

WE, the members of the Professional Training Class of the Chicago Normal School, believing that an ideal school is an ideal self-governing community, and that each member should show by his conduct the true ideal of a pupil, teacher and citizen, do establish this Constitution for the government of the Professional Training Class.

Article I.==LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

SECTION I.

All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Representative Assembly of the Professional Training Class which shall consist of a Senate and House

SECTION II.

Clause 1.—The House shall be composed of members chosen during the first week of each term, except the first election of each school year, which shall be held during the first week in October, by the students of the several Classes.

Clause 2.—The number of representatives shall be five from each Class of forty or more members.

Clause 3.—When vacancies occur in the representation from any Class the president thereof shall call for an election to fill such vacancies.

Clause 4.—The House shall choose their Speaker and other officers and shall have the sole power of impeachment.

SECTION III.

Clause 1.—The Senate shall be composed of the Presdent, Treasurer, and Marshal of each Class, who shall be elected the first week in October and the last week in the fall term of each school year.

Clause 2—The Vice President of the Professional Training Class shall be president of the Senate but shall have no vote unless they be equally divided

Clause 3—The Senate shall choose their other officers, and also a president *pro tempore*, in the absence of the Vice. President or when he shall exercise the office of President of the Proffssional Training Class.

Clause 4.—The Senate shall have the sole power to try all impeachments.

SECTION IV

Clause 1—The election for representatives shall be held in the several Class rooms during the first week in October and of the winter and spring terms.

Clause 2.—The Representative Assembly shall meet at least once each month; the House on the second and the Senate on the fourth Wednesday of each month, at 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon, unless they shall by law appoint a different day or hour, and shall continue in session each day till all necessary business, which may be brought before it, is disposed of.

SECTION V.

Clause 1.—Each house shall be the judge of the elections, and a majority of each shall constitute a quorum to do business, but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day.

· Clause 2.—The rule of each house shall be Roberts' Rules of Order.

Clause 3.—Each house shall expel a member for non-attendance (except for unavoidable cause) or disorderly behavior, whether as member of that body or of the Professional Training Class; and such member so expelled shall not hold office in the Professional Training Class during the remainder of that term in which he is expelled.

Clause 4.—Each house shall keep a journal of its proceedings, open at all times to the inspection of the Principal of the CHICAGO NORMAL SCHOOL, and the yeas and nays of the members of either house on any question shall, at the desire of one-fifth of those present, be entered on the journal.

SECTION VI.

No student holding any office under the Professional Training Class shall be a member of either house during his continuance in office; but the provision of this section shall not interfere with Clause I of Section III.

SECTION VII.

Clause 1.—Any bill, rule or regulation of whatever nature may originate in either house, but the house in which they do not originate may propose or concur with amendments

Clause 2.—Every measure which shall have passed the House and the Senate, shall, before it becomes a law, be presented to the President of the Professional Training CLASS; if he approve he shall sign it, but if not, he shall return it with his objections to the house in which it originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it. If after such reconsideration, two-thirds of that house shall agree to pass the measure, it shall be sent, together with the objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered, and if approved by two-thirds of that house, it shall become a law, provided, however, it receive (after such reconsideration) the endorsement of the Principal of the CHICAGO NORMAL SCHOOL. If any measure shall not be returned by the President on or before the next regular meeting of the house in which the measure shall have originated, after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law in like manner as it he had signed it SECTION VIII.

Clause 1.—The Representative Assembly shall have power to lay and collect all taxes and dues and appropriate the same for the general welfare of the Professional Training Class

Clause 2 — To make rules and regulations for the government of the Professional Training Class.

Clause 3 – To decide how all questions having a direct relation to the Professional Training Class and not herein otherwise provided for, shall be settled.

Article II. == EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

SECTION I.

Clause 1.—The executive department of the Professional Training Class shall consist of a President, who shall hold his office during the current school year, and, together with the Vice-President, shall be elected as follows:

Clause 2.—Each Class shall choose, by popular vote one elector for every twenty members and fraction thereof, but the number of electors shall not exceed three from any one room.

Clause 3.—The Principal of the Chicago Normal School may determine the time of choosing the electors and the day on which they shall give their votes.

