## **First Things First**

#### Getting information before you register

If you have recently been admitted to a degree or certificate program, and are beginning your studies at UMass Boston, you should already have been informed about the process through which you will choose courses and begin registration. If you believe that you need more information, check with the Undergraduate Admissions Office at 617.287.6100 (if you are an undergraduate) or with your program director (if you are a graduate student).

If you are a continuing student enrolled in a degree or certificate program, the University has sent you important information you will need for registration. The information includes your student ID number, your personal identification number (PIN), and your "access period"—that is, the period during which you are eligible to register. As a rule, the more credits you have accumulated, the earlier the access period will begin. If you are concerned because you haven't received this information, check with the Undergraduate Registrar's Office at 617.287.6200 or the Graduate Registrar's Office at 617.287.6401.

You should also be sure, before you register, to discuss your course selections and academic requirements with an appropriate advisor from the University Advising Center or your college, major department, or graduate program.

If you are an undergraduate in the College of Public and Community Service (CPCS) or you want to register for a CPCS instructional activity, please see the information on page 22. Registration procedures for CPCS differ from those described in this publication, and involve advising in the CPCS Student Services Office and on-line registration.

If you want to study at UMass Boston without seeking a degree or certificate, please see the "Information for Non-Degree Students" on page 24. You are welcome to take any course for which you are prepared and in which space is available (for graduate courses, you will need permission from the graduate program director). You may also be able to apply credits you have earned to degree or certificate requirements.

If you want to take an off-campus, Friday evening, or Saturday course, please see the information on page 22. These courses, which are administered by the University's Division of Continuing Education, are like other UMass Boston courses in terms of their substance and applicability to degree requirements, but the registration procedures, charges, and dates for them differ from those for most courses listed in this publication.

If you are neither a citizen nor a permanent resident of the United States, please see "Information for International Students" on page 28.

We encourage you to review course descriptions for all courses you might want to take. You can find them in the UMass Boston *Undergraduate Catalog* and *Graduate Bulletin*, the *Continuing Education Bulletin* (for off-campus and weekend courses), and also at the UMass Boston web site, www.umb.edu. 

## **How to Use the Touch-Tone Registration System**

#### What you can do by phone

#### If you are

- a College of Arts and Sciences undergraduate
- a College of Management undergraduate
- a College of Nursing undergraduate (this college includes the Human Performance and Fitness Department)
- a graduate student
- a continuing undergraduate non-degree student

#### You can

- register for a course or section
- add or drop a course or section after having previously registered
- change the number of credits of a variable-credit course for which you have previously registered

To do so, see "Registering, Adding, and Dropping Procedures" on the next page. Please also review "Adding and Dropping Courses" on page 8.

#### You can also

- register (if you are an undergraduate) to take a course pass/fail, or change pass/fail status to normal status
- withdraw from a course

To do so, see "Pass/Fail and Course Withdrawal Procedures" on page 10. Please also review "Taking Courses Pass/Fail" and "Withdrawing from Courses" on pages 8 and 9.

Please do not use the system to register for undergraduate College of Public and Community Service competencies or instructional activities, or for off-campus, Friday evening, and Saturday courses.

#### What information you will need in order to register

After you have chosen your courses, be sure you know

- your access period (the period during which you can initiate registration, or add and drop courses)
- your student ID number (usually your social security number)
- your PIN (confidential personal identification number)
- the schedule number of each course section, including laboratory and discussion sessions, for which you wish to register. You should also be aware of the number of credits for each course.

#### When to place your call

The touch-tone registration system operates Mondays through Thursdays, 9:00am-9:00pm; Fridays, 9:00am-4:45pm; and Sundays, 10:00am-9:00pm. The system is not available on Saturdays.

To record your original registration choices (and avoid a \$50 late registration fee),

- if you are a continuing student, call after your access period begins and no later than May 26.
- if you are a new student, call after conferring with the appropriate advisor, and no later than September 13.

#### To add or drop a course, call

• no later than September 13.

#### To make or change a pass/fail selection, call

• no later than November 5. Please see "Taking Courses Pass/Fail" on page 8.

#### To withdraw from a course, call

• from September 14 through November 5. Please see "Withdrawing from courses" on page 9.

## Registering, Adding, and Dropping Procedures

First, put all your information together.

To register, you must have the information indicated by the shaded boxes below. We recommend that you use these boxes to write it down. To avoid mistakes or conflicts, and to make a record of your choices, you should also write down the department name, course and section number, credits, and day and time for each course.

Then, at the appropriate time, call 617.287.2100.

Please call only during your access period. The system will be available Mondays through Thursdays, 9:00am-9:00pm; Fridays, 9:00am-4:45pm; and Sundays, 10:00am-9:00pm. When you call, it will prompt you for information in the order below. Be sure to include all laboratory and/or discussion sections required in multi-part courses. To erase an entry before completing it, enter an asterisk (\*). If you have completed an incorrect entry, cancel the first entry and make a second, correct entry. For example, you can use code 90 and the incorrect schedule number to cancel a mistaken registration, and then code 10 and the correct schedule number to register for the right course.

## **After You Register**

#### **Confirmation Notices**

A notice confirming your registration will be mailed to you a week before classes begin. If you have been moved from a waiting list to the official class list, the notice will indicate this.

#### **Adding and Dropping Courses**

**What:** After your initial registration, you may add (register for) one or more additional courses, or drop (cancel your registration for) any course for which you have registered.

