Town Meeting Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Monroe in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Monroe on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will appropriate for the town hall and other town buildings.

4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

5. To see what action the town will take on raising money for the purpose of keeping a physician in town.

6. To see how much money the town will raise to construct and maintain sewers.

7. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for Town Road Maintenance.

8. To see how much money the town will raise for street lighting.

9. To see how much money the town will raise for Libraries more than the law requires.

10. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor.

11. To see how much money the town will raise for old age assistance.

12. To see how much money the town will raise for Memorial Day and other celebrations.

13. To see how much money the town will raise for Parks and Playgrounds including Band Concerts.

14. To see how much money the town will raise for Cemeteries.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise the required amount to pay the interest on indebtedness.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum sufficient to accept State Aid Construction.

17. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the Inventory Blanks at the time they appraise the property to be taxed.

18. To see what action the town will take in regard to real estate taken over for non-payment of taxes.

19. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to raise money on town notes if necessary.

20. To bring in your ballots for Delegate to Constitutional Convention to be held in Concord in May, 1938.

21. To hear reports of town officers and pass any vote relating thereto.

22. To raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$907, based on 1-100 of 1% of assessed valuation, to be paid as its share of the expense of carrying on an advertising and other beneficial program for the section of the state known as the White Mountains Region, of which this town is a part, in cooperation with the state of New Hampshire and other towns in said region, to be paid by the Board of Selectmen to the Treasurer of the White Mountains Region.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The library subscribes for the following magazines: American Magazine, American Boy, American Girl, Atlantic Monthly, Child Life, Literary Digest, National Geographic Magazine, Needlecraft, Readers Digest, Yankee Magazine, Nature, Better Homes and Gardens, Country Gentleman.

The library has been given the following magazines: New Hampshire Troubador, Our Dumb Animals, Red Book, McCall's, The Watchman, Farm Journal, Woman's Home Companion, and single copies of various magazines.

One hundred fifty-five books, (six of them gifts) have been added this year.

Forty-five old books rebound and made in good readable condition.

New librarian's desk adds much to the looks as well as convenience of the room.

A gift of curios and minerals are on exhibit, and we plan to have them classified and displayed to better advantage as soon as possible. Other exhibits this fall and winter have been the Crown Rayon Mills "from tree to fabric" and "Fabrics Made of Glass", "Corning Glass Works", "How Book Bindings Are Woven from Raw Cotton", "Holliston Mills".

We wish to thank Rev. George Thomas, Mrs. Agnes Little, Mrs. H. S. Smith and Mrs Jean Burrill for their gifts of books and magazines.

The librarian attended the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Library association at New London, N. H., Sept. 9 to 11, and with Mrs. Agnes Little (one of the board of trustees) attended the district meeting at Littleton in October.

Much valuable information regarding library work and popular books is obtained at these meetings.

Remember your town reports for the past five years have had lists of the books in them, so if you are not able to get to the library, or the branch, consult these lists. A penny post card to either librarian with your wants will bring results or if you have a book that you would like renewed, one cent will save you money.

Mrs. Little spent some time reading the book shelves this summer and as a result of her work it is interesting to know that during the 40 years that the library has lived only 90 books were unaccounted for. Of these we know most of them were worn out and discarded.

At the present time there are a few over 3,000 books on the shelves.

Use your library. It is not only a source of entertainment, but a means of adult education.