Clause 4.—The electors shall meet and vote by ballot for President and Vice-President. A separate vote shall be taken for President and Vice-President and a majority vote shall elect. In case of failure to agree on a candidate after seven ballotings, the Electoral College shall be dissolved; then from the persons having the highest numbers not exceeding three or four if the third be a tie, on the list of those voted for as President, on the seventh ballot, the House shall choose immediately, by ballot, the President. But in choosing the President, the vote shall be taken by Classes. the Representation from each class having one vote; a quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or mempers from two-thirds of the Classes, and a majority of all the Classes shall be necessary for a choice. If no person have a majority for Vice-President, then from the two, or three if the second be a tie, highest numbers on the list, the Senate shall choose the Vice-President; a quorum for the purpose shall consist of two-thirds of the whole number of senators, and a majority of the whole number shall be necessary to a choice.

Clause 5.—In case of inability of the President to discharge the duties of his office, the same shall devolve on the Vice-President, or in case of the permanent removal of both President and Vice-President, for whatever cause, a

new election may be called, according to Section I, Clause 2, 3 and 4 of this Article.

Clause 6.—In case of the *temporary* inability of both President and Vice-President, the office of President shall devolve upon a member of the cabinet, the order of succession being as follows: Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Marshal and Attorney-General.

SECTION II.

Clause 1.—The President shall preside at all meetings of the Professional Training Class.

Clause 2.—He shall be a member, ex officio, of all Class committees, and may convene them.

Clause 3.—The President shall appoint, with the confirmation of the Senate, a Cabinet of four members—Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Marshal, and Attorney-General—who will advise with him on all matters pertaining to the Professional Training Class.

Clause 4.—The President shall appoint, with the confirmation of the Senate, all committees having a direct relation to the Professional Training Class as a whole, except ushers and reception committees, which may be appointed by him without the confirmation of the Senate.

Clause 5.—He shall appoint, with the confirmation of the Senate, members of the Judiciary, and all other officers of the Professional Training Class, whose appointments are not herein otherwise provided for, and which shall be established by law; but the Representative Assembly may vest the appointment of such officers as they think proper in the President alone.

SECTION III.

He may recommend to the consideration of the Representative Assembly such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient; he may, on extraordinary occasions, convene both houses, or either of them, and in case of disagreement between them with respect to the time of adjournment, he may adjourn them to such time as he shall think

proper; he shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed.

SECTION IV.

The President, Vice-President and all officers of the Professional Training Class shall be removed from office on impeachment for, and conviction of, nonattendance to duty, willful violation of the rules and regulations of the Professional Training Class.

Article III.=-JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

SECTION I.

Clause 1.—The Judiciary shall consist of five counselors, appointed by the President of the Professional Training Class, and confirmed by the Senate. One to be appointed for six months, one for four months, one for three months, one for two months and one for one month; and all vacancies as they may occur shall be filled for the remainder of the school year.

Clause 2.—The person appointed for six months shall be the Chief Counselor and preside at all meetings, but in his absence the Judiciary shall choose one of their number Chief Counselor *pro tempore*.

SECTION II.

Clause 1.—The Judiciary will decide all matters of dereliction or disobedience of law.

Clause 2.—The Judiciary shall meet at least once a month, at such time and place as the Principal of the Chicago Normal School shall name; and in such extra sessions as the Principal of the Chicago Normal School, or the President of the Professional Training Class, may deem best.

Article IV. == CABINET OFFICERS.

SECTION I.

The Cabinet shall consist of a Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Marshal and Attorney General.

SECTION II

Clause I.—The Treasurer shall receive from the treasurers of each of the several Classes all moneys voted by the Representative Assembly, and pay out the same according to the acts of the Representative Assembly.

Clause 2.—He shall report from time to time the state of the treasury, to the Representative Assembly, or when ever either house may so request.

SECTION III.

The Secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings of general nature, pertaining to the Professional Training Class

SECTION IV

Clause 1.—The Chief Marshal shall have charge of the general order of the Professional Training Class

Clause 2.—The Chief Marshal shall act under the President in preserving order

Clause 3.—The Chief Marshal shall have general charge of the seating and ushering at all general entertainments in Assembly Hall.

SECTION V.

The Attorney-General shall present all cases of dereliction of law, to the Judiciary.

Article V.=-COMMITTEES.

SECTION I

The following committees shall be appointed at the beginning of each term: a committee on decorations, a committee on program, and a conference committee.

SECTION II.

The committee on decorations shall consist of ten members, who will have general charge of decorations.

SECTION III.

The program committee shall consist of ten members, who will have charge of the program for all Class entertainments.

SECTION IV.

The conference committee shall consist of three members through whom the Professional Training Class shall confer with a committee of the Faculty, on all matters relating to the Class as a whole. This committee shall not be subject to Section VI of Article I.

Article VI.==DIVISION OFFICERS.

SECTION I

The president, treasurer and marshal of each Class shall be members of the Senate.

