to his credit that Ocean's Twelve's convoluted plotting makes as much sense as it does. Even more than in the original, Soderbergh here revels in the funky, retro-cool of both early Sixties' machismo mythologizing (as perfected by Frank, Dino, Sammy, and Peter) and Seventies-era societal and cinematic laissez-faire (no one's getting bent out of shape that they're forever on the wrong side of the law or that they may be dead in two week's time). Soderbergh's film is at least as much a movie lover's wet dream as anything Quentin Tarantino's done lately. It may be fluff, but it's some of the best fluff you're ever going to get. Chris Van Allsburg's magical tale of the Christmas Eve re-education of a Santa-doubting adolescent teetering on the brink of disbelief gets a multimilliondollar makeover via CGI and a revolutionary new filming process that allows Hanks to "act" five different roles. There's Christmas magic in Zemeckis' film, but there's also a bizarre, palpable sense of unease lurking just below the surface. Nearly all of that is due to the animation style, which faithfully replicates Van Allsburg's painterly compositions, but doesn't translate all that successfully to the screen. If the human characters give you the willies, they're nothing compared to Santa's elfin minions (believe me, the word fits), who, with their big ears and pug faces, look like micronaut Bowery Boys on a snowblowing bender. William Broyles' script is faithful to the spirit of the original 30-page text while adding various hair-raising events at every turn, but Zemeckis and DreamWorks

The same can't be said for *Ray*, the movie of his life, although the transcendent performance of Jamie Foxx as Ray Charles kicks this otherwise ordinary biopic into the realm of the extraordinary. The movie follows a pedestrian biopic path, recounting the early struggles of the artist, his dual addictions to heroin and women, and his ultimate redemption and embrace as a beloved American icon. Despite the movie's 2½-hour running time, Ray concludes well before Charles' death this past summer, making it seem like the movie's almost fairy-tale episode of Charles kicking heroin is the real end of this story: It's the kind of rise, fall, and redemption pattern that has become familiar to any casual watcher of television's Behind the Music-type shows. #### **SHARK TALE**

There's a surprising lack of surprises in DreamWorks' answer to Disney/Pixar's runaway smash Finding Nemo. It's not that Shark Tale is a bad film - kids will bask in the underwater eye-candy colors – it's just that there's so little that feels fresh to adult eyes that it may as well have come out back in the ancient days of Toy Story. Shark Tale's problems stem from a dearth of fresh jokes and a corresponding surfeit of obvious ones. Much of the film's genuine humor, what there is of it, comes from the secondary characters, including Ziggy Marley and Doug E. Doug as Rastafarian fish Ernie and Bernie, a running gag on Michael Schultz's bicentennial classic *Car Wash* (now a whale wash), and some of the most bizarre product placement ever to (dis-)grace the screen, à la Kelpy Kreme and, yeesh, Old Navy. Who knows what might happen when men become uncorked? Sideways is a smart and delightful romantic comedy, yet in the course of creating his new charmer Alexander Payne has sheared off some of the rambunctious edges that made his previous films, About Schmidt, Election, and Citizen Ruth, such marvelous studies in social parody. Adapting from Rex Pickett's novel with his writing partner, Jim Taylor, Payne has created a sophisticated date movie about male midlife malcontents and the women who love them. And there is nothing wrong with *Sideways* that the inclusion of a few unimagined unpredictabilities wouldn't have improved. Sideways pleases but it does not surprise. The note-perfect ensemble cast is the key to Sideways' abiding charm, and it makes us recognize that Payne's work with actors may be his greatest talent. #### **SPANGLISH**

For an astute comic appreciation of the culture clashes among the Los Angeles minions, almost any movie would be better than this misguided effort from the usually dependable James L. Brooks This time out, the acclaimed writer-director of As Good as It Gets, Broadcast News, and Terms of Endearment loses his way and can't see the forest of L.A. through the individual trees of his characters – each of whom stops making sense early in the game. Additionally, the film's cryptic characters, mundane visual look, and minimal drama make the two-hour-plus running length of *Spanglish* seem positively brutal. It's unclear what Brooks is trying to say about our melting-pot culture, if anything. So much attention is put into scapegoating the lady of the house (Leoni) that it's hard to believe that Brooks is the same man who coaxed award-winning performances from a host of TV and film actresses. - Marjorie Baumgarten

Once again the title pretty much says it all.


