



- This solid state color TV is designed to operate on 120 volts 60Hz, AC household current.
- Insert power cord into a 120 volt 60Hz outlet.
- To prevent electric shock, do not use the television's plug with an extension cord, receptacle, or other outlet unless the blades and ground terminal can be fully inserted to prevent blade exposure.
- Never connect the TV to 50Hz, direct current, or anything other than the specified voltage.








### PROTECTION AND LOCATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

- 16. If an outside antenna is connected to the television set, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built- up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, NFPA No. 70-1975, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit connection to grounding electrode, and requirements for the grounding electrode.
- 16-1. Note to CATV system installer: (Only for television sets with CATV reception) This reminder is provided to call CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.



EXAMPLE OF ANTENNA GROUNDING AS PER NATIONAL ELECTRICAL

17. An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electrical lights or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.



 For added protection for the television set during a lightning storm, or when it is unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect antenna. This will itlet and This will prevent damage due to lightning and power-line surges.



### OPERATION OF YOUR TELEVISION SET

### Care and Cleaning

### **Picture Tube (Turn TV Off)**

Use a mild soap solution or window cleaner with a soft clean cloth, DO NOT USE ABRASIVE CLEANERS, Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry.

### **Plastic Cabinets**

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Avoid excessive moisture. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

### Remote Control

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and wipe dry with a soft clean cloth. Do not use benzene, thinner or other petroleum based products.

### **Television Location**

This television is intended to be used with a stand or entertainment center. Consult your dealer for available options. Locate for comfortable viewing. Avoid placing where sunlight or other bright lights (including reflections) will fall on the screen. Use of some types of fluorescent lighting may reduce remote control transmitter range.

Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent internal component failure. Keep away from excessive heat or moisture. To ensure optimum color purity do not position magnetic equipment (motors, fans, external speakers) nearby.

### **Optional External Equipment Connections**

The Audio/Video connections between components can be made with shielded video and audio cables. For best performance, video cables should utilize 75 ohm coaxial shielded wire. Cables are available from your dealer or electronic supply house.

Before you purchase any cables, be sure you know what type of output and input connectors your various components require. Also determine the length of cable you'll need.

### **AC Power Supply Cord**

CAUTION: TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF AC OUTLET AND FULLY INSERT. DO NOT USE A PLUG WITH A RECEPTACLE OR OTHER OUTLET UNLESS THE BLADE CAN BE FULLY INSERTED TO PREVENT BLADE EXPOSURE. FOR SOME MODELS THAT ARE NON-POLARIZED, THE USE OF AN AC ADAPTOR CONNECTOR MAY BE NECESSARY.




Polarized Plug















### **Remote Control Battery Installation**

Batteries: Use two "AA: batteries.

- Remove the battery compartment cover on back of the remote.
- Install the batteries in the battery compartment. (Polarity (+) or (-) must be correct.)
- 3. Reattach the battery cover.



For frequent remote users, replace old batteries with alkaline batteries longer life.

### **Precaution on Battery Use**

Incorrect installation can cause battery leakage and corrosion that will damage the remote control.

### **Observe the Following Precautions:**

- 1. Batteries must be replaced as a pair.
- 2. Do not combine a used battery with a new one.
- 3. Do not mix battery types (Example: "Zinc Carbon" with Alkaline").
- 4. Do not attempt to charge, short-circuit, disassemble, heat or burn used batteries.
- Battery replacement is necessary when remote control reacts sporadically or stops operating the television.



### Cable / Antenna

For proper reception, either a cable or antenna connection is required.

### Cable Connection

Connect the cable supplied by your local cable company.

Note: A cable converter box may be required for proper reception. Check with your local Cable company for compatibility requirements.



### Antenna Connection

- For proper reception of VHF/UHF channels, an external antenna is required. For best reception an outdoor antenna is recommended.
- Antenna must be selected as the signal source in the SET-UP menu.







Cable (CATV) mode is preset at the factory. Antenna users must change to antenna mode in the Set -Up menu.














### **Optional Equipment Connections**

### **Audio / Video Connections**

VCRs, video disc players, video game consoles, and SAT equipment can also be connected to the video inputs. See the optional equipment manual for details.



### **Procedure**

- 1. Connect equipment as shown to front or rear Audio/Video input jacks.
- Select the video mode by pressing INPUT button.
- Operate optional equipment as instructed in equipment manual.

