MAITLAND, LIEUT.-GENERAL CHARLES LENNOX BROWNLOW, C.B., col. 1st Batt. Duke of Edinburgh's Regiment since May, 1884; Lieut. Tower of London 1876-84; J.P. Liberty of the Tower, military sec. to his father, General Sir Peregrine Maitland, in Kaffir War, 1846-7; a dep. assist. adjutant-general in Crimea; battles of Alma, Balaklava, Inkerman (dangerously wounded), and siege of Sebastopol (medal); knight Legion Honour, and Medjidie; lieut.-gov. Chelsea Hospital 1869-74; 20TH IN DESCENT FROM HENRY III.; born 27 Sept., 1823.

HENRY III., born 1 Oct., 1206, succeeded when nine years of age; crowned at Gloucester by the Bishops of Winchester and Bath, 28 Oct., 1216, London being then held by Prince Louis of France (who was soon after defeated at Lincoln); was

taken prisoner at the battle of Lewes, 1264, by Simon de Montfort, Earl of Leicester, together with Prince Edward, the Earl of Cornwall, his son Henry, and others; the Prince escaped from Hereford Castle, raised an army, and defeated the Earl of Leicester at the battle of Evesham, and

released the King. In 1269 Prince Edward undertook the Holy War, and to obtain supplies sold Gascony to France for 30,000 marks; died at Westminster 16 Nov., 1272, having married, 14 Jan., 1236, Eleanor, 2nd daughter and co-heir of Raymond Berengar, Count of Provence; she was crowned at Westminster 19th same month, took the veil, and died at Amesbury, Wilts, 25 June, 1291, having had, with other issue, 2 sons,

[1] **Edward** "Longshanks," King of England on the death of his father.

[2] **Edmund**, surnamed "Crouchback," Earl of Chester 1253, Earl of Lancaster 1267, Earl of Leicester and Steward of England 25 Oct., 1274, upon the forfeiture of Simon de Montfort, Earl of Leicester. The title of King of Sicily was bestowed upon him by Pope Alexander VI., but he never obtained possession; he went to the Crusade with his brother Edward, whence the name of Crouchback, afterwards misinterpreted; born 16 Jan., 1245; died during the wars in Gascony, 1296, buried in Westminster Abbey, having married 1st, April, 1269, Aveline, daughter and heir of William de Fortibus, Earl of Albemarle; she died without issue same year. He married 2nd, Blanche, Dowager Queen of Navarre and Countess Palatine of Champagne and Brye, daughter of Robert, Count of Artois (brother to St. Louis, King of France), and had, with other issue, a son,

HENRY, restored to the earldom of Leicester 1324, 3rd Earl of Lancaster and Leicester, and Steward of England on the reversal of his brother's attainder, 1 Edward III., 1327; he was one of the principal leaders in that confederacy which destroyed the power of the Spencers and deposed Edward II.; died 1345, having married Maud, daughter and heir of Sir Patrick Chaworth, and had, with an only son, 6 daughters, of whom

ELEANOR (5th daughter) died at Arundel, 11 Jan., 1372; married 1st, to John, Lord Beaumont, son and heir of Henry de Beaumont, Earl of Buchan, in Scotland, and had an only son, Henry, lineal ancestor of Beaumont of Coleorton and Grace Dieu, co. Leic. (see Foster's *Baronetage*, and page 367 of this work)

She re-married in 1345, as 2nd wife to Richard FitzAlan, 9th earl of Arundel (ancestor of the Dukes of Norfolk, Earls of Berkeley, &c.); restored to the earldom (forfeited by his father's attainer) 4 Edward III., 1331; made his will 5 Dec., 1375; he died at Arundel, 24 Jan., 1375-6; buried at Lewes, and had, with 4 daughters, 3 sons, of whom the 2nd, viz.,

SIR JOHN DE ARUNDELL (adopted this surname instead of FitzAlan), Marshal of England upon the resignation of Percy, earl of Northumberland; had summons to parliament, 1, 2, and 3, Richard II.; made his will 26 Nov., 1379, in which he styles himself Sir John de Arundel, Knt., and desires to be buried in the Priory of Lewes; drowned off the coast of Ireland 15 Dec., 1379; *inquis. post-mortem*, 3 Rich. II.; married Alianor, daughter of John Maltravers, and granddaughter and (38 Ed. III.) co-heir of John Lord Maltravers; she died 10 Jan., 1405, having re-married as 2nd wife to Reginald, Lord Cobham, of Sterborough Castle, Surrey; he died 6 July, 4 Henry IV., 1403. Sir John de Arundell had 5 sons and 2 daughters.

[1] Sir John Arundell, Ch'r, Lord Maltravers in right of his mother, but never summoned, was in the Scottish wars of Ric. II., 1383; born 3 Nov., 1364; died 14 Aug., 1390; buried in Missenden Abbey. He married Elizabeth, daughter of Edward, Lord le Despencer, K.G.; she died 11 April, 1408, having (re-married as 2nd wife to Sir William la Zouche, of Harringworth, Knt., who died 13 May, 19 Richard II., 1396, leaving issue by a former wife) had 3 sons, of whom the eldest, John, became Earl of Arundell.

[2] Sir William Arundell, K.G., governor of Rochester Castle; made his will 1 Aug., 1400, to be buried in the priory at Rochester; names his "carnal brother, Sir Richard Arundell, Knt.," &c.

[3] Thomas, *alias* Edward, living 1375.

[4] Henry, living 1375.

[5] **Sir Richard**, of whom presently.

[6] Joan, wife of Echyngham.

[7] Margaret, married, before 1397, to William, Lord Roos, K.G., who died Sept., 1414.

