Honors Day is observed annually as an occasion upon which the University of Illinois gives official public recognition to those students who excel in scholarship.

The University Senate, in establishing Honors Day, provided that "announcement shall be made of the names of undergraduate students who have distinguished themselves in scholarship during the two previous semesters; with the exception that in the case of freshmen the honors award is to be based upon the grades for one semester only."

A PRIVILEGE FOR HONOR STUDENTS

The original Senate action on Honors Day provides that "a student whose name is among the upper ten per cent of his class in his junior year shall be permitted so to adjust the studies of his senior year as to allow him freedom to put a considerable proportion of his time on some selected subject of study or investigation, under the supervision of the department concerned; provided that such arrangement shall not cause omission of prescribed subjects in set curricula except by special permission of the dean of his college. In lieu of a final examination the department may require such reports or theses as it deems suitable. The amount of approved work which may be thus taken during the senior year shall not exceed the equivalent of a total of ten semester hours if taken within one department, or of sixteen semester hours if in two departments. A student availing himself of the opportunity which this plan offers shall not register for more than a total of eighteen hours either semester of his senior year."

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GENERAL SENATE RULES FOR RECOGNITION OF HONORS STUDENTS

I. CLASS HONORS

Students in the upper ten per cent of each class within the several Schools and Colleges are awarded Class Honors and are entitled to have their names printed on the Convocation program in recognition of their high scholarship, provided that no student shall be included whose average is below B.

II. COLLEGE HONORS

Students in the upper three per cent of the sophomore, junior, and senior classes in the several Schools and Colleges are awarded College Honors in recognition of their superior scholarship.

III. UNIVERSITY HONORS (BRONZE TABLET)

(a) Those seniors who have been in the upper three per cent of their class in the several Schools and Colleges in the four semesters in which they were considered for junior and senior honors, and, therefore, have been awarded College Honors in both junior and senior years, are awarded University Honors in recognition of their sustained excellence in scholarship, and are entitled to have their names inscribed on the Bronze Tablet.

(b) Other graduating senior students who have earned College Honors twice, and whose scholastic averages for all semesters prior to the one in which they are scheduled to graduate are equal to or higher than the four-semester average of the lowest student currently chosen for University Honors from their school or college under (a), are also entitled to have their names inscribed on the Bronze Tablet.

(c) Graduating senior transfer students who have not been at Illinois long enough to be considered under (a) or (b) are also entitled to have their names inscribed on the Bronze Tablet, provided that: (1) their scholastic averages in the University of Illinois for the three prior semesters are equal to or higher than the four-semester average of the lowest student currently chosen for University Honors from their school or college under (a); and that (2) their averages in transferred credits are at least equal to the average of the lowest student currently chosen for University Honors from their school or college under (a).

HONORS DAY RULES OF PROCEDURE

(1) Averages are computed to three decimal places by the Office of Admissions and Records. Grades in required military and physical education are not included. Grades considered for honors are those earned in semesters of residence as follows: (a) freshman honors, first semester; sophomore honors, second and third semesters; junior honors, fourth and fifth semesters; senior honors, sixth and seventh semesters; or (b) one semester and two summer sessions where there has been no intervening registration in a regular semester; or (c) for students requiring more than eight semesters to graduate senior honors will be based upon the two semesters preceding the semester in which the student is scheduled to graduate. For such students junior honors may also be deferred upon recommendation of the college in which the student is registered. Grades considered shall be those on file in the Office of Admissions and Records for the preceding year. Transfer grades to be considered must be on the records of the Office of Admissions and Records of the University of Illinois at the close of the semester for which honors are being computed.

(2) Students who transfer more than twenty hours are not eligible for Class Honors as freshmen; and no students, other than freshmen, are considered for honors until they have been in residence for two semesters or their equivalent.

(3) Students will be classified as to colleges for honors according to their registration during the last semester which is considered in averaging their grades.

(4) Students are eligible for Class, College, or University Honors, irrespective of whether or not they are in residence after the last semester which is considered in averaging their grades.

(5) Students who graduate in less than eight semesters will not be considered for Senior Honors prior to graduation. If earned, these honors will be awarded after graduation.

(6) Only those students are considered who have earned in courses at least twelve hours of credit during each semester under consideration (excluding freshman and sophomore physical education, Rhetoric 100, and Mathematics 107 and 108).

(7) Unclassified students are not considered.

(8) Special examinations are disregarded in computing the status of students for honors.

(9) First semester grades in thesis courses are disregarded in computing the status of students for honors.

(10) No student shall appear in the Honors Day program two years as a member of the same class, i.e., Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior.

(11) Minor changes may be made from time to time as occasion demands in these Rules of Procedure by the Senate Committee on Honors Day, without specific reference to the University Senate.