NOTE: The S-VIDEO connection is optional and overrides normal VIDEO connection. Use INPUT 2, AUDIO R and L with S-VIDEO connection.
















### **Amplifier Connection (TO AUDIO AMP)**

Connect to an external audio amplifier input for listening to TV from a stereo system speakers.

### **Audio Adjustments**

- 1. Select INTERNAL SPEAKER ON located in the AUDIO menu on screen.
- 2. Set amplifier volume to minimum.
- 3. Adjust TV volume to desired level.
- 4. Adjust amplifier volume to match the TV.
- 5. Select INTERNAL SPEAKERS OFF&VAO from AUDIO menu.
- 6. Volume, mute, bass, treble and balance are now controlled from the TV.


Note: TO AUDIO AMP terminals should not be connected directly to external speakers. In OFF&FAO the volume is controlled by the external amplifier.

### Digital TV - Set-Top Box (DTV-STB) Connection

Use this diagram to connect a DVD player or a DTV-STB (Digital TV-Set-Top Box) to the back of your TV.



**Note:** There are three video inputs, Y,  $P_B$ , and  $P_R$ . Separate component color inputs provide luminance and color separation. Use the L (left) and R (right) audio inputs.


### **Procedure**

- Connect incoming cable to antenna (ANT) input on back of TV.
- Press the PIP button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.
- Choose channels for the *PIP* frame by pressing the remote control **PIP** CH ▲▼ buttons.
- Choose channels for the *Main Picture* by pressing the remote control **CH** ▲▼ buttons or by using the numeric

### With a VCR and Cable Box

Connect your television to a VCR and cable box, as shown.


### **Procedure**

Press the PIP button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.

To view scrambled channels through your cable box in the PIP frame:

- Press the INPUT button on the remote control to select the video input to which your VCR is connected.
- Verify the CABLE BOX and VCR are ON and the VCR tuned to channel 3 or 4.
- Choose channels for the PIP frame by pressing the CABLE button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or CH ▲▼ buttons.
- Choose channels for the Main Picture by pressing the TV button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or CH ▲ ▼ buttons.

Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.


















# Picture in Picture (PIP) Operation

### With a VCR - No Cable Box

This television includes a two tuner Picture In Picture (PIP) feature. This allows watching two (2) live broadcasts at the same time without or with an external video source (VCR).

Connect your television to a VCR, as shown.

### **TERMINALS ON BACK OF TV**



The Remote Control must be programmed with the supplied codes to operate the VCR. (See "Programming the Remote" on page 16).

### **Procedure**

Press the PIP button on the remote control to display the PIP frame.

The audio is from the Main Picture only.

To view an external video source in the PIP frame:

- Press the INPUT button on the remote control to select the video input to which your VCR is connected.
- Verify the VCR is on.
- View the external video source in the PIP frame.
- Choose channels for the Main Picture by pressing the TV button on the remote control and using the numeric keypad or **CH** ▲▼ button.



The SWAP button switches the PIP and the main picture source. The RECALL button shows the status of the onscreen PIP and the main picture.









### **Remote Control**



Press to turn ON or OFF.

### **PIP Buttons**

Press to control PIP features.

### **PIP CH Buttons**

Press to select PIP channels.

### Menu Button

Press to display main menu and access on screen features and adjustment menus.

### **Mute Button**

Press to mute sound (Closed Caption appears, if available). A second press resumes sound (Closed Caption will not be displayed).

### **Volume Buttons**


Press to adjust TV sound level.

### **Input Button**

Press to select TV or video input.

### Precoded VCR Buttons

These buttons transmit the chosen precoded VCR codes.

### **Mode Buttons**

Set remote to control your TV, cable box or VCR.

### **TV/VCR Button**

When controlling the TV or VCR, this switches TV/VCR. When controlling cable, this switches between A and B.

### **Cursor Button**

Press to adjust audio menus, video menus and select operating features.

### Lst-Ch (Last Channel) Button

Press to switch to the previous channel.

### Exit Button

Press to exit menus.

### **Channel Button**

Press to select channels.

### **Keypad Buttons**

Press desired channel number to randomly access any channel.

### **Sleep Button**

Press to turn TV off in 30, 60 or 90 minutes.

