We begin to stand. The court, the stage, the field, the classroom--

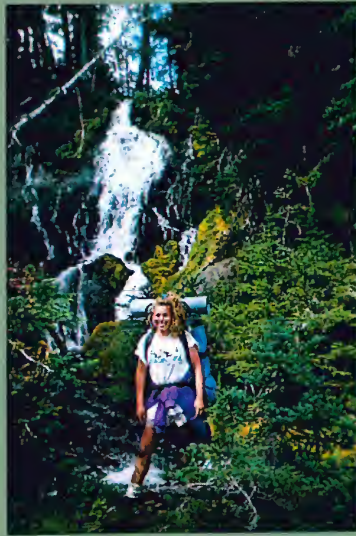
where we are given the opportunity to give our best--where we are

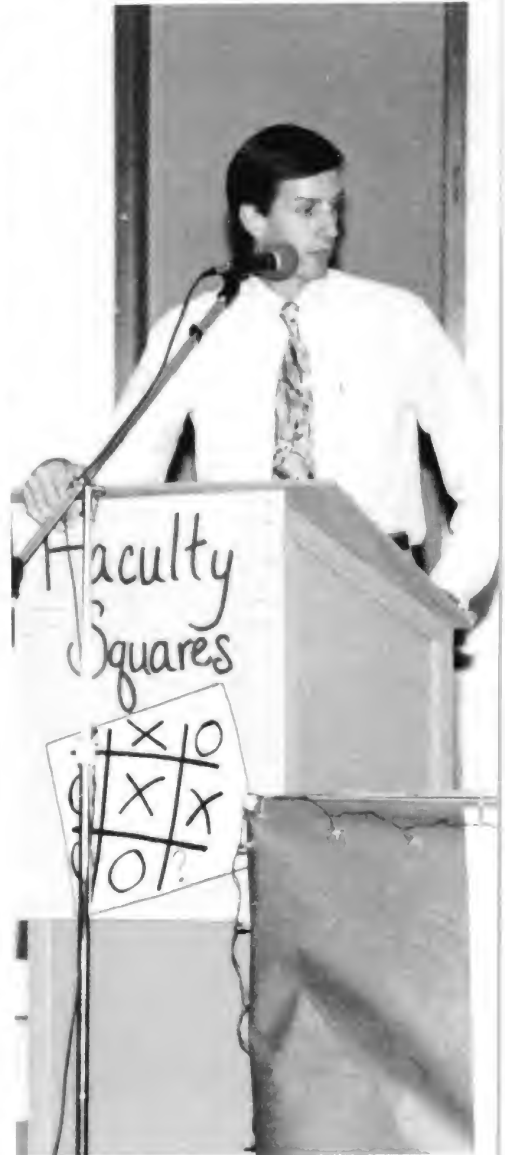

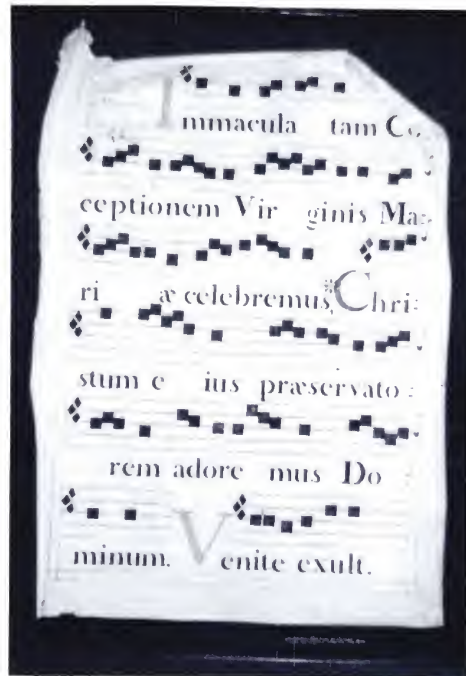


# Harmonize, Glorify, Praise

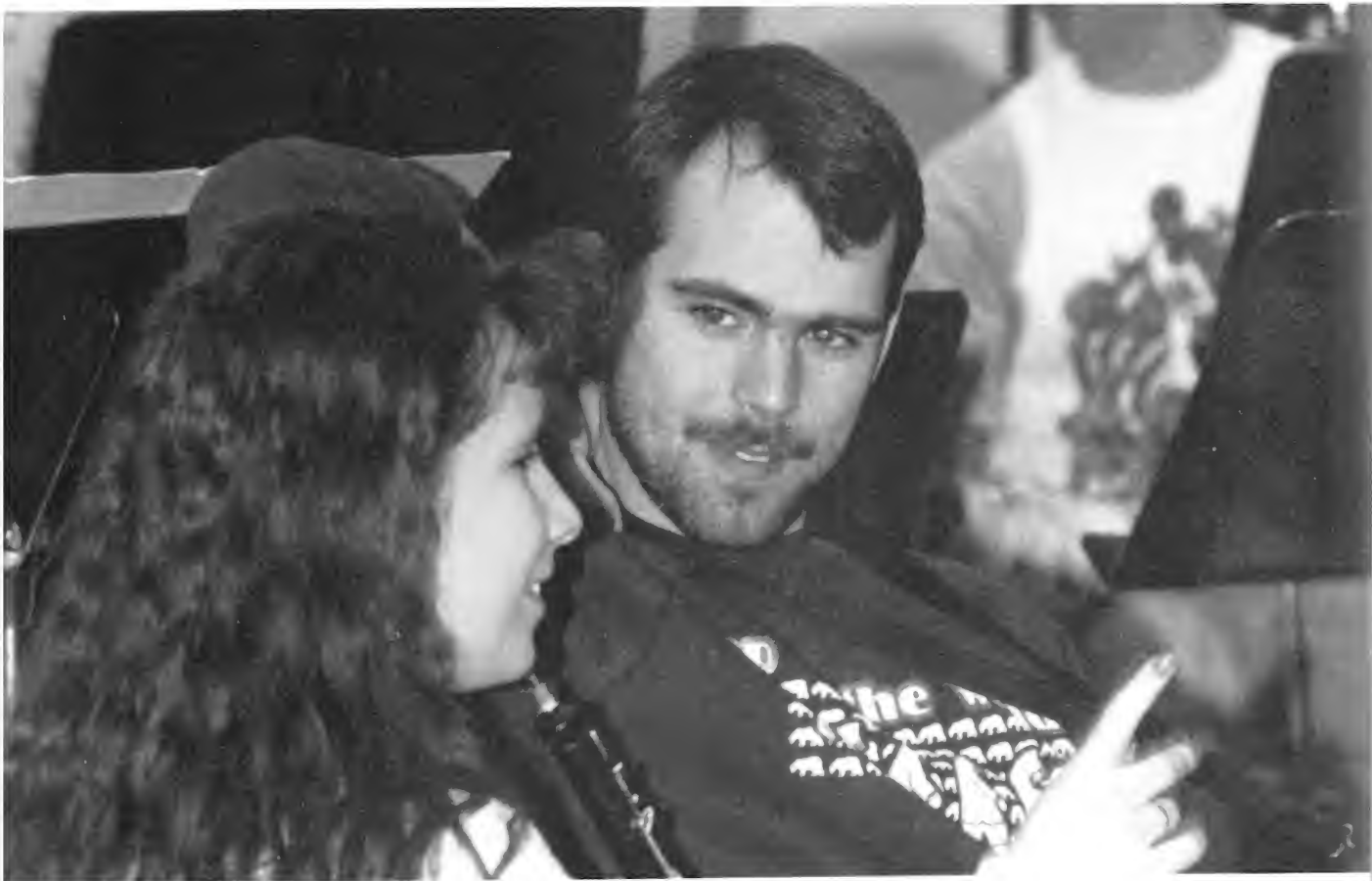

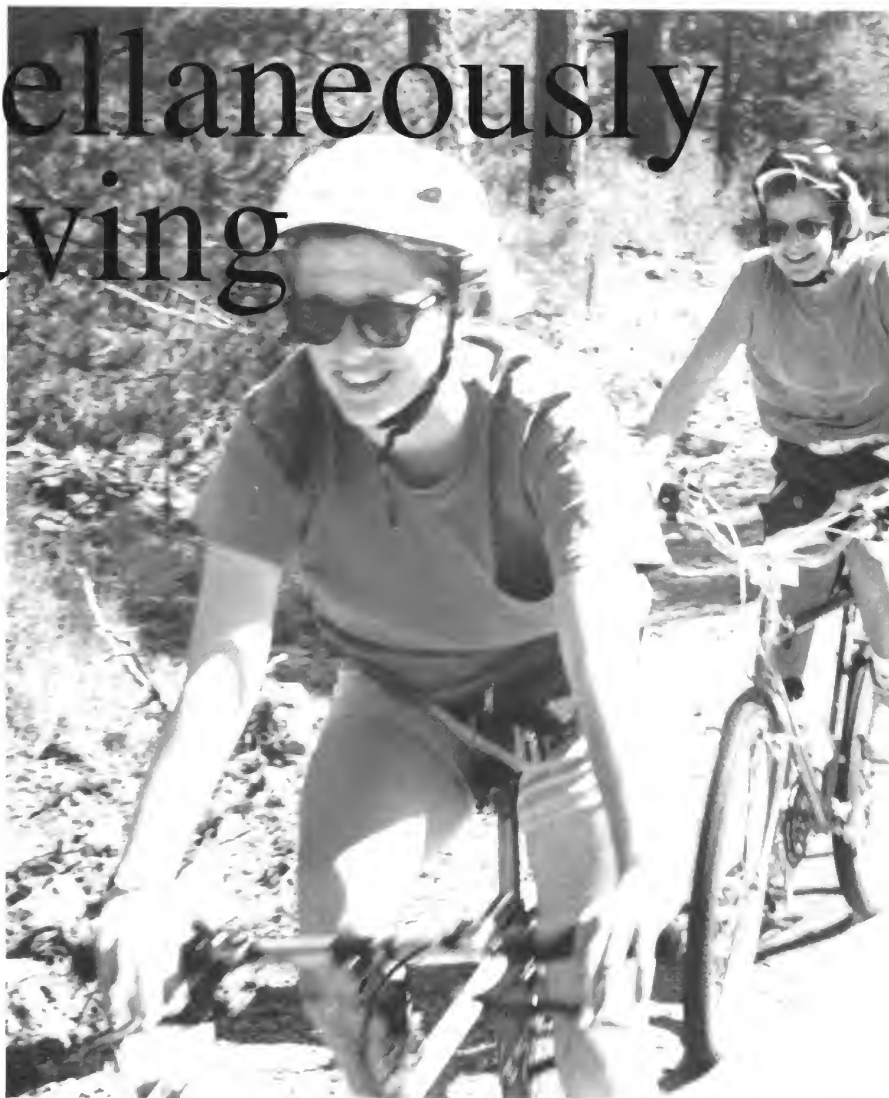

