



ASTHMA TASK FORCE

The Asthma Task Force consists of a total of 27 members (15 voting, 12 nonvoting), 17 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. 15 of the 17 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members; two are non-voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint voting members from the following categories: (1) two representatives of community-based organizations that provide community-based research or advocacy related to asthma issues in San Francisco; (2) one representative of childcare coordinating/advocacy organizations; (3) three individuals who are either persons with asthma, the parent of a child with asthma, or an asthma patient advocate; (4) one representative of the Department of Public Health; (5) two representatives of environmental health/justice organizations; (6) two representatives of hospital associations, health care provider institutions, or MediCal Managed Care Insurers; (7) two representatives of lung health/asthma-specific organizations; (8) two individuals who represent health care professions working with asthmatics. In addition to the voting members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one non-voting member to represent property interests and one non-voting member to represent tenant interests.

In addition to the above 17 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the head of each of the following San Francisco

departments/agencies: Department of Human Services; Department of Children, Youth and Families; Department of Building Inspection; Department of the Environment; Fire Department; Emergency Medical Services Division; Planning Department; the San Francisco Housing Authority; and the San Francisco Unified School District. Each of the following federal agencies may designate a representative to join the Task Force as a non-voting member: United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States Housing and Urban Development.

The purpose of the Task Force is to recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and citywide strategies that would ensure the highest standard of asthma management and prevention services for all residents in the City and County of San Francisco, and to provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city policies for the prevention and management of asthma in the City and County of San Francisco.

Term of Office: Voting members of the Asthma Task Force shall be appointed for a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The Task Force by September 24, 2002 was to prepare a strategic plan with recommendations for legislative action and city-wide strategies to manage and prevent asthma in San Francisco to the Health Commission and to the Board of Supervisors. The timelines for completion of the Strategic Plan were extended to February 28, 2003. Thereafter, the Task Force was to submit status reports on progress toward implementing the plan recommendations and meeting the plan's goals to the Board bi-annually.

Sunset Date: The Asthma Task Force shall submit a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors two years after the passage of this ordinance regarding whether the Asthma Task Force should continue in effect. Unless reauthorized by the Board by resolution prior to June 30, 2008, this task force shall expire.

Compensation: Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.



Each of the following federal agencies may designate a representative to join the Task Force as a non-voting member: United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States Housing and Urban Development.

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Term of Office: Voting members of the Asthma Task Force shall be appointed for a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.



western Soma citizens' planning task force

The Western SoMa Citizens' Planning Task Force consists of 26 members: 20 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors; three members appointed by the District 6 Supervisor; one appointed by the Planning Director; one appointed by the Director of the San Francisco County Transportation Authority; and one appointed by the Director of the Department of Public Health.

The Western SoMa Citizens' Planning Task Force is established to advise the Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission on planning for western SoMa and to carry out the following duties: (a) using existing zoning as the starting point for an analysis of land use decisions that will shape the future of the entire community; (b) map and evaluate existing Residential Enclave Districts (REDs) and consider modifications to existing RED zoning map boundaries; (c) recommend basic RED preservation policies including height, density and design guidelines; (d) map and evaluate land uses proximate to existing and proposed REDs and develop basic height, density and design guidelines in order to provide a buffer between REDs and areas where more intense development might be allowed; (e) map overall western SoMa existing land use conditions; (f) recommend policies for the preservation of service and light industrial jobs, residential uses, and arts and entertainment opportunities; (g) consider policies to guide increased heights and density along the major arterial streets where appropriate; (h) Recommend policies that promote more community-serving retail and commercial uses and that encourage improvements to transportation, open space, street safety, bicycle circulation, and mass transit; and (i) develop recommendations to ensure that the creation of a future Folsom Boulevard be developed in such a manner as to complement all of the above referenced goals.

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SAN FRANCISCO PUBLIC LIBRARY The Board of Supervisors shall appoint 20 members as follows: one of whom shall have been a resident of western SoMa for more than three years, one of whom has been a resident of western SoMa for less than three years, one of whom resides in a Single Room Occupancy hotel in western SoMa, one of whom is a youth in western SoMa, one of whom is raising a family in western SoMa, one of whom is a senior in western SoMa, one of whom operates a local business in western SoMa, one of whom works with a community-based organization in western SoMa, one of whom represents the arts, one of whom represents the entertainment industry, one of whom is a non-profit developer, one of whom is a for-profit developer, one of whom is a bicycle advocate, one of whom is a parks and open space advocate, one of whom is a transportation advocate, one of whom is a preservation advocate, one of whom represents labor, one of whom is a person with a disability, one of whom is a resident of the area defined as "SoMa West" by the Planning Department, and one of whom represents the interests of homeless individuals.

Three members are appointed by the District 6 Supervisor; one appointed by the Planning Director, if it is his pleasure; one appointed by the Director of the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, if the Director chooses not to exercise his appointment, the Supervisor representing District Six shall appoint the member, and one appointed by the Director of the Department of Public Health.

The members shall serve for the duration of the Task Force and the quorum of the Task Force shall be a majority of sitting members. The Task Force shall meet no less frequently than every four months.

In the event that any member misses three regularly scheduled meetings of the Task Force within a year without giving prior notice to the Task Force, the Task Force, or its designee, shall certify in writing to the member's appointing authority that the member has missed three meetings. On the date of such certification, the member shall be deemed to have resigned from the Task Force.

In the event a vacancy in the Committee membership occurs, the successor to the vacant position shall be appointed in the same manner used to select the previous occupant of that position.

The members of the Task Force shall convene the first meeting within 30 days of receiving notice of the appointment of a quorum of the membership and the operation of the Task Force shall expire three years from the passage of this resolution.

URBAN FORESTRY COUNCIL

The Urban Forestry Council shall be comprised of 15 voting members, 8 of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors as follows: one member from an educational organization involved with tree management; one representative of the tree management profession (International Society of Arboriculture, American Society of Landscape Architects, etc.); one member from the Golden Gate National Recreation Area; two members of non-profit organizations involved in urban forestry or other environmentally-related issues; and three members at large.

Additionally, members shall be appointed from 5 municipal agencies with representatives from: Director of the Department of Public Works; General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department; Director of the Planning Department; Director of the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency; and General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission. The Mayor shall appoint: one member from the tree care industry with a tree management professional affiliation and one member at-large.

The Body that appoints Council members also may appoint at-large members to serve any unfilled Council positions. Members shall serve for a term of two years.

The Council shall: 1) Advise on urban forestry concerns; 2) review project plans for major publicly-sponsored developments and civic improvements and changes to the public right-of way as they may impact trees; 3) establish criteria for a landmark/heritage tree program to provide for the protection of valuable trees on public and private property; 4) adopt guidelines for protecting trees during project design and construction; 5) encourage public participation; 6) facilitate the cooperative interaction of tree-related activities among various agencies, utilities, businesses, and the public; 7) notify public agencies when issues relate to trees on lands under their jurisdiction; 8) provide a forum at regular meetings for public discussion of urban forestry issues; 9) assist with the formulation of legislation and policies that affect trees; 10) serve as a clearinghouse for information related to the urban forest through the Department of the Environment; 11)

Report: The council shall report to the Board of Supervisors and Mayor by September 1st of each year.



