Read Proverbs 10:11-12, 17:9, 18:13, 15:1, 16:24, 26:28. What do those verses say to you?

On Sunday, I gave the advice to Talk Less, Listen More, Understand Pain (specifically how pain works and how it is affecting the people around you) and to be Gracious when giving Truth. Do you know anyone who regularly lives this out? Have you encountered anyone who brought you words of healing?
