Our financial status has not improved since last month's skinny Folio; we're still trying to pay off the debts that have accumulated since the May Marathon—taxes, rents telephone bills, wire service bills, **Folio** expenses and staff salaries. To cover operating expenses for October, our financial goal is \$30,000. This represents 1,000 new subscriptions and the renewals of 1,175 subscriptions that will lapse this month. \$30,000 will not get us out of debt; it will only help us from getting deeper into it. What we must have—unless we receive a windfall no-strings gift of around \$50,000—is voluntary individual support. We do not want to raise the cost of subscriptions, as the Los Angeles Pacifica station has been forced to do. Our basic premise is to have the largest possible number of listener-sponsors at a price everyone can afford. Despite the fact that we're more than broke, we are going to have programs that are more than worth the cost of a subscription (consider **really** asking freinds to sponsor WBAI).
