



Abraham Lincoln lived in Illinois for over a quarter of a century. He moved from Indiana to Coles County, Illinois, in 1830, when he was 21 years of age. He remained there only a short time and then located in New Salem. In 1837 he removed to Springfield and practised law there. He was in the Illinois House of Representatives from 1834 to 1842.

Abraham Lincoln was huried in Springfield, in 1865, in Oak Ridge Cemetery. The measurement which Covers has remains was erected in 1864. It is designed by the American Artist, Larkin G. Mead, and cost upwards of \$2010,000. There was great rejoicing at New Salem when the steamer arrived there on this trip. This was the first time a steamer had navigated the Sangamon River.