When: You may add or drop courses up through September 13, 2000. The touch-tone system will be available Monday-Thursday, 9:00am-9:00pm; Friday, 9:00am-4:45pm; Sunday, 10:00-9:00pm.

**How:** To add\* and drop courses, use the touch-tone registration system and follow the instructions on page 7.

- \*During the period from September 6 to September 13, please do not use the touch-tone to add any undergraduate courses offered by the following departments in the College of Arts and Sciences:
- Communications/Theatre Arts (including Communication Studies)
- English
- Hispanic Studies (Latin American Studies, Portuguese, Spanish)
- Modern Languages (Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Russian)
- Music
- Philosophy
- Psychology

To add a course from this group, obtain an add form from the Undergraduate Registrar's Office (Administration Building, 1st Floor), have the completed form signed in the office of the department offering the course, and return the form to the Undergraduate Registrar's Office.

**Remember!** 1) If you do not attend a class, you will not be withdrawn automatically. 2) You are financially responsible for any course(s) for which you remain registered after September 13.

#### **Taking Courses Pass/Fail**

What: If you are an undergraduate, you may take one course each semester on a pass/fail basis, up to a maximum of eight. (Mandatory pass/fail courses do not count toward this limit.) If you successfully complete the course, you will earn a grade of "P," and the course will be counted toward your graduation requirements, although it will not affect your cumulative grade point average. The grade of "F" will count as a failure. Please note: The requirements of your college, major, or program may not permit you to take certain courses pass/fail. Be sure to check these requirements carefully.

**When:** The pass/fail deadline is November, 5. You can make pass/fail arrangements at any time after your initial registration until the deadline. The touch-tone system will be available Monday-Thursday, 9:00am-9:00pm; Friday, 9:00am-4:45pm; Sunday, 10:00-9:00pm.

**How:** To take a course pass/fail, or to change pass/fail status to normal status, use the touch-tone system and follow the instructions on page 10.

**Remember!** 1) Be sure to check the requirements of your college or program before choosing the pass/fail option. 2) You cannot cancel a pass/fail choice after the deadline.

#### Withdrawing from Courses

**What:** You may withdraw from any individual course. If you do so, you will be given a grade of "W," which will remain on your record but will not affect your cumulative grade point average. You may register for the course in another semester.

**When:** The course withdrawal deadline is November 5. You may withdraw at any time after September 13 until the deadline. The touch-tone system will be available Monday-Thursday, 9:00am-9:00pm; Friday, 9:00am-4:45pm; Sunday, 10:00-9:00pm.

**How:** To withdraw from a course, or to cancel a course withdrawal, use the touch-tone system and follow the instructions on page 10.

**Remember!** 1) You cannot cancel a withdrawal after the deadline. 2) There are no refunds for course withdrawals. 3) If you do not attend classes, you will not be withdrawn automatically. Unless your instructor takes attendance and submits a grade of "NA" to the registrar's office, you will receive a grade of "F" for the course.

#### Withdrawing from the University

**What:** If necessary, you may withdraw from all your courses, which is considered withdrawing from the University. If you do this, you will be given a grade of "W" for each course, which will remain on your record but will not affect your cumulative grade point average. If you withdraw early enough in the semester, you will be eligible for a refund (see page 31). If you withdraw in good academic standing, you may return to the University through a readmission process and, if appropriate, enroll again in courses from which you have withdrawn.

**When:** You may withdraw from the University as late as the last day of classes of a semester. The effective date of withdrawal will be the date on which all required forms are completed and returned to the appropriate offices.

**How:** You must confer with an appropriate advisor (for example, a staff member in the University Advising Center, a member of your dean's office staff, or your graduate program director) and complete and submit a withdrawal form. You must also receive clearance from any University office in which you have incurred financial charges.

**Remember!** 1) You cannot cancel a withdrawal after the deadline. 2) There are no refunds for course withdrawals. 3) If you do not attend classes, you will not be withdrawn automatically. Unless your instructor takes attendance and submits a grade of "NA" to the registrar's office, you will receive a grade of "F" for the course.

#### Remember!

- If you do not attend a class, you will not be withdrawn automatically. You must follow the appropriate procedure.
- You are financially responsible for any course(s) for which you remain registered after September 13.

## Pass/Fail and Course Withdrawal Procedures

Be sure you have read the pass/fail or withdrawal instructions on pages 8 and 9.

#### Then, during the appropriate period, call 617.287.2100. The deadline for fall 2000 is November 5.

The system will be available from September 14 through November 5 during the following hours: Mondays-Thursdays, 9:00am-9:00pm; Fridays, 9:00am-4:45pm; Sundays, 10:00-9:00pm. If you call the day of the deadline (November 5) and experience difficulties with the system, you must call 617.287.6207 and leave a message about the action you want to take.

At the prompt, enter #2 for pass/fail or withdrawal, and provide the information below as instructed. For each course or section, enter the action code first, then the schedule number. Be sure to include all laboratory and/or discussion sections required in multi-part courses. To erase an entry before completing it, enter an asterisk (\*). If you realize that you have completed an incorrect entry, cancel the first entry and make a second, correct entry.

## **Information Particularly for Undergraduates**

#### **ADVISING AND TESTING**

#### **Academic Advising**

We strongly encourage you to confer with the appropriate advisor about your course selections and academic requirements before attempting to register. For some students, advising before registration is a requirement, and this may be the case for you. You can find knowledgeable advisors in the offices listed below.