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GRAFFITI ADVISORY BOARD

The Graffiti Advisory Board consists of 25 voting members who shall be appointed as follows: (1) The Mayor, or his or her designee; (2) Eleven persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors to serve a term of two years, at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor. These appointments shall be effective when written notice of the appointment is received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; (3) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint the following members, who shall serve a term of two years:

- (A) One member representing youth groups who provide services for juveniles involved in alternative programs for graffiti diversion,
- (B) One member representing nonprofit organizations who provide services related to the City's beautification and neighborhood cleanup programs,
- (C) Two members representing businesses who operate in San Francisco, one of which must be a property owner,
- (D) One member representing private schools or art schools who operate in San Francisco, and
- (E) One member representing the contracting agency for Municipal Railway shelters.

- (4) The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one member to serve on the Advisory Board:
- (A) The General Manager of the Municipal Railway,
- (B) The Director of Public Works,
- (C) The Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic,
- (D) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department,
- (E) The District Attorney,
 - A. The Chief of Police, and
 - B. The Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint one member. If the Board of Education fails to appoint a member within 60 days of a vacancy, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a student, teacher, or member of the San Francisco Unified School District academic branch.

The other members shall consist of the following: the Mayor, or his or her designee, shall serve as a voting member. The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one representative to serve on the Advisory Board as a voting member: The General Manager of the Municipal Railway; The Director of Public Works; The Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic; The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department; the Sheriff; The Chief of Police; the Juvenile Court: and the Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District.

The Graffiti Advisory Board shall have the duty to:

Reports: (a) Prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a report every six months on graffiti as it affects neighborhoods and the downtown area of San Francisco, which shall include a review and evaluation of the services and programs in place to respond to graffiti, prevention strategies, and recommendations and plans as to a consolidated program of public and private efforts;

- (b) Advise about the coordination of information, activities and goals among existing programs funded by the City and County and privately sponsored programs;
- (c) Advise about improving the efficiency in the provision of graffiti enforcement, prevention, and clean-up services.

Compensation: Members of the Advisory Board shall not be compensated, nor shall they be reimbursed for expenses.


SRO TASK FORCE

The SRO Task Force consists of a total of fourteen members, eight of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors appoints eight voting members of the Task Force: one SRO tenant; two private SRO owners/operators; one non-profit SRO operator/owner; and one representative from each of the four SRO Collaboratives (Mission SRO Collaborative, Central City SRO Collaborative, Chinatown SRO Collaborative, and Families SRO Collaborative).

In addition to the above eight members, five voting members shall be appointed to the Task Force by the heads of each of the following San Francisco departments/agencies: The Director of the Human Services Agency will appoint one representative, the Director of the Department of Building Inspection will appoint one representative, the City Attorney will appoint one representative from the Code Enforcement Task Force, and the Director of the Department of Public Health will appoint one representative from Housing and Urban Health and one representative from Environmental Health. Also, the Director of the Department of Public Health will appoint one non-voting (except in the case of a tie vote) Task Force Chair.

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The SRO Task Force shall monitor and make policy recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and annually produce a comprehensive report. The SRO Task Force will adopt and assist in the implementation of the following two goals:

A. Goal 1: San Francisco SRO Hotels are safe, accessible, stable, and 'just' places to live in.

- 1. Identify and provide training, consultation and direct services furthering this goal.
- 2. Develop and advocate legislation, regulations, policies and/or procedures furthering this goal.
- 3. Monitor compliance with relevant laws, regulations, policies and/or procedures.
- B. Goal 2: Affordable, healthy, and appropriate housing options are available in San Francisco so that extremely low-income families do not have to raise their children in SRO Hotels.
- 1. Advocate strategies to move families out of SROs and into permanent housing.
- 2. Advocate goals for assuring San Francisco housing and supportive housing units are affordable to 0-25% medium income families will be advocated for.
- 3. Advocate strategies to prevent families from losing their housing.
- 4. Review San Francisco Planning Code, Administrative Code, and other pertinent City Ordinances and recommend amendments necessary to implement Goal 2.

Term of Office: Members of the SRO Task Force shall be appointed for a term of three years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The SRO Task Force shall monitor and make policy recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and annually produce a comprehensive report.

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GRAFFITI ADVISORY BOARD

The Graffiti Advisory Board consists of 25 voting members who shall be appointed as follows: (1) The Mayor, or his or her designee; (2) Eleven persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors to serve a term of two years, at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor. These appointments shall be effective when written notice of the appointment is received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; (3) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint the following members, who shall serve a term of two years:

- (A) One member representing youth groups who provide services for juveniles involved in alternative programs for graffiti diversion,
- (B) One member representing nonprofit organizations who provide services related to the City's beautification and neighborhood cleanup programs,
- (C) Two members representing businesses who operate in San Francisco, one of which must be a property owner,
- (D) One member representing private schools or art schools who operate in San Francisco, and
- (E) One member representing the contracting agency for Municipal Railway shelters.



- (4) The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one member to serve on the Advisory Board:
 - (A) The General Manager of the Municipal Railway,
 - (B) The Director of Public Works,
 - (C) The Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic,
 - (D) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department,
 - (E) The District Attorney.
 - (F) The Chief of Police,
- (G) The Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint one member. If the Board of Education fails to appoint a member within 60 days of a vacancy, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a student, teacher, or member of the San Francisco Unified School District academic branch.

The Graffiti Advisory Board shall have the duty to:

- (1) Advise about the coordination of information, activities and goals among existing programs funded by the City and County and privately sponsored programs;
- (2) Advise about improving the efficiency in the provision of graffiti enforcement, prevention, and clean-up services.

Reports: The Advisory Board shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a report every six months on graffiti as it affects neighborhoods and the downtown area of San Francisco, which shall include a review and evaluation of the services and programs in place to respond to graffiti, prevention strategies, and recommendations and plans as to a consolidated program of public and private efforts.

Compensation: Members of the Advisory Board shall not be compensated, nor shall they be reimbursed for expenses.

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

BIODIESEL ACCESS TASK FORCE

The Biodiesel Access Task Force consists of a total of 17 members (7 voting, 10 non-voting), 7 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. All members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members. Those appointed must be members of the public who represent the biodiesel community, such as gas station owners, fleet operators and consumers. Such community members may include organizations. No organization shall have more than one representative on the Task Force.

In addition to the above 7 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the heads of each of the following San Francisco departments/agencies: Department of the Environment; San Francisco Public Utilities Commission; Fire Department; Department of Public Health; Department of Building Inspection; Department of Planning; Municipal Transportation Authority; Treasurer/Tax Collector; Mayor's Office of Workforce and Economic Development; and the Port.

The purpose of the Task Force is to facilitate the creation of a biodiesel fueling infrastructure that provides public access to biodiesel and biodiesel blends. In order to reach this goal, the Task Force shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors appropriate legislative action and city-wide strategies that would increase biodiesel use



such as the following: (1) the development of incentives for consumer, wholesaler and retailers of biodiesel, (2) the streamlining of current city processes that support biodiesel use among city fleets and among the city's consumers, and (3) the implementation of a permitting process for biodiesel fueling stations. Permitting process proposals can include, but are not limited to, permit fee waivers for the first ten biodiesel filling stations selling neat biodiesel and biodiesel blends of B99. The permitting process shall be consistent with federal, state and existing local law and shall balance the public's health, safety and right-to-know with the time and cost to potential permittees. The Task Force shall consult with state environmental agencies in considering proposed requirements.

Term of Office: Members of the Biodiesel Access Task Force shall be appointed for a term one year. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The Task Force shall prepare a written report setting forth its recommendations as well as criteria for evaluating the success of the Task Force's proposals. The Task Force shall submit their report within 12 months after the first meeting of the Task Force.

