








Millikin Students Reach Out to Help



Dr. LaVern J. Meyer



In Like a Lion, Out Like a Lamb


Coach Poelker's squad recorded its 12th winning season in the last 13 years.








Numbers are up

For the third consecutive season, the Millikin women's basketball team has been selected as the season favorite in the CCIW as selected by the conference coaches. And for the past two seasons the Big Blue have been able to live up the expectations with two conference titles and berths in the NCAA Division III national tournament.

Once again the team won it third consecutive CCIW Championship and reached the final 16 in the 64-team NCAA tournament.


Julie Roe led the league in scoring with an average of 20.7 points per game and finished second in rebounding at 10.2 rebounds per game.

Jenny Nichols averaged 19.1 points per game and led the team in free throw percentage with 84.4 percent.

Several school records have been set by this team. Julie Roe set the record for points in a season with 629 and has scored 1,044 points in her career. She ranks 11th on Millikin's all-time scoring list and 10th on the all-time rebounding list with 551. Roc also set the MU record for free throws in a season with 153 and the record for consecutive free throws with 22. Hercareer scoring average of 17.4 points per game ranks second in school history.





Shooting for a goal







Coach Gadbois said, "A considerably better team than last year."


With the return of three time All-American swimmer Brad Cain and five other returning lettermen and the addition of a host of quality freshmen and newcomers, Coach Gadbois had high hopes for a top 20 finish at the NCAA Division III championships. Millikin finished in 20th place at the national meet with 43 points.

Brad Cain earned All-America honors four consecutive seasons and he owns Millikin records in the 500 freestyle, 1650 freestyle and the 100 backstroke. He also won 11 CCIW titles to rank second all-time in the number of conference titles.

Three of Millikin's relay teams also won titles at the CCIW Conference meet: 200 freestyle relay team Cain, Rene Vereecken, Scott Schnurbusch and Mark Potter; and 400 and 800 relay teams of Cain, Vereecken, Schnurbusch and Dave Williams.

In talking about the women's team, "A considerably better team than last year," said Gadbois. The 95-96 women 's team included thirteen letter winners from last season.

Jennifer Winslow recorded three of the teams best times this season and swam a leg on four of the fastest relay times. Ali Sweeney swam the top time in the 100 butterfly and was a member of the team's fastest relays.





Running it up







Putting away
