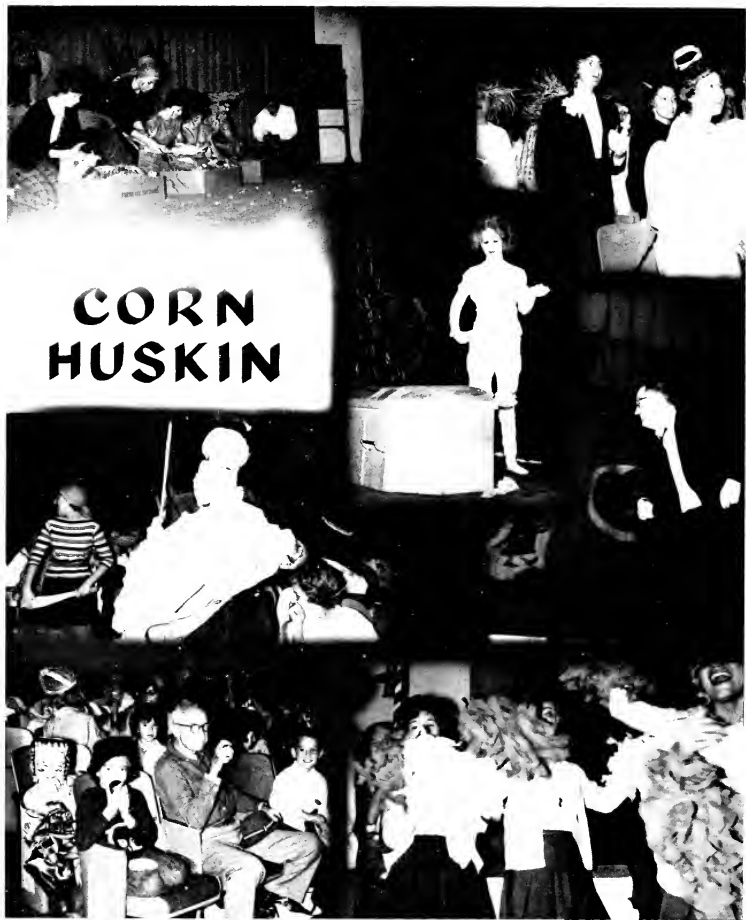




TRADITIONS

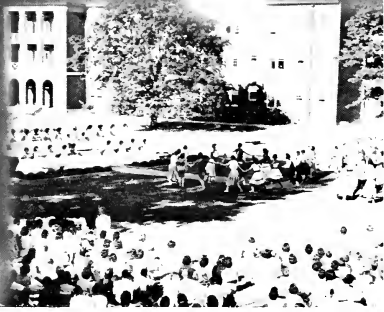
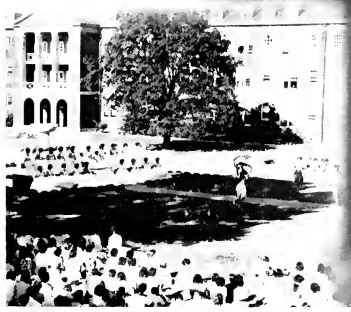
PLAY DAY