Sunset Date: The Biodiesel Access Task Force shall expire no later than December 31, 2009.

Compensation: Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.

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
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PARK, RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Park, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee consists of a total of twenty-three members. In addition, one member shall be appointed by the Mayor.

The Committee members shall serve for terms of two years at the will of the appointing authority except that at the first meeting of the Committee, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department shall, by lot, designate twelve members to serve terms of one year. Thereafter, all members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four consecutive terms.

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The Advisory Committee shall assist the City Planning Commission and Recreation and Park Commission in the implementation of Section 16.107 of the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco. They shall assist the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department and the Director of the City Planning Department in establishing priorities for renovation, acquisition, development and maintenance of properties in accordance with the Recreation and Open Space Programs to implement the recreation and open space element of the Master Plan.

Reports: Input into the Strategic Plan updated annually, the Capital Plan updated annually, and the Operational Plan updated annually.

Compensation: None referenced.

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

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MENTAL HEALTH BOARD

The Mental Health Board consists of 17 members. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a member of the Mental Health Board (11 members). The remaining six members are appointed by the full Board of Supervisors, one of whom shall be a member of the Board of Supervisors. As required by Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5604, at least nine members shall be consumers or the parents, spouses, siblings or adult children of consumers; at least four members shall be consumers; and at least four members shall be family of consumers. A consumer is a person who has received mental health services in San Francisco from any program operated or funded by the City and County, from a State hospital, or from any public or private nonprofit mental health agency. The Board of Supervisors member position shall not count in determining whether the consumer and family of consumer requirements of this section are met. In addition, one member shall be a child advocate (a family member or consumer advocate for minors who use mental health services); one member shall be an older adult advocate (a family member or consumer advocate for persons 60 years of age or older who use mental health services); and two members shall be from the following professions: psychiatry, psychology, mental health social work, nursing with a specialty in mental health, marriage and family counseling, psychiatric technology, or administrator of a hospital providing mental health services or of a community mental health facility. Any positions not allocated to specific types of members may be filled by

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persons with experience and knowledge of the mental health system representing the public interest.

Except for the Board of Supervisors member, the term of each member shall be for three years. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms. The term of office of a member appointed by an individual Board of Supervisors member is not affected by the Board of Supervisors member no longer continuing in that office.

The Mental Health Board shall review and evaluate the City and County's mental health needs, services, facilities and special problems and other duties as stated in Administrative Code Section 15.14.

Reports: An annual report shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors on the needs and performance of the City and County's mental health system.

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SHELTER MONITORING COMMITTEE

The Shelter Monitoring Committee consists of 13 members; six appointed by the Board of Supervisors, three appointed by the Mayor; and four appointed by the Local Homeless Coordinating Board.

The purpose of the Committee is to provide the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate, comprehensive information about the conditions in and operations of shelters.

The Committee shall consist of 13 members, one of whom shall be a homeless person (or homeless within the 3 years prior to appointment) with a disability and one of whom shall be a homeless person (or homeless within the 3 years prior to appointment) living with their homeless child who is under the age of 18. The 13 members of the Committee shall be appointed as follows: three members shall be appointed by the Mayor, including one member from the Department of Human Services, one member from the Department of Public Health, and one member who is homeless or formerly homeless and who has experience providing direct services to the homeless through a

community setting. Six members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors including: two homeless or formerly homeless individuals; one member who has experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting; one member selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by community agencies that provide behavioral health, housing placement, or other services to the homeless; and two members selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by non-profit agencies that provide advocacy or organizing services to homeless people, one of which is homeless or formerly homeless. Four members shall be appointed by the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, including: one member selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by non-profit agencies that provide advocacy or organizing services to homeless people; two members who have experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting, one of which is formerly homeless: and one member shall be homeless or formerly homeless and selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by community agencies that provide behavioral health, housing placement, or other services to homeless individuals. In making their appointments to the Committee, the appointing authorities are encouraged to select people who are bilingual.

The term of office of each Committee member shall be two years. In the event that a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any Committee member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the expired term of office. The interim appointment shall be made in the same or similar manner that governed the initial appointment of the departing member.

The Committee member from the Department of Human Services shall monitor the attendance of Committee members. In the event that any Committee member misses three regularly scheduled Committee meetings in a six-month period without prior notice to the Committee, the Committee member from the Department of Human Services shall certify in writing to the Committee that the member missed three meetings in a six-month period of time. On the date of such certification, the member shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee.

Reports: The Committee shall prepare and submit quarterly reports that shall include but not be limited to information on the following: safety in the shelter, cleanliness in the shelter, disability access to and within the shelter, family life in the shelter, a review of policies and procedures in place at the shelter and any information received regarding the treatment and personal experiences of shelter residents. The reports shall also include recommended action steps for the shelter and for the City department that contracts for services at the shelter. The reports shall not identify shelter residents or disclose any confidential information concerning shelter residents consistent with state and federal law. The Committee may issue emergency reports at any time it deems necessary. The reports shall be provided to: 1) the Mayor, 2) the Board of Supervisors,

3) the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, 4) the appropriate city department responsible to take action, 5) the city department that contracts for services at the shelter, 6) the shelter under review, and 7) the public. These reports shall be public documents. Any city department identified in the report as responsible to take action recommended in the report shall, within 30 days of issuance of the report, provide to the Board of Supervisors a departmental report setting forth how the department intends to respond to the Committee's recommendations.

The Graffiti Advisory Board consists of 25 voting members who shall be appointed as follows: (1) The Mayor, or his or her designee; (2) Eleven persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors to serve a term of two years, at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor. These appointments shall be effective when written notice of the appointment is received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; (3) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint the following members, who shall serve a term of two years:

- (A) One member representing youth groups who provide services for juveniles involved in alternative programs for graffiti diversion,
- (B) One member representing nonprofit organizations who provide services related to the City's beautification and neighborhood cleanup programs,
- (C) Two members representing businesses who operate in San Francisco, one of which must be a property owner,
- (D) One member representing private schools or art schools who operate in San Francisco, and
- (E) One member representing the contracting agency for Municipal Railway shelters.

- (4) The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one member to serve on the Advisory Board:
 - (A) The General Manager of the Municipal Railway,
 - (B) The Director of Public Works,
 - (C) The Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic,
 - (D) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department,
 - (E) The District Attorney,
 - (F) The Chief of Police,
- (G) The Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint one member. If the Board of Education fails to appoint a member within 60 days of a vacancy, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a student, teacher, or member of the San Francisco Unified School District academic branch.

The Graffiti Advisory Board shall have the duty to:

- (1) Advise about the coordination of information, activities and goals among existing programs funded by the City and County and privately sponsored programs;
- (2) Advise about improving the efficiency in the provision of graffiti enforcement, prevention, and clean-up services.

Reports: The Advisory Board shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a report every six months on graffiti as it affects neighborhoods and the downtown area of San Francisco, which shall include a review and evaluation of the services and programs in place to respond to graffiti, prevention strategies, and recommendations and plans as to a consolidated program of public and private efforts.

Compensation: Members of the Advisory Board shall not be compensated, nor shall they be reimbursed for expenses.

Sunset Clause: None



SUNSHINE ORDINANCE TASK FORCE 2000

The Sunshine Ordinance Task Force 2000 consists of a total of 13 members, 11 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Mayor or his/her designee, and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors or his/her designee serve as non-voting members. The term of each appointive member shall be two years unless earlier removed by the Board of Supervisors. In the event of such removal or vacancy during the term of office of any appointive member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the office vacated.

