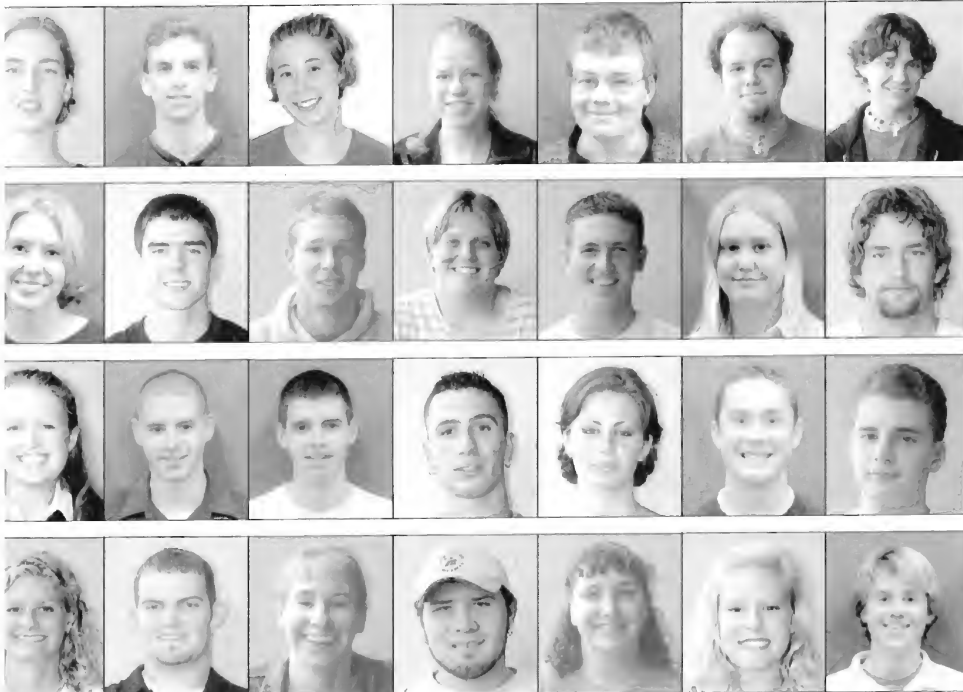

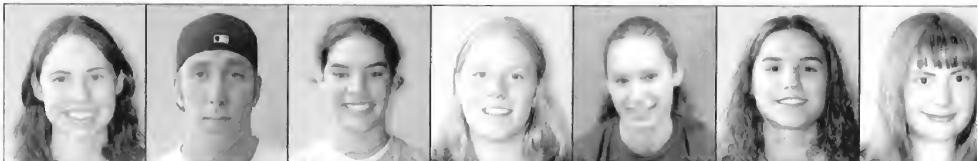

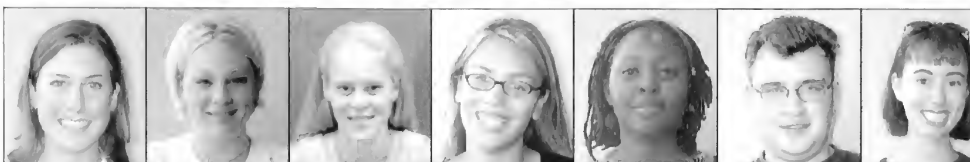

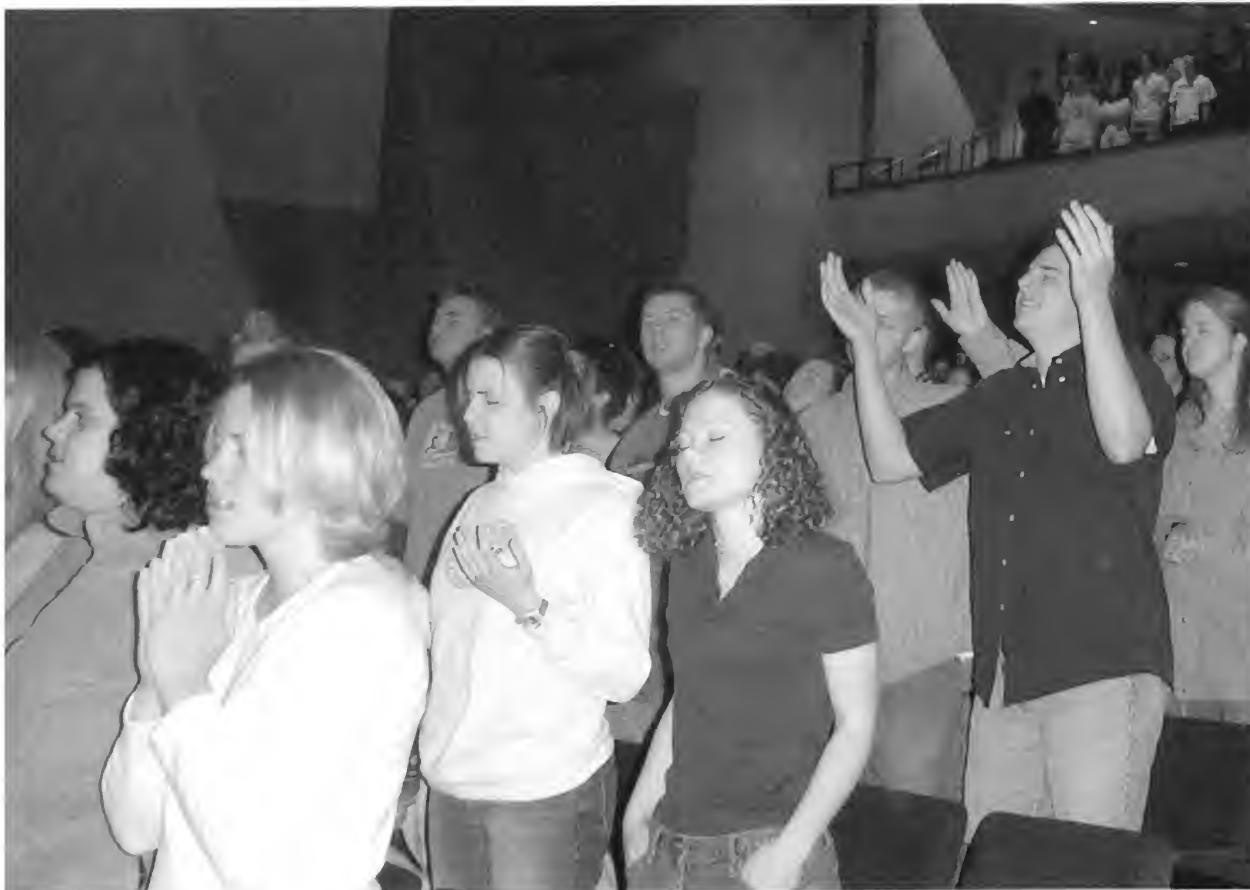

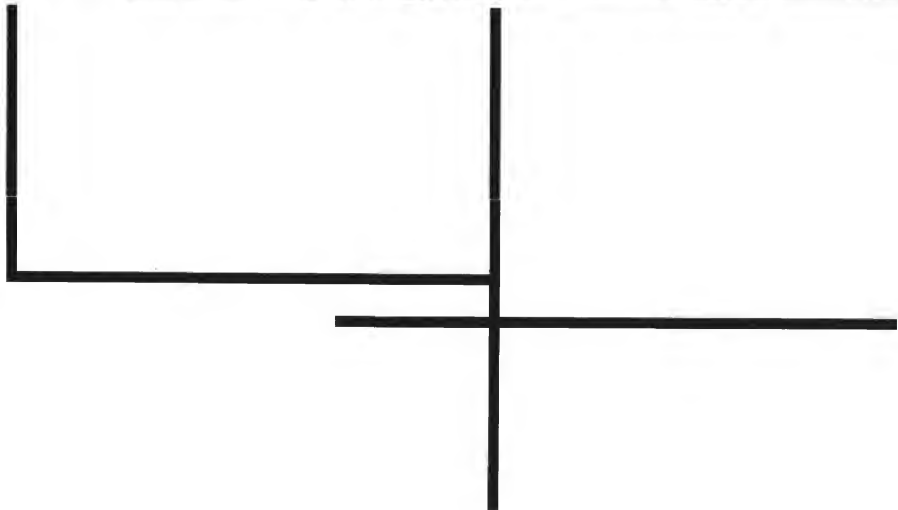

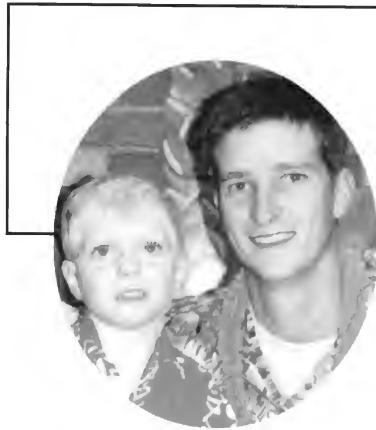

