The Generals wound up their best season in the school's history, setting several team and individual records on the way. Several of the new records were the 1290 points for the season and an average of 56.08 points per game. Jack Schilling left his mark as he dropped in 249 points and averaged 11.9 per game.
The first five games served only to warm up for the real competition as the cagers rolled up an excess of 81 points over the opposition. Jack Schilling and Wally Ryland were pacing the team with 54 and 46 points respectively.

Three of the first losses suffered during the season came in a streak as Roosevelt, George Washington and St. John's all dropped the Generals. Of these only St. John's really had a win when they fought their way to an 80-63 victory. This proved to be the only time an opponent scored more than 60 points.

After recovering from the sudden change of fortune, the hoopsters began a string which contained 12 victories carrying them to the end of the regular season without a further loss.

In tournament play the Generals had a record of one win and two losses. However, both losses were to the eventual winners of the two tournaments.