SIR RICHARD ARUNDELL, Knt., lord of the manor of Wychampton, Dorset; governor of Bamborough Castle, Northumberland, and of the castle and city of Rochester; distinguished himself at the tournament at Smithfield, held in honour of the coronation of Isabel of France, after her marriage with Richard II., &c.; in the retinue of the King at the siege of Agincourt; mentioned in the will of Sir William Arundell, his brother, 1400, and in that of Agnes his widow 1401; made his first will 5

July, 8 Henry V., and the second 8 July, 1417, desires to be buried in the chapel of the Blessed Mary in the Abbey of Rochester; he died 3 June, 1419; married Alicia, relict of Roger Burley; she died 2 Aug., 1436, having had 3 daughters,

[1] Philippa Arundell, died s.p. before 5 Edward IV.

[2] Joan (2nd daughter and co-heir), married to Sir Thomas Willoughby, of Parham, Suffolk, "Bellator egregius," and had, with a daughter, 2 sons, of whom the elder.

Sir Robert Willoughby, of whom presently.

[3] Alianor (3rd daughter and co-heir) had the manor of Brandon; married to Sir William St. George, who died without issue, 11 Ed. IV., 1472.

SIR ROBERT WILLOUGHBY, was found to be next heir male to Robert, Lord Willoughby, who died 30 Henry VI.; married Cecily, 2nd daughter of Lionel, Lord Welles, K.G.; and died 30 May, 5 Edward IV., 1465, seized of the manors of Wychampton, &c., &c. He had at least 2 sons.

[1] Sir Robert Willoughby, Knt., died 24 or 27 March, 7 Edward IV., 1467, being in ward to the King.

[2] Sir Christopher Willoughby, K.B., aged 14 at his brother's death; had livery of his lands 14 Edward IV., Knight of the Bath at the coronation of Richard III.; made his will 1 Nov., 1498, proved 13 July following; married Margery, daughter of Sir William Jenney, of Knotteshall, Suffolk Knt., had 5 sons and 3 daughters.

(1) **William**, 8th Lord, of whom presently.

(2) Christopher, ancestor of Lord Willoughby, of Parham (see Foster's *Peerage*.)

(4) Thomas, Chief Justice of Common Pleas, ancestor of Lord Middleton (see Foster's *Peerage*.)

WILLIAM, 8TH LORD WILLOUGHBY, of Eresby, K.B.; had summons to parliament 17 Oct., 1 Henry VIII., 1509, to 15 April, 14 Henry VIII., 1523; had a special livery of his father's lands 19 Henry VII.; and in 24 Henry VII., upon the failure of issue male of Lord Welles, he was found to be one of his co-heirs; a Knight of the Bath at the coronation of Henry VIII.; served in the wars with France, 3 and 5 Henry VIII., at the taking of Therouenne, and at the siege of Tournay; made his will 4 May, 16 Henry VIII.; died at Hertford 19 or 27 Oct., 17 Henry VIII., 1525; buried at Mettingham, Suffolk; married 1st, Mary, daughter of Sir William Hussey, of Sleaford, Knt.; she died s. p., and he married 2nd, Donna Maria de la Salinas, daughter of Don Diego Lopez, Sarmiento, Count

de Salinas; she accompanied the Infanta, Katherine of Arragon, into England on her marriage with Arthur, Prince of Wales, and was one of her maids of honour after her marriage with Henry VIII., and had 2 sons and a daughter,

[1] Henry, and [2] Francis, both died young.

[3] Catherine, Baroness Willoughby of Eresby, daughter and co-heir; died 22 Oct., 1580; her wardship and marriage was granted to Charles Brandon, Duke of Suffolk, in 20 Henry VIII., whose fourth wife she became; he died 21 Aug. 1545, leaving by her 2 sons.

(1) Henry (Brandon), and

(2) Charles (Brandon), both died at Bugden, Hunts, 14 July, 1551.

CATHERINE, Duchess of Suffolk, re-married 1553, to Richard Bertie, of Edenham (son of Thomas Bertie, of Bersted, Kent, who had a grant of arms from Hawley, Clarendieux), fellow of Corpus Christi Coll., Oxon, M.A.; bred to the bar; sheriff of Lincoln 1564; made his will 23 Feb., 1581-2, died 9 April, 1582, aged 64, and had, with an only daughter, an only son.

PEREGRINE BERTIE, 10TH LORD WILLOUGHBY OF ERESBY, claimed and was allowed the barony; had summons to Parliament 16 Jan., 1581, to 24 Oct., 1597; admitted to Gray's Inn 1573; general of the forces in the Netherlands 30 Elizabeth; governor of Berwick at his death; born at Wesel, in the duchy of Cleve, Germany, 12 Oct., 1555; made his will at Berwick 7 Aug., 1599, proved 12 Sept., 1601; married Mary, daughter of John Vere, Earl of Oxford, and sister and heir of Edward, 17th Earl of Oxford; she died 1624, having had, with other issue, a son,

ROBERT BERTIE, 11TH LORD WILLOUGHBY, had summons to Parliament from 5 Nov., 3 James I., 1605, to 17 May, 1 Charles I., 1625, Knight of the Bath 5 Jan., 1604; admitted to Gray's Inn 1605; Lord Great Chamberlain of England; created Earl of Lindsey, co. Lincoln, 22 Nov., 1626; K.G. April, 1631; Lord High Admiral 11 Charles I.; governor of Berwick, 1639; general of the King's forces 22 Aug., 1642; slain at Edge Hill fight 23 Oct., 1642, aged 60; buried at Edenham; married Elizabeth, only child of Edward, 1st Lord Montagu of Boughton, Northants, K.B.; she died 30 Nov., 1654, having had, with other issue, a son,