- If you are in the College of Arts and Sciences and you have not declared a major, seek advising in the University Advising Center (see below).
- If you are in the College of Arts and Sciences and you have declared a major, seek advising in your major department (see the list of locations and phone numbers on page 35). For matters not related to your major, you can also use the services of the University Advising Center (see below).
- If you are in the College of Management and you have not declared a concentration, go to the University Advising Center (see below).
- If you are in the College of Management and you have declared a concentration, seek advising in your concentration department (see the list of locations and phone numbers on page 35). You can also get information in the college's Undergraduate Program Office (M/5/603; 617.287.7760) and use the services of the University Advising Center for matters not related to your concentration (see below).
- If you are in the College of Nursing, including the Human Performance and Fitness

  Department, see the faculty advisor who has been assigned to you, or go to the college's Student Affairs Office (S/2/015; 617.287.7500).
- If you are in the College of Public and Community Service, seek advising in the college's Student Services Office (W/4/151; 617.287.7120).

#### **Testing**

#### The Math and Reading/Writing Diagnostic Tests

Appropriate preparation is especially important for students taking certain introductory courses, and the University wants to be certain that students in these courses have the skills they need for success.

Before registering for math courses up through #140 or computer science courses up through #110, students must demonstrate their skills by taking a diagnostic test, unless they have completed the appropriate prerequisite course(s) at UMass Boston (transfer equivalencies do not count).

Before registering for any English or ESL course, each student must take a placement test, unless the student has previously completed an English or ESL credit course at UMass Boston. The test involves reading a passage and writing a short essay about it.

The University uses these tests to place students in the courses that will serve them best. The tests will be offered at the following dates and times.

All testing sessions take place in the UMass Boston Testing Center (M/3/612). There is no fee, and no appointments are necessary. Tests are given at the hours specified above; please arrive on time. Each test takes approximately one hour. Results can be obtained two hours from the time one finishes testing. A photo ID is required at the test session. Calculators, books, or notes are not allowed, and practice tests are not available. For further information, please call 617.287.5522.

#### **CLEP Exams**

CLEP (the College Level Proficiency Examination Program) is a national program through which students can earn college credit for what they already know. The program conducts standardized exams that measure proficiency in college-level areas of history and social sciences, foreign languages, English composition and literature, science and mathematics, business, and the humanities.

UMass Boston is a CLEP center, and CLEP exams are given here on the third Thursday of every month. You can pick up a CLEP application at the UMass Boston Testing Center (M/3/612), or call 617.287.6000 for more information.

#### THE GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

Beginning in fall 2000, newly enrolled UMass Boston undergraduates in the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Management, and the College of Public and Community Service will be expected to meet new general education requirements that will typically include participation in special seminars and quantitative reasoning courses; writing, distribution, and diversity requirements similar to those now in effect; and a capstone experience. Students entering in fall 2000 will be given appropriate information at orientation sessions. Further information about general education requirements will appear in future editions of this publication and in other publications such as the *Undergraduate Catalog*.

Please note that students absent from the University for four or more consecutive semesters are subject to all requirements and policies in effect the semester they return.

#### THE DIVERSITY REQUIREMENT

UMass Boston believes that explicit study of the diversity of the world's peoples is an essential component of an undergraduate education. The University defines diversity broadly to include race, gender, culture (national origin, ethnicity, religion), social class, age, sexual origin, and disability. Attention to cultural and social groups previously ignored or marginalized in curricula helps students acquire analytical tools and knowledge with which they can understand human diversity in our complex and changing world, and strengthens their academic preparation by exposing them to a rich body of scholarship from a wide range of disciplines. All undergraduates at UMass Boston must therefore take courses that address human diversity as a major theme.

If you are in the College of Arts and Sciences, there are two groups of courses to choose from. The courses in one group focus on diversity in the United States, those in the other have an international focus. If you enter UMass Boston with fewer than 60 credits, you must take one course from each group. If you enter UMass Boston with 60 or more credits, you must take one course, which can be drawn from either group.

If you are in the College of Management, you must take one approved diversity course in the College of Management or the College of Arts and Sciences. This course may also fulfill a liberal arts or elective requirement. For a list of approved diversity courses, contact the college's Undergraduate Program Office (M/5/603).

If you are studying nursing in the College of Nursing, you will meet the diversity requirement automatically by taking courses required for various purposes.

If you are studying human performance and fitness in the College of Nursing, you must take HPF 220 and one other course. That second course can be HPF 180 or a course designated as a diversity course by the College of Arts and Sciences.

**If you are in the College of Public and Community Service,** you can get more information about the diversity requirement and your college from the CPCS Academic Affairs Office.

**For a list of diversity courses offered this semester,** see the front of the schedule section of this publication. For information about additional diversity courses, see the University Advising Center or your college advising office.

#### THE WRITING PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

This requirement applies to all students in the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Nursing, including the Human Performance and Fitness Department. Students can meet the requirement either by passing a proficiency examination or by submitting a portfolio.

#### The Writing Proficiency Examination

This examination involves writing an essay of seven to ten paragraphs in answer to a question based on a set of readings. A passing essay will demonstrate the student's thorough understanding of the readings, as well as an ability to analyze and synthesize the material, use evidence appropriately, form concepts, draw inferences, and construct a well-organized response to the question. The examination is offered two times a year, in January and June. Students should sign up for the exam and pick up the assigned readings in the Core Curriculum Office (M/4/603), five to six weeks ahead of the date of the examination (see the schedule on the next page).

Note: The Writing Proficiency Examination is not the same as the English Placement Test, which students take when they enter the College of Arts and Sciences.

