Some of the services which the Student Council has performed are placing monitors in the hall every period and recovering a few stolen articles. They plan to publish handbooks to be given to all the students.

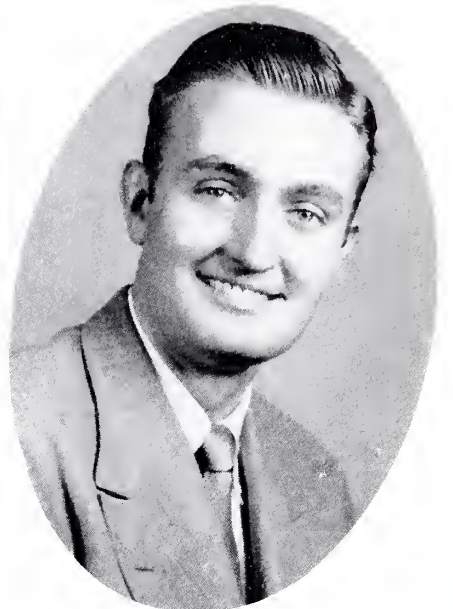
The Student Council hopes to do much more during the remainder of the year to make Madison High School a better school and to establish a Student Council which will last through the coming years.