There's nothing you wouldn't expect (with the possible exception of live-action Hasselhoff) and everything you would: pernicious meddling by next-door nemesis Squidward (Bumpass); musical hijinks at Goofy Goober's Ice Cream Party Boat; and little bits of wry wit (and a decent soundtrack, with Wilco, Ween, the Flaming Lips, and much more). Is it good? Is it bad? Does it matter either way? Parents, prepare to be steamrolled by the SpongeBob merchandising juggernaut. Movies like this defy comment. #### A VERY LONG ENGAGEMENT

Jeunet labored for years to bring this adaptation of Sébastien Japrisot's World War I novel to the screen, but only after the international success of his last film Amélie were the necessary doors flung open to him. Pity that: I wonder what kind of film A Very Long Engagement might have been had Jeunet tackled it on the heels of his deliciously macabre Nineties collaborations with Marc Caro. Instead, Jeunet has misguidedly carried over some of Amélie's sensibilities (its glibness, its manic pace) to A Very Long Engagement. He's also brought over that film's star, Audrey Tautou, she of the irresistibly impish grin. The scenes of warfare are realistically awful and bloodcaked, but the power of these scenes is besmirched by Jeunet's tendency toward ... cutesiness, frankly. The elements are all here for something spectacular - and in brilliant bursts, Jeunet really gets it - but in the end, all that potential is sunk by a terminally confused tone and milquetoast pairing of lovers. #### Consumer Scams – Just Hang Up!

I sometimes get phone calls or mail that say I've been chosen to win some cool prize, which I can claim if I send some money to the company running the contest. Are these ever legit?

Have you ever gotten a phone call from a company that you have never heard of telling you that you've been "selected" to win a sweepstakes and receive a boatload of money or some exotic trip? It seems strange as you don't remember submitting your name for a contest, but the idea of a big payout or sitting on a beach and sipping a fruity drink starts to cloud your reasoning. You start thinking maybe this could be for real. Maybe your luck has finally changed for the better? Guess what - nothing has changed, so hang up the phone and throw away the mail!

Here is how these scams often work: The "company" tells someone that they have won the lottery or sweepstakes, but in order to "collect" the prize, the person needs to pay some initial "fees" and "taxes." The fee may only be nominal, which can encourage people to give it a try (it's the "I'll pay \$20 if it means I could get \$1 million" logic). Predictably, once the money is sent, the company is never heard from again. The people running these scams can be so persuasive that even consumers who know better sometimes fall prey.

According to the Texas Attorney General's office, which receives complaints regarding consumer scams, phony lotteries and sweepstakes still defraud consumers all the time. In fact, the AG's office launched a new public-awareness campaign called "Just Hang Up" in order to reach more consumers who are in danger of falling for these types of scams.

The safest bet is to follow the AG's advice and ignore all of these offers. Be especially wary of anyone that says you need to send in money in order to receive your prize. Read next week's column to find out about other common consumer scams to avoid.



## Click and Clack Talk Cars car talk

#### **Dynamic Stability Control Is** Worth the Money

Dear Tom and Ray:

My husband and I recently moved from Connecticut to Colorado, and are considering buying a new car. We have a 2000 BMW 528i, which I have loved, but because we are now in a place with a lot more snow and in a county with a lot of dirt and gravel roads, it doesn't really fit our needs anymore. Neither of us wants a sport utility vehicle, but we have been considering the Subaru Outback Wagon. My question: The vehicle dynamics control is only available on the most expensive model. Is that system worth the extra cost? My husband is suspicious of any system that claims to take over for the driver - probably because when he was younger, he raced cars, and he likes to feel as if he always has control - but I will be the main driver of the car, and I'm a normal driver. Is it worth it? Thanks so much.

TOM: The short answer is yes. It is worth it. More and more studies are showing that dynamic stability control (often referred to by a confusing array of acronyms like VDC, DSC, ESP, MSPCA, etc.) does do a lot to help people avoid accidents.

RAY: Dynamic stability control is one of the newest electronic forms of skid control. These systems work by using sensors to detect signs of a skid and then limiting acceleration and applying the brakes on individual wheels to regain control of the car.

TOM: Why do you want to prevent a skid? Well, once you're skidding - once the tires are no longer in full contact with the road - it's very hard to control the car. You're much more likely to plow into something, be it another car, a tree, or a mango-smoothie stand by the side of the road.

RAY: These days, the three major anti-skid systems are: ABS, or antilock-brake systems, which help you avoid skidding when you're making an emergency stop; TCS, or traction control, which helps you avoid skids while you accelerate; and DSC (or whatever each manufacturer happens to call its version of dynamic stability control), which helps you avoid skids while you're moving and turning. DSC helps prevent you from losing control of the car when you take a corner too fast or swerve to avoid something. And it works.

TOM: So, if it's available - and sadly, Subaru only makes it available on the top-of-the-line Outback we'd recommend it.

RAY: Your husband - like most guys who take his position - is wrong. Sure, we all want to be "in control." But the fact is that microcomputers can handle certain tasks better than even the most skilled driver ever could. The computer that controls these systems can pulse an individual wheel's brake 10 or 15 times per second. A human driver could never do that.

