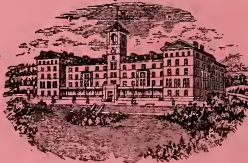



Notwithstanding the greatly increased cost of production, the price of two shillings has been maintained.

COUNTY OF BUTE.

THE COUNTY OF BUTE comprises the seven islands in the Firth of Clyde, viz. —BUTE, the most populous; ARRAN, the largest; the GREAT and LITTLE CUMBRAES, off the Ayrshire Coast; HOLY ISLE and PLADDA, off Arran; and INCH-MARNOCK, off Bute.

The total AREA OF THE COUNTY (land and water, exclusive of tidal water) is 139,658 acres, of which 53,510 are mountain and heath lands used for grazing. 3,806 acres are under plantations, and 794 are covered with water. There are 25,981 acres under all kinds of crops, bare fallow and grass, which is a gradual inroad on the mountain heath and hitherto uncultivated land.

The principal INDUSTRIES are agriculture, horticulture, and fishing. The islands possess great and varied natural attractions, and are in the forefront as holiday resorts.

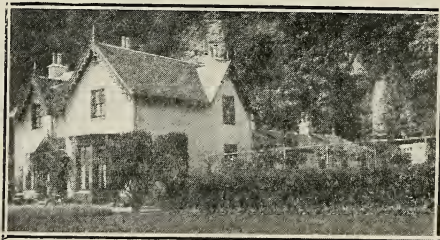

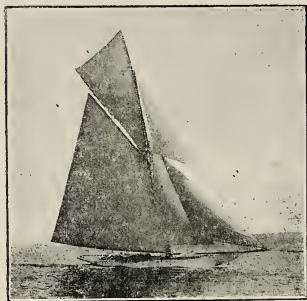

THIS is the northern portion of the island of Bute. Port-Bannatyne, its principal village, is two and a-half miles from Rothesay, with which it is connected by tramway. Kames Castle, in the vicinity, is said to be the oldest inhabited castle in the country, and was the ancient seat of the Bannatynes. The village was named after that family—two brothers of whom (John and Gilbert)—received a charter from King Robert the Bruce, for services rendered at Bannockburn.

At the 1921 census, (taken in June instead of April) the parish contained 1201 males and 1529 females—total, 2730.

The International Language— ESPERANTO

—is an attempt to save the greatest amount of labour and open the widest fields of thought and action to the greatest number.

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESSES.

The First International Congress was held at Boulogne-sur-Mer, 1905,

When the British and Foreign Esperantists met for the first time and wondered if they could understand each other's speech as they had done their writing. To their mutual delight they found that they were no longer foreigners but gealllandanoj (male and female inhabitants of other lands). If they did not sing "Auld Langsyne" thus early, they all felt that they were brethren "happy to meet, sorry to part," and all looked forward to the pleasure of meeting again.

The Second was held at Geneva, in August, 1906,

And the translated introductory pages of BONNIE SCOTLAND'S RESORTS had here the honour of being the first national guide-book printed in the international language, since known throughout the World as **Belega Skotlando**.

The Third was held at Cambridge, August, 1907,

When we printed and published a class book of typical **Scottish Scenery**, and about seventy ladies and gentlemen (representing eight nationalities) took a brief trip to Scotland, where they visited three places, viz., Edinburgh, Glasgow and Rothesay. They had a most pleasant and memorable holiday. By means of the Esperanto letters they sang "Auld Langsyne" as Scotsmen sing it, and the words were ringing in their ears long after they arrived home.

The Eleventh was to have been held at Edinburgh, in 1915, but

The Eleventh Tuta Mondo Esperanto Kongreso absorbed the Tuta Pacifica Congress, at San Francisco, to commemorate the Opening of the Panama Canal.

The Twelfth was held at the Hague, Holland, 1920.

The Thirteenth at Prague, Czechoslovakia, August, 1921,

The Fourteenth at Helsingfors, Finland, August, 1922,

The Fifteenth at Nürnberg, Bavaria, August, 1923,

The Sixteenth at Vienna, Austria, August, 1924,

The Seventeenth at Geneva, August, 1925, and

The Eighteenth at Edinburgh, in July-August, 1926,

where the complete translation of the Bible in Esperanto was dedicated.

The Nineteenth at Danzig, July-August, 1927.

NATIONAL CONGRESSES

were continuous during the Great War. Stirling and Linlithgow were early in evidence as the rendezvous of Scottish Esperantists.

The British Esperanto Association, although it only passed its 18th Annual Congress at Whitsunday, 1927, is a larger and more vigorous institution than the Scottish, which held its 22nd annual meeting in June, this year at Ayr.

On the Continent and elsewhere the movement is much more advanced than here: the necessity is more apparent.

At the Esperanto Congress at Cheltenham, in 1927, the British Esperanto Association, at the unanimous recommendation of the Executive Committee, elected Sinjoro GEORGE HIGGIE, Rothesay, to Honorary Fellowship of the Association, for his long and devoted pioneer work done for the cause.

ESPERANTO.

