The story of foot-and-mouth disease, the centuries' old plague affecting cloven-hoofed animals that has swept over the Old World time and again and caused havoc to the livestock industry of every country it touched, is told. The film documents foot-and-mouth disease from its earliest history to the outbreaks in the United States and Mexico. It shows what happened during the 1929 outbreak in California, and uses this occurrence to show how the disease can be controlled through quick action by local, State, and Federal agencies. A Mexican sequence brings the data on the disease up-to-date, and tells what the Mexican and United States Governments are doing cooperatively to combat it.