#### The Writing Proficiency Portfolio

The portfolio consists of four papers, each at least five typewritten pages in length. Three of the papers are expository essays, written for different courses and based on multiple reading materials. Each of these essays must be certified as the student's own work by the instructor of the course for which it was written. Certification forms are available in the Core Curriculum Office (M/4/603). The fourth paper is a new one, based on a set of readings and responding to a question distributed by the Core Curriculum Office.

Portfolios may be submitted in January and June at any of the scheduled examination times, and also in October and March (see the schedule on the next page).

#### When the Requirement Must be Met

As a rule, students should have met the Writing Proficiency Requirement by the time they have completed 68 credits. Students who have not done so are expected to take the examination or submit a portfolio at the next scheduled opportunity. Students transferring in with more than 60 credits are expected to meet the requirement by the end of their first semester after matriculation.

#### What Happens if the Requirement is not Met

Students with 90 or more credits who have not met the Writing Proficiency Requirement are subject to suspension and cannot continue to make normal progress toward the degree until the requirement has been met.

To avoid suspension, a student with 90 or more credits who has not met the requirement must come to the Core Curriculum Office (M/4/603) or phone the office (617.287.6330) before the beginning of the next semester to schedule an appointment with a writing specialist. The student should bring to the conference his or her transcript and papers or other examples of his or her writing. After assessing the student's level of writing proficiency, the writing specialist will draw up a "learning contract" specifying which courses the student may take during the upcoming semester and when the student will pass the requirement. This contract usually requires the student to reduce his or her course load and to take a writing course. Signed by both the student and the writing specialist, the contract serves as a formal agreement between the student and the University about the actions the student will take to meet the requirement.

Any student who does not fulfill the terms of the learning contract (e.g., a student who fails to reduce his or her course load) will be suspended during the semester governed by the contract. Any student who has not met the Writing Proficiency Requirement by the end of that semester will be suspended until the requirement is met.

If a student with 90 or more credits who has not met the requirement misses the deadline for scheduling an appointment with a writing specialist, or does not keep such an appointment, he or she may file a formal appeal to the associate dean for undergraduate education explaining in detail why he or she has been unable to comply with the College's standard procedure.

#### **Getting Help**

The Core Curriculum Office offers two writing courses to help students complete the Writing Proficiency Requirement.

- CRWZ282 focuses on practice in the kind of writing required for successful college-level essays.
- CRWZ283 is an intensive reading and writing course designed for students who have had repeated difficulty in completing the requirement. Its aim is to help students compose a set of papers to be submitted as part of a Writing Proficiency Portfolio.

#### INFORMATION FOR COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES STUDENTS

The undergraduate curriculum in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) is divided into three parts: preparation in general education; a major field of study; and electives that complement the major and provide the breadth and depth of a liberal education. To earn a B.A. degree, students must meet the general education, major, total credits, and grade point average requirements described below. Additional requirements for students seeking the B.S. are also described. For complete information about these requirements, please see the *Undergraduate Catalog*.

#### **General Education**

Five general education requirements are in effect for CAS students who have matriculated before fall 2000.

- The Freshman Writing Requirement. Students must complete a year of Freshman English (English 101 and 102). Students who place into English 099 on the English Placement Test must complete that course before beginning work on this requirement.
- The Core Requirement. For information, see page 18.
- The Distribution Requirement. For information, see page 18.
- The Writing Proficiency Requirement. For information, see page 14.
- The Diversity Requirement. For information, see page 13.

#### The Major

CAS students must complete the requirements of one of the majors offered by the college. In most cases, transfer students must complete a minimum of five courses in their major at UMass Boston. Major requirements are listed by department in the *Undergraduate Catalog*. Students may also design an individual major under the supervision of a faculty member. Information on this option is available from the CAS Academic Support Office.

#### **Total Credits**

CAS students must acquire a minimum of 120 credits to graduate, at least 30 of which must be earned at UMass Boston. Please note that the following courses do not count toward this graduation requirement, although they do count toward the semester course load: ESL courses other than 100D; English 099; Math Skills 097 and 098; and Math 110.

#### **Grade Point Average**

To graduate, students must achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0, calculated only from UMass Boston courses; see the *Undergraduate Catalog* for details. Some majors require a specific average in courses taken toward the major; see the major departments for more information.

#### **Additional B.S. Degree Requirements**

In addition to the requirements above, students seeking the B.S. degree in biology, chemistry, geography, mathematics and computer science, physics, or psychology must complete six semester courses in science or mathematics/computer science outside their major discipline. Specific B.S. degree requirements for each major appear in the departmental sections of the *Undergraduate Catalog*.

**New students please note!** Beginning in fall 2000, new students will be expected to meet requirements that differ somewhat from those described above. For example, all incoming freshmen will complete a newly designed "first-year seminar" and a course in quantitative reasoning. Students entering in fall 2000 will be given appropriate information at orientation sessions and in an updated edition of this publication appearing in July.

Students absent from the University for four or more consecutive semesters are subject to all requirements and policies in effect the semester they return.

#### Waivers

**Writing.** Under certain conditions, the Freshman Writing Requirement may be waived. For information, see the English Department. The Writing Proficiency Requirement may not be waived.

**Foreign Languages.** Students who present placement scores or transcripts demonstrating proficiency in a foreign language at the level of fourth-semester college work (if they are seeking the B.A.) or second-semester college work (if they are seeking the B.S.) will receive a waiver of two courses in the foreign language area of the distribution requirement. Native speakers of languages other than English are encouraged to apply for this waiver. For information about the waiver, see the appropriate foreign language department or, for languages not taught at UMass Boston, the assistant dean for undergraduate education (in the CAS Academic Support Office, M/3/421).