### **Recall Button**

Press to display Time, status of Sleep Timer, Channel, Video Mode, Channel I.D. and Audio Mode.




# **Special Buttons**

### **Recall Button**


Press the **RECALL** button to check:

- 1. Audio mode status
- CH number or video input selected
- Channel Caption (Station Identifier)
- Clock time 4.
- Sleep timer status



### **LAST-CH Button**


Pressing the LAST-CH button will switch between the last two channels viewed.



When scanning channels with the CHANNEL ▲ ▼ buttons, pressing the LAST-CH button will switch between the last two channels scanned.

### **Swap Button**

Press the SWAP button (when the PIP frame is displayed) to interchange what is being viewed on the main picture with that of the PIP frame.



Note: The audio is from the Main Picture only.














# **Special Buttons**

### PIP (Picture in Picture) Button

This feature allows the viewer to monitor one channel program while watching another. The monitored source (PIP) can be a different channel or a different video source (such as a VCR) when connected to the input jacks.


### **PIP Operation**

1. Press the **PIP** button (set must be ON). The PIP frame will appear at the position it was last displayed. The main picture video source and PIP video source will display on screen momentarily. Audio will be that of main picture.




Note: When the Main Picture is in Video mode with no signal, the PIP will not operate properly.

2. Press the PIP button again to size PIP frame or twice to cancel PICTURE IN PICTURE feature.



### **PIP CH Buttons**

Press the **PIP CHANNEL** ▲ ▼ button while the PIP frame is displayed to sequentially scan through channels.
















# **Special Buttons**

### Frz (Freeze) Button

Press the FREEZE button to stop action in the PIP frame.



### Notes:


- Pressing the FREEZE button when the PIP frame is not displayed, will freeze a frame from the main picture and display it in the PIP frame.
- Pressing the FREEZE button when the PIP frame is displayed, will freeze action from the PIP frame. Press the FREEZE button again to continue action.
- Press the PIP button as needed to delete PIP frame.

### **Move Button**

The PIP frame may be located at any corner of the Main Picture by pressing the MOVE button (when the PIP frame is displayed).



Note: As MOVE button is pressed (when the PIP frame is displayed), the PIP frame will move counterclockwise as illustrated.















## **Programming the Remote**

### **DVD/VCR Functions**

This remote is designed to operate different brands of DVD players and VCRs. You must first program the remote to match the remote system of your DVD or VCR.

### **Procedure**

- 1. Turn ON your DVD or VCR.
- 2. Aim the remote control at the front of your DVD or
- 3. While holding down the DVD/VCR button on the remote, enter the 2-digit preset code that matches your DVD or VCR. (See "Component Codes" on page 17) The remote will turn off your DVD or VCR when the correct 2 digit preset code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your DVD or VCR. If the DVD or VCR does not turn off after 25 seconds, try a different code, if available.
- 4. The remote will now control your DVD or VCR.

### **Notes**

- If your DVD or VCR will not operate remotely after performing the above procedures, this means that your equipment's code has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your equipment's operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries repeat programming procedure stated above.
- If your VCR does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
- The MENU button will act as the VCR MENU button for HITACHI VCRs.
- The INPUT button will act as your VCR +100 button, if required.

### Cable/Satellite Box Functions

This remote is designed to operate different brands of cable boxes and Satellite boxes. You must first program the remote to match the remote system in your cable/satellite box.

### **Procedure**

- 1. Turn ON your cable/satellite box.
- 2. Aim the remote control at the front of your cable/ satellite box.
- 3. While holding down the CABLE button on the remote, enter the 2 digit preset code (See "Component Codes" on page 17) that matches your cable/satellite box. The remote will turn off your cable/satellite box when the correct 2 digit code is entered. When this occurs, the remote control is programmed for your cable/satellite box. If the cable/satellite box does not turn off after 5 seconds, try another 2 digit preset code, if available.

4. The remote will now control your cable/satellite box.

### **Notes**

- If your cable/satellite box will not operate remotely after performing the procedures, this means that your cable/ satellite box code has not been coded into the remote. Please consult your cable/satellite box operating guide.
- The remote control will remember the codes you have programmed in until the batteries are removed from the remote control. After replacing the batteries, repeat the entire programming procedure stated above.
- If your cable/satellite box does not have a remote power function, the remote will issue the CHANNEL UP function.
