Fact statement concerning Indianhead incident.

1. Incident occurred on 8/25/16.
2. The incident was reported by the Indianhead foreman Brian Proud, at 3:37 P.M. to Precision safety personnel.

Synopsis:

8/25/2016: What is known is Brian Proud found operator Nicholas Janesich in the cab of a farm tractor he was operating with his bloodied shirt around his head from unknown yet apparent injuries. Mr. Proud asked Mr. Janesich several questions which he answered with short correct responses. Realizing he was injured Mr. Proud gathered another employee and removed Mr. Janesich from the equipment, upon his removal Mr. Janesich displayed symptoms consistent with that of a head injury. (Vomiting and bleeding from nose and eyebrow area.)

8/25/2016: Mr. Janesich was transported by his foreman to Tioga Medical Center in Tioga North Dakota. Due to the nature of the head trauma he was examined and transported to the hospital in Minot N.D. (facility name unknown) for further treatment.

8/25/2016: Indianhead safety personnel was notified by Mr. Proud and preliminary report was sent to Precision Pipeline Safety personnel, and distributed to ETC at 4:50 P.M.

8/26/2016: Indianhead Safety Director Doug Richardson has confirmed that OSHA was contacted per requirement concerning the incident.

8/26/2016: The status of Mr. Janesich has been confirmed to be critical and Indianhead upper management has agreed to update Precision Pipeline as his condition updates become available.

08/26/16: Indianhead management has confirmed that Mr. Janesich was pronounced dead this afternoon.

Precision Pipeline has performed a preliminary investigation and secured the scene of the accident pending possible OSHA investigations. Updates to follow.