At all times, the Task Force shall include at least one member who shall be a member of the public who is disabled and who has demonstrated interest in citizen access and participation in local government.

The Task Force shall advise the Board of Supervisors and provide information to other City departments on appropriate ways in which to implement Chapter 67 of the Administrative Code. BIODIESEL ACCESS TASK FORCE

The Biodiesel Access Task Force consists of a total of 17 members (7 voting, 10 non-voting), 7 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. All members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members. Those appointed must be members of the public who represent the biodiesel community, such as gas station owners, fleet operators and consumers. Such community members may include organizations. No organization shall have more than one representative on the Task Force.

In addition to the above 7 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the heads of each of the following San Francisco departments/agencies: Department of the Environment; San Francisco Public Utilities Commission; Fire Department; Department of Public Health; Department of Building Inspection; Department of Planning; Municipal Transportation Authority; Treasurer/Tax Collector; Mayor's Office of Workforce and Economic Development; and the Port.

The purpose of the Task Force is to facilitate the creation of a biodiesel fueling infrastructure that provides public access to biodiesel and biodiesel blends. In order to reach this goal, the Task Force shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors appropriate legislative action and city-wide strategies that would increase biodiesel use

such as the following: (1) the development of incentives for consumer, wholesaler and retailers of biodiesel, (2) the streamlining of current city processes that support biodiesel use among city fleets and among the city's consumers, and (3) the implementation of a permitting process for biodiesel fueling stations. Permitting process proposals can include, but are not limited to, permit fee waivers for the first ten biodiesel filling stations selling neat biodiesel and biodiesel blends of B99. The permitting process shall be consistent with federal, state and existing local law and shall balance the public's health, safety and right-to-know with the time and cost to potential permittees. The Task Force shall consult with state environmental agencies in considering proposed requirements.

Term of Office: Members of the Biodiesel Access Task Force shall be appointed for a term one year. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The Task Force shall prepare a written report setting forth its recommendations as well as criteria for evaluating the success of the Task Force's proposals. The Task Force shall submit their report within 12 months after the first meeting of the Task Force.

Sunset Date: The Biodiesel Access Task Force shall expire no later than December 31, 2009.

Compensation: Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.

ASTHMA TASK FORCE

The Asthma Task Force consists of a total of 27 members (15 voting, 12 nonvoting), 17 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. 15 of the 17 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members; two are non-voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint voting members from the following categories: (1) two representatives of community-based organizations that provide community-based research or advocacy related to asthma issues in San Francisco; (2) one representative of childcare coordinating/advocacy organizations; (3) three individuals who are either persons with asthma, the parent of a child with asthma, or an asthma patient advocate; (4) one representative of the Department of Public Health; (5) two representatives of environmental health/justice organizations; (6) two representatives of hospital associations, health care provider institutions, or MediCal Managed Care Insurers: (7) two representatives of lung health/asthma-specific organizations; (8) two individuals who represent health care professions working with asthmatics. In addition to the voting members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one non-voting member to represent property interests and one non-voting member to represent tenant interests.

In addition to the above 17 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the head of each of the following San Francisco

departments/agencies: Department of Human Services; Department of Children, Youth and Families; Department of Building Inspection; Department of the Environment; Fire Department; Emergency Medical Services Division; Planning Department; the San Francisco Housing Authority; and the San Francisco Unified School District. Each of the following federal agencies may designate a representative to join the Task Force as a non-voting member: United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States Housing and Urban Development.

The purpose of the Task Force is to recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and citywide strategies that would ensure the highest standard of asthma management and prevention services for all residents in the City and County of San Francisco, and to provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city policies for the prevention and management of asthma in the City and County of San Francisco.

Term of Office: Voting members of the Asthma Task Force shall be appointed for a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The Task Force by September 24, 2002 was to prepare a strategic plan with recommendations for legislative action and city-wide strategies to manage and prevent asthma in San Francisco to the Health Commission and to the Board of Supervisors. The timelines for completion of the Strategic Plan were extended to February 28, 2003. Thereafter, the Task Force was to submit status reports on progress toward implementing the plan recommendations and meeting the plan's goals to the Board bi-annually.

COMMUNITY OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF MARIJUANA OFFENSES

The Community Oversight Committee Regarding Enforcement of Marijuana Offenses shall consist of seven members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors, for a term of two years.

The Board shall appoint one member with each of the following qualifications or backgrounds: one medical cannabis patient; one member of the public defender's office; one representative of a medical cannabis dispensary operating in San Francisco; one civil liberties advocate; one harm reduction practitioner; one representative of a drug policy reform organization; and one representative from any of the following categories: juvenile justice advocate, advocate for homeless persons, resident of public housing, or representative of an organization providing services to or advocating on behalf of residents of public housing in San Francisco.

The Police Department, the Department of Public Health and the District Attorney are encouraged to send one representative as a non-voting liaison to the advisory committee.

At the initial meeting of the advisory committee, and annually thereafter, the committee shall select a chairperson, and any other officers deemed necessary by the committee. Consistent with the requirements of state and local law, the committee shall establish

rules for its own organization. All meetings shall be open to the public, except as provided by law.

The Community Oversight Committee Regarding Enforcement of Marijuana Offenses shall:

- (1) Monitor the implementation of this Ordinance by gathering information, with the cooperation of the San Francisco Police Department and other law enforcement agencies.
- (2) Receive statements from individuals who believe they were subjected to law enforcement activity contrary to the lowest law enforcement priority policy.
- (3) Design a supplemental report form for San Francisco law enforcement officers to use to report all adult marijuana arrests, citation, and property seizures, and all instances of officers assisting in federal arrests, citations, and property seizures for any marijuana offenses by adults within the City and County of San Francisco. The Community Oversight Committee shall design the supplemental report with the goal of allowing the Committee to ascertain whether San Francisco law enforcement officers followed the lowest law enforcement priority policy.
- (4) Request additional information from any San Francisco law enforcement officer who engaged in law enforcement activity relating to one or more marijuana offenses under circumstances that appear to violate the lowest law enforcement priority policy. An officer's decision not to provide additional information shall not be grounds for discipline.
- (5) Within one year of the effective date of this ordinance, make recommendations to the Police Department and Police Commission regarding regulations for implementing this ordinance.
- (6) Recommend to the Board of Supervisors policy changes that would further the purposes of this Committee.

Reports: The Community Oversight Committee Regarding Enforcement of Marijuana Offenses submit written reports semi-annually to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors on the implementation of this ordinance. URBAN FORESTRY COUNCIL

The Urban Forestry Council composition and administration was restructured by Ordinance No. 210-08 as follows:

The Mayor shall appoint two voting members as follows:

The following departments shall have voting members:

Director of the Department of Public Works or designee; Director of the Planning Department or designee.

The Council shall have advisory members comprised of representatives from the following departments: Recreation and Park Department and Public Utilities Commission.

In addition, the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, and the Golden Gate National Recreation Area are invited to send representatives to sit as advisory members of the Council.

The Body that appoints Council members also may appoint at-large members to serve any unfilled Council positions. Members shall serve for a term of two-years. Members can serve successive terms if reappointed by the body originally appointing the Council member. The Council shall meet at least once each month and establish its own operating procedures, which at a minimum, shall meet the public notice, meeting, voting, agenda and other procedural requirements set forth in local law. SHELTER MONITORING COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Committee is to provide the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate, comprehensive information about the conditions in and operations of shelters, as well as City policies in place that affect operations of shelters or their impact on shelter clients. The Department of Public Health shall provide administrative support for the Committee.

