Klansman Loses Job 2-24-74 NAPANOCH, N.Y.—A man claiming to be the head of the Ku Klux Klan in the state has been suspended from his teaching job at an upstate prison fol-lowing a probe into alleged Klan ac-tivity at the facility. Earl Schoonmaker, a teacher for high school equivalency diplomas, said Sunday; They can't get me out of the prison for being a member of the Klan —that's perfectly legal. So they have to look for something under the rug, and this is the best they could come up with."

with." A state corrections department spokesman said the suspension came after an inmate reportedly was asked to make Klaninspired paintings. There were also several suspicious fires in the cells of black and Spanish-speaking prisoners, the spokesman said. The de-
