


## Impacts and Preparation for Winter Weather

- The City Faired Well in First Storms this Season
  - \* No Damage Reported
  - \* Sandbags are available (25 per resident) at Fire Station #44 (Highland)
  - \* Debris Basins and Storm Drains Functioned as Intended
    - Los Angeles County Public Works Flood Maintenance Division at work @ Spinks & Bradbury Basins
- Building Inspection Is Monitoring Construction and Residential Sites
  - \* Some Violations Notices Issued for Quick Corrective Action Prior to the Next Storm
  - \* Staff Will Continue to Monitor the City During the Report Runoff Storm Concerns to Winter and Spring Season.



## Construction of Sewer for Mount Olive Lane

- Sewer Project Phase III is Complete 1,350 Linear Feet of New Public Sewer from Approximately Mount Olive Lane to Woodlyn Drive.
- The next Phase of the Sewer Project is to Construct Sewer for Mt. Olive Lane.
- The City Is Committed to Contributing over \$20,000 for the Preliminary Engineering Work Needed to get the Project Started.
- The Engineer has Obtained Verbal Agreements with Duarte Unified School District and Two Private Property Owners, allowing for the Preliminary Engineering to Begin, Which will Include Surveying, Preparation of Legal Descriptions, Etc.
- Once the Easements are Recorded, the Engineer will Return to City Council for Approval to Begin Design Engineering







## Lessons Learned from Fire & Evacuations

- Evacuation Ordered without Closing Street
- Many Did Not Evacuate
- Mt. Olive Remained Closed for Ingress and Egress Reasons, Not for Obvious Safety Reasons (Based on Conditions)
- Sheriff and Fire Command Had Different Views of Length of Evacuation
- Ultimately, Limiting Access to Only Residents (with ID) Made Sense









### Development Around Town

- The City Is Experiencing New Development Throughout the City
  - \* 1901 Royal Oaks Drive Is Working on a Sub-division Project with Some Environmental Work In-Progress
  - \* 1533 Royal Oaks Drive Parcel Map Approved for a Three Lot Sub-Division, Demo Permit Approved, Homes Being Designed
  - \* Mt. Olive Development under Construction and in Plan Review (8 Projects)
  - \* 606 Spring Point Under Construction
  - \* Application Received for 191 Acre Development Known as Oak View Estates within Bradbury Estates in Environmental Review
- Potential Demolition of Homes of Historical Interest
  - \* Opportunities to Preserve History
- New Ordnance for Homes Qualifying as Remodels
- Neighborhood Compatibility Standard
- Short-Term Rentals in the City




### City Budget

The City is Doing Well But Continues to Face Uncertain Storm Water Clean-up and Monitoring Costs



## FAQs and Update on UUT Measure


- In May 2013, our residents passed the UUT
- Initial Rate of 5.5 % on Telecommunication Services (Including Phone), Video Services (Including Cable TV), Electricity, Natural Gas and Solid Waste Disposal
- Also Applies to Water, But at Half the Rate initial rate is 2.25%
- Does Not Apply to:
  - \* Solar Self-Generation
  - \* Internet Access, Internet Purchases (Such as Books, Ringtones, Games or Other Digital Products)
- Rate Sunsets in Five Years, on June 30, 2018
- Tax Rate will be Reviewed by the City Council Each Year and Raised or Lowered Based Upon the City's Revenue Needs, But Not Above 7.5% or Lower Than 1%, and no more than 1.25% each year. Water always at Half the Rate for Other Utilities.
- Exemption for People Over 62 Years of Age or with Certain Disabilities if the Total Household Income Qualifies as "Extremely Low Income"
- Raised Approximately \$207,000 Last Year