MONTAGU, 2ND EARL OF LINDSEY, K.G., Lord Great Chamberlain; had summons to Parliament by writ in his father's barony of Willoughby 31 Oct., 1640; Knight of

the Bath at the coronation of Charles I., 1625, and gentleman of the bedchamber; capt. of the King's guards, 1639; was at both battles of Newbury and at the battle of Naseby, &c.; P.C. to Charles II.; lord lieutenant of Lincolnshire 1660; K.G. 1 April, 1661; died 25 July, 1666, aged 58; buried at Edenham; he married 1st, Martha, widow of John Ramsay, Earl of Holderness, daughter of Sir William Cockayne, of Rushton Northants, Knt.; he married 2nd, Bridget, daughter and sole heir of Edward Wray, groom of the bedchamber to James I., and by her had a son, James, summoned to Parliament as Baron Norreys 1675, and created Earl of Abingdon, 1682 (see Foster's *Peerage*). By his 1st wife he had, with other issue, a son,

ROBERT, 3RD EARL OF LINDSEY, Lord Great Chamberlain; of the Privy Council, 12 Dec., 1666, lord lieutenant of Lincolnshire 1684, recorder of Lincoln; died 8 May, 1701; buried at Edenham; he married 1st, Mary, daughter and co-heir of John Massingberd, of London, merchant; he married 2nd, Elizabeth, daughter of Philip, Lord Wharton; she was buried at Spilsby, 10 Oct., 1689; he married 3rd, Elizabeth, widow of Sir Francis Henry Lee, of Ditchley, Oxon, Bart., daughter and heir of Thomas Pope, Earl of Downe; she died 1 July, 1719; buried at Edenham. By his 2nd wife he had, with other issue, a son.

ROBERT, 4TH EARL OF LINDSEY, Lord Great Chamberlain; M.P. Boston 1685-7, 1689, and Preston 1690; summoned to Parliament in the barony of Willoughby in his father's lifetime by writ 19 April, 1690; created Marquis of Lindsey 21 Dec., 1706, and Duke of Ancaster and Kesteven 26 July, 1715, with remainder to the heirs male of the body of his father by his wife Elizabeth Wharton; lord lieutenant of Lincolnshire; P.C. to William III., Queen Anne, and George I.; born 20 Oct., 1660; died 26 July, 1723; married 1st, 30 July, 1678, Mary, daughter of Sir Richard Wynne, of Gwydyr, Carnarvon, Bart.; she died 20 Sept., 1689; he married 2nd, Albinia, daughter of Major-Gen. William Farrington, of Chislehurst, and had issue; (she re-married 6 April, 1726, to James Douglas, M.P., Clerk of the

Green Cloth to the Prince of Wales, and died 29 July, 1745, aged 46). By his 1st wife the Duke had a son and successor.

PEREGRINE, 2ND DUKE OF ANCASTER AND KESTEVEN, Lord Great Chamberlain; Vice-Admiral 1702; D.C.L., 1702; P.C. 1708; M.P., Lincolnshire, 1708-10, 1710-13, 1713-15; summoned to Parliament in his father's lifetime in the barony of Willoughby, by writ 16 March, 1714-15; lord lieutenant, Lincolnshire, 1733; lord warden of the forests north of Trent 1734; born 29 April, 1686; died 1 Jan., 1742-3; married Jane, daughter and co-heir of Sir John Brownlow, of Belton, Bart.; she died 25 Aug., 1736, having had, with other issue, a daughter,

LADY JANE BERTIE (3rd daughter) died ; married 1760, to General Edward Mathew, lieutenant-governor Island of Nevis ; governor of Grenada 1784-9; col. 62nd foot; general 1797; commander-in-chief West Indies; entered the Coldstream guards 1745; equerry to George III.; commanded a brigade of guards in America 1775 (son of General William Matthew); died 25 Dec., 1805, aged 78, having had a son and 3 daughters (a).

[1a] Brownlow (Bertie-Mathew), assumed the additional surname of Bertie in accordance with the testamentary injunction of the Duke of Ancaster; born ; died 29 April (? Sept.), 1826; married 2 April, 1807, Harriet Anne, daughter of North Naylor, Esq., H.E.I.C.S. (by his wife —, sister of Admiral Sir Albemarle Bertie, Bart., K.C.B.); she died, having had 3 sons and 5 daughters.

Jane Anna Elizabeth (Austen), died 1 Sept., 1872; married, 8 Nov., 1814, to Rev. Benjamin Lefroy, Rector of Ashe, Hants (3rd son of Rev. Isaac Peter

George Lefroy, of Ashe); he died 27 Aug., 1829, having had a son and six daughters.

(1) George Benjamin Austen (Lefroy), civil service, born 18 May, 1818, married 17 Nov., 1853, Emma, daughter of Thomas Cracroft, Esq., of and has 2 sons and 4 daughters.

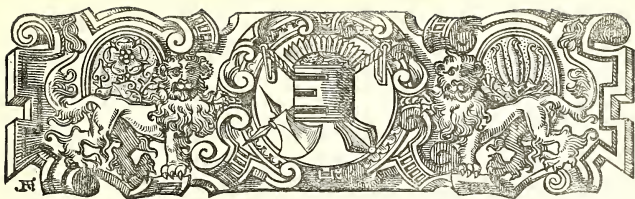

EDWARD III., KING OF ENGLAND, Earl of Chester, 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon Hill

1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England, and Lord of Ireland," and quartered the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of Cressy 26 Aug., 1346; 17 Oct. following the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years; his descendant,

EDWARD III., KING OF
 ENGLAND, Earl of Chester 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon Hill,

1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England, and Lord of Ireland," and quartered the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of

Cressy 26 Aug., 1346; 17 Oct. following the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years. Instituted the order of the Garter 1349. His son, the BLACK PRINCE, defeated the French at the battle of Poitiers, 19 Sept., 1356, and brought King John prisoner to London, where he remained nearly five years (for further particulars, see *Royal Lineage*, Foster's *Peerage*). The King died at Sheen, Surrey, 21 June, 1377, having had, with other issue,

