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STEREO



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It has been said that the Negro spiritual is one of the most exalted expressions of the human spirit. Springing from thralldom and oppression and combining the passionate yearning to be free with deep religious fervor and faith in God, the spiritual has always been one of the most profoundly emotional song forms in musical art.

Born in the slave society of the South before the Civil War, the spiritual was a direct outgrowth of the impact made by Christianity on the American Negro slave. Employing the graphic narrative method of the folk ballad and supported by strongly marked rhythm, it served as an emotional and religious outlet for a people in bondage.

It was no accident that most spirituals derived directly from the Old Testament stories of trials and triumphs of the Israelites. To the Negro slaves there was a direct identification with and parallel to the enslavement of the Israelites in Egypt and their own plight in the American South.

There is a very definite tie between the spiritual and the Negro slaves' constant, unremitting struggle for freedom before 1861. This manifested itself in the interpretations placed on many lyrics of some of the most popular spirituals. *Go Down Moses* is one. "Let my people go!"

In a more purely religious vein, there is such deep feeling, such dedicated devotion to God expressed in songs such as *Deep River* or *Sometimes I Feel Like a Motherless Child* that one cannot but truly appreciate the implacable strength of belief inherent in them.

Jimmy Witherspoon reveals himself in this album to be a superb interpreter of the spirituals of his people. Known primarily as one of the greatest blues singers of all time by virtue of some 15 years of personal appearances and recordings, Witherspoon is cast now in a role expressive of his notable virtuosity as an artist.

In this set there are many highpoints worthy of special note, though the songs and their interpreter essentially speak for themselves. Jimmy Witherspoon is supported by the Randy Van Horn Singers.

Rarely does a singer appear carrying within him or her the gift of universal appeal that towers above temporal tastes and trends. Jimmy Witherspoon is such an artist.