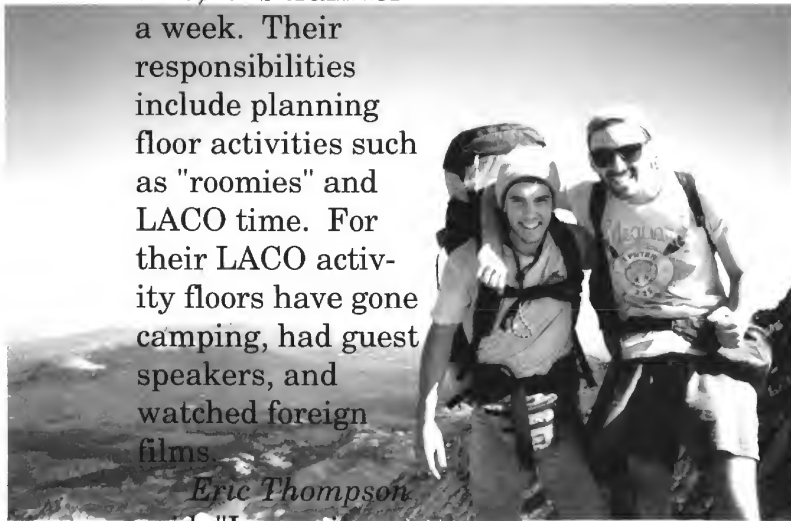
# The WALK

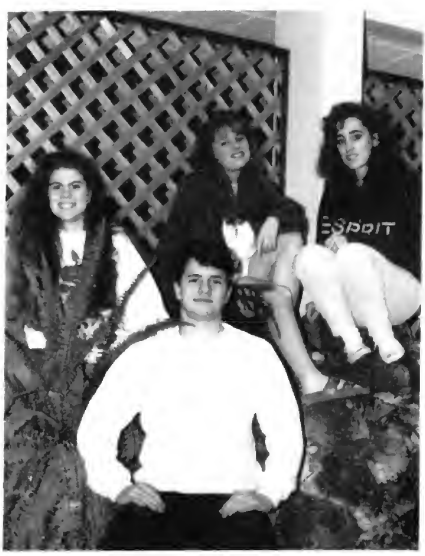

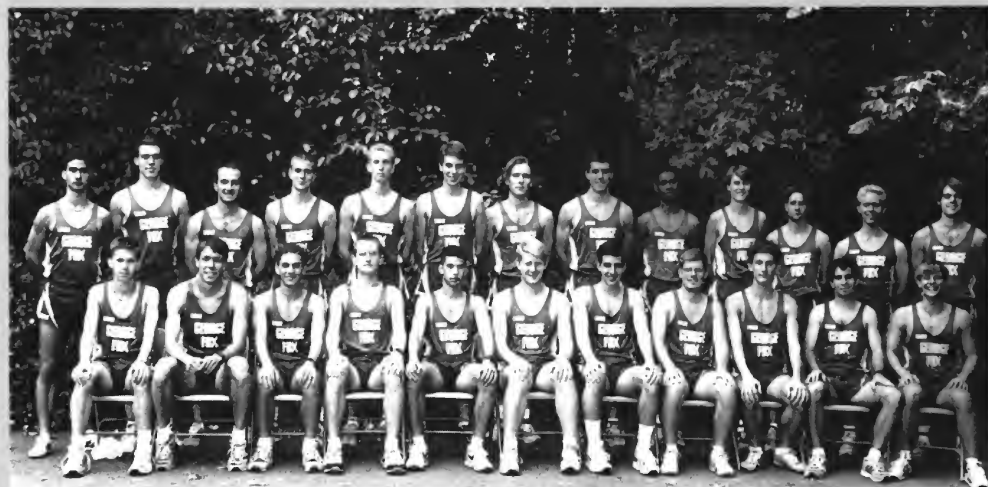

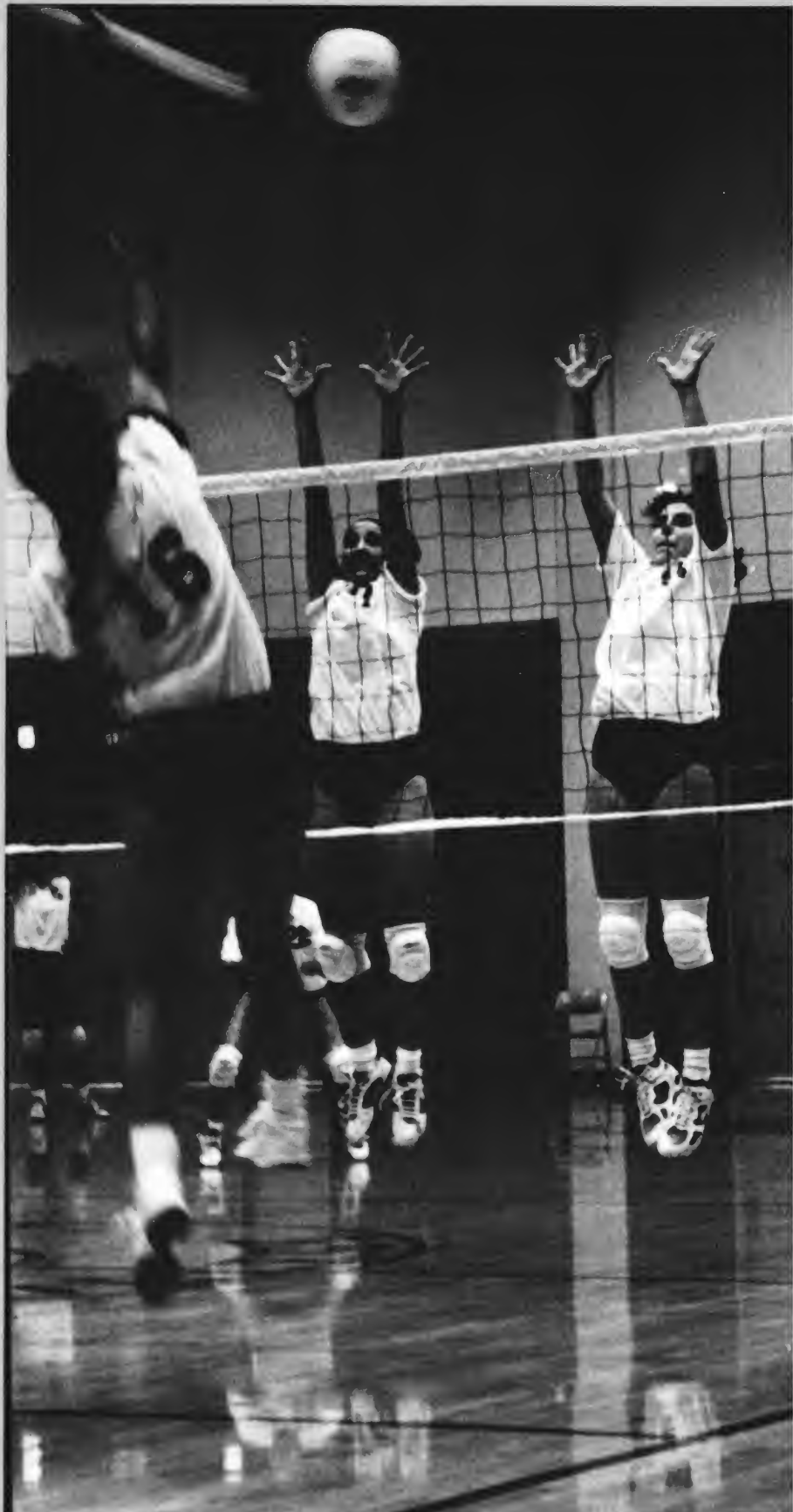