EDMUND OF LANGLEY, 5th son, born at King's Langley, Herts, 5 June, 1341; Lord of Tindale, K.C., Earl of Cambridge by charter 13 Nov. 1362; constable of Dover Castle; warden of the Cinque Ports, 12 July, 1376; a commissioner during the tutelage of his nephew Richard II.; commanded an army in Portugal in support of the claim of John of Gaunt to the throne of Castile, 1381; created DUKE OF YORK 6 Aug. 1385; Warden of the kingdom during the King's absence in Ireland, 1394-5; died at Langley, 1 Aug. 1402, married 1st, 1372, Isabel, younger daughter and co-heir of Peter (the Cruel), King of Castile and Leon; her will dated 6 Dec. (6 Rich. II.), 1382. The Duke married 2ndly, Joane, daughter of Thomas Holland, Earl of Kent; she re-married 1st, to William, Lord Willoughby of Eresby; 2ndly, to Henry, Lord Scrope; and lastly, to Henry Bromflete, Lord Vescy, for which marriage they had a pardon 14 Aug. 4 Hen. V.; she died s. p. By his 1st wife the Duke of York had with 2 sons an only daughter.

CONSTANCE, married to the ill-fated Thomas, 6th Baron Le Despencer, two years old at his father's death, had summons to parliament 30 Nov. (20 Richard II.), 1396; and 18 July

(21 Richard II.), 1397; in the latter year he obtained the reversal of the Act of Parliament, declaring his ancestors, Hugh 3rd and Hugh 4th Barons, traitors. Created Earl of Gloucester, 29 Sept. 1397 (by virtue of his descent from Hugh le Despencer by his wife Eleanor, daughter and co-heir of Gilbert de Clare, Earl of Gloucester, by his wife, Joan of Acre, daughter of Edward I.); Richard II. granted him several manors, and he shared the misfortunes of that monarch, for he was degraded in the 1st Parliament of Henry IV.; was captured at Bristol when attempting to escape from the kingdom, and beheaded by the rabble in the market-place 16 Jan., 1400, had with other issue a daughter.

ISABEL LE DESPENCER, sister and eventually (1414) sole heir of Richard Le Despencer; born (posthumous) at Cardiff, 26 July, 1400; died 26 Dec., 1440; made her will 1 Dec., 1439, proved 4 Feb., 1439-40; to be buried at Tewkesbury; she married 1st, "on the day of the Seven Sleepers," 27 July, 1411, to Richard Beauchamp, Lord Bergavenny, though his name does not appear among the barons of Parliament in 1417 and 1419; created Earl of Worcester 1420 (son of William, Lord Beauchamp de Bergavenny by his wife Joane daughter of Richard, and co-heir of her brother Thomas, Earls of Arundel); he died 1422, being mortally wounded at Meaux, in France; buried at Tewkesbury; she re-married to her husband's cousin, Richard Beauchamp, 5th Earl of Warwick, K.G., by whom she also had issue; he died 30 April, 1438; by her 1st husband, the Earl of Worcester, she had an only daughter,

ELIZABETH BEAUCHAMP, Baroness Bergavenny, or Baroness Beauchamp of Bergavenny; born at Hanley Castle, co. Worcester, 16 Dec. 1415; died 18 June, 1447; buried at the Carmelites, Coventry; married before 1426, as 1st wife, to Sir Edward Neville (6th son of Ralph, 1st Earl of Westmorland, though 4th son by his 2nd wife, Joan Beaufort, daughter of John of Gaunt); had livery with his wife of the lands, but *not* of the castle of Bergavenny, 14 Henry VI.; knighted by John, Duke of Bedford, at Leicester, Whitsuntide, 4 Henry VI, with his brothers, William and George

Nevill (Lord Latimer), and the king himself; had summons to parliament as a baron from 5 Sept. (29 Henry VI.), 1450, to 19 Aug. (12 Edward IV.), 1472; in 10 Edward IV. he was a commissioner of array for Kent to oppose the Duke of Clarence and the Earl of Warwick; he married 2ndly (dispensation 15 Oct., 1448), Catherine Howard, sister of John, first Duke of Norfolk (see vol. i. page 5); and died 18 Oct., 1476, leaving by his first wife, with other issue, a son.

SIR GEORGE NEVILL, Lord Bergavenny; had livery of the lands of his father and mother, 12 Jan. (16 Edward IV.), 1476-7; one of the barons at the coronation of Richard III.; served in the wars in France; knighted for his services at the battle of Tewkesbury by Edward IV. at Barton, 9 May, 1471; had summons to parliament 15 Nov., 1482, to 12 Aug., 1492; born at Raby Castle, co. Durham, 1440; died 20 Sept., 1492; buried at Lewes Priory, Sussex; will dated 1 July, 1491; proved 1492 (see *Testamenta Vetusta*, page 406); he married 1st, Margaret, daughter and heir of Sir Hugh Fenne, of Sculton Burdeleys, Norfolk, and of Braintree, Essex, treasurer of the household to Henry VI.; she died 28 Sept., 1485. His widow, Elizabeth, made her will 14 April (proved 19 June), 1500 describing herself as of Berghdenne, parish of Chartham, Kent, widow, and naming her 4 husbands; her 2nd was Richard Naylor, citizen of London, her 3rd Robert Bassett, and her last husband John Stokker, Lord Bergavenny had by his 1st wife with 3 daughters 5 sons.

in the Tower, and 3 Jan. indicted for "devising to maintain, promote and advance one Reginald Pole, late dean of Exeter, enemy to the king beyond the sea, and to deprive the king," was attainted and beheaded on Tower Hill 9th of same month, 1538-9; married Eleanor, widow of Ralph, 8th Lord Scrope, of Masham, daughter of Andrew, Lord Windsor, and had with 3 sons 4 daughters, of whom the eldest, viz. :—

CATHERINE, married 1stly to ——— Royden, and, 2ndly, to Clement Throckmorton, of Haseley, Warwick, sewer to the Queen temp. Henry VIII. ; a commander at the siege of Boulogne, 1544 (son of Sir George Throckmorton, co. Warwick, by Katherine Vaux, also of royal descent); he died 19 Oct., 1594 (? 18 Oct., 1599), having had 6 sons and 7 daughters.