**Mathematics.** Students who present placement scores or transcripts demonstrating proficiency in mathematics at the level of college calculus (MATH 141 at UMass Boston) will receive a waiver of two courses in the mathematics area of the distribution requirement. Students granted this waiver need take only ten courses toward the distribution requirement. For information about this waiver, see the Mathematics and Computer Science Department.

**Please note:** Students granted a foreign languages waiver or a mathematics waiver need take only ten courses toward the distribution requirement (or eight, if they are granted both waivers).

#### **Course Loads**

Students may enroll for no more than 16 credits during their first semester at UMass Boston. After this semester, a student may take additional credits if

- the student's cumulative grade point average is 3.0, or the average is 3.5 for the previous full-time semester, and
- written permission is secured from the assistant dean for undergraduate affairs (in the CAS Academic Support Office, M/3/421)

#### **Distribution and Core Requirements**

#### The Distribution Requirement

To ensure that CAS students develop a broad familiarity with the range of human knowledge, they must take twelve courses distributed among seven areas of study, with the option of omitting one area. Most 100- and 200-level CAS courses are assigned to distribution areas and count toward this requirement. These courses are identified in the schedule section of this publication by letter codes representing distribution areas. Distribution areas are also identified in the *Undergraduate Catalog*. The areas and their codes are:

- The Arts (A)
- Historical and Cultural Studies (H)
- Philosophical and Humanistic Studies (P)
- Social and Behavioral Studies (S)
- Natural Sciences (N)
- Mathematics and Computer Science (M)
- Foreign Languages (F)

#### The Core Requirement

Currently enrolled students who matriculated with fewer than 30 credits must include five "Core" courses among the twelve courses described above, three at the 100 level and two at the 200 level. Currently enrolled students who entered UMass Boston with 30 or more credits are not required to take Core courses; if they wish to do so, they may take no more than three at the 100 level and two at the 200 level. No more than five Core courses may count toward graduation. Core courses are identified in the schedule by a "C" prefix in the course number (e.g., C108). They are listed according to the departments that offer them, and also in a separate section at the beginning of the CAS area of the schedule.

Please note! Core courses will not be offered after 2000-2001. Currently enrolled students who have Core requirements to complete are strongly encouraged to do so during the 2000-201 academic year. Those who do not will be required instead to take intensive seminars being developed as part of the University's new general education curriculum. Students who have entered the University at any time with 30 or more credits will not be permitted to take Core courses in 2000-2001.

#### **Important Policies**

- All College of Management (CM) students receive a degree in management, with a concentration of their choice.
- Once a student has earned 60 credits, he or she declares a concentration in one of the following areas: accounting, finance, marketing, management, international management, management information systems, or operations management and information systems.
- Students who have not declared a concentration should seek advising in the University Advising Center (M/3/625; 617.287.5500). Students who have declared a concentration are assigned a faculty advisor from the department administering their concentration: Accounting and Finance (617.287.7670); Management and Marketing (617.287.7850); or Management Science and Information Systems (617.287.7880).
- 120 credits (40 courses at 3 credits each) are required for graduation. A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at UMass Boston.
- CM coursework is sequential. Students must therefore carefully follow curriculum requirements and meet all prerequisites for required courses.
- The CM curriculum is divided into five categories: liberal arts, foundation, core, concentration, and elective courses.

- Level I and Level II courses (indicated above) are part of the liberal arts requirement. To meet the Level I requirement, students must complete two courses at any level in each of the following areas: natural sciences, social sciences, and humanities. To meet the Level II requirement, students must complete any four courses at the 200 level or higher from the same three areas.
- CM students must also meet a diversity requirement (see page 13). This is normally done through liberal arts or elective coursework.
- Only elective courses may be taken on a pass/fail basis.
- CM accepts inter-college transfer applications twice a year.

#### **Important Policies for Nursing Students**

- Only course work that fulfills a College of Nursing requirement will transfer. All transfer courses must carry at least 3 credits, or 4 credits in the case of lab courses. The student must have earned a grade of C (2.0) or higher in each transferred course. To transfer, courses in the natural sciences must have been taken within seven years prior to matriculation in the College of Nursing. There is no time limit on other courses.
- To graduate, students must achieve a grade of C (2.0) or higher in all courses in the worksheet above, except electives. They must also meet the Writing Proficiency Requirement (see page 14) and complete a total of 123 credits, at least 30 of which must be earned at UMass Boston.
- ESL and ACDSKL courses do not count toward the total of 123 required credits.
- All registered nurses will receive 35 credits for previous clinical work after submitting a current license and completing NURSNG 280 (Transition to Baccalaureate Nursing).

- All nursing students must meet with an advisor at least once per semester for registration purposes. Faculty advisors are assigned during the first semester and are available by appointment for discussion of matters other than registration.
- Non-nursing students who wish information about course requirements and admission to the nursing program are invited to attend a nursing information session.
   Sessions are held periodically during the year (to sign up to attend, call 617.287.6000).
- Students seeking to transfer into the nursing program from other UMass Boston colleges must file for inter-college transfer by June 1. These students must have completed 12 credits, including at least one lab science course, at UMass Boston. Forms are available at the College of Nursing and Undergraduate Registrar's Offices.