**W**ith two district titles under their belts, the Bruins started out on a rollercoaster season. The loss of assistant coach Ken Bowen was difficult for much of the team as well.

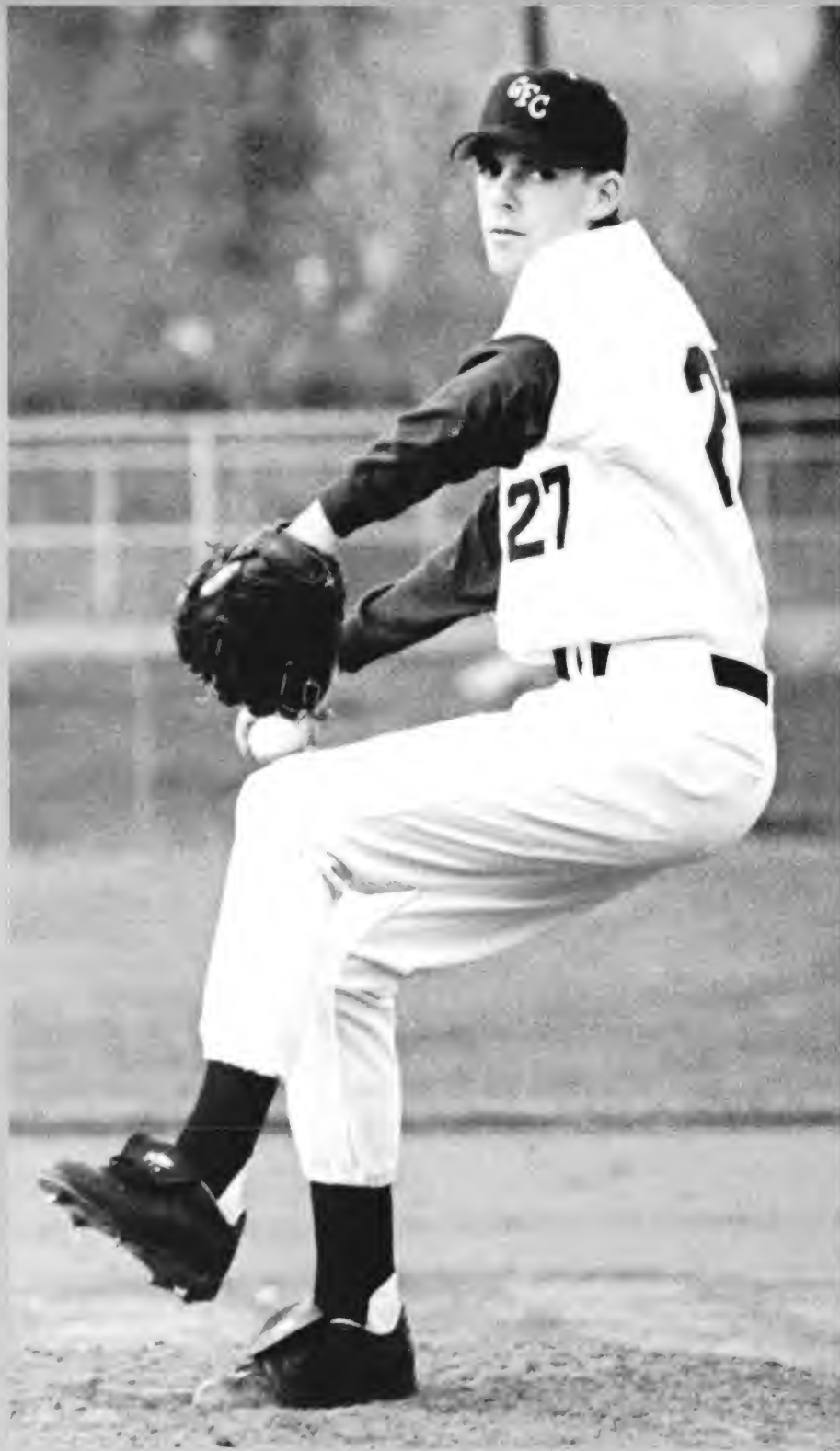
Transfers joining the team created a whole new core for Fox. The new juniors and seniors brought strong defense and power pitching.

