






Welcome to Sweet Briar







bers were given candles to hold as the tree was lit and they joined the Sweet Tones in caroling.


In addition to the tree in the Upper Quad, the Chapel was decorated for







he swim team consisted of one senior, two juniors, three sophomores and three firstyears. This young team started off their season with a conference loss at Randolph-Macon College. The vixens quickly picked up momentum to defeat the College of Notre Dame. They hosted their first tri-meet and defeated both Virginia Military Institute and Greensboro College. They gained their first conference win against Emory & Henry College while suffering their second conference loss to Washington & Lee University. They then started a winning streak when they beat conference teams Hollins University and Randolph-Macon Women's College, as well as non-conference teams King College, Salem College, and Agnes Scott. Their 10th win happened at their tri-meet at Guilford College to end their conference record 4-2. They were defeated by non-conference team Catawba to end their overall season 10-3.

This season proved to be a successful one individually for First-year Hannah Hesser when she set a school record in the 800 meter freestyle at the Guilford College tri-meet. Hannah was also named Old Dominion Athletic Conference Swimmer of the Week in November as well as in January.

To end a fantastic season the Vixens placed third in the conference at the 2007 ODAC/Atlantic States meet at Radford in February, with 341 points overall. They had a total of 28 top-twenty finishes during the three-day competition.





In October, the hills were alive with the sound of music - *A Little Night Music*, that is.