The Committee shall consist of 13 members, one of whom shall be a homeless person (or homeless within the 3 years prior to appointment) with a disability and one of whom shall be a homeless person (or homeless within the 3 years prior to appointment) living with their homeless child who is under the age of 18.

The 13 members of the Committee shall be appointed as follows:

Three members shall be appointed by the Mayor, including one member from the Department of Human Services;

One member from the Department of Public Health; and

One member who is homeless or formerly homeless and who has experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting.

Six members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors including: two homeless or formerly homeless (within the 3 years prior to appointment) individuals, one with a disability and one living with their homeless child under age 18; one member who has experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting; one member selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by community agencies that provide behavioral health, housing placement, or other services to the homeless; and two members selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by non-profit agencies that provide advocacy or organizing services to homeless people, one of which is homeless or formerly homeless.

Four members shall be appointed by the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, including: one member selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by non-profit agencies that provide advocacy or organizing services to homeless people; two members who have experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting, one of which is formerly homeless; and one member shall be homeless or formerly homeless and selected from a list of candidates that are nominated by community agencies that provide behavioral health, housing placement, or other services to homeless individuals.

In making their appointments to the Committee, the appointing authorities are encouraged to select people who are bilingual.

The term of office of each Committee member shall be two years. In the event that a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any Committee member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the expired term of office. The interim appointment shall be made in the same or similar manner that governed the initial appointment of the departing member.

The Committee shall meet a minimum of once per quarter at such times and places as the Committee shall designate. The location of the meetings shall be accessible to the public and the meetings shall comply with applicable public meeting requirements under state and local law.

The Committee shall monitor the attendance of Committee members. In the event that any Committee member misses three regularly scheduled meetings in a sixmonth period without prior notice to the Committee, the Committee shall certify in writing that the member missed three meetings in a six-month period of time. On the date of such certification, the member shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee. The Committee shall notify the appointing authority accordingly and request the appointment of a new member.

City departments that contract for services at a shelter that is under review must respond within 15 days to any reasonable request for information submitted by the Committee relative to the shelter or to City policies that affect operations of shelters or their impact on shelter clients. The reports shall also include recommended action steps for the shelter and for the City department that contracts for services at the shelter. City departments and the reports referenced in this subsection shall not identify shelter residents or disclose any confidential information concerning shelter residents consistent with state and federal law. The Committee may issue emergency reports at any time it deems necessary. The reports shall be provided to: 1) the Mayor, 2) the Board of Supervisors, 3) the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, 4) the appropriate city department responsible to take action, 5) the city department that contracts for services at the shelter, 6) the shelter under review, and 7) the public. These reports shall be public documents. Any city department identified in the report as responsible to take action recommended in the report shall, within 30 days of issuance of the report, provide to the Board of Supervisors a departmental report setting forth how the department intends to respond to the Committee's recommendations.

MARKET AND OCTAVIA COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

SAN FRANCISCO TASK FORCE ON RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FOR YOUTH IN CARE

The Task Force on Residential Treatment for Youth in Foster Care is established to address care for San Francisco's higher need children and youth in the foster care system. The specific focus shall be to address the need for: 1) a vision and transition plan for a new baseline system of agency coordination that will improve San Francisco's out-of-home placement system and ensure the best possible treatment and outcomes for San Francisco children and youth; and 2) development of a staged implementation plan that will improve the out-of-home placement system through coordination among the Juvenile Probation Department, Department of Public Health, Human Services Agency and the agencies that provide residential treatment services for youth.

The Task Force shall recognize that the ultimate goal for all San Francisco outof-home placements is to ensure that children and youth, wherever possible, are placed
within their own community, that placements are individualized, family and youth
guided, least restrictive, family and community based, clinically appropriate, and
culturally and linguistically relevant, that family reunification and return to a home-like
setting as soon as possible is the goal, and that adequate support is provided to foster
care parents and other foster care providers.

The Task Force shall consist of the following 13 members: the Director of Juvenile Probation, or his or her designee; the Director of the Human Services Agency, or his or her designee; the Director of Department of Public Health, or his or her

designee; the Director of Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, or his or her designee; the Public Defender, or his or her designee.

Six members of the community appointed by the Board of Supervisors: four shall be Executive Directors of S. F. mental health service providers, with an emphasis on providers that serve youth designated level 12 or 14 in a residential setting; two shall be former foster children, current or former foster parents, or the parents or guardians of current or former foster children.

The Board of Supervisors shall invite the Superintendent of S. F. Unified School District, or his or her designee; and the Supervising Judge of the Unified Family Court of the S. F. Superior Court, or his or her designee, to participate as full voting members of the Task Force. If either or both of these officials decline or fail to participate, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint another individual(s) with expertise in the relevant area - the operations of the SFUSD and/or the operations of the Unified Family Court - as necessary to fill the vacant seats.

The Task Force shall meet at least monthly and shall elect a Chair and a Vice Chair from among its members. The Human Services Agency shall provide all administrative support, including, but not limited to provision of necessary supplies, meeting space and staff support.

Reports: Within six months of the effective date of this ordinance, a report on an interim plan to coordinate all foster care placement improvement plans among Juvenile Probation, DPH, and HSA, a report on an interim plan to coordinate all placements made by Juvenile Probation, DPH and HSA, for S. F. children and youth in need of high-end residential treatment, and a progress report in order to inform the 2009-2010 budget process. Within nine months, a transition plan to bring S. F. higher need children and youth currently in higher level placements outside S. F. back to their home communities whenever possible. Within one year, a plan to coordinate all placements made by Juvenile Probation, DPH and HSA for S. F. children and youth in need of highend-residential treatment for mental illness and severe emotional distress, and a permanent maintenance plan for the new coordinated system of placement services for S. F. youth.



WESTERN SOMA CITIZENS' PLANNING TASK FORCE

The Western SoMa Citizens' Planning Task Force consists of 26 members: 20 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors; three members appointed by the District 6 Supervisor; one appointed by the Planning Director; one appointed by the Director of the San Francisco County Transportation Authority; and one appointed by the Director of the Department of Public Health.

The Western SoMa Citizens' Planning Task Force is established to advise the Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission on planning for western SoMa and to carry out the following duties: (a) using existing zoning as the starting point for an analysis of land use decisions that will shape the future of the entire community; (b) map and evaluate existing Residential Enclave Districts (REDs) and consider modifications to existing RED zoning map boundaries; (c) recommend basic RED preservation policies including height, density and design guidelines; (d) map and evaluate land uses proximate to existing and proposed REDs and develop basic height, density and design guidelines in order to provide a buffer between REDs and areas where more intense development might be allowed; (e) map overall western SoMa existing land use conditions; (f) recommend policies for the preservation of service and light industrial jobs, residential uses, and arts and entertainment opportunities; (g)

consider policies to guide increased heights and density along the major arterial streets where appropriate; (h) Recommend policies that promote more community-serving retail and commercial uses and that encourage improvements to transportation, open space, street safety, bicycle circulation, and mass transit; and (i) develop recommendations to ensure that the creation of a future Folsom Boulevard be developed in such a manner as to complement all of the above referenced goals.

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall consist of twenty-three (23) voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint twenty-one members from the following categories: two representatives from pedestrian safety organizations; two representatives from a senior or disability organization; one representative from bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organization; one representative from transit or environmental organization; one representative from child advocate or school support organizations; one representative from a public health organization; two at-large representatives; eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board shall appoint a representative who resides in his or her district.