SECTION II.

The president of each Class shall make returns to the Senate and House, of all elections to those bodies.

SECTION III.

The treasurer of each Class shall collect all taxes and dues voted by the Representative Assembly, and turn the same over to the Treasurer of the Professional Training Class

SECTION IV.

The Class marshal shall have charge of his Class when marching to and from recitations and morning exercise, and be responsible for the order of the same.

Article VII.==MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

SECTION I.

On all special occasions, except Commencement Day, when orators, essayests, poets, etc., are to be chosen; the

same shall be done according to Article II, Section I, Clause 2, 3 and 4.

SECTION II.

All measures relating to school government, which shall pass the Representative Assembly, shall, before the President of the Professional Training Class take definite action on the same, be presented by him to the Principal of the Chicago Normal School; if he approve he will sign it, but if not, it shall be returned with his objections for reconsideration, according to Article I, Section VII, Clause 2.

SECTION III.

No society shall be formed within the Professional Training Class without the consent of the Principal of the Chicago Normal School.

SECTION IV.

Until such time as the Class elect a president and vicepresident the government shall be a provisional one, under the direction of the Principal of the Chicago Normal School.

Article VIII. == POWER OF AMENDMENT.

The Representative Assembly, whenever two-thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose amendments to this Constitution, or on the application of two-thirds of the several Classes, shall call a convention for proposing amendments, which in either case shall be valid, as a part of this Constitution, when ratified by three-fourths of the several Classes, and a majority of the Faculty.

Article IX. == RATIFICATION OF THE CONSTITUTION.

The ratification of this Constitution by seven Classes, and a majority of the Faculty shall be sufficient for its establishment.

Article X.==POWER OF THE PRINCIPAL.

This Constitution and all amendments to it shall not be ratified until endorsed by the Principal of the Chicago Normal School.

The foregoing has been adapted from the Constitution of the United States, with the thought, that as students and teachers we will be led, in the consideration of our Class organization, to a more thorough study of our national government.

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Article 1.

SECTION I.—The colors of the Chicago Normal School shall be pine-needle green and white; the emblem shall be the Pine; the badge shall be pine needles, tied with a bow of white ribbon, and the pin shall be a pennant with a white enamel back-ground and the letters C. N. S. in pine-needle green enamel across the face.

Section 2.—No class, or division of any class, shall use, as such, any colors, emblem, badge, pin or yell other than the school colors, emblem, badge, pin and yell, except that each class may so add to the school yell as to give it a distinctive class feature.

BY-LAWS.

1. The Professional Training Class shall hold an afternoon reception once in every two weeks, and an evening reception once in every two months, dates for such receptions being determined by the President of the Professional Training Class.

2. The attendance in each division shall be taken by a member of that division, who shall be appointed by the President of said division and shall hold office for one term.

3. The National form of procedure shall be followed in the Representative Assembly so far as is consistent with the Constitution and the needs of the Assembly.

4. A copy of all laws shall be posted by the Secretary of the Professional Training Class within twenty-four hours of the time of their enactment.

5. The twenty-minute session, each Tuesday and Friday morning, shall be devoted to a business meeting in the several rooms.

6. There shall be a five-minute recess between the second and third period of the morning session.

7. All school material shall be issued subject to regulations of the Curator.

8. There shall be no dancing in the Assembly Hall between 1:15 and 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, when practice work follows this period.

9. There shall be no conversations in the corridors while marching to and from recitations and morning exercises, or while recitations are in progress.

10. At the sound of the warning bell all students shall take their seats and refrain from conversation.

- 11. No student shall absent himself from any session or recitation without the permission of some member of the faculty, and, if unavoidably absent, he shall file proper explanation as to cause of absence.
- 12. Books, the property of the Chicago Normal School, shall not be taken from the Library without being registered, and all books taken out for stated time, or called in by the Librarian, shall be returned promptly. There shall be no conversation in the Library.
- 13. The President of the Professional Training Class may appoint, with the confirmation of the Senate, an Assistant Secretary and Assistant Chief Marshal.
- 14. There shall be printed near the close of each school year a Class Year Book, which shall contain the Constitution and Laws of the Professional Training Class, names of Faculty, Class-officers and members of the Class, with the School Song and Yell; and six hundred copies, containing the Constitution, Laws, School Song and Yell, only, shall be for the incoming class.
- 15. All record books of the Professional Training Class shall be kept in a proper place in the Library of the Chicago Normal School (only the duly authorized officers having access to them) and in no case shall they be removed from the Library, except, as either house may order, its journal to be retained for the one session only.
