Walnut Grove Church/School Southern Corner of Highways 377 and 59 Lewis County, Kentucky

- 1. Jess Chinn, present owner of the building, relates how his grandfather, Ed Pierce, helped build the church/school in 1877. The interior stil contains a hand carved pulpit and home made simple poplar pews. Each pew was constructed from one log that formed the back and seat. Originally it was the Community Methodist Church and School which was in session from 1877 to circa 1897. The school was then moved to Grassy Creek school a mile up 59. The Methodist Church continued to hold service in the structure until circa 1955-1960. It was also used as a community center of the unincorporated community of Kinnekinick. After 1960 the Pentacostal community held services in the building for some time. Today the building stands vacant.
- 13. The Pentacostals added a porch on the front elevation between 1975 and 1978. They also replaced the clear windows on the side elevations with multipaned red, blue and green windows after 1975.
- 14. The front elevation of the rural church is unadorned except for a round slated vent under the front gable eave. The 4 paneled wooden front door has a 1/1 light transom. A simple wooded bell tower is centered over the front eave and topped with a simple wood cross. The rear elevation is pierced with a 4 light diamond window surrounded by a shiplapped frame and this feature is original to the building.
