The Board of Barber Examiners exists to upgrade the barber profession by enforcing the laws governing the practice of barbering as to sanitation and health. It will continue to create harmony among barbers and help them to elevate their profession so as to provide the most modern and healthful services and appliances in their service to the public.

#### ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM

#### Achievements:

During the fiscal year 1969-70, we traveled nearly 27,000 miles giving examinations, contacting barbers and inspecting barber shops. Because of the personal contacts and inspections, we feel that we have brought about better sanitary conditions and a better overall understanding among barbers.

#### MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS

PROGRAM: ADMINISTRATION

REQUIRED IMPLEMENTATION ACTION: LEGISLATIVE

PRIORITY RATING: 1

CATEGORY: ADMINISTER EXISTING PROGRAM

RECOMMENDATION. A revision must be made of the present law governing the practice of barbering, specifically license fees. We must have additional revenue, because by the end of 1973, our surplus will be spent. We cannot cut our travel and still continue to improve the standards of sanitation.



#### ADMINISTRATION

Services Frovided. Issuing of occupational licenses, personal and shop, inspections of new shops, etc.

Objectives. To have all barber shops equipped with proper sanitation equipment and each barber have a current health certificate.

<u>Achievements</u>. During this last licensing period, no practical barber was given a license without first submitting a health certificate. Members of the Board have tried as far as possible to cover all shops to check on proper sanitation practices.