#### **Important Policies for HP&F Students**

- Each student must meet with an advisor before registering for courses. A list of all HP&F students showing each student's concentration and faculty advisor is posted outside the main HP&F office (\$/3/30114).
- To graduate, all students must:
  - complete two semesters of Freshman English, and meet the Writing Proficiency Requirement (see page 14),
  - complete the Core/Distribution requirement of the College of Arts and Sciences (see page 18),
  - meet the HP&F diversity requirement by completing HPF 220 and a second course, which may be either HPF 180 or a College of Arts and Sciences diversity course (see page 13 and the listing of diversity courses in the schedule section),
  - earn a grade of C (2.0) or higher in all HPF courses and maintain a cumulative quality point average of 2.5 or higher in all required HPF courses, prior to registering for HPF 486 or HPF 400/450, and
  - earn a total of 120 credits, including 30 at UMass Boston.
- Students must meet all course prerequisites, along with any special requirements outlined in the UMass Boston Undergraduate Catalog and Student Handbook.

 Only course work that fulfills an HP&F requirement will transfer. To transfer, courses in the natural sciences must have been taken within seven years prior to matriculation. There is no time limit on other courses.

\*Students must take two courses from the disciplines of Africana Studies, American Studies, Anthropology, or Philosophy.

- All courses taken in the major of human performance and fitness after a student has matriculated at UMass Boston must be taken through the HP&F Department.
- Courses required in a student's concentration may not be taken pass/fail.
- Non-HP&F students may take certain courses in HP&F, such as HPF 110, 120, 130, 140, 180, 221, and 256, and HPFCCH 349. These students may take other HP&F courses if they meet the prerequisites (they should contact the department for further information).
- Students wishing to transfer into HP&F from other UMass Boston colleges should complete an intercollege transfer application and submit it to Valerie Corrente in the College office. Forms are available in this office and in the Undergraduate Registrar's Office.

## INFORMATION FOR COLLEGE OF PUBLIC AND COMMUNITY SERVICE STUDENTS

#### **Registration for Fall 2000**

Information about registration for students in the College of Public and Community Service (CPCS), and for other students wishing to enroll in CPCS learning activities, is contained in a separate publication, *The CPCS Instructional Activity Book*. This publication will be available in the CPCS Office of Student Services (W-4-151) two weeks before fall registration starts in May.

This semester, for the first time, CPCS students will be using an on-line registration system to select their fall courses and competencies. CPCS students will receive information on the new system by mail in March. Information on the new system will also be available in the CPCS Office of Student Services.

Each CPCS student will receive, from the Undergraduate Registrar's Office, an "Invitation to Register" that will include that student's access period for registration. Each students should initiate fall registration during this access period to avoid a late charge and ensure enrollment in selected learning activities. ## **Information for Non-Degree Students**

UMass Boston offers many opportunities for non-degree students—that is, students who have not been formally admitted into the University. Many of these students take courses in order to sample UMass Boston's offerings and strengthen their skills before applying for admission to a degree or certificate program. Others enroll because individual courses can help them advance in their current careers or prepare for new careers, or simply because they seek the personal growth and enrichment that university study can give them.

In this publication's schedule listings, you will find courses offered on weekdays and Saturdays at UMass Boston's Harbor Campus, and on weekdays at off-campus locations in Braintree and downtown Boston. For the convenience of working students, many courses meet during late afternoon or evening hours (these courses are identified in the schedule listings with a star).

If you are interested in attending UMass Boston as a non-degree student, you should know that:

- you can take any course for which you meet the prerequisites, and in which space is available (for graduate courses you will also need the permission of the graduate program director),
- you can call or visit us for academic advising before you register for undergraduate courses,
- you can register by phone for undergraduate courses,
- you can often apply credits you earn as a non-degree student to UMass Boston degree requirements (as many as 16 for undergraduates, 6 for graduate students)
- your UMass Boston ID will entitle you the use of all University facilities, and
- you'll be welcome!

Please note: The information below about registration and costs applies to most courses offered at the UMass Boston campus. Additional courses offered at off-campus locations, and at UMass Boston on Friday evenings and Saturdays, are administered by the University's Division of Continuing Education, and are identified in the schedule by the code "dce." They are like other UMass Boston courses in terms of their substance, faculty, and applicability to degree requirements, but the registration procedures, charges, and dates for them differ somewhat. Please see "Information about Off-Campus, Friday Evening, and Saturday Courses" on page 22.

#### When to Register

August 14 - September 1

Walk-in and telephone registration, as well as academic advising, will be available during the following periods:

Monday - Thursday 9:00am-6:00pm Friday 10:00am-4:00pm

Late registration is possible (see page 27), but a far wider selection of courses will be available if you register on time—the earlier, the better.

#### How and Where to Register

#### Walk-in Registration

Come to the Undergraduate Registrar's Office, which is on the first floor of the Quinn Administration Building, during the registration period (see the dates and hours above). The staff will give you detailed information about registration, courses and locations, and payment procedures, as well as the appropriate forms. (Please also see "Payments" on page 28.)

#### Telephone Registration (617.287.6212)

You can also register by calling the Undergraduate Registrar's Office at 617.287.6212 during the registration period (see the dates and hours above). Please be ready to refer to the course listings in this publication. Each course section has its own six-digit schedule number, which appears to the left of the course number and title. You will need to use this schedule number to identify the section you want to enroll in. The staff will give you registration instructions when you call, and will also give you information about payment procedures. (Please also see "Payments" on page 28.)

#### Academic Advising by Phone or In Person

We encourage you to visit or telephone the University during registration period for academic advising before you register. See the dates and hours on page 24. You can call us at 617.287.3953, and you can also come to the Undergraduate Registrar's Office to meet with an advisor and discuss your course selections and your academic plans. We recommend that you bring unofficial transcripts from any colleges you have attended.