TOM: Of course, most cars with stability control have a switch that allows you to turn it off. So, if your husband is determined to have control, he can turn off the system, make some high-speed swerves, and crash your new car into a chicken coop to prove our point.

RAY: But dynamic stability control is something we do recommend, when it's available. And we hope it will be available on more cars and SUVs as time goes by. (Ford just announced that it's putting it on all its SUVs in 2005, and Chevy is putting it on its full-size SUVs and vans.)

Q. Has it ever been proven that zinc lozenges cure a cold?

A. No. There is a good bit of evidence that they shorten the duration of a cold, on average by about half, but that is not quite the same thing as a cure. Also, some cold symptoms are relieved by zinc lozenges, but not all, so additional remedies are still beneficial.

There are many reasons why there is not yet a cold cure. One is that colds are a short-term problem, seldom lasting more than a week. They still create substantial economic loss, in terms of time lost from work or complications involving more serious viral infections. Because of the immense diversity of cold-causing viruses (almost 200 varieties of rhinovirus alone), the possibility of a cold vaccine can be ruled out.

A second reason is that it costs a lot of money to "prove" a medical treatment, more than a single individual could afford. The patent for using zinc as a cold remedy is owned by a Texan, George Eby, who observed that his daughter did not develop an impending cold after she fell asleep with a zinc tablet in her mouth because she was too young to swallow it. For more than 30 years he has investigated the ability of zinc to inactivate viruses and believes he knows how it works and why some clinical trials using zinc to stop a cold failed. However, to prove his theory would be very expensive, so he simply sells on the Internet what he has found to be the best antiviral form of zinc.

Although zinc is an important nutrient, with major influences on immune function, it stops replication of a cold virus in your nose the same way it does in a test tube, and in a way not too different than the way an antibiotic stops bacterial replication. Antibiotics keep bacteria from forming cell walls, and without a protective cell wall they are vulnerable to attack by our immune system. Zinc appears to prevent the virus from forming its protective wall, called a capsid, leaving the virus defenseless. Zinc-deficient individuals benefit from the zinc supplementation through the enhanced cellular immunity, but zinc lozenges seem to avert a cold even in those who are not zinc-deficient.

To explain why several clinical trials of zinc lozenges have not worked, Eby points out that zinc works only when it is in solution and at high concentrations. Zinc lozenges in a form that does not dissolve easily have no antiviral activity. It is also important to concentrate zinc in the mouth, nose, and throat. A lozenge that is dissolved in the mouth does this, while zinc in a pill that is swallowed distributes zinc throughout the body, diluting the effect in any one area. If you are threatened by a cold, it may be

necessary to choose between zinc lozenges and high-dose vitamin C supplements, another stillunproven nutritional therapy for colds. Some clinicians believe vitamin C may interfere with zinc's effectiveness, so don't consume citrus fruit or juices for 30 minutes before or after sucking on a zinc lozenge. Vitamin C and zinc are nutritionally essential for production of infection-fighting white cells, so you need both but not necessarily at the same time. Shortterm use of zinc lozenges appears to safe, but watch for mild nausea and discontinue if this becomes a problem.

There may not yet be a cure for a cold, but symptoms can be eased with plenty of water, hot soups, and lots of rest.

#### Don't Toss Extra Meds!

Got medications you don't need? Don't throw them away! They could make the difference between life and death for HIV-infected people in poorer countries.

Access to medications is one of the biggest problems facing HIVers in less-developed nations. Fortunately, several organizations will take unneeded pills and ship them to doctors and patients in places where treatment needs would otherwise go unmet.

The anti-HIV medications themselves are the most obviously needed, especially the newer drugs (e.g., Viread, Sustiva, Emtriva, etc.), although the older compounds are also widely used (e.g., AZT or Combivir, Crixivan, etc.).

Nor does the need stop there. Any prescription taken by a poz person is likely to be useful, even if it is not specifically to combat HIV, as the same problems plague AIDS patients regardless of geography. Antibiotics, pain meds, appetite boosters, and heart medications are commonly needed, too.

The key restriction is the expiration date: expired meds are not accepted. Patient names are removed, if still present, before shipping.

ASA sends collected medications to two organizations which seem particularly International AIDS Empowerment in El Paso (contact skiprosenthal@usa.com) and Aid for AIDS in NYC (contact aid4aids@aol.com). Both ship to Latin America and the Caribbean. (We feel these areas receive less attention than Africa. A complete list of organizations can be found at www.thebody.com.) Or, medications can be brought to ASA, 7215 Cameron, attn: Sandy Bartlett. ASA has shipping-paid arrangements with both groups.

Over time, HIV disease will almost always produce surplus pills, whether because the patient changed regimens or got extra doses; or sometimes the PWA has died. Don't just let those medications go to waste – let's put them to good use!


