Well, I have to go now. I have to study for my tests and get an oral report ready for Thursday, so I better get busy. I'll probably be home next weekend. Bye for now.

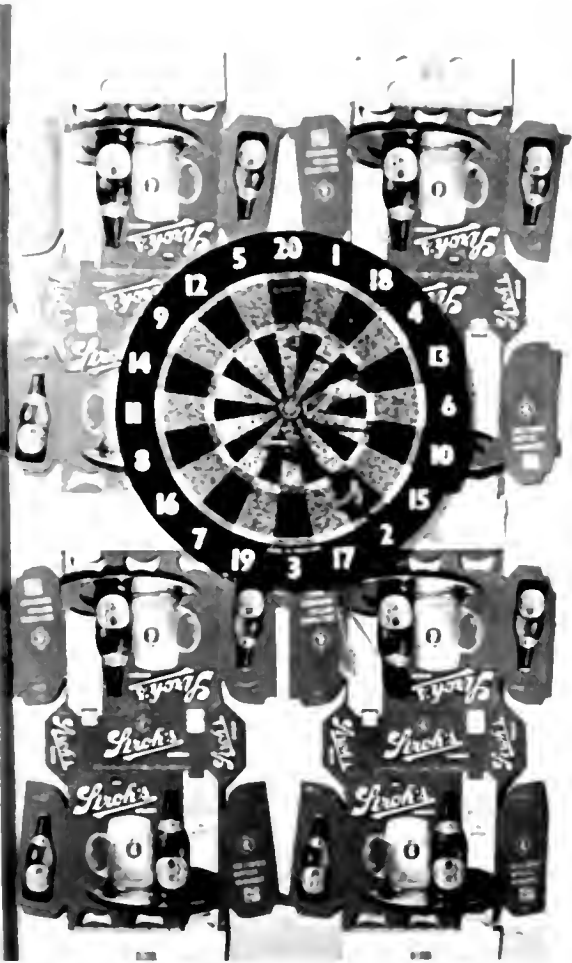

No doubt this same desire prompted your decision to enter College and has also led you to this most important milestone in your life.



