



The Student Council is the student governing body on the campus and act is the voice of the entire student body. Through the Council, our opinions on faculty, curriculum, administration, activities, and services are expressed to the college in policy making forms. The president of ASCC is a student representative on the Committee on Undergraduate Life. Through support and financial aid of the Student Council, various organizations are able to work to give students control and expression in matters directly concerning them. Among these organizations under the juridiction of the council, are the Red Lantern, the AWS, the NSA, the WAA, C Club, the Independent groups, the Tigers and the Growlers.

NATIONAL STUDENT ASSOCIATION

Our local NSA committee is the C. C. representative in the regional and national assemblies of the National Student Association. The national group is a non-political, non-sectarian organization with the purpose of exchanging information concerning every phase of student life among all types of colleges and universities. It deats with such projects as student study and travel abroad, academic freedom, discrimination, students rights, and it acts as the representative of United States students in government educational organizations as well as international groups, such as UNISCO.

On the campus level, the committee aids the Student Council by investigating and recommending action on many pertinent issues, and works in conjunction with other student organizations. It distributes information on national and regional activities to the students. The NSA, in the part, has set up the basic structure of our present cut policy, instituted both the leadership conference and the foreign student program on the C. C. campus, and has organized student-faculty committees and set up a system of faculty rating. This year. NSA has broadened its activities to include the organization of the Campus Chest drive and investigated and made recommendations for the improvement of our advisory system.