The Superintendent of Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent.

In addition to the twenty-three voting members, the following City Departments shall select a non-voting representative: Parking and Traffic; Public Health; Municipal Railway; Public Works; Planning; Police; Recreation and Parks; District Attorney's Office; the Mayor's Office on Disability; and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians.

Advisory Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation

of law upon the issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee.

The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years. However, half of the members will serve an initial one year term and half will serve a two year term to

be determined by lot.

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall (1) Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City departments in order to improve pedestrian safety and ambiance; (2) Develop concepts and review policies and planning efforts regarding pedestrian improvements; (3) Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities; (4) Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco; (5) Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan.

The Department of Parking and Traffic shall support the Advisory Committee.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.

Within six months of the appointment of members of the Advisory Committee as newly constituted by File No. 070082, the Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors, in writing, as to the number of meetings for which the Advisory Committee has had a quorum.

VOTING SYSTEMS TASK FORCE

The Voting Systems Task Force shall be comprised of individuals with backgrounds in good government, computer science or the computer industry, election administration, and accommodations of persons with disabilities.

The Task Force will investigate and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors about voting system standards, design and development.

The Task Force will consist of nine voting members appointed by the Board of Supervisors and one ex-officio non-voting member representing the Elections Commission. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint two members representing good government groups; four members with substantial background in computer science or the software or computer industry; two members with background in or knowledge of election administration; and one member with a background working in accommodation of persons with disabilities.

The voting members shall serve a term of two years from the date that all nine members have been appointed. The Board of Supervisors shall fill any vacancies occurring in the voting membership of the Task Force.

The Office of the City Administrator shall provide administrative support to the Task Force.

The Task Force shall have the authority to hold hearings and take testimony regarding voting systems and related matters.

reviewing voting systems; methods for generating or acquiring designs for voting systems; models for developing a voting system including proprietary, disclosed and open source software and hardware approaches; business models, including the CCSF acting as its own vendor, which promote transparency in the design and implementation of the voting system; and any other considerations related to voting systems which will promote public trust in the conduct and results of elections.

SWEATFREE PROCUREMENT ADVISORY GROUP

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall consist of eleven members. The Mayor and the Board of Supervisors shall each appoint five members. The Controller shall appoint one member. Each member shall be appointed to a term of two years. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience representing employees in labor matters. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience acquiring goods or services for a public entity. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience as an advocate for human rights or the poor. The Controller's appointee shall have significant experience in finance, financial auditing, or accounting. All members of the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall be appointed within sixty days of the effective date of this Chapter. Each member shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall meet not less than once each fiscal year.

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall evaluate the industries engaged in the manufacture and sale of goods to determine whether contracts for any goods, in addition to apparel and garments, should be targeted for enforcement, and to evaluate the implementation, administration, and enforcement of this Chapter. To

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determine whether a particular good shall be targeted for enforcement, the factors that the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall consider shall include, but not be limited to: (a) the amount the City and County has spent, and anticipates spending for such good; (b) evidence of Sweatshop Labor or other conditions prohibited by this Chapter in the manufacturing, assemblage or distribution of such good; and (c) any financial impact that targeting the good for enforcement will have on the City and County.

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall determine how the City and County may maximize its purchase of goods produced in San Francisco. Within four months of its formation, the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall examine how the City and County may provide preferences and/or incentives to garment industry manufacturers in San Francisco that are in compliance with this Chapter, and explore the expansion of preferences and/or incentives to other industries. Within the fourmonth period, the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall propose legislation to immediately implement the preferences and/or incentives.

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PARK, RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Reentry Council is created to coordinate local efforts to support adults NCISCO exiting San Francisco County Jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out of home RARY placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population.

The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law.

The council shall consist of 21 members, seven of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as a member, and shall also appoint three of the members.

The Board of Supervisors shall appoint three members as follows: one member who shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system; one member must have been released from custody within two years of his/her appointment; and one member must have served multiple terms.

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency and the Department of Public Health.

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court; Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations; and the United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one member each to the Council. If any of these four agencies does not appoint a representative, the Council co-chairs shall appoint an additional member.

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any Council member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned.

Seven members of the Council shall constitute a quorum and the Council shall have the authority to act on the vote of the majority of the quorum.

The three members appointed by the District Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office and the Sheriff's Department, respectively, as well as the Mayor or the Mayor's representative, shall co-chair the Council.

EASTERN NEIGHBORHOODS CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

An Eastern Neighborhoods Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is hereby established for the purposes of providing input on the prioritization of Public Benefits, updating the Public Benefits Program, relaying information to community members in each of the four neighborhoods regarding the status of development proposals in the Eastern Neighborhoods and providing input to plan area monitoring efforts as appropriate. The CAC shall be advisory, as appropriate, to the Planning Department, the Interagency Planning & Implementation Committee (IPIC), the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors.

Within six months of adoption of the Eastern Neighborhoods Area Plan and related Planning Code changes, the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors shall have appointed all members to the CAC.

The CAC shall consist of 13 members representing the diversity of the Eastern Neighborhoods; key stakeholders, including resident renters, resident homeowners, low-income residents, local merchants, established neighborhood groups within the plan area; and other groups identified through refinement of the CAC process.

All members shall live, work, own property or own a business in the Eastern Neighborhoods Plan Area they are appointed to represent.

The Board of Supervisors shall appoint 8 members to the CAC: District 10 Supervisor shall nominate 4 members, District 6 Supervisor shall nominate 2 members, District 8 Supervisor shall nominate 1 member and District 9 Supervisor shall nominate

1 member. The appointment of each nominee shall be confirmed by the full Board of Supervisors.

The Mayor shall appoint 5 members, one member representing each of the four neighborhoods, and on at-large member.

Members shall serve two-year terms that are staggered such that of the initial membership, some members will be randomly selected to serve four-year terms and some will serve two-year terms. 

Reentry Council

The Reentry Council is created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco County Jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population.

The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law.

The council shall consist of 21 members, seven of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as a member, and shall also appoint three of the members.



The Board of Supervisors shall appoint four members.

At least two of these seven members shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system. At least one of these seven members must have been released from custody within two years of his or her appointment; at least one must have served multiple terms; and at least one must be between the ages of 18 to 24 at the time of appointment.

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency and the Department of Public Health.

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court; Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations; and the United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one member each to the Council. If any of these four agencies does not appoint a representative, the Council co-chairs shall appoint an additional member.

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any Council member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned.

Seven members of the Council shall constitute a quorum and the Council shall have the authority to act on the vote of the majority of the quorum.

The three members appointed by the District Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office and the Sheriff's Department, respectively, as well as the Mayor or the Mayor's representative, shall co-chair the Council.

The Council may establish subcommittees. The Council shall meet in full at least three times per year.

Reports: At least once a year, the Council shall prepare and submit a report that shall include but not be limited to information identifying funding streams; programs serving individuals exiting the criminal justice system; needs of reentry population; and barriers to safe and successful reentry. City departments shall respond within 30 days, if mentioned in report. Reports shall be provided to the Mayor; Board of Supervisors; City departments in report and the public.

The Council shall be staffed, subject to fiscal and budgetary provisions of the Charter, by the Public Defender's Office, District Attorney's and the Mayor's Office designating one staff member each.