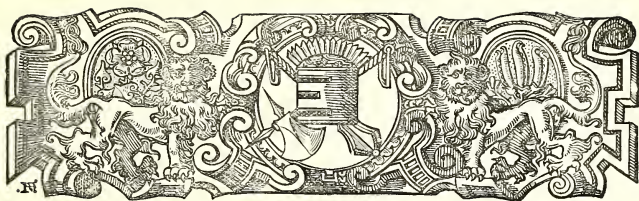

in Westminster Abbey; by his 1st wife, Eleanor, daughter of Ferdinand III., king of Castile, who died 27 Nov., 1290, he had, with other issue, a daughter,

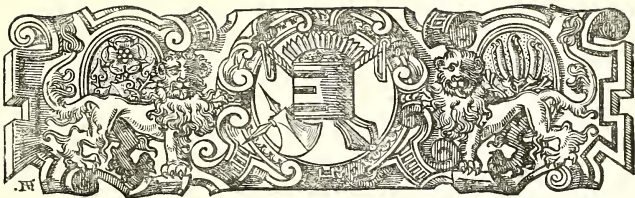

EDWARD III., KING OF ENGLAND, Earl of Chester 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon Hill,

1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England, and Lord of Ireland," and quartered the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of Cressy 26 Aug., 1346; 17 Oct. following the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years. Instituted the order of the Garter 1349. His son, the BLACK PRINCE, defeated the French at the battle of Poitiers, 19 Sept., 1356, and brought King John prisoner to London, where he remained nearly five years (for further particulars, see *Royal Lineage*,

Foster's *Peerage*). The King died at Sheen, Surrey, 21 June, 1377, having had, with other issue,

EDMUND OF LANGLEY, 5th son, born at King's Langley, Herts, 5 June, 1341; Lord of Tindale, K.G., Earl of Cambridge by charter 13 Nov. 1362; constable of Dover Castle; warden of the Cinque Ports, 12 July, 1376; a commissioner during the tutelage of his nephew Richard II.; commanded an army in Portugal in support of the claim of John of Gaunt to the throne of Castile, 1381; created DUKE OF YORK 6 Aug. 1385; Warden of the kingdom during the King's absence in Ireland, 1394-5; died at Langley, 1 Aug. 1402, married 1st, 1372, Isabel, younger daughter and co-heir of Peter (the Cruel), King of Castile and Leon; her will dated 6 Dec. (6 Rich. II.), 1382. The Duke married 2ndly, Joane, daughter of Thomas Holland, Earl of Kent; she re-married 1st, to William, Lord Willoughby of Eresby; 2ndly, to Henry, Lord Scrope; and lastly, to Henry Bromflete, Lord Vesey, for which marriage they had a pardon 14 Aug. 4 Hen. V.; she died s. p. By his 1st wife the Duke of York had with 2 sons an only daughter.

CONSTANCE, married to the ill-fated Thomas, 6th Baron Le Despencer, two years old at his father's death, had summons to parliament 30 Nov. (20 Richard II.), 1396; and 18 July (21 Richard II.), 1397; in the latter year he obtained the reversal of the Act of Parliament, declaring his ancestors, Hugh 3rd and Hugh 4th Barons, traitors. Created Earl of Gloucester, 29 Sept. 1397 (by virtue of his descent from Hugh le Despencer by his wife Eleanor, daughter and co-heir of Gilbert de Clare, Earl of Gloucester, by his wife, Joan of Acre, daughter of Edward I.); Richard II. granted him

several manors, and he shared the misfortunes of that monarch, for he was degraded in the 1st Parliament of Henry IV.; was captured at Bristol when attempting to escape from the kingdom, and beheaded by the rabble in the market-place 16 Jan., 1400, had with other issue a daughter.

ISABEL LE DESPENCER, sister and eventually (1414) sole heir of Richard Le De Spencer; born (posthumous) at Cardiff, 26 July, 1400; died 26 Dec., 1440; made her will 1 Dec., 1439, proved 4 Feb., 1439-40; to be buried at Tewkesbury; she married 1st, "on the day of the Seven Sleepers," 27 July, 1411, to Richard Beauchamp, Lord Bergavenny, though his name does not appear among the barons of Parliament in 1417 and 1419; created Earl of Worcester 1420 (son of William, Lord Beauchamp de Bergavenny by his wife Joane daughter of Richard, and co-heir of her brother Thomas, Earls of Arundel); he died 1422, being mortally wounded at Meaux, in France; buried at Tewkesbury; she re-married to her husband's cousin, Richard Beauchamp, 5th Earl of Warwick, K.G., by whom she also had issue; he died 30 April, 1438; by her 1st husband, the Earl of Worcester, she had an only daughter,

ELIZABETH BEAUCHAMP, Baroness Bergavenny, or Baroness Beauchamp of Bergavenny; born at Hanley Castle, co. Worcester, 16 Dec. 1415; died 18 June, 1447; buried at the Carmelites, Coventry; married before 1426, as 1st wife, to Sir Edward Neville (6th son of Ralph, 1st Earl of Westmorland, though 4th son by his 2nd wife, Joan Beaufort, daughter of John of Gaunt); had livery with his wife of the lands, but *not* of the castle of Bergavenny, 14 Henry VI.; knighted by John, Duke of Bedford, at Leicester, Whitsuntide, 4 Henry VI., with his brothers, William and George Nevill (Lord Latimer), and the king himself; had summons to parliament as a baron from 5 Sept. (29 Henry VI.), 1450, to 19 Aug. (12 Edward IV.), 1472; in 10 Edward IV. he was a commissioner of array for Kent to oppose the Duke of Clarence and the Earl of Warwick; he married 2ndly (dispensation 15 Oct., 1448), Catherine Howard, sister of John, first Duke of Norfolk (see page 5); and died 18 Oct.,