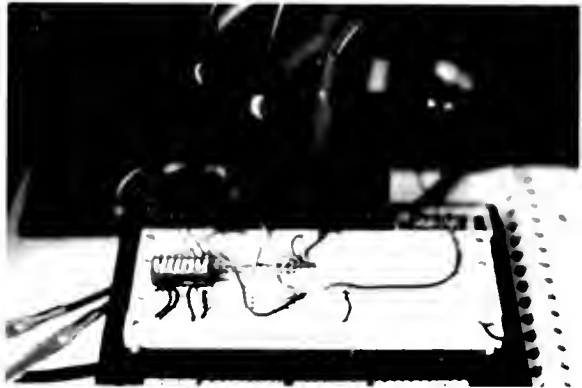


























## **SEA OF LIGHT**

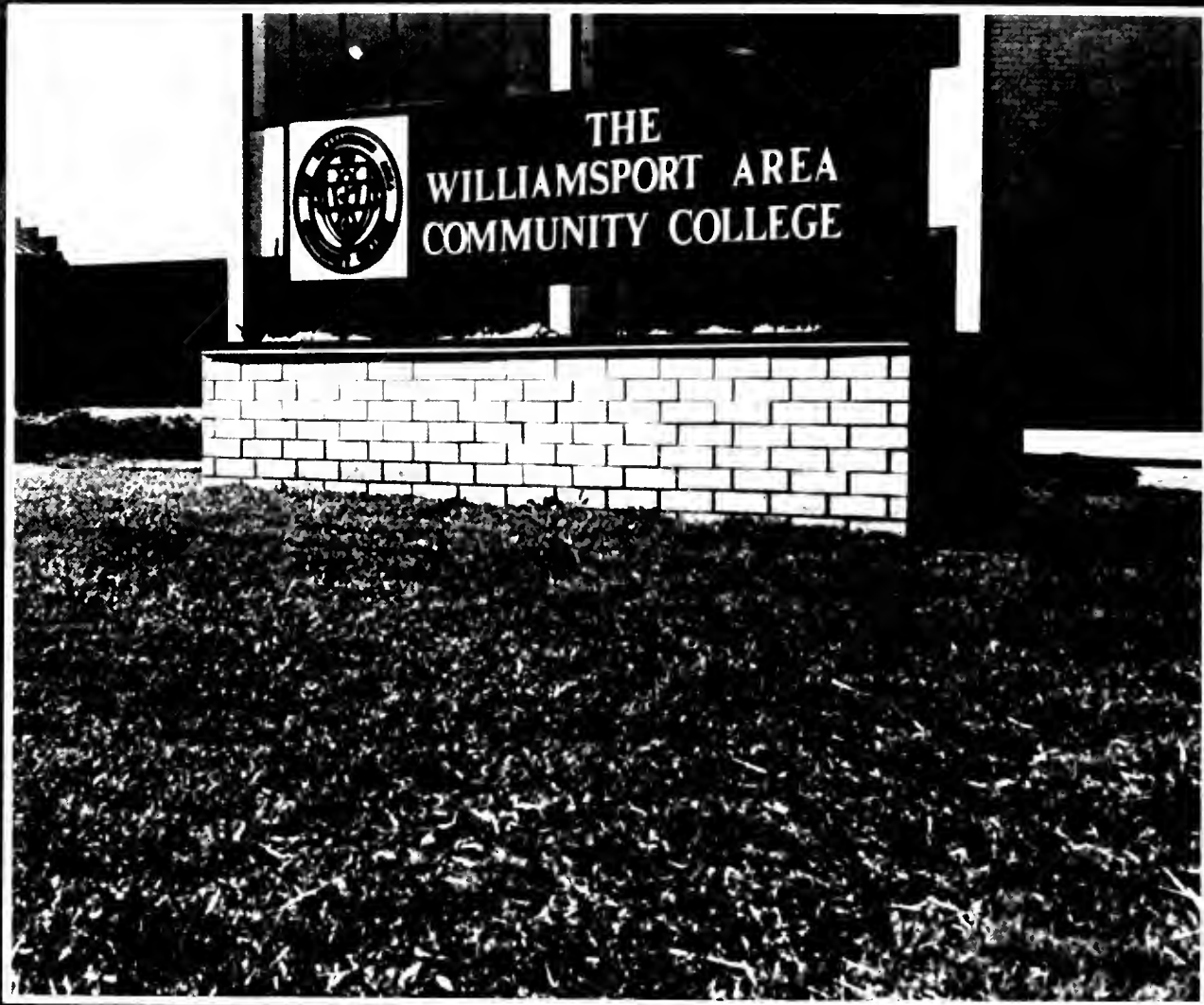








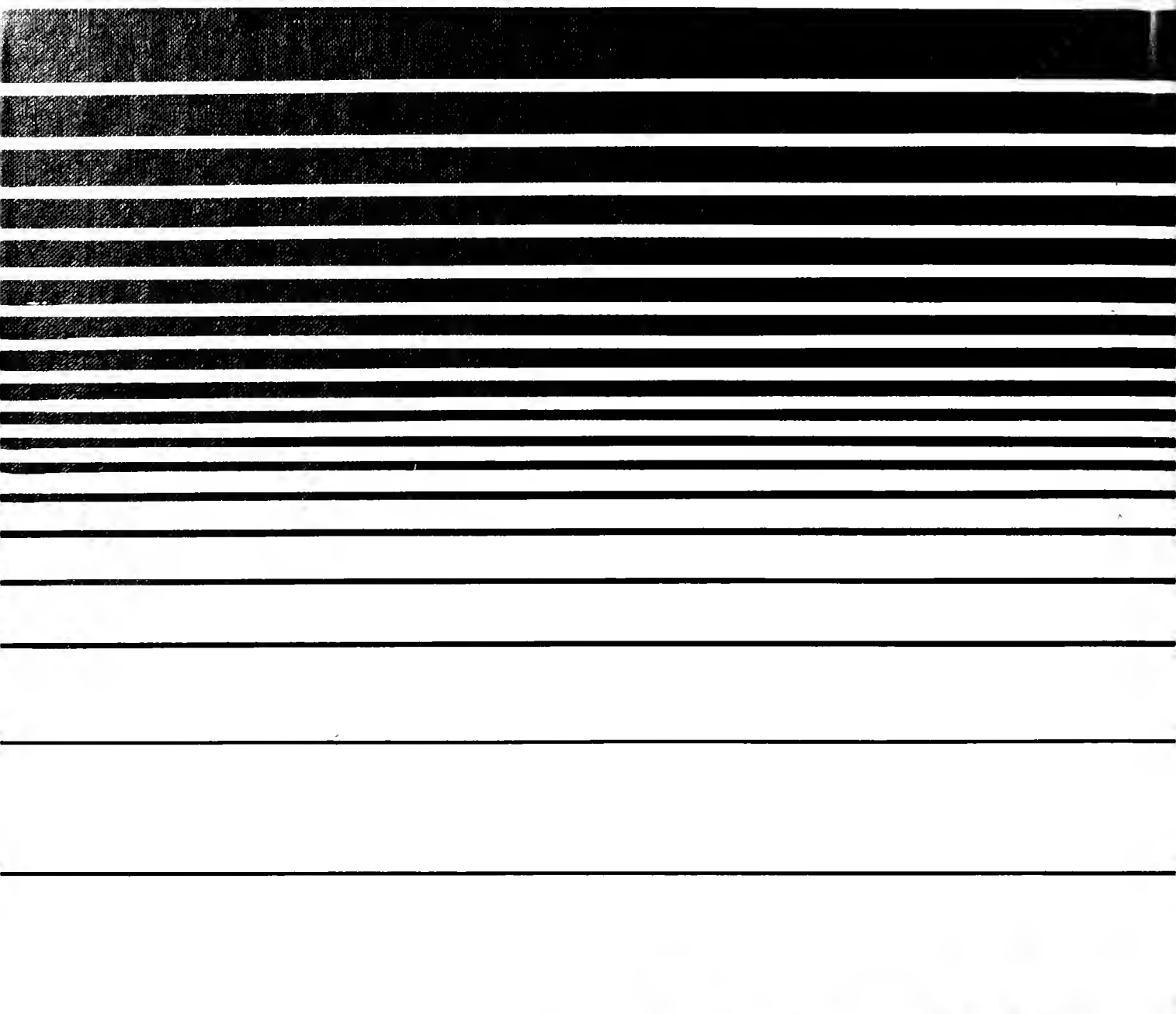
