The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948. The Guinness Book of Records describes the UDHR as the “most translated document” in the world. It consists of 30 articles which outline the view of the General Assembly on the human rights guaranteed to all people. (*Wikipedia*)