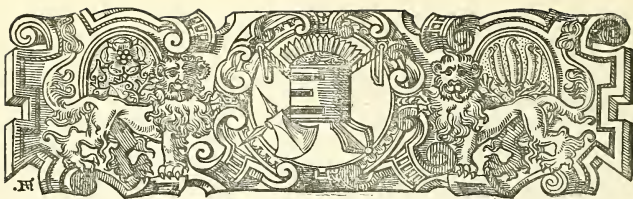

EDWARD III., KING OF ENGLAND, Earl of Chester 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon

Hill, 1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England and Lord of Ireland," and quartered the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of Cressy 26 Aug., 1346; 17 Oct. following, the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years. 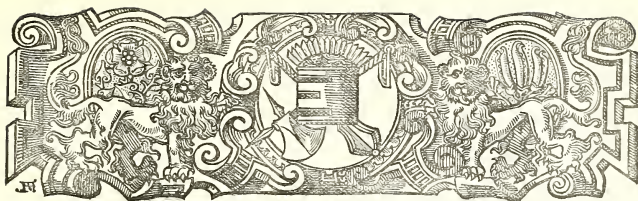

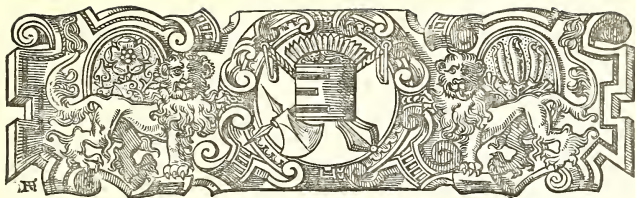

EDWARD I., so named after Edward the Confessor; born at Westminster, 17 June, 1239, knighted at Burgos, 1254, created Earl of Chester; crowned at Westminster, 19 Aug. 1274, king of England, lord of Ireland, duke of Aquitaine; he subdued the principality of Wales 1283, claimed and exercised feudal superiority over Scotland; died at Burgh-on-the-Sands, Cumberland, 7 July, 1307, buried in Westminster Abbey; by his 1st wife, Eleanor, daughter of Ferdinand III., king of Castile, who died 27 Nov., 1290, he had

JOAN OF ACRE, born there 1272; died 10 May, 1305, having married 1st, 2 May, 1290, as 2nd wife to Gilbert de Clare (surnamed "The Red"), Earl of Gloucester and Hertford;

he died at Monmouth Castle, 7 Dec., 1295, she re-married, 1296, to Ralph de Monthermer, who had summons to parliament as Earl of Gloucester and Hertford, in right of his wife 1299-1306, and had issue. JOAN OF ACRE had by her 1st husband, with other issue, a daughter,

MARGARET DE CLARE, 2nd sister and co-heir of Gilbert de Clare, Earl of Gloucester and Hertford (who fell at Bannockburn, 24 June, 1314, s.p.); she married 1st to Sir Piers Gaveston, Earl of Cornwall, to whom Edward II. granted the county of Cornwall by charter, dated at Dumfries, 6 Aug., 1307, summoned to parliament 19 Jan. following; beheaded without form of trial, 1314, leaving an only daughter, who was betrothed to John Moulton, Margaret, Countess of Cornwall, married 2ndly to Hugh de Audley; he had summons to parliament in the lifetime of his father, 1317-21, and 1326-36, and was created Earl of Gloucester by patent, 16 March, 1337; he died without male issue in 1347, and the dignity which was to him and his heirs appears to have been considered extinct; he left an only child,

MARGARET DE AUDLEY, died 7 Sept., 1349, having married to Ralph de Stafford, K.G. (son and heir of Edmund de Stafford, a lord of parliament); summoned to parliament 14 Jan., 10 Edward III., 1337, to 25 Nov., 24 Edward III., 1350; created Earl of the County of Stafford, 5 March, 1351, to hold to him and his heirs; served in the wars in Scotland and in Britany; taken prisoner at the siege of Nantes; seneschal of Aquitaine, 20 Edward III.; had a principal command at the battle of Cressy; one of the founders of the Order of the Garter; lieutenant and captain-general of the duchy of Aquitaine; he died 31 Aug., 1372, having had with other issue, a son,

HUGH DE STAFFORD, K.G., 2nd Earl of Stafford and 3rd baron; was in the retinue of the Black Prince in the French wars; made his will 6 April, 1385; died at Rhodes, on his return from a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, Oct., 1386; married Philippa, daughter of Thomas Beauchamp, Earl of Warwick, and had with other issue, a daughter,

KATHERINE DE STAFFORD, married to Sir Michael de la Pole (son of Michael, attainted earl of Suffolk); on the accession of Henry IV. he was restored to the lands and earldom of his father; he fell at the siege of Harfleur, 18 Sept., 1415 (on Wednesday next after the feast of the Holy Cross); made his will on the preceding 1 July; he had, with other issue, a daughter,

ISABEL DE LA POLE; her will dated 1464, proved 1466; married to Thomas Morley, 5th Baron Morley, heir of his grandfather; had summons to parliament, 15 July, 1427, to 5 July, 1435, in which year he died, leaving an only son and 2 daughters.

