Vandalism Continues By Alleged Klansmen

BALTIMORE, Dec. 14 (AP) — Two more incidents of vandalism by persons claiming to be members of the Ku Klux Klan were reported today in Northwest Baltimore.

Roland L. Hayes of the 4800 block of Park Heights Avenue said that a soft drink bottle was hurled through the front window of his home at about 1 a.m., police said. Inside was a note reading, "You are being watched by the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan."

Viola Starks, 37, of the 3300 block of Avondale Avenue told police that pieces of brick were thrown through her front window and a door glass about an hour earlier.

The vandalism continued alleged threats by the KKK in the area. A burning cross was found early Saturday in the racially mixed neighborhood. The same printed message was attached to a brick there.