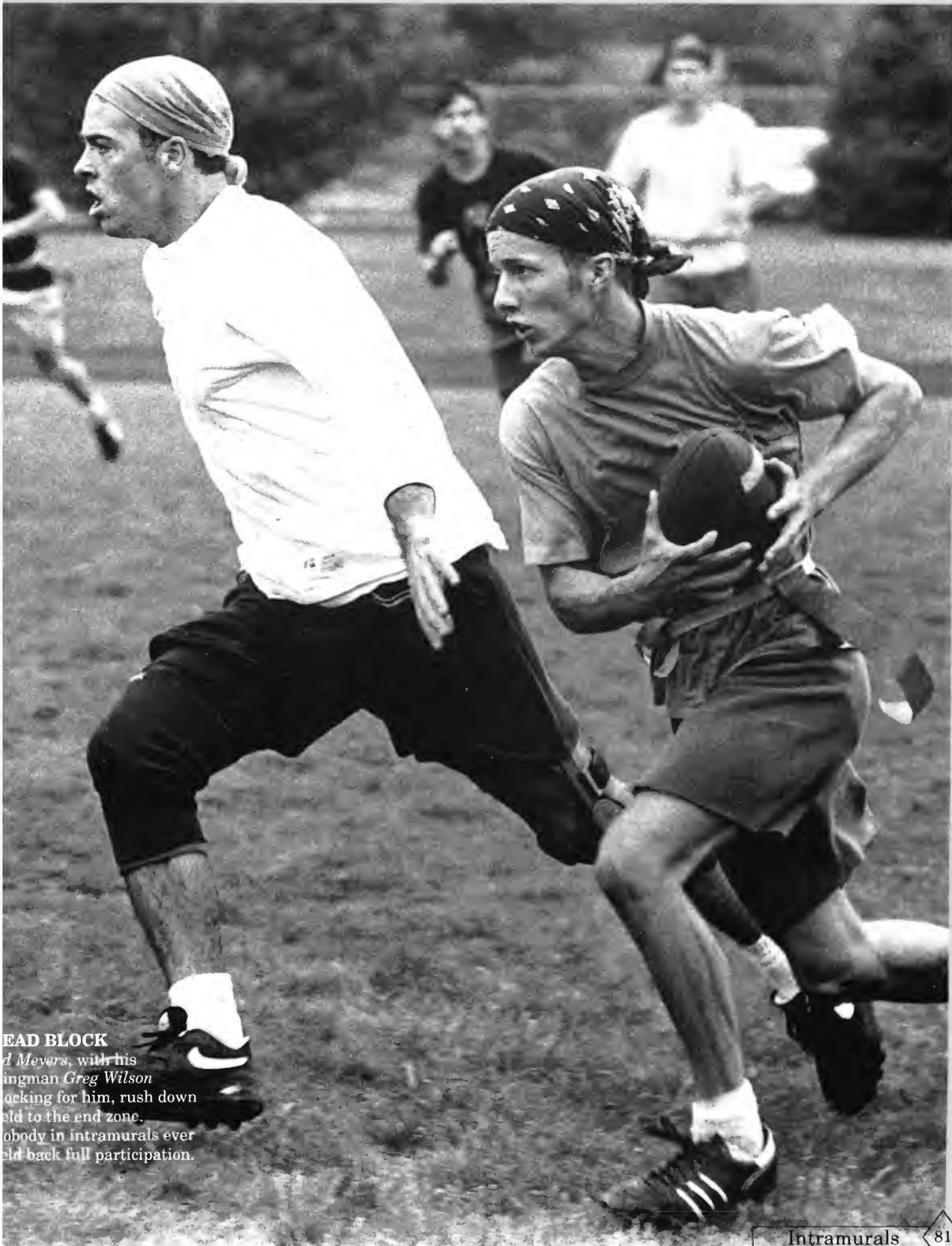

## WIDE NEWS

Christopher Columbus' Santa Maria stops in Miami Florida—the first stop in a 20 city US tour. The Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria were built with the same materials carpenters used to build the original ships. Hand-forged nails were modeled after those recovered from a 16th century shipwreck. The sails were made of the closest natural fiber to the original hemp canvas, linen. Shortly after noon on February 26, 1993, an explosion rocked the World Trade Center in New York (NY), leaving several dead and hundreds injured. This was the first terrorist act ever committed on US soil.





More than a million Somalians have fled their homeland for refugee camps in neighboring countries. The Somali famine is one of the worst in history. The death toll has been estimated between 100,000 to half a million. The international community has concentrated its relief efforts in Central Somalia.

U.S. volleyball player Bob Samuels celebrates a victory against Canada. The summer Olympics were transformed forever when professionals were allowed to compete in the 1992 summer Olympics in Barcelona, Spain.

