INTRODUCTION

The twenty-ninth ¹ Annual Directory of Officials and Organizations Concerned with the Protection of Birds and Game is issued for the convenience of game-law enforcement officials, bird and game protection and conservation associations and societies, and others interested in procuring information concerning game conditions and game laws. The organization and personnel of governmental agencies of the United States, Canada, Newfoundland, and Mexico concerned with game matters are given, with the names and addresses of officials of state-wide game and bird protection associations and societies, and of the principal national organizations. Officials of the national and State divisions of the Izaak Walton League of America and of the various Audubon Societies also are included.

As in the previous issue of the directory the lists of organizations that are national in character are given directly following the list of Federal officials, and the organizations that are state-wide in character are inserted immediately after the names of State officials. Similar arrangement has been made of the national and provincial organizations in Canada.

Jurisdiction extended to game by the Lacey Act, approved May 25, 1900, and the migratory-bird treaty act, approved July 3, 1918, both of which are administered by the Bureau of Biological Survey, Washington, D. C.

The Alaska Game Commission, at Juneau, established under the Alaska game law of January 13, 1925, acts in an advisory capacity to the Secretary of Agriculture in the formulation of regulations for Alaska on game, birds, and land furbearing animals, and enforces the law and regulations; the executive officer is the chief representative of the Bureau of Biological Survey resident in Alaska. All Federal game and bird reservations in the Territory are administered through the Biological Survey.
