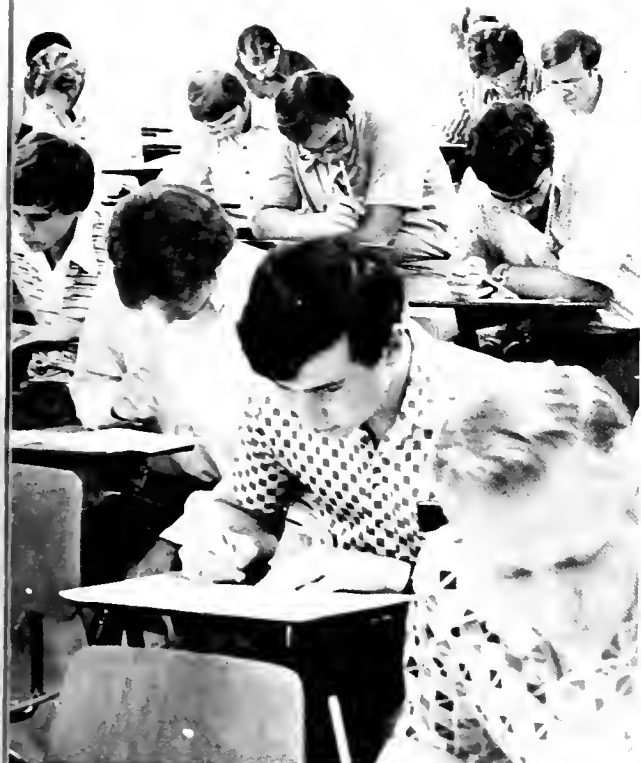




BEGINNING AGAIN

CONFERENCES

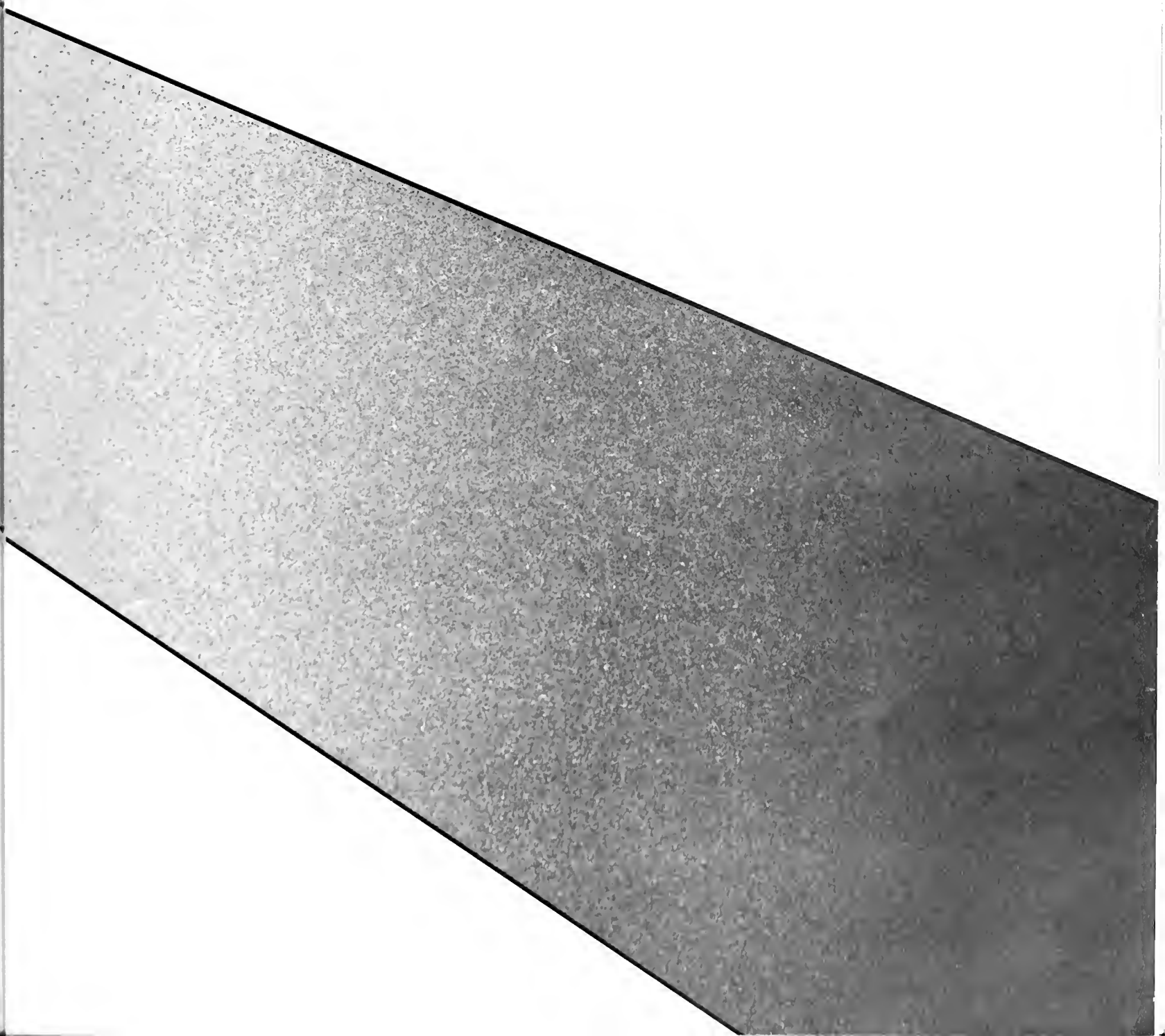