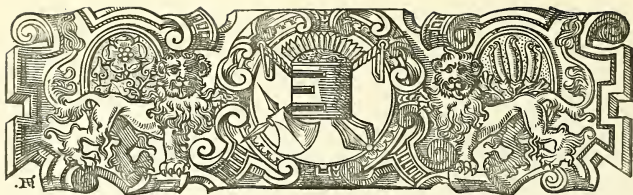

EDWARD I., so named after Edward the Confessor; born at Westminster 17 June, 1239; knighted at Burgos, 1254; created Earl of Chester; crowned at Westminster, 19 Aug., 1274, King of England,

Lord of Ireland, Duke of Aquitaine; he subdued the principality of Wales 1283, claimed and exercised feudal superiority over Scotland; died at Burgh-on-the-Sands, Cumberland, 7 July, 1307; buried in Westminster Abbey; by his 1st wife, Eleanor, daughter of Ferdinand III., King of Castile, who died 27 Nov., 1290, he had, with other issue, a daughter,

ELIZABETH, died 5 May, 1316, aged 32; she married 1st to John, Count of Holland and Zealand, and Lord of Friesland, who died s.p.; she re-married to Humphrey de Bohun, Earl of Hereford and Essex, Lord of Brecknock, and constable of England; served in the

wars against Scotland; taken prisoner at the battle of Stryvelin, 7 Edward II., was exchanged for the wife of Robert Bruce; he fell at the battle of Boroughbridge, Yorks, 16 March, 1321, leaving, with other issue, a son,

WILLIAM DE BOHUN, K.G., created Earl of Northampton 17 March, 1337; one of the heroes of Cressy; served also in the wars with Scotland; married Elizabeth, widow of Edmund de Mortimer, daughter of Bartholomew, —and co-heir of her brother, Giles—de Badlesmere, and had, with other issue, a daughter,

ELIZABETH DE BOHUN, died 3 Feb., 1385; buried at Lewes; married 1359, as 1st wife to Richard, Earl of Arundel and Surrey, K.G., admiral of the west and south 1377, and of England 1386; beheaded in Cheapside 21 Sept., 1397, buried in the Church of the Augustine Friars, in Bread Street; his will dated 4 March, 1392; and had a daughter.

ELIZABETH FITZALAN, (elder sister and co-heir of her brother, Thomas FitzAlan, Earl of Arundel); died 8 July, 3 Henry VI., 1425; married, 1st, to Thomas de Mowbray, created Duke of Norfolk, 1397, and died 27 Sept., 1400, leaving a son and 2 daughters; the Duchess of Norfolk re-married to Sir Robert Goushill, Knt., and had 2 daughters, viz. :—

[1] Elizabeth Goushill, elder daughter and co-heir, married to Sir Robert Wingfield, Knt., and had issue.

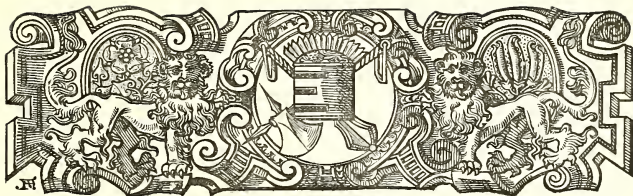

daughter of Ferdinand III., king of Castile, who died 27 Nov., 1290, he had, with other issue, a daughter,

JOAN OF ACRE, born there 1272; died 10 May, 1305, having married 1st, 2 May, 1290, as 2nd wife to Gilbert de Clare (surnamed "The Red"), Earl of Gloucester and Hertford; he died at Monmouth Castle, 7 Dec., 1295; she re-married, 1296, to Ralph de Monthermer, who had summons to Parliament as Earl of Gloucester and Hertford, in right of his wife, 1299-1306, and had issue. **JOAN OF ACRE** had by her 1st husband, with other issue, a daughter

MARGARET DE CLARE, 2nd sister and co-heir of Gilbert de Clare, Earl of Gloucester and Hertford (who fell at Bannockburn, 24 June, 1314, s.p.); she married 1st to Sir Piers Gaveston, Earl of Cornwall, to whom Edward II. granted the county of Cornwall by charter, dated at Dumfries, 6 Aug., 1307; summoned to Parliament 19 Jan. following; beheaded without form of trial, 1314, leaving an only daughter, who was betrothed to John Moulton Margaret, Countess of Cornwall, married 2ndly to Hugh de Audley; he had summons to Parliament in the lifetime of his father, 1317-21, and 1326-36, and was created Earl of Gloucester by patent, 16 March, 1337; he died without male issue in 1347, and the dignity which was to him and his heirs appears to have been considered extinct; he left an only child,

MARGARET DE AUDLEY, died 7 Sept., 1349, having married to Ralph de Stafford, K.G. (son and heir of Edmund de Stafford, a lord of Parliament); summoned to Parliament 14 Jan., 10 Edward III., 1337, to 25 Nov., 24 Edward III., 1350; created Earl of the County

of Stafford, 5 March, 1351, to hold to him and his heirs; served in the wars in Scotland and in Brittany; taken prisoner at the siege of Nantes; seneschal of Aquitaine, 20 Edward III.; had a principal command at the battle of Cressy; one of the founders of the Order of the Garter; lieutenant and captain-general of the duchy of Aquitaine; he died 31 Aug., 1372, having had, with other issue, a daughter,

BEATRIX STAFFORD, married 1st to Maurice Oge, 2nd Earl of Desmond, and had a daughter; she re-married 1368, to Thomas, 5th Lord Roos, of Hamlake, who had summons to Parliament 24 Aug., 1362, to 3 March, 1384, in which year he died, leaving, with other issue, a son,

WILLIAM DE ROOS, 7th Baron, K.G. (on the death of his brother John at Paphos, in the Isle of Cyprus, in 1393); had summons to Parliament 20 Nov., 1394, to 24 Dec., 1413; Lord Treasurer of England, 1404; he married Margaret, younger daughter of Sir John de Arundel, Knight, Marshal of England; he died Sept., 1414, having had, with other issue, a daughter,

