





In the final NAIA poll of the season, the Lady Bearcats were ranked 10th in the nation. 





The Procession

At McKendree College, the academic procession is always composed of the candidates At NEKEMETER ORIGE, the academic procession is always composed of the candidates for degrees in course, the faculty, the administration, and certain others who participate in Commencement. The faculty appear in order of rank (Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Instructor, Lecturer) with the Professors at the head of the group followed in that order by the other four ranks.

The candidates for degree-in-course represent those who have completed requirements for either the Bachlor of Arts or the Bachelor of Science degree during the 1985-86 Fall Term, Spring Term, and the 1986 Summer Term.

It has become customary for the procession to assemble in front of Stevenson House, the home of the President. The procession then moves through Centennial Gate, up Centennial Walk past the Botthwell Chapel and then into the reserved seating spaces in the southwest area of the campus.

Academic Dress

The attire worn by the candidates for degrees, the faculty, the administration, and others on the occasion of this Commencement has its roots in medieval times. The academic dress has evolved through a long tradition, going back to the medieval univer-sities of Paris, Bologna, Oxford, and Cambridge.

The precise beginnings of the several parts of the academic regalia are hard to determine Nonetheless, since the medieval students enjoyed the status of cleric during their university years, it has been concluded that their attire found its importation in the clerical dress of medieval times. It appears that the gown may be an adaptation of the robe of their first or priest, the hood of the first's cowl, and the motarboard cap of today recalls the skull cap of times when tonsured heads needed protection against the drafty classrooms of

When McKendree College was in her seventh decade of existence, academic atrire first began to appear in the 1890's in the United States. Its use has now become common for college and university functions and its pattern highly uniform.

THE GOWN. There are three gowns: the bachelor's, master's and doctor's. 


Alpha Phi Omega