Advising can be particularly important because many courses have prerequisites that students must meet before enrolling. At the University you can consult the UMass Boston *Undergraduate Catalog* for information about courses and prerequisites. The catalog is also available in most public libraries and at UMass Boston's World Wide Web site (www.umb.edu). Please see "Where to Learn More" on page 33.

#### **REGISTERING FOR GRADUATE COURSES**

#### When to Register

Registration schedules vary according to program. In the case of some programs, registration for nondegree students begins early in August; in other cases, students begin to register shortly before classes begin. For information, contact the appropriate graduate program director, using the directory below. Please remember that classes begin September 6, and that the final deadline for course registrations is September 13. Be sure to register as early as possible. The sooner you begin, the greater your chances will be of finding space in the course(s) you want.

#### **How to Register**

First, contact the appropriate graduate program director to discuss your preparation for the course or courses you are interested in and the availability of space in any course you wish to take. If you are eligible, the program director will arrange to give you a registration form carrying an approval signature.

Once you have obtained this form, bring it to the Graduate Admissions and Graduate Registrar's Office (Quinn Administration Building, Second Floor). For registration period hours, call 617.287.6400. You will be required to bring payment with your form: please see "Payments" on page 28.

Please note: We encourage you to consult the UMass Boston *Graduate Bulletin* for program and course descriptions and information about prerequisites. Copies of the bulletin are available at the Graduate Admissions and Graduate Registrar's Office and at most public libraries. You can obtain a copy by mail from the University by calling 617 287.6000, but you should be aware that your copy may not reach you for a week. You can also find information from the *Graduate Bulletin* at UMass Boston's World Wide Web site (www.umb.edu). Please see "Where to Learn More" on page 33.

#### IMPORTANT REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

#### **Academic Regulations**

The University's academic regulations apply to non-degree students, just as they do to other UMass Boston students. All students should consult the University's *Undergraduate Catalog* or *Graduate Bulletin* for information about academic programs and requirements. The following regulations are of critical importance to non-degree students.

■ Non-degree undergraduate students must meet the following minimum retention standards.

Minimum required
cumulative average
1.75
2.00

- Non-degree graduate students must maintain a 3.0 average in all graduate courses.
- If a student's cumulative average at the end of any semester has fallen below the required level, that student will not be permitted to take UMass Boston courses in future semesters. The cumulative average will be based on grades for all UMass Boston courses that the student has taken as a non-degree student at any time.

- If a non-degree student is admitted to an undergraduate degree program, that student may count as many as 16 credits earned as a non-degree student toward the degree, subject to the approval of the appropriate academic dean.
- No more than 6 credits earned as a graduate non-degree student may be applied toward a graduate degree or certificate.
- Any undergraduate student may choose to take one course per semester or summer on a pass/fail basis, up to a maximum of eight. The course must be chosen before the appropriate pass/fail deadline in the academic calendar. If the student successfully completes the course, it will count toward degree requirements. See "Taking Courses Pass/Fail" on page 8.
- Graduate students may not take courses on a pass/fail basis.

#### Placement Testing for Computer Science, Math, English, and ESL Courses

Before registering for math courses up to #140, computer science courses up to #110, English courses, or ESL courses, you will probably be required to take a diagnostic placement test. For details and testing dates, please see "Testing" on page 12.

#### International Students Please Note!

No student with F-1 visa status may register at UMass Boston as a non-degree student unless the student is also registered for a full course of study at the institution that has issued the student's I-20. If you are not studying full-time at the school that issued your I-20, you are out of status with the INS. Students on other visa statuses (such as F-2, J-2, H-4, H-1B) usually do not need to be studying full-time or in a degree program. Check the conditions for your particular status. For more information, please see "Information for International Students" on page 28.

#### LATE REGISTRATION

Late registration will be possible during the period from September 6 through September 13. To register for undergraduate courses, come to the Undergraduate Registrar's Office. For registration period hours, please call 617.287.6200.

The staff will give you detailed information about registration, class instructors and locations, and payment procedures, as well as the appropriate forms. Remember that you must bring your payment to the Bursar's Office (Quinn Administration Building, 2nd floor lobby) no later than September 13. For Bursar's Office hours, call 617.287.5350.

Please note: Registration for off-campus and "dce" Saturday courses is possible through September 30 (there is a \$25 late fee after September 6). Please see "Information About Off-Campus, Friday Evening and Saturday Courses on page 22.

To register for graduate courses, follow the procedures described in "Registering for Graduate Courses" on page 25.

#### **PAYMENTS**

#### **Tuition and Fees**

For tuition and fee rates, please see "Tuition, Fees, and Payments" on page 30. Please note that the payment procedures described there apply to degree-seeking students.

#### **Undergraduate Courses**

If you register in person, you will be given detailed information about payment procedures when you come to the University. If you register by telephone, this information will be sent to you. In all cases, you must pay in full no later than September 13. You may pay with a check or money order made out to UMass Boston, or using VISA, Discover, or MasterCard.

#### **Paying for Graduate Courses**

You must pay in full no later than September 13. You may pay at the Graduate Admissions and Graduate Registrar's Office with a check or money order made out to UMass Boston, or using VISA, Discover, or MasterCard. For registration period hours, call 617.287.6400.

Cash payments must be made at the Bursar's Office (Quinn Administration Building, 2nd floor lobby). For registration period hours, call 617.287.5350. Please note that after paying at the Bursar's Office you must bring your registration form to the Graduate Admissions and Graduate Registrar's Office to complete the registration process.

