of them entirely destitute of the means of
support, and nearly all of said families
will require some aid and assistance
that these families will suffer unless
the assistance and services of some ^{efficient} able-
bodied man can be procured. We therefore
earnestly desire you to have Moses M. Allen
who is now a member of the Sixth Battalion
Texas State Troops Command by Maj Joseph
Taylor, detailed and sent back to our
neighborhood that, he may aid and assist
said families in obtaining the necessaries ~~of~~
supplies essential for their comfort and
support. We further state that Mr. Allen's
former conduct and kind attention to
soldiers families has been such as to
fully justify the conclusion that if he is
detailed and sent back to us for the
purposes we desire, he will discharge his
duty promptly and faithfully. We would
further state that there are a great number
of negroes in our neighborhood -
some of them refractory and hard to

- that many of these Negroes are
 left upon plantations where there is no over-
 see or white male person to restrain or
 govern them, and in this connexion we
 would state that Mr. Allen is an excel-
 lent patroller - was faithful and attentive
 in patrolling the neighborhood up to the
 time he was drawn in to the service, and
 we know of no one better qualified to
 train and govern the Negroes of the
 plantation than Mr. Allen. We therefore
 for the reasons stated in this petition
 beg you to have Mr. Allen detailed

General Commanding, a draft of an Order
regarding the organization of the Militia, the
contents of which was agreed upon in my last
communication with you.

The silence of His Excellency
Governor with reference to the suggestions
made in the Major General Commanding's
communication of 20th ult, renders it the
more necessary that the programme of or-
ganization, should at once be laid before
the country.

The privilege of volunteering as
Cavalry, will, I think be generally adopted
by the Militia; and we will have some bat-
talions composed almost exclusively of them.
I have therefore shaped the order for assigning
the troops to service in camp, so as to cover this
contingent.

Yours



To check the order to some extent for the Cavalry line of service, I have made a provision that in case of a call to meet an emergency, the Cavalry will be first ordered to camp.

I propose to furlough the troops from the date of their muster into service until the 17th of August, ^(Monday) in order to allow time to procure forage, subsistence, &c., and to perfect organization. The troops will be apt to become demoralized if kept in camp, before matters are systematized; and besides it is best to let them go home and arrange their affairs.

I have been very particular concerning the release of claims for pay during furlough. The release of claims from the date of furlough until the date of next term of service in camp prevents the raising of the question of traveling allowance, mileage, &c. It is deemed that the privilege of furlough will more than compensate for the expense of travel.

I would respectfully ask if it is the desire of the Major General Commanding that a clause embodying the arrangement to

the points incident to the organization of the troops. I trust my efforts will meet the approval of the Major General Commanding and that orders will be issued at an early day.

Upon receipt of the views of the Major General Commanding, I will be enabled to proceed on the discharge of the duties assigned me.

I have the honor to report that Maj. J. S. Saylor has been ordered to take command at Camp Grace.

Two companies reported at Camp Grace on the 15th inst. Another has reported since from Saylor's Battalion, making in all about 200 men. I also ordered that part of Capt. Spiller's command which had reached since from 25th Batt. fifty to the same point, increasing the force to over 200 men.

Many rumors had reached me of serious dissatisfaction among the troops concerning the idea that it was not safe to trust the prisoners in their hands. I have placed no confidence in them. The report of Maj. Saylor justifies my views of the matter.

Yesterday is a letter written this morning:

"In obedience to orders, I remained com-
mand at this place as yesterday. From a con-
fident inquiry, I am well satisfied that the
reports in regard to the loyalty and vigilance of
the companies are wholly without foundation.
Every man who is here will do his duty to the
best of his knowledge. & + + + +

Eight of Capt. Sheurman's Co. left with
our horses, but it is supposed that they have done
so for the purpose of obtaining clothing and
carrying articles &c. I ordered these companies
from Branham and gave them no opportunity
to make their preparations for leaving home.

I have obeyed the instructions of the
Maj. Gen. Comdg and placed the companies
at Camp Three, to relieve the troops of the
line there. I regard that this portion of the
duties assigned me has been performed since the
arrival of the two companies at
this point.

Camp Three. He has proved to be a faithful
and intelligent officer and deserves much credit
for the zeal he has displayed in the service, hav-
ing already put into the field near 600 men,
175 of whom are as good as ready for the army
of Upper California.

rather are joining. I sent an express to Genl. Sherman
in a hurry and called his attention to it. He would
send me information in regard to the matter as he was

understood they will be retained in the Indian nation.

The Brigade is almost entirely on the frontiers and
I have had them in number of ^{gangs} going into Delany & Montague

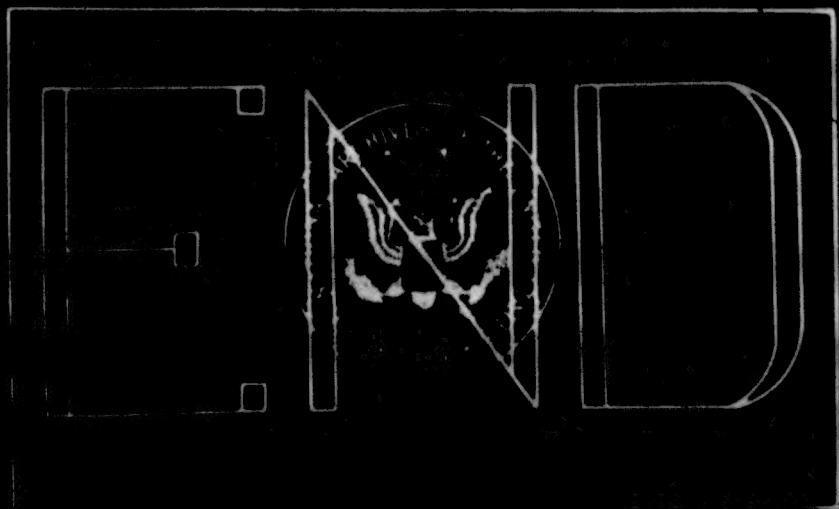