MARGARET DE ROOS, married as 1st wife to James Touchet, Lord Audley, who had summons to Parliament as "Jacobo de Audley," from 26 Feb., 1421, to 26 May, 1455; served in the French wars, at the siege of Molyn, on the Seine; lord almoner at the coronation of the King and Queen; at the siege of Meaux, 9 Henry V.; in 8 Henry VI. he had a chief command of some forces in the war with France; he encountered the forces under Richard Nevil, Earl of Salisbury, at Blore Heath, with about 10,000 men, and was there slain, 1458, leaving by his 1st wife a son,

JOHN, LORD AUDLEY; had summons to Parliament 26 May, 1461, to 9 Dec., 1483; had a grant of the stewardship of all the King's manors and lands lying in the county of Dorset, and warden of his forests, chaces, and parks in that county, and of the castle of Wardour, &c.; a commander of the forces in Brittany, 15

Edward IV., and an ambassador to treat for peace; he attended among the barons at the coronation of Richard III.; married Anne, daughter of Sir Thomas Itchingham, and died 26 Sept. (or Dec.), 1491, having had, with 3 daughters, a son,

JAMES, LORD AUDLEY, Knight of the Bath at the creation of Edward, Prince of Wales; had summons to Parliament 12 Aug., 1492, to 16 Jan., 1497; at the siege of Boulogne; he joined the Cornishmen in their insurrection, and was taken prisoner at the battle of Blackheath, 24 June, 1497; he was drawn from Newgate to Tower Hill in his own coat-of-arms, painted on paper, but reversed and torn, and there beheaded, 4 days after; buried in the Blackfriars, near Ludgate; attainted and forfeited; he married 1st, Joan, daughter of Fulke Bouchier, Lord FitzWarren; he married 2ndly, Margaret, daughter of Richard Dayrell, of Lillingston Dayrell, Bucks; his son,

JOHN, LORD AUDLEY, was restored to his father's honours in 4 Henry VIII., 1512; had summons to Parliament 23 Nov., 1514, to 21 Oct., 1556, in 5 Henry VIII.; he was at the taking of Therouenne; had restitution of his father's lands 25 Henry VIII.; he married Mary, daughter of John Griffin, of Braybrooke, Northants, and had a son,

GEORGE, LORD AUDLEY; had summons to Parliament, and took his seat 20 Jan., 1558; married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Bryan Tuke, Knt.; treasurer of the chamber to Henry VIII.; he died 1560, leaving 2 sons, of whom the elder,

HENRY, LORD AUDLEY, never sat in Parliament; was made a Knight Banneret, 7 Oct., 1586, for his distinguished services at the fight before Zutphen, 22 Sept.; he died 1595; married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir William Sneyd, of Bradwell, Staff.; she was buried at Thelwall, 4 Jan., 1610, having had, with 2 sons, 2 daughters, of whom the elder,

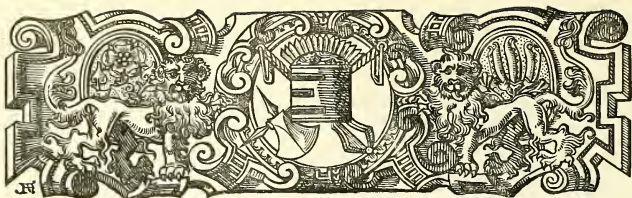

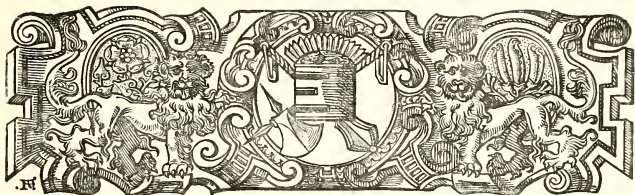

EDWARD III., KING OF ENGLAND, Earl of Chester 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon Hill, 1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England, and Lord of Ireland," and quartered the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of Cressy 26 Aug., 1346; 17 Oct. following the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years. Instituted the Order of the Garter 1349. His son, the **BLACK PRINCE**, defeated the French at

the battle of Poitiers, 19 Sept., 1356, and brought King John prisoner to London, where he remained nearly five years (for further particulars, see *Royal Lineage*, *Foster's Peerage*). The King died at Sheen, Surrey, 11 June, 1377, having had issue; his descendant

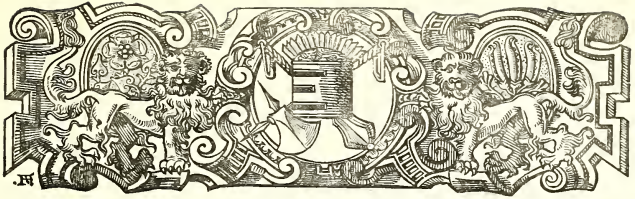

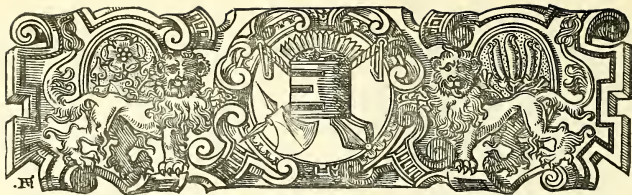

EDWARD III., KING OF ENGLAND, Earl of Chester 1320, Duke of Aquitaine, Count of Ponthieu and Montreuil, 1325; crowned at Westminster in his father's lifetime, 1 Feb., 1327; defeated the Scots at Halidon Hill, 1333. In 1339 he assumed the style of "King of France and England, and Lord of Ireland," and quartered

the arms of France in the first quarter; gained a great naval victory over the French off Sluys, 1340, and won the celebrated battle of Cressy 26 Aug. 1346; 17 Oct. following the Scots were defeated at Neville Cross, and King David II. taken prisoner to London, where he remained nearly 11 years. Instituted the order of the Garter 1349.