There's a new flag flying over Canada—the World Series pennant. The Toronto Blue Jays took baseball's championship outside the US for the first time ever, beating the Atlanta Braves 4-3 in 11 innings in Game 6.

Hurricane Iniki dealt a direct blow to Kauai, one of the Hawaiian Islands, with torrential rain and wind gusts of up to 160 mph. Iniki was the most powerful hurricane in the Hawaiian Islands this century.



Hurricane Andrew struck Southern Florida, in a 54 hour rampage, with 164 mph wind gusts and twelve foot tidal surges which flattened homes, uprooted trees, flung boats into the streets and wrecked an Air Force base. Fifty-five deaths were directly or indirectly linked to the hurricane.





Slavs are confronted daily by shelling, sniper fire, and the death of war. They fill the streets during the occasional ceasefire to buy bread and other necessity staples. The territory of Yugoslavia, torn by demands for autonomy by Croats who opposed Serbian domination, has been a battleground for centuries.

The air filled with cheers as William Jefferson Clinton was sworn into office as the 42nd President of the United States on January 20, 1993. "Jobs. Health care. Education. These commitments aren't just promises from my lips," Clinton said. "They are the work of my life."

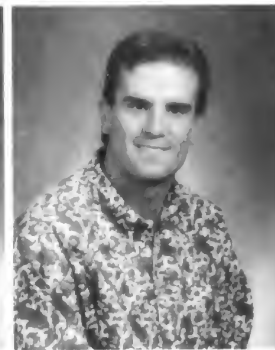

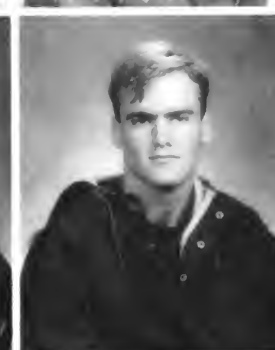
