## CONFIDENCE - 2 CORINTHIANS 10 (P. 545)

## 2 Corinthians 10:1-2

What do you notice from these verses?

Paul speaks of himself being gentle and humble, but then he offers a kind of threat. What do you think of that?

#### 2 Corinthians 10:3-6

Keep this passage in context. Paul is speaking about fighting a battle, but in the context of the letter, what does he mean? Against whom or what is that battle?

People have a tendency to see these words as Paul referring to a kind of spiritual warfare, but the battle is against human reasoning. Other people see this as a reference to Christian apologetics, but the weapons are to be spiritual. In many of Paul's letters he talks about using some spiritual power against human reasoning, and one of those passages is **1 Cor 1:18**. How do these two passages relate?

What do you think Paul means by verse 6, and what do you think of the idea of church "punishment"?

## 2 Corinthians 10:7-11

What do you notice from this section? How would you describe Paul's attitude?