ASTHMA TASK FORCE

The Asthma Task Force consists of a total of 27 members (15 voting, 12 nonvoting), 17 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. 15 of the 17 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members; two are non-voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint voting members from the following categories: (1) two representatives of community-based organizations that provide community-based research or advocacy related to asthma issues in San Francisco; (2) one representative of childcare coordinating/advocacy organizations; (3) three individuals who are either persons with asthma, the parent of a child with asthma, or an asthma patient advocate; (4) one representative of the Department of Public Health; (5) two representatives of environmental health/justice organizations; (6) two representatives of hospital associations, health care provider institutions, or MediCal Managed Care Insurers; (7) two representatives of lung health/asthma-specific organizations; (8) two individuals who represent health care professions working with asthmatics. In addition to the voting members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one non-voting member to represent property interests and one non-voting member to represent tenant interests.

In addition to the above 17 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the head of each of the following San Francisco

departments/agencies: Department of Human Services; Department of Children, Youth and Families; Department of Building Inspection; Department of the Environment; Fire Department; Emergency Medical Services Division; Planning Department; the San Francisco Housing Authority; and the San Francisco Unified School District. Each of the following federal agencies may designate a representative to join the Task Force as a non-voting member: United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States Housing and Urban Development.

The purpose of the Task Force is to recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and citywide strategies that would ensure the highest standard of asthma management and prevention services for all residents in the City and County of San Francisco, and to provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city policies for the prevention and management of asthma in the City and County of San Francisco.

Term of Office: Voting members of the Asthma Task Force shall be appointed for a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

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

MENTAL HEALTH BOARD

Any positions not allocated to specific types of members may be filled by



persons with experience and knowledge of the mental health system representing the public interest.

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COMMISSION ON THE AGING ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Advisory Council is not to exceed 22 members (voting members), 11 of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The composition of the other members are as follows: 11 members appointed by the Commission on the Aging. More than 50% of the members of each group of 11 members shall be persons who are 60 years of age or older. The Council shall be representative of the geographic and ethnic populations of the City and County of San Francisco by districts determined by the Commission. The council shall include service providers, older persons with the greatest socio and economic need, consumers, and others specified by federal regulation.

The Advisory Council members shall be appointed to serve two year terms. When vacancies occur due to resignation or other causes, they shall be filled by the appointment of a person to fill the unexpired portion of the term by the Commission or corresponding Supervisor.

The Advisory Council shall advise the Commission on the Aging on all maters relating to the development and administration of its area plan and the operations conducted thereunder, including needs assessment, priorities, programs, and budgets, and such other matters relating to the well-being of all senior citizens 60 years of age



and older within the scope and spirit of Federal, State and local regulations, laws and ordinances. The Advisory Council member shall be responsible for representing the needs and concerns of all senior citizens in the City and County of San Francisco, duties of which are outlined in the Bylaws.

Council members shall collect all appropriate information in order to provide the Commission with advice in the Commission's decision-making on the needs, assessments, priorities, programs and budgets concerning older San Franciscans.

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SWEATFREE PROCUREMENT ADVISORY GROUP

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall consist of eleven members. The Mayor and the Board of Supervisors shall each appoint five members. The Controller shall appoint one member. Each member shall be appointed to a term of two years. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience representing employees in labor matters. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience acquiring goods or services for a public entity. At least one of the Board of Supervisors' appointees and one of the Mayor's appointees must have significant experience as an advocate for human rights or the poor. The Controller's appointee shall have significant experience in finance, financial auditing, or accounting. All members of the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall be appointed within sixty days of the effective date of this Chapter. Each member shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall meet not less than once each fiscal year.

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall evaluate the industries engaged in the manufacture and sale of goods to determine whether contracts for any goods, in addition to apparel and garments, should be targeted for enforcement, and to evaluate the implementation, administration, and enforcement of this Chapter. To



determine whether a particular good shall be targeted for enforcement, the factors that the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall consider shall include, but not be limited to: (a) the amount the City and County has spent, and anticipates spending for such good; (b) evidence of Sweatshop Labor or other conditions prohibited by this Chapter in the manufacturing, assemblage or distribution of such good; and (c) any financial impact that targeting the good for enforcement will have on the City and County.

The Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall determine how the City and County may maximize its purchase of goods produced in San Francisco. Within four months of its formation, the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall examine how the City and County may provide preferences and/or incentives to garment industry manufacturers in San Francisco that are in compliance with this Chapter, and explore the expansion of preferences and/or incentives to other industries. Within the fourmonth period, the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall propose legislation to immediately implement the preferences and/or incentives.

Report: At the end of the first full fiscal year of the City and County following the effective date of this Chapter, and annually thereafter, the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group shall submit a written report to the Director and the Office of Labor Standards Enforcement that contains any recommendations on the administration, implementation, and enforcement of this Chapter, or the application of this Chapter to other goods. The report shall include the supporting information upon which each recommendation is based and a report on the financial impact that adoption of the recommendation will have on the City and County. The Director may submit any recommendation to extend the applicability of this Chapter to other goods to the Board of Supervisors. Upon the adoption of an ordinance approving such recommendation, Contracts for the purchase of such goods shall be subject to this Chapter. The Director in the Director's discretion may adopt other recommendations of the Sweatfree Procurement Advisory Group subject to the Municipal Code and the Charter.

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ASTHMA TASK FORCE

The Asthma Task Force consists of a total of 27 members (15 voting, 12 nonvoting), 17 of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. 15 of the 17 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors are voting members; two are non-voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint voting members from the following categories: (1) two representatives of community-based organizations that provide community-based research or advocacy related to asthma issues in San Francisco; (2) one representative of childcare coordinating/advocacy organizations; (3) three individuals who are either persons with asthma, the parent of a child with asthma, or an asthma patient advocate; (4) one representative of the Department of Public Health; (5) two representatives of environmental health/justice organizations; (6) two representatives of hospital associations, health care provider institutions, or MediCal Managed Care Insurers; (7) two representatives of lung health/asthma-specific organizations; (8) two individuals who represent health care professions working with asthmatics. In addition to the voting members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one non-voting member to represent property interests and one non-voting member to represent tenant interests.

In addition to the above 17 members, one non-voting member shall be appointed to the Task Force by the head of each of the following San Francisco departments/agencies: Department of Human Services; Department of Children, Youth



and Families; Department of Building Inspection; Department of the Environment; Fire Department; Emergency Medical Services Division; Planning Department; the San Francisco Housing Authority; and the San Francisco Unified School District. Each of the following federal agencies may designate a representative to join the Task Force as a non-voting member: United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States Housing and Urban Development.

The purpose of the Task Force is to recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and citywide strategies that would ensure the highest standard of asthma management and prevention services for all residents in the City and County of San Francisco, and to provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city policies for the prevention and management of asthma in the City and County of San Francisco.

Term of Office: Voting members of the Asthma Task Force shall be appointed for a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor to complete the remainder of that term.

Reports: The Task Force by September 24, 2002 was to prepare a strategic plan with recommendations for legislative action and city-wide strategies to manage and prevent asthma in San Francisco to the Health Commission and to the Board of Supervisors. The timelines for completion of the Strategic Plan were extended to February 28, 2003. Thereafter, the Task Force was to submit status reports on progress toward implementing the plan recommendations and meeting the plan's goals to the Board bi-annually.

Sunset Date: The Asthma Task Force shall submit a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors two years after the passage of this ordinance regarding whether the Asthma Task Force should continue in effect. Unless reauthorized by the Board by resolution prior to June 30, 2011, this task force shall expire.

Compensation: Members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.

Vacant seat, succeeding Nadia Thind, seat 3, resigned, must be a representative of childcare coordinating/advocacy organizations and is a voting member, for the unexpired portion of a term ending July 1, 2011.

