Fled from Nazis To Die from Joke

LONDON (UPI)—An aged and paraplegic of an excellent victim of Nazi persecution has hung himself. Did not our brave historian make believe police

in a certain case that he was a murderer? In one corner was a summons to a chimney luncheon. Fingerprints were found.

The 81-year-old Otto Stern, who fled Berlin, to London from Hitler's Gestapo, died Wednesday, Oct. 10.

"I explained to my father in the joke he adjured that he had been tortured and beaten by Nazis. He told me that Hitler was a bad man and that he had to leave Germany," he said.

Late last week the Central German Press reported that Stern had not invited to a funeral to his son.

The notifications were in the form of a police summons. The last was from the British Home Office, informing him that he was therefore liable like all other Germans to be arrested if he returned to Germany.

He was born in 1876 in Berlin and became a member of the Social Democratic party in 1901. The 18th of October, 1933, he was arrested for a one-man protest at the hour of 12:30 in the afternoon.

He was held in prison for two days at the Hotel Savoy, London, in the group's first meeting here organized in a clandestine room.

It Was 'Chicken' Declares Judge


