TOWN WARRANT.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deerfield in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Deerfield, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid highway maintenance and appropriate money for the same.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for town construction of highways and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred fifty dollars for Memorial Day.
6. To see if the town will vote to build a cement bridge and raise and appropriate money for the same.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to breaking the roads on the south side of the town and raise and appropriate money for the same.

8. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for snow fence.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate four hundred dollars for the control of the white pine blister rust.

10. To see if the town will vote to install a chemical toilet in town hall and raise and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to housing the tractor.

12. To transact any other business that may come before this meeting.

THE PHILBRICK FUND

The Philbrick Fund is now the only fund handled by the selectmen. There have been some changes in the various items and a statement of the several amounts and the income from them follows:

In town treasury, \$1,701.25 yielding $3\frac{1}{2}\%$.

In Amoskeag Savings Bank, \$1,200 yielding $4\frac{1}{2}\%$.

This amount (\$1,200) was derived from the sale of Manhattan Beach R. R. stock.

During the year 1928 the Liberty Bond matured and this amount, \$150, is included in the amount \$1,701.25.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board of Deerfield:

I submit my report for the school year ending June 30, 1928.

Teachers.

The only change in the teaching staff was made at the Parade school, where Miss Mary Szlosek of Hollis was employed. Mrs. Robinson was obliged to give up her work at the Center school for several weeks on account of ill health. Her place was ably filled by Mrs. Sara K. Simpson.

Instruction.

I still insist that even experienced teachers must necessarily refresh their preparation for their work, by attending summer schools or by considerable professional reading in order to give the best service. I further believe that we should employ trained teachers to the end that we should obtain more efficient service and economy of time for pupils.

Health Supervision.

During the latter part of the year, this work which had been somewhat interrupted, was resumed under the charge of Mrs. Nora D. Reese, R. N., of Manchester. Mrs. Reese came to us from a long experience in such work and did her work thoroughly. She found a large number of school children unvaccinated. Therefore, she proceeded to organize a clinic under charge of Dr.

Weaver of the State Board of Health, who vaccinated forty-three children at the close of the spring term.

Classification of Pupils.

Your Superintendent is planning a careful survey of all the pupils, by using standard tests, with a view to determining how our pupils stand in comparison with thousands of children throughout our nation. The results of this survey may result in some readjustments of individuals to classes so that they get the most value from their school work.

I appreciate the apparent cordial relations between your Board and the Superintendent. Harmonious feelings are essential to the best administration.