THIS highly commended, tested, living and very successful International Language has now got a firm hold on human life and work in every civilised country.

Several attempts had been made by far-seeing and eminent persons in many lands—including Scotland,—to surmount the lingual barriers, with the view of facilitating mutual intercourse and promoting peace and goodwill throughout the whole world, but none has triumphed except Esperanto—which does not seek to interfere with the working of other languages, but is just an easy method by which *each person* can communicate with *all others* who also desire perfect mutual understanding in regard to any subject.

To enjoy this modern miracle it is but necessary to read (in any language desired) some of the wonderful testimonies of persons engaged in business, science or pleasure to learn of its immense benefits.

To be without Esperanto is to be like those who prefer to work in obscurity, or the ships (if there are any outside canal boats) where the code of International Signals at Sea is ignored.

Esperanto has come to stay, and, like the rain and sunshine, is for the benefit of everybody.

N.B.—There still appears to be a belief in some quarters that this extraordinarily-useful language is only a fad of lingual enthusiasts (!) It has won admiration and success wherever adopted. Though “Belega Skotlando” and “Skotlanda Pejzaĝo” are enjoyed throughout the civilized world, they are favourites among the hundreds of Esperanto groupoj in the British Isles and Empire, who delight in circulating the “key” language of universal peace and good-will.

P. S.—At the Annual Congress of the BRITISH ESPERANTO ASSOCIATION, held at Cheltenham in April, 1927, Mr GEORGE HIGGIE, Rothesay, was unanimously elected an Honorary Fellow for his pioneer work.

SPELING REFORM

THIS IS NOT A NEW DESIRE ; BUT BESPEAKS
A GREATLY INCREASED INTEREST IN A
VERY IMPORTANT SUBJECT AT THE PRESENT
TIME. Under the appropriate heading,

“A Wasted Year,”

there appeared, on 3rd May, 1924, a Special Article in the *Evening Citizen*, Glasgow, showing that this is the time lost in the life of every child in Britain while acquiring the irregular and inconsistent spelling of our language.

The SIMPLIFIED SPELING SOCIETY is promoting a petition to present to the Prime Minister, calling for the appointment of a Royal Commission—including Scholars, Teachers, Men of Letters and Men of Business—to consider the whole question, and report.

Experiments already made by enthusiasts have proved eminently satisfactory, and shows how much valuable time will be saved for other studies by the removal of the spelling incubus.

The Speling Reformers include all classes of the people, and the question is not a party one.

The Simplified Speling Society of Great Britain, and the Speling Reform Association of U. S. A., have issued the first number of a joint quarterly journal, “Speling.”

Shorthand could not be written without a Reformed and Phonetic Alphabet.

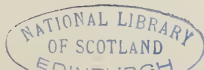

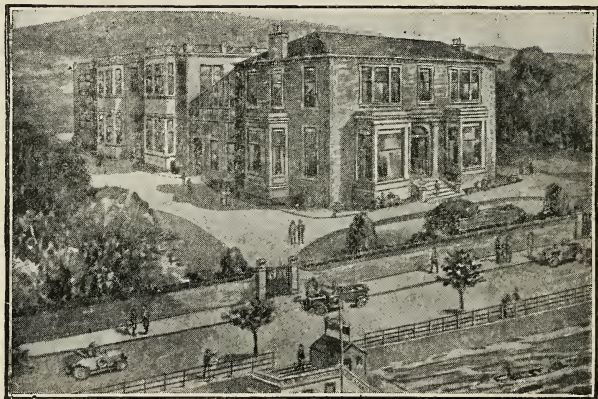

The 11th Annual International Congress was to have been held in Edinburgh in 1915, but the Great War, which prevented the holding the 10th in Paris the previous year, was the means of causing the transfer of the 11th to San Francisco. To commemorate the opening of the Panama Canal a big Exhibition was held there, and a Tuta Pacifika Esperanto Kongreso developed into the 11a Tuta Mondo Esperanto Kongreso.

The 12th Kongreso Internacia was held at th Hague, Holland in 1920; the 13th at Prague, in 1921; the 14th at Helsingfors, Finland, in 1922; the 15th at Nürnberg in 1923, the 16th at Vienna in 1924, the 17th the following August again at Geneva; and the 18th at **Edinburgh**, in **1926** (when the Holy Bible, in Esperanto, was dedicated in St Giles' Cathedral). An official photograph of the vast assemblage hangs in our office at Rothesay.

Esperanto—the language of Peace on Earth and universal brotherhood—is steadily spreading. It is much easier to learn and comprehend than any national language, and does the work of all. On the Continent during the Great War it was an incalculable blessing to Red Cross work and tracing the missing. It was a veritable open sesame into everything good. The world-wide Boy Scout movement has taken up the study of la kara lingvo. It was used at the great international Jamboree in London—a meeting so happy and harmonious that it was appropriately closed by the singing of "Auld Langsyne."

Esperanto has been adopted by the League of Nations, League of Religions, and numerous business firms, tourist organisations and scientific societies everywhere. It is, of course, regularly broadcast by wireless.
