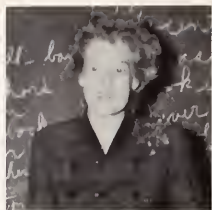
### ALPHA KAPPA PSI

## ART

The Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center, a two million dollar institution given to the Pikes Peak Region by Alice Bemis Taylor, was conceived in 1931 as a focal point for the cultural growth of the community and as a spur to greater interest in fine arts throughout the Rocky Mountain area.

Its facilities include four large exhibition galleries, a music and rehearsal room seating 200, a theatre seating 450, an art school, a library, an anthropological laboratory, storage facilities for collections, offices, kitchens, carpentry shops, residence apartments, a girls' dormitory, and a studio for children's art classes.

The Fine Arts Center provides the college with facilities for over 100 students in thorough instruction in painting, sculpture, design, drawing, and other facets of art training. Use of the auditorium, galleries, and library is also available to the students; and the Fine Arts Center has become the cultural focal point of the C. C. campus.

## NATIONAL STUDENT ASSOCIATION

Our local NSA committee is the C. C. representative in the regional and national assemblies of the National Student Association. The national group is a non-political, non-sectarian organization with the purpose of exchanging information concerning every phase of student life among all types of colleges and universities. It deals with such projects as student study and travel abroad, academic freedom, discrimination, students' rights, and it acts as the representative of United States students in government educational organizations as well as international groups, such as UNESCO.

On the campus level, the committee aids the Student Council by investigating and recommending action on many pertinent issues, and works in conjunction with other student organizations. It distributes information on national and regional activities to the students. The NSA, in the past, has set up the basic structure of our present cut policy, instigated both the leadership conference and the foreign student program on the C. C. campus, and has organized student-faculty committees and set up a system of faculty rating. This year, NSA has broadened its activities to include the organization of the Campus Chest drive and investigated and made recommendations for the improvement of our advisory system.

## HONOR COUNCIL

## VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE

The Counseling Center was opened last fall with the purpose of providing vocational guidance for all students. A series of tests, both aptitude and personality, are used as a basis for the counseling. Information is made available concerning requirements for jobs, fellowships, scholarships, and graduate work. Miss Marcia Myers and Miss Minam Grant serve as counselors at the Center.

The CC Hockey team finished the season with a total of 16 wins, 6 losses, and 1 tie. However, CC finished on bottom of the NCAA Tournament at the Broadmoor Ice Palace. The Tournament was dominated by the Michigan Wolverines, who defeated Boston University in the first game and went on to take Brown in the finals. In their first game CC was defeated by Brown. The consolation game fell to Boston University.

In spite of their upset in the tournament, CC placed two men on the twelve-man United Press All-American team. They were Jim Starrak, defense, and Tony Frasca, center. Starrak and Ron Hartwell were both named on the Columbine Network All-American team, chosen by members of the leading college teams in the nation. Named on the first All-Tournament team, chosen by Associated Press at the end of the NCAA play-offs, was Jim Starrak. Omer Brandt was elected as a wing on the second team. Hartwell was also the leading scorer in college hockey this year, with a record of 43 goals and 18 assists for a total of 61 points. Jim Starrak was voted the most valuable player of the year, and Ron Hartwell was voted most popular player at CC during the past season.

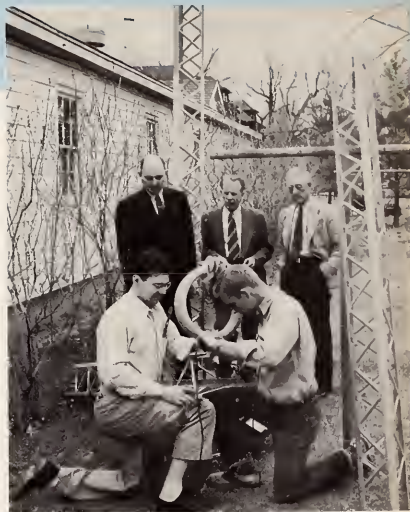

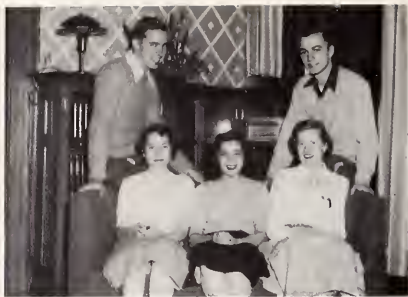