Thompson and Nicole Prazeau, a trio of seniors who earned All-Conference honors, all 15 players made contributions to the success of the team.

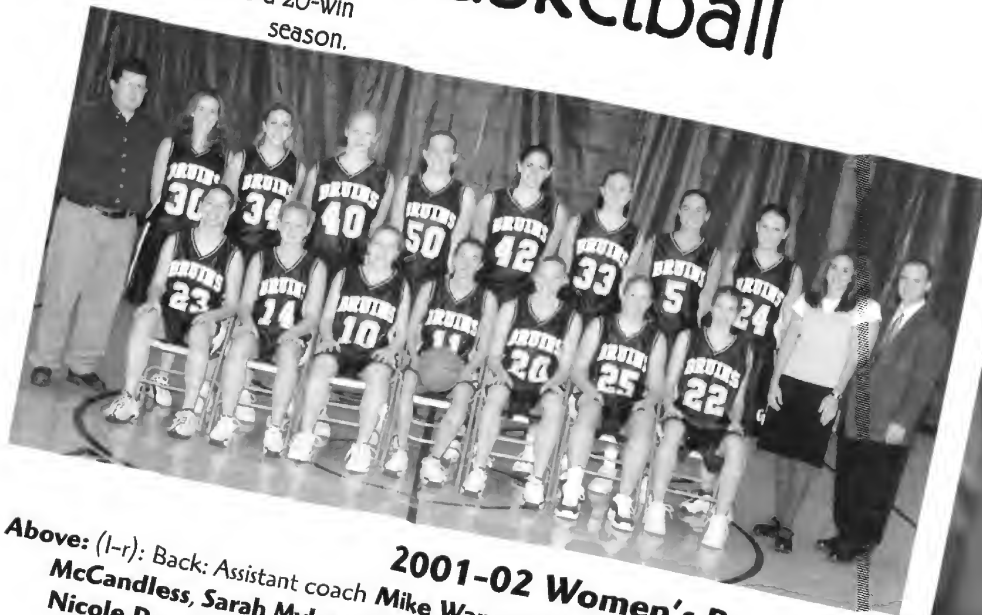

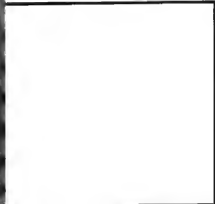