## Information for International Students

If you have F-1 visa status, and you want to seek a degree at UMass Boston,

- you must apply to and be accepted into a degree program at UMass Boston;
- you must submit acceptable financial documentation to the UMass Boston Undergraduate or Graduate Admissions Office, in order to receive an I-20;
- you must receive and sign your UMass Boston I-20;
- you must register for and complete a full course of study at UMass Boston each semester (12 credits for undergraduate students, 9 for graduate students);
- you must attend the New Student INS Conference and Workshop to process your documents, where you will learn more about the conditions you must follow. Information about this conference will be mailed to you.

If you are transferring from another institution, your old I-20 will no longer be valid. You must receive a new UMass Boston I-20. It is extremely important that you attend the INS Conference and Workshop at UMass Boston, so that we can notify INS of your transfer.

#### If you have F-1 visa status, and you want to attend UMass Boston as a non-degree student,

- you must also be taking a full course of study at another college or university, and you must have a valid I-20 from that school.
- If you are no longer attending another college or university, and you wish to study at UMass Boston, you must be admitted to a UMass Boston degree program (see the instructions above).
- If you do not follow these regulations, you will be out of status with the INS.

#### If you have a visa status other than F-1, different conditions apply.

- If you have J-1 status, you should also be a full-time student but must follow other, different regulations. Call Lurlene Van Buren at the University Advising Center with questions (617.287.5500).
- Students with many other visa statuses, especially dependent statuses (F-2, J-2, H-4, E-2, L-2, etc.) or working statuses (H-1B, etc.) do not need to maintain full-time enrollment. Check the conditions for your particular status.

## **Tuition, Fees, and Payments**

#### **Your Financial Obligation**

If you register for any course, and are accepted into it, you must pay for the course in full unless you:

- drop the course by September 13 (see "Adding and Dropping Courses" on page 8), or
- withdraw from all your courses early enough to be eligible for a refund (see "Withdrawing from the University" on page 9 and "Refunds of Tuition and Fees" on page 31).

You will be financially responsible for any course for which you remain registered after September 13 even if you

- withdraw from all your courses after the fifth week of classes,
- withdraw from the individual course after September 13, or
- receive a grade of "NA."

Please see "Current Tuition and Fees" on page 32.

#### **Paying on Time**

The due date for paying your tuition and fees appears on your most recent bill from the UMass Boston Bursar's Office. You must pay your bill by the due date. Any one of the following three actions, or a combination of two or three, will meet this requirement:

- Full payment by the due date of all charges with cash, a money order, or a credit card (VISA, MasterCard, and Discover Card are accepted).
- Enrollment and active participation in the Interest Free Tuition Payment Plan offered through Academic Management Services (for information, call 1.800.635.0120).
- Official notification received by the Bursar's Office of eligibility for financial aid that will cover all of your charges or the remaining balance in your account.

#### How to Pay

You can pay your bill by mail or in person.

- To pay by mail, follow the instructions on your bill.
- To pay in person, come to the Bursar's Office (Q/2/071; hours: M-F 9:00-4:30).

## Remember!

- You are financially responsible for any course(s) for which you remain registered after September 13.
- If you do not attend a class, you will not be withdrawn automatically. You must follow the appropriate procedure (see page 9).

#### **University Payment Policy**

University policy requires that no registration be considered complete until the semester charges are paid in full. Charges are computed on the basis of courses/programs for which students are registered. Initial bills are sent in July (for the fall semester) and in December (for the spring semester) to all students who have already registered.

Late registrants are billed after the add/drop deadline. Note: Non-degree students must pay in full at the time or registration. Follow-up billings will be made periodically, reflecting any additional charges, payments, or credits that have occurred within the semester period. Each student must pay all charges in full prior to the due date indicated on the initial bill to avoid late charges or cancellation of registration and financial aid. No time or deferred payments are allowed by the University.

Overdue accounts will be considered sufficient cause for cancellation of registration, as University regulations prohibit final registration, graduation, or granting of credit for any student whose account with the University is unpaid. Any delinquent accounts will be cause for administrative withdrawal and must be paid prior to readmission to the University. Unpaid accounts will be referred for collection action, to include collection costs of 33% added to the outstanding bill.

#### **Refunds of Tuition and Fees**

In general, students who withdraw from the University receive refunds as follows:

Date of Withdrawal	Percentage Refunded
Before the first class meeting	100%
During the first two weeks of classes	80%
During the third week of classes	60%
During the fourth week of classes	40%
During the fifth week of classes	20%
After the fifth week of classes	No Refund

Students in their first year of enrollment who are receiving federal financial aid and withdraw from the University are subject to a different policy. For information, contact the Financial Aid Services Office.

#### **Residency Reclassification**

If you have been classified as not a resident of Massachusetts and you wish to appeal for reclassification as a Massachusetts resident, you must file your appeal no later than September 13. Forms and information are available in the undergraduate and graduate registrar's office.

#### **Tuition Surcharge Policy**

Undergraduates who earn more than 118% of the credits required for graduation must pay for additional credits at the non-resident rate. Normally the surcharge will apply to credits beyond a total of 141. There are several exceptions to this policy:

- Students who transfer into UMass Boston are exempt.
- Credits earned at other institutions after a student enrolls at UMass Boston, and transferred in, do not count toward the total.
- Credits earned through the Division of Continuing Education do not count toward the total.
- Credits earned for programs requiring more than the normal 120 do not count toward the total.
