Going Deeper

As we will see in this book, Paul writes Corinthians from a place of frustration. The church in Corinth is messed up in many ways, they are accepting immorality, they are racists, they are abusing the poor, and they are even rejecting Paul's authority. Why is Paul able to thank God for them in verses 4-9? How does Paul see them?

The problems in Corinth are the result of the church people focusing on the wrong things. They have been focusing on which teacher has the best teaching and other unimportant issues. We have those same problems in churches today, but what should church people focus on?

Paul's final words in chapter 1 are borderline insulting to the church. He's really trying to drive home the point that they, by themselves, are foolish nothings, but that in Christ, they are recipients of power and wisdom. Read 26-31 again. In light of that and the rest of the chapter, what is your takeaway from 1 Corinthians 1?



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
