Good morning,

Yesterday, we handled a call in the City of Duarte regarding a neighbor dispute where a suspect allegedly swung a knife at the victim. Deputies arrived and held the suspect at gunpoint, but the suspect ran to a backyard. A containment was established and the suspect eventually surrendered. Temple Station detective bureau is handling the case and will file one count of assault with a deadly weapon with the District Attorney's Office. The incident was mentioned in today's newspaper. Below is the article:

A man allegedly threatened a neighbor with a knife and then holed up in a Duarte home Monday, authorities said. He later gave up.

It started at 10:19 a.m. with an incident between neighbors in the 2300 block of Maynard Drive, according to Lt. Marsha Williams of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Temple station. She said one neighbor threatened the other with a knife. Williams didn't know what started the dispute.

She said the suspect barricaded himself in a house, but with deputies present he later came out. She didn't know if deputies found a knife at the scene.

Sgt. Michael Martinez said deputies arrested Willie Cummings, 44, on suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon.

Booking records show Cummings was being held at the Temple station jail on \$30,000 bail. He is scheduled for arraignment Wednesday at Alhambra Superior Court.

It was a busy day yesterday and the information was not sent to you in a timely manner, as I would like – my apologies. I will address the issue with my staff again.
