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SUMMARY OF ENROLLMENT FACTS AND TRENDS

Comparison of 1972-73 Enrollment with the 1971-72 Enrollment. (See Table 1)

A comparison of Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1972-73 and Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1971-72 total on-campus University enrollment statistics shows an increase of 2,334 students (4.46 percent). All three campuses contributed to this increase with Urbana-Champaign reporting an increase of 1,516 students, Chicago Circle--445 students, and the Medical Center--373 students. The table below also shows that enrollments in Extramural courses resulted in a total decrease of 314. The combined on-campus and Extramural enrollment resulted in a total University increase of 2,020 students or 3.54 percent.

At Urbana-Champaign, the highest rates of increase were reported by the Colleges of Commerce and Business Administration (27.69 percent) and Agriculture (13.98 percent). Also, the School of Basic Medical Sciences doubled its enrollment with an increase of 16 students. The highest rates of enrollment decreases were experienced in the Colleges of Education (24.89 percent) and Law (10.13 percent).

At Chicago Circle, the College of Urban Sciences enrolled students for the first time in 1972-73 (143). Increases at Chicago Circle also occurred in the undergraduate Colleges of Business Administration (14.16 percent), Architecture and Art (5.40 percent), and Liberal Arts and Sciences (2.11 percent), and in the Graduate College (6.71 percent). Decreases occurred in the Colleges of Education (18.99 percent), Engineering (6.58 percent), and Physical Education (6.06 percent).

The Medical Center, which reported an increase in all colleges and a total increase of 373 students, experienced the highest rates of increase in the School of Associated Medical Sciences (41.23 percent), College of Nursing (26.84 percent), and the Dental Assistants Program (11.54 percent). Also, the School of Public Health enrolled students (43) for the first time in 1972-73.

Extramural courses at Urbana-Champaign experienced decreases of 6.44 percent in Graduate credit courses, 7.04 percent in Undergraduate credit courses, and 6.83 percent in Noncredit courses. Chicago Circle increased enrollments in Undergraduate credit courses by 173.17 percent and decreased Graduate credit enrollments by 22.10 percent.

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Percentage of Women. (See Table 2)

The trend toward a higher ratio of women at the University of Illinois is again evidenced in the Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1972-73 data with the percentage of women increasing to 36.84. This compares with 35.99 for the same 1971-72 term, 35.65 percent in 1970-71, and 35.62 percent in 1969-70. The percentage in 1961-62 was 28.95, and in 1950, 23.86.

Noncontinuing and Continuing Students. (See Tables 3, 4, and 5)

Noncontinuing students, including New Students, Readmissions and Intercampus Transfers, experienced a 4.70 percent increase in Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1972-73 when compared with 1971-72. Data for the same period showed that Continuing Students increased by 1,966 students or 3.95 percent. The net increase for Noncontinuing and Continuing Students, excluding Noncredit Extramural Courses, for Second Semester Winter Quarter 1972-73 equalled 4.01 percent.

Quality of Beginning Freshmen in Terms of High School Quartile Rank. (See Table 6)

Data for Second Semester 1972-73 at Urbana-Champaign show that 76.87 percent of the 134 Beginning Freshmen for which data are available came from the top quarter of their various high school graduating classes as compared with 77.58 percent in 1971-72 and 52.50 percent in 1970-71. Also, 100.00 percent of the Beginning Freshmen ranked in the upper half as compared with 93.96 percent in 1971-72 and 85.00 in 1970-71.

At Chicago Circle in the Winter Quarter 1972-73, 39.78 percent of the 93 Beginning Freshmen for which data are available ranked in the top quarter of their various high school graduating classes as compared with 38.79 in Winter 1971-72, and 47.37 in Winter 1970-71. Also, 69.79 percent ranked in the upper half as compared with 64.65 last winter and 77.63 in Winter 1970-71.

Percentage of Full-time and Part-time Students. (See Table 8)

Few substantial changes in the percent of full-time and part-time students occurred in Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1972-73 when compared to the same term in 1971-72. The highest rate of change was noted with first-professional students at Urbana-Champaign where full-time students increased from 87.01 percent to 96.05 percent.

Except for Graduates at Urbana-Champaign, where 67.56 percent of the men are full-time students and 50.88 percent of the women are full-time students, the differences between sexes in percent of full-time students are not great. All extramural students are classified as part-time.

Resident and Nonresident Students. (See Table 9)

Since 1950, when nonresident enrollment equalled 14.09 percent of total University enrollment, the ratio of nonresidents has steadily declined to 8.27 in Second Semester-Winter Quarter 1972-73. This compares with 8.79 percent in 1971-72, 9.78 percent in 1970-71 and 13.80 percent in 1961-62.

Geographical Distribution. (See Table 10)

A. Urbana-Champaign Campus

Home addresses in the State of Illinois are listed by 28,779 students, which is 88.84 percent of the 32,390 registered for the Second Semester at Urbana-Champaign. There are 2,412 students from 49 other states (plus the District of Columbia). In addition, 9 students came from 2 United States Possessions and 1,193 students came from 88 foreign countries.

B. Chicago Circle Campus

Home addresses in the State of Illinois are listed by 18,087 students which is 96.54 percent of the 18,735 registered for the Winter Quarter at Chicago Circle. There are 205 students from 38 other states. In addition, 2 students came from 2 United States Possessions and 441 students came from 55 foreign countries.

C. Medical Center Campus

Home addresses in the State of Illinois are listed by 3,165 students, which is 89.00 percent of the 3,556 registered for the Winter Quarter at the Medical Center. There are 162 students from 35 other states (plus the District of Columbia). In addition, 229 students came from 48 foreign countries.

D. Extramural Credit Courses (Urbana-Champaign Campus)

Home addresses in the State of Illinois are listed by 1,523 students which is 97.44 percent of the 1,563 registered for the Second Semester in Extramural credit courses at the Urbana-Champaign Campus. There are 40 students from 9 other states (plus the District of Columbia).

E. Extramural Credit Courses (Chicago Circle Campus)

There are 489 students registered in Extramural credit courses at the Chicago Circle Campus and all are from the State of Illinois.