Vacant seat, succeeding Tiffany Sutter, seat 13, resigned, must be a representative of a lung health/asthma-specific organization and is a voting member, for the unexpired portion of a term ending July 1, 2011.

Vacant seat, succeeding Kimberly Knox, seat 17, resigned, must be an individual who represents tenant interests, non-voting member, for the unexpired portion of a term ending July 1, 2011.

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IMMIGRANT RIGHTS COMMISSION

The Immigrant Rights Commission consists of fifteen voting members. Eleven voting members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The other four voting members are appointed by the Mayor.

At least eight members shall be immigrants to the United States who are appointed in accordance with Section 4.101 of the Charter. The remaining members must have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be two years; provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that eight members shall serve a term of three years and seven members shall serve a term of two years. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that for the initial member.



The Immigrant Rights Commission shall advise and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor about issues affecting immigrants residing in San Francisco.

In addition, members shall have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 6, 2011.





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ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD NO. 2

The Assessment Appeals Board No. 2 consists of eight members, five regular members, and three alternate members all of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

No person may concurrently hold a seat on Assessment Appeals Board No. 1 and a seat on Assessment Appeals Board No. 2.

The Board members' term of office is three years, beginning on the first Monday in September. In the event of a vacancy, the newly appointed member shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

The Board shall have the following qualifications as stated in the eligibility criteria set forth in Section 1624.05 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code as follows: Must have a minimum of five years professional experience in the State of California as one of the following: Certified Public Accountant (CPA) or Public Accountant (PA); licensed Real Estate Broker; Attorney; or a Property Appraiser accredited by a nationally recognized professional organization, or Property Appraiser certified by the Office of Real Estate Appraiser; or he or she is a current member of an assessment appeals board.



Hearing Officers: The regular and alternate members of the Board shall also serve as hearing officers. The Clerk shall designate members to act as hearing officers for particular applications using a rotating system designed to assure that all members with the same priority level, as described in this subsection, have an equal opportunity over time to participate as hearing officers. The Clerk shall designate hearing officers in the following priority order: (a) the alternate members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 2: (b) the alternate members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 1; (c) the regular members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 2; and (d) the regular members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 1. In their capacity as assessment hearing officers, the officers shall serve at the pleasure of and by contract with the Board of Supervisors.

It shall be the duty of each Assessment Appeals Board to equalize the valuation of the taxable property within the City and County for the purposes of taxation in the manner and subject to the limitations contained in Article XIII of the California State Constitution. Assessment Appeals Board No. 2 shall have jurisdiction to only hear applications for reduction for property on the secured or unsecured rolls assessed at less than \$50,000,000, excluding applications involving possessory interests or real property located all or in part within Assessor's Blocks 1 - 876, inclusive, or Assessor's Blocks 3701-3899 inclusive. Except not including residential real property on the secured roll consisting of four units or less that is located all or in part within those blocks.

Report: Pursuant to Section 1639 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, the hearing officer shall prepare a summary report of the proceedings together with a recommendation on the application and shall transmit this report and recommendation to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

The other four members who are non-voting members include the following: One member shall consist of the Director of the Animal Care and Control Department or his or her designated representative. One City Department representative member shall be appointed by each of the following: the Director of the Department of Public Health or his or her designated representative; the Chief of Police or his or her designated representative; and the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department or his or her designated representative.

Each member of the Commission of Animal Control and Welfare of the City and County of San Francisco shall be a resident of the City and County of San Francisco, except for the licensed veterinarian, who must practice in San Francisco, but who need not be a resident of San Francisco.

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The Commission shall have the powers and duties to (a) hold hearings and submit recommendations regarding animal control and welfare to the Board of Supervisors and the City Administrator; (b) study and recommend requirements for the maintenance of animals in public, private, and commercial care; and (c) work with the Tax Collector, the Director of the Animal Care and Control Department and authorized licensing entities to develop and maintain dog licensing procedures and make recommendations on fees.

COMMUNITY OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF MARIJUANA OFFENSES

The Community Oversight Committee Regarding Enforcement of Marijuana Offenses shall consist of seven members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors, for a term of two years.

The Board shall appoint one member with each of the following qualifications or backgrounds: one medical cannabis patient; one member of the public defender's office; one representative of a medical cannabis dispensary operating in San Francisco; one civil liberties advocate; one harm reduction practitioner; one representative of a drug policy reform organization; and one representative from any of the following categories: juvenile justice advocate, advocate for homeless persons, resident of public housing, or representative of an organization providing services to or advocating on behalf of residents of public housing in San Francisco.

The Police Department, the Department of Public Health and the District Attorney are encouraged to send one representative as a non-voting liaison to the advisory committee.

At the initial meeting of the advisory committee, and annually thereafter, the committee shall select a chairperson, and any other officers deemed necessary by the committee. Consistent with the requirements of state and local law, the committee shall establish



rules for its own organization. All meetings shall be open to the public, except as provided by law.


The Community Oversight Committee Regarding Enforcement of Marijuana Offenses shall:

- (1) Monitor the implementation of this Ordinance by gathering information, with the cooperation of the San Francisco Police Department and other law enforcement agencies.
- (2) Receive statements from individuals who believe they were subjected to law enforcement activity contrary to the lowest law enforcement priority policy.
- (3) Design a supplemental report form for San Francisco law enforcement officers to use to report all adult marijuana arrests, citation, and property seizures, and all instances of officers assisting in federal arrests, citations, and property seizures for any marijuana offenses by adults within the City and County of San Francisco. The Community Oversight Committee shall design the supplemental report with the goal of allowing the Committee to ascertain whether San Francisco law enforcement officers followed the lowest law enforcement priority policy.
- (4) Request additional information from any San Francisco law enforcement officer who engaged in law enforcement activity relating to one or more marijuana offenses under circumstances that appear to violate the lowest law enforcement priority policy. An officer's decision not to provide additional information shall not be grounds for discipline.
- (5) Within one year of the effective date of this ordinance, make recommendations to the Police Department and Police Commission regarding regulations for implementing this ordinance.
- (6) Recommend to the Board of Supervisors policy changes that would further the purposes of this Committee.



CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FIRST COMMISSION

The San Francisco Children and Families First Commission (aka the First Five Commission) consists of a total of nine members, all of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

The Commission is comprised of two type of members. Of the first type there are four (4) members: One (1) member shall be the Director of Public Health or designee; one (1) member shall be the General Manager of the Department of Human Services or designee; one (1) member shall be a member of the Board of Supervisors; one (1) member shall be the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families or designee. These members shall be entitled to serve as long as they meet the qualifications of membership.

The remaining five (5) members shall be appointed from among the following categories: persons responsible for management of the following county functions: children services, public health services; behavioral health services, social services and tobacco and other substance abuse prevention and treatment services; recipients of project services included in the county strategic plan; educators specializing in early childhood development; representatives of a local child care resource or referral agency, the Child Care Planning and Advisory Council or another local child care coordinating group; representatives of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk; representatives of community-based organizations that



have the goal of promoting and nurturing early childhood development; representatives of local school districts; and representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric associations or societies. Their terms shall be for four years, provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that two members shall serve a three-year term, and three members shall serve a four year-term. On the expiration of these terms, their successors shall be appointed for a four-year term. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any appointed member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that for the initial member.

This Commission is established to promote, support and improve the early development of children from the prenatal state to five years of age and to carry out the provisions of the California Children and Families First Act of 1998.
