Read Job 35:4-8, 36:26-32. What do you think his point is here?

How would you summarize what Elihu has been saying?

There's one additional thing Elihu says that's worth talking about. Read Job 36:15-16. What does it mean that God delivers sufferers **IN** their suffering?
